





to the ground conditions but at least it did provide entertainment and the teams showed great determination all through. The football standard suffered somewhat but I feel that both teams did extremely well in adapting themselves to appalling conditions.

Since our opening match at Swindon in August, our opponents have acquired several new players such as Nurse from Middlesbrough, a Welsh international centre-half, Lawton from Darlington, Richardson of Sheffield United, Henderson of Bury and Downsborough from Halifax, and departed from Swindon are the well-known Ernie Hunt, and more recently Atherton who has returned to Bury, so they have quite a formidable set-up with plenty of experience, but I am confident a good display by our own boys should be capable of gaining us a couple of points and should prove the best up to date.

Our unluckiest player this season must surely be Colin Booth who has now had the cartilage removed from his right knee. With treatment and care he should be playing again in about six weeks, and knowing him it cannot be too soon as he is the type who is only happy when playing, and there is still plenty of good football left in him which I believe we shall get. All the rest of the boys are quite fit up to the present time.

Every week that passes one reads of more acts of vandalism and violence being displayed at football matches, and in consequence may I take this opportunity on behalf of our own Club by saying to all concerned, that we have no desire to have our ground blacklisted or even closed by a few people who seem to delight in this kind of act. I realize only too well we are all elated when our own Club is doing well, and sometimes express our emotions to the full, but surely when we do resent decisions or even defeats that is no reason why the Club or other people should have to suffer. After all, the Football Association has the power to impose penalities as it sees the facts and I, therefore, feel sure that common sense should always prevail and matches enjoyed by all.

No new dates have yet been made regarding the two outstanding fixtures with Walsall and Brighton and Hove, but an announcement will be made when they are confirmed. I feel, as Walsall are a 3rd Division club along with ourselves, we offer to them our heartiest congratulations upon their great victory at Stoke City on Saturday last, it was without doubt the performance of the round, a result that personally I did not believe could happen but it does emphasize the glorious uncertainty of cup-tie football.

Finally as we are anticipating our biggest League gate today since our entry into the League, extra Police have been engaged and more Stewards, and with your co-operation we feel that everyone should be able to see the game without any incidents, please remember, they are all in attendance to assist you the Supporters.

afternoon's This game Swindon Town gives us the chance to go one better than when we played on the Wiltshire club's ground on the opening day of the season, that game resulting in a goalless draw. Curiously enough, Swindon's next two home fixtures also produced a similar result, and they did not score their first goal on their own ground until 5 October, when they defeated Bristol Rovers 4-3. They did not find it so difficult to score in away fixtures, however, winning three and drawing one of their first four engagements on tour.

Since "breaking their duck" at home Swindon have been scoring quite consistently, and at times have found the net particularly freely. Not long ago they had a purple patch which yielded no fewer than 16 goals in three successive home games from two fives and a six. One of their nap hands was in the first round of the F.A. Cup when they had a 5—1 home victory over Merthyr Town. In the next stage they

did even better with a 6—1 away win at the expense of another non-League side in Grantham. This qualified them for last week's home encounter with Second Division promotion challengers, Coventry City, which they only lost 1—2 after putting up a fine display.

During the last close-season Swindon received a very large fee from Manchester City for their talented outside-right Mike Summerbee, and the money has been put to good use by their new manager, Danny Williams. The former Rotherham United player, who was appointed in June in succession to Bert Head (now with Bury) has since improved the club's financial outlook still further by the transfer of inside forward Ernie Hunt to Wolves in September.

Newcomers signed by Swindon during the summer were that experienced forward Ken Keyworth from Coventry City, and goalkeeper Peter Downsborough. The latter came from Halifax Town, with inside-forward Bill Atkins going to the Yorkshire club in part exchange.

Since the start of the season there have been other additions to the playing staff in Welsh international centre-half Mel Nurse, signed from Middlesbrough at the end of August; full-back Joe Butler from Newcastle United; centre-forward Jim Lawton who came from Darlington in September, and more recently

wing-half Brian Richardson and winger Tommy Henderson from Sheffield United and Bury respectively. As part of the deal for Henderson wing-half Gordon Atherton rejoined Bury from whence he had moved to Swindon in December 1964.

All the newcomers, with the exception of Ken Keyworth, Joe Butler and Jim Lawton, have held regular places in the Swindon senior side. Butler has so far played in only six League games, and Keyworth in five, divided between centre-forward and inside-left, while Lawton has made eight senior appearances. Since Lawton dropped out through injury early in November, Keith East, the man whom he originally replaced, has been scoring regularly. In his first game on his recall he netted four times in the Cup-tie with Merthyr. The following week he scored five goals in a 6—2 League victory over Mansfield Town and has since added another five to his total in the last six League matches.

Tommy Henderson has taken over on the right wing from England Under-23 international Don Rogers, who has reverted to his usual position on the opposite flank. Dennis Brown and Roger Smart have been regular choice at inside-forward where Brown has been scoring most encouragingly.

Mel Nurse has done a lot to strengthen the defence since his arrival, and the rearguard should be even more reliable with the acquisition of Brian Richardson, who made well over 200 League-appearances for Sheffield United. He has played at left-half in the last two League matches, with Keith Morgan an ever-present all season in the other wing-half berth. An injury received at the beginning of this month forced Peter Downsborough to drop out of the side when local product Tony Hicks was brought in as his deputy.

Owen Dawson has missed six League games at right-back, and his partner, Norman Trollope, has continued this season to enhance his reputation for consistency. An ever-present

in each of the last three seasons as well as this, Trollope made his 200th consecutive League appearance at the end of October.

After their excellent away start to the campaign Swindon went through a much leaner spell when gaining only two points from eight matches on opponents' grounds. When they ended that run with a 3—2 victory at Peterborough a fortnight ago it was their fourth away win, the others having been at York (2—0), Bristol Rovers (1—0) and Workington (3—0). They have drawn at Swansea and Exeter (both 1—1) and Grimsby (2—2). Their seven away defeats have been at Hull, Millwall and Gillingham (all 0—1), Southend (2—4), Watford (0—2), Queen's Park Rangers (2—3) and Scunthorpe (1—2).



First for Young. Alex Young's recall to Everton's team last week marked a change in his Cup fortune, for he scored one of his team's goals which helped to put Sunderland out. Previously Young had figured in ten F.A. Cup games for Everton over five years without once getting his name on the marksman's list.

Consistent Newman. Utility player John Newman has just completed six years with Plymouth Argyle, who signed him from Leicester City, and he has been one of the Devonshire club's most consistent players in recent years. Since joining Argyle he has missed only fifteen out of a possible 250 League appearances.

* * * * *

Contrasts for McIlmoyle. Hugh McIlmoyle's scoring feats for Wolves this season has been quite a contrast. After getting four goals in his first eight games he had blanks in the next eight, then scored six in the next five matches, followed by another six blanks. This spell ended when he scored last week in the Cup-tie against Altrincham.

Versatile Cottager. Fulham's Brian O'Connell has further proved his adaptability recently by turning in some sound displays at left-back. Earlier in the season he had occupied every position in Fulham's attack except outside-right.

* * * * *

Making up for it. Although he did not score this season until early in October, Southport's Alan Spence is now the Sandgrounder's leading marksman with eight goals in League games. Signed from Darlington in 1962, Spence is a part-timer who combines football with a teaching post at a Southport school.

* * * * *

A close race. Centre-forward Chris Chilton and inside forwards Ken Wagstaff and Ken Houghton are having a neck and neck race for the distinction of being Hull City's leading scorers. At the moment Houghton leads the way with twenty in League and Cup to Chilton's sixteen and Wagstaff's fifteen.

* * * * *

Bee's not stinging. From eleven away games Brentford have taken only five points, all from draws, and have scored only eight goals. At the same stage a year ago they had gathered in more than double the points and goals.

* * * * *

Third century. Bristol Rovers' wing-half Ray Mabbutt, who soon completes ten years as a professional at Eastville, should shortly take his total of League appearances to 300. Although starting his career as a winger, he has been a stalwart at wing-half now for several seasons, and one of the club's most consistent players.


