Good Afternoon Ladies and Gentlemen,

On Saturday last we travelled to Watford in a Football League fixture, this being the third time our Clubs had met this season, the two previous being in the Football League Cup Competition.

In the early stages of the game both sides were somewhat slow to settle down to the conditions and as a result play was rather

scrappy.

Unfortunately for us, Dick Spiers was not able to resume after the interval owing to an injury, and Brian Faulkes came on as substitute and took over the left full back position with Colin Meldrum moving up to centre half back.

The players took time to adjust themselves to these team changes and some six minutes after the change over Watford

scored through Garbett.

We struggled desperately for the equalising goal, but the home team's defence gave nothing away and all of our efforts were in vain.

Last Wednesday evening we entertained Darlington in the return Football League fixture and completed the double with a

one nil victory.

Changes had to be made in the team owing to injuries, and Rodney Thornhill filled the centre half position, Michael Travers was at left half and Alan Scarrott came back on the right wing.

We took up the initiative right from the kick-off and within a few minutes George Harris opened the scoring from David

Bacuzzi's free kick.

Owing to an injury, Maurice Evans did not resume in the


second half and Jimmy Wheeler came on as substitute.

During this half, Darlington came more into the game and our defence was subjected to considerable pressure but remained intact until the final whistle sounded.




