NEWS and VIEWS

This evening we welcome with the utmost pleasure the officials and players of West Bromwich Albion. We believe we are right in saying this is the very first time the two clubs have met in competitive football (i.e., League or Cup matches). A West Bromwich Albion team played against Swindon in 1951-52 in a benefit game for Harry Martin, at that time Reserve team trainer.

Harry, a quiet, reserved man, and a very shrewd judge of a player, was first-team trainer for many years before World War II. During that period a left full-back, Jack Smith, played for Swindon and was transferred for a large amount to Chelsea. Later this player became manager of West Bromwich Albion from 1948-53. Thus the link; Jack had not forgotten his old friend and trainer. Harry Martin, incidentally, played outsideleft for Sunderland when that club was in its hey-day, one of the outstanding teams in the country. Harry retired to Nottingham, and we have met him many times at the Forest ground or that of Notts County. His heart is still in Swindon, and he follows its fortunes through the medium of the "Football Pink", sent to him every week by his friend Mrs. "Addy" Loveday, whose house in Shrivenham Road was home and rendezvous for almost every professional who played for Swindon after the war to the 'fifties.

We had several associations with West Bromwich Albion: two players, J. Cookson and W. Richardson, came to Swindon from that club, and of course a well-known Swindonian, Ray Barlow, played many years for them, gaining a Cup-winners medal in 1954.

West Bromwich has gained many honours in football. They won the F.A. Cup four times, and in 1888 made their third successive appearance in the Final. They were League champions in Season 1919-20, and have several times been runners-up. Their greatest achievement however was probably in Season 1930-31, when they were runners-up in Division II, thus gaining promotion, and also F.A. Cup winners. Rarely has a Division II side appeared in the Final, let alone won the trophy.

Many great players have represented the Club. Such famous names as Billy Bassett, Jesse Pennington, W. Boyes, J. Carter, T. Magee, T. Glidden and A. McNab have worn the famous blue and white striped shirts of the "Throstles".

Their present manager is Mr. J. Hagan, the famous English inside-left of the 'forties. Remember the team? Swift; Scott, Hardwicke; Britton, Cullis, Mercer; Matthews, Carter, Lawton, Hagan, L. G. F. Smith. Probably the most outstanding personality who served this famous club was Mr. F. Everiss (1896-1948), as player, secretary and manager.

Tonight West Bromwich Albion appear at the County Ground as holders of the League Cup. As a result of this they are participating in the European Fairs Cup competition. They will be anxious to continue in this football, and therefore the game is very important. Swindon have not made a great start in the League programme, but have risen to top form in the League Cup. Spectators should witness a great game.

The Football League Cup was inaugurated in Season 1960-61 for the benefit of all clubs in membership of the four divisions. Unfortunately, some clubs were not very optimistic about the new competition. Now all clubs except two (Cup and League winners) take part, making for greater interest. The visit of one

of the best teams in the country to Swindon tonight, certainly is a "shot in the arm" for the Club. A win tonight could create great confidence in the camp.

This competition is now firmly established, and is arranged to fit in with League fixtures. The great point is the clubs taking part control their own competition.

It is natural for West Bromwich to do well in the League Cup, as it is as cup-fighters that the Club is really famed. Individual stars there have certainly been, but almost invariably the Club's greatest achievements have been the result of all-round team work — a delightful combination of artistry, pace and power. That they will serve up football tonight in keeping with the Albion tradition is a guarantee of fine entertainment.

The draw for the F.A. Challenge Cup has not been very kind to Swindon. We have to travel to Horsham in Sussex to play the local amateur club. At present they occupy third position in the Athenian League. In the last round they defeated Hastings United, a club which is in the First Division of the Southern League. Many supporters will remember the set-back we received when we played there in 1954 in the second round, and were defeated by four goals to two. We trust history will not repeat itself, although the ground we shall play on is rather small, capable of holding 6,000 spectators. Rather let us think of Grantham, and the result when we travelled north last year.



SUPPORTERS CLUB NOTES

One of the rather annoying aspects of writing these notes is that football news is never "hot off the press" as it were. As I write this, last Saturday's match with Swansea has not been played and, up to a point, the Walsall and Middlesbrough matches are past history. What is more important is that three more valuable points were lost, and we are three points nearer Division 4.

I am told that in the football world it is generally conceded that any club with less than 20 league points by Xmas can be considered as probable relegation candidates. With four teams to be relegated from Division 3 to Division 4 it could be that 20 points is too low a figure. Including the match last Saturday, there are ten matches to Xmas. In short, a loss of 5 or more league points between now and Xmas is something to be avoided.

Now I am sure that all supporters are at one in not wanting relegation. Everyone wants Division 2 and, in due course, Division 1 football. Well, ladies and gentlemen, let's hear you do something about it in the way of encouraging vocal support. In my view a supporter who gives up hope and walks out 15 minutes before full-time is no better than a player who stops trying before the final whistle. In fact, I'm not sure that such a supporter is not worse insofar as his action can have a most adverse affect on a team as a whole.


The situation calls for team work — directors, team, and supporters. So let's get down to it.




