A splendid shot, which simply flew into the top corner of the net before the goalkeeper could realise what was happening.

Our spectators will have a feast of matches between now and the end of the season. Swindon has eleven home games and four away. We have also been asked to stage the England v. Spain Youth International on 30th March (the Wednesday before Election Day). We also have some very attractive Combination games, where the Reserve team is making great endeavours to retain Division I status. The game last Tuesday against Arsenal was most enjoyable. A fast, open game, played with spirit and energy and a fine victory for Swindon.

CLUB NOTES—continued

Today we welcome, after a long absence from the County Ground, old friends in Millwall. Many battles have been fought between the two clubs. Older supporters will have many memories of "The Den" at New Cross. One famous match, played in a dense fog in the early 20's, stands out in the memory of the writer. The result: Millwall 4, Swindon 0.

Our opponents today spent a spell in Division 4 (far too long) but this season we were pleased to welcome them in Division 3. That their return was overdue is shown by their position at the top of the league table, with an advantage of three points over second place Hull City. To date they have gained 46 points from 31 games, against Swindon's 33 points from 29 games.

In away matches they have won 6, drawn 4 and lost 4, with a goal average of 16 against 12. The match will be hard fought, and the result could have a bearing on the final league positions.

Millwall have made much improvement under their present manager, Mr. Billy Gray, who played for several clubs including Chelsea and Notts Forest. A very famous ex-manager, Mr. Jimmy Seed, is now a director of the club, and a man known to all in the football world, Mr. Pursuer, is still the Chairman. He has given great service to the club.

Other well-known managers were Mr. J. Cock (England centre-forward), Mr. Charlie Hewitt, and Mr. W. McCracken.

A Londoner from Bethnal Green. Harry began his career with West Ham United as a youngster. Signed by Millwall on a free transfer in June 1961. One of the most popular players with the Millwall crowd. Whole-hearted Club stalwart.

ADAMS, BRIAN (Right Half)

Londoner who at one time was apprentice professional with Chelsea. Joined Millwall and turned professional. Not a regular, but has been drafted into the side at the appropriate time this season.

SNOWDON, BRYAN (Centre Half)

Born at Bishop Auckland. Had five seasons at Blackpool before moving to Portsmouth. After three seasons with Pompey, transferred to Millwall in October 1964. Club captain.

WILSON, TOM (Left Half)

A Scot from Midlothian. Was with Falkirk for three seasons before transferring to Millwall in July 1961. Age 25. Height 6ft. 0½in. Weight 11st. 4lb.

A Dubliner and Eire international. Transferred a couple of months ago from York City. Age 20. Has been with Manchester United.

NEIL, BILLY (Outside Left)

Another Scot in the Millwall side; like Wilson, hails from the Midlothian area. Was a junior player with Bonnyrigg Rose and was transferred to Millwall in March 1964.

Native of Newcastle-on-Tyne. Previously with Brentford. Joined Millwall two seasons ago.

NOTICE

to

PLAYERS, OFFICIALS AND SPECTATORS

(Extract from Rules)

Players, Officials and Spectators are only allowed to take part in or attend matches on condition that they observe the Rules of the Association, and every affiliated Association or Club is required to observe and enforce such rules.

Every Association or Club is responsible to the Council for the action of its Players, Officials and Spectators, and is required to take all precautions necessary to prevent Spectators threatening or assaulting Officials and Players, during or at the conclusion of Matches. An Official of an Association or Club, Referee, Linesman, or Player, shall not bet on any Football Match, and Association and Clubs are also required to prevent betting and the use of objectionable language by Spectators. In the case of a breach of this Rule, any Player, Official, or Spectator may be removed from any ground, and such force used as may be necessary for the purpose of effecting such removal.

The Association shall be entitled to publish in the public Press, or in any other manner it shall think fit, reports of its proceedings, acts and resolutions whether the same shall or shall not reflect on the character or conduct of any Club, Official, Player, or Spectator, and every such Club, Official, Player, or Spectator shall be deemed to have assented to such publication.




