CLUB NOTES

Two wins in a week, and good ones at that (v. Millwall 1-0; v. Southend 4-0). Unfortunately, our league position has not improved. We are still fourth in the league table, and it looks as if we shall find it difficult to move higher, with Hull City 1st position 50 points, Millwall 2nd position 49 points, Q.P.R. 3rd position 39 points (and two games in hand), Swindon 4th position 37 points.

The two games were vastly different. The match against Millwall was hard-fought, with the result in the balance right to the final whistle. A fine battle enjoyed by a very large crowd of over sixteen thousand. The issue of the game against Southend was really settled in the first fifteen minutes, with the scoring of two goals by Don Rogers. After that, much interest went out of the game, although two more goals were scored and at least two saved by goal-line clearances.

TWO MINUTES FROM GROUND

CLUB NOTES—continued

Our opponents today threatened to challenge for promotion earlier in the season. At present they occupy sixth position with 35 points gained from 32 games, compared with Swindon's 37 from a similar number of games. To date they have won four and drawn six of their sixteen away games. We should, therefore, witness a very close, hard-fought match.

Swindon last played Watford in Season 1962-63. In the home game, played on 6th October, we won by three goals to nil.

Swindon's team was: Turner; Wollen, Trollope; Morgan, Owen, Woodruff; Summerbee, Hunt, Smith, Jackson, Darcy. The composition of teams changes rapidly. After $2\frac{1}{2}$ years, it looks as if only two of the above will be in Swindon's colours, namely K. Morgan and J. Trollope. Watford's team was: Underwood; Bell, Nicholas; Porter, McNeice, Gregory; Bunce, Fraser, Chung, Ward, Howfield. We wonder how many of these will appear on the County Ground today. Probably none at all.

Watford, like Swindon, has spent most of its football life in Division 3. The only occasion when it played in another league was in Season 1958-59, when they were members of Division 4 on its formation, by virtue of the fact they finished in sixteenth position in Division 3 in Season 1957-58. Fortunately they soon gained promotion from Division 4.

We remember many exciting games played between Watford and Swindon at Vicarage Road, probably the most outstanding when we won by seven goals to one. Those were the days when such names as Maurice Owen (centre forward), Harry Lunn (outside right), Brian Farr (right half), Roy Onslow (inside right), Mike Betteridge (inside left) and Mick Page (right half), appeared in the programme. Unfortunately, the following week Watford came to the County Ground and won by one goal to nil, the scorer being Morris Jones (inside left), an ex-Swindon player.

CLUB NOTES—continued

The Annual Dinner and Dance of the Supporters' Club was held on Wednesday last. As usual, this was well attended, a very large crowd being present at the dance. A good time was had by all. Our manager, Mr. D. Williams, made his first real public appearance at an official Supporters' Club function, and cheered everyone by his now well-known short and witty speech.

This week an important meeting of Club Chairmen was held at the League Headquarters at Lytham St. Annes. Many matters were discussed, amongst them the wages structure and the much-debated "signing-on" fees. Everyone connected with football realise that some system must be evolved. The money is just not coming through the turnstiles. (We at Swindon are very fortunate: our gates have been extremely high, by far the best in Division 3.) Clubs will obviously have to reduce staff or wages. Unless something of this nature is carried out football could pass into the hands of the very rich clubs, while many of the others could close down.

We feel it would be a sorry day if the present league formations functioned fully.

We hear a great deal of European football (Cup, Fairs Cup, Cup-winners Cup, etc.). That, however, is still only for the favoured few, between four and six clubs. The rest of the country can be out in the cold.

TOMMY ANDERSON.

A much-travelled footballer, Tommy returned to Watford in December 1964, after service with several English league clubs and a visit to Australia to sample their kind of football.

DENNIS BOND.

Dennis ended Season 1964/65 on a triumphant note by playing in several representative games for England Youth XI. He also starred in an International Youth Tournament staged in Germany and in his first full season for Watford played in 18 league games.

DAVE CARR.

Dave went to Watford in February 1965 as part of an exchange deal which took Ken Oliver to Workington. Injury restricted his number of games for the Club, but he has now recovered and is fit for the coming season.

SAMMY CHUNG.

Sammy has now completed 8 years' service with the Club, during which time he has become a fully qualified F.A. coach. Apart from his team duties, he assists in the coaching of young players who go to the Club requesting a trial.

JOHN COWEN.

John became a Watford player in October 1964, when he was released by Chelsea. Some excellent performances in the reserve side were rewarded with promotion to the senior side towards the end of the season.

RON CRISP.

Best described as a utility player, Ron is equally at home at inside forward, centre forward or wing half. Has been at Vicarage Road since 1961.

BRIAN GARVEY.

A close-season signing from Hull City, Brian normally plays at wing half, but is known to be more than useful in the middle of the half back line.

GEORGE HARRIS.

George is now entering his fourth season at Vicarage Road, having joined the staff from Newport County in 1962. Last season, George broke the goal-scoring record for a winger, when he scored 21 goals and has, so far, hit the net on 50 occasions.

BILLY HOUGHTON.

Bill joined the staff in June 1964 from Barnsley but, unfortunately, injury kept him out of the league side for a considerable period at the start of the season. Later performances showed that he had completely recovered.

ROGER HUGO.

Another close-season capture, Roger was formerly with West Ham United. Usually plays at outside left but caught Manager Ken Furphy's eye whilst playing at centre forward.

BRYN JONES.

Formerly with Newport County, Bournemouth and Northampton, Bryn joined the staff in November 1963. He is a brother of Spurs' winger, Cliff Jones.

HUNTER KENNEDY.

"Ken" signed professional forms for the Club, having served his apprenticeship through the S.E. Counties league side. He is 18 years old and was born in Watford.

CLIVE LOMAS.

Like Kennedy, Clive served his apprenticeship with the junior team before signing as a full professional in January this year.

JIM McANEARNEY.

A native of Dundee, Jim saw service with Sheffield Wednesday and Plymouth before going to Watford in November 1963. During the present season he will also undertake certain coaching activities for the Club.

TERRY MANCINI.

Terry is now entering his fifth season at Vicarage Road and before signing professional forms in July 1961 he was on the staff as an amateur.

BRIAN OWEN.

Brian was a regular member of the league side last season, making 33 appearances and scoring 4 goals.

DUNCAN WELBOURNE.

Signed from Grimsby Town in November 1963, Duncan has made most of his appearances at wing half, but towards the end of last season he successfully moved to right back.

JOHNNY WILLIAMS.

Johnny signed as a professional at the end of September 1964 and was given an extended run in the first team, making 17 appearances in all.

ALAN WILLIAMS.

Signed from Oldham last close season. Alan was previously with Bristol City.

KEN FURPHY.

Previous clubs include Everton, Darlington and Workington. Signed from the latter club as player-manager in November 1964. Is an F.A. staff coach.

STEWART SCULLION.

Joined Watford last month from Charlton Athletic as part of the arrangement that took Cliff Holton to the Valley.

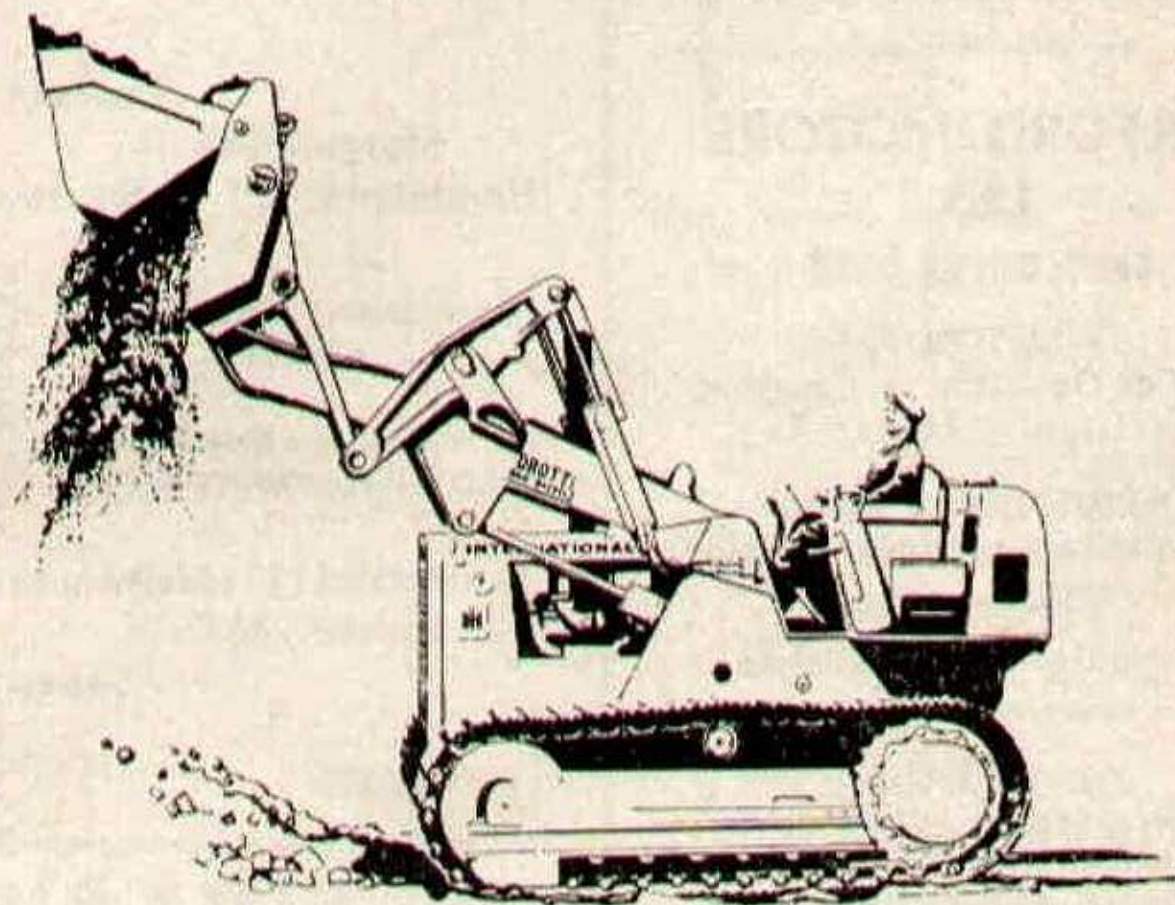

THE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION

NOTICE

to

PLAYERS, OFFICIALS AND SPECTATORS

(Extract from Rules)

Players, Officials and Spectators are only allowed to take part in or attend matches on condition that they observe the Rules of the Association, and every affiliated Association or Club is required to observe and enforce such rules.

Every Association or Club is responsible to the Council for the action of its Players, Officials and Spectators, and is required to take all precautions necessary to prevent Spectators threatening or assaulting Officials and Players, during or at the conclusion of Matches. An Official of an Association or Club, Referee, Linesman, or Player, shall not bet on any Football Match, and Association and Clubs are also required to prevent betting and the use of objectionable language by Spectators. In the case of a breach of this Rule, any Player, Official, or Spectator may be removed from any ground, and such force used as may be necessary for the purpose of effecting such removal.

The Association shall be entitled to publish in the public Press, or in any other manner it shall think fit, reports of its proceedings, acts and resolutions whether the same shall or shall not reflect on the character or conduct of any Club, Official, Player, or Spectator, and every such Club, Official, Player, or Spectator shall be deemed to have assented to such publication.

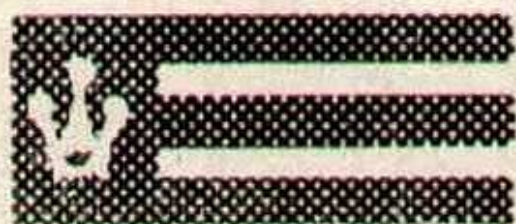
