NEWS and VIEWS

This afternoon we play our second important game in a week. These notes must be written before the replayed Cup-tie. Whatever the result of that game (and we hope it was good), today's match is much more vital to us. Whilst the Cup is a great attraction, sometimes a money-spinner, and success in it brings confidence, our League position is such that we badly need points to improve it. The end of the season draws dangerously nearer, and we are far from being out of the wood.

Today's game is naturally an attractive one. With Reading providing the opposition, and a local derby, interest and excitement can be high. I wonder if the gate will be in the same region as on Tuesday, or will it reach half that figure? The receipts from Division 3 games are the backbone of our finances. The Cup produces, in some cases, big money, but each club receives less than one-third of the income.

Last season we entertained Reading before a crowd of 15,627 (we shall be very happy to see that number present today). The result was a win of five goals to nil in Swindon's favour. In the return game at Reading we won by two goals to nil. The match was played in the evening of the 1st April. Although we lost at home to Watford on the previous Saturday, Swindon had a tremendous following, something approaching five thousand; and did they cheer and support their team? I remember the announcer at half-time saying rather dejectedly, but trying to stir up enthusiasm: "Come along Reading supporters, people will think this game is being played at Swindon".

From time to time we have referred to articles published in the "Football League Review". This month Mr. Clifford Coombs, newly-appointed chairman of Birmingham, makes what some consider rather provocative suggestions for the financial improvement of clubs. Some well-known chairmen disprove the ideas, even "shoot them down in flames" in some cases. However some people in football think there is food for thought. Mr. Coombs merely says "One additional gate each week would transform the balance sheet of many clubs. So why not play twice a week, once at home and once away. Several objections are put forward: quite impossible to meet the demands of training and turn out a first-class performance every three days; no manager can start to get his players fit until two days after the last match.

We hope this week, especially today's game, will disprove the argument of a match every three days. What happens at holiday times, Christmas and Easter? Not so long ago clubs played three games in four days on the latter occasion. As for training, a match releases players from training after a tedious process at this period of the year. In fact some people would go so far as to say many players would prefer to play a game rather than train. Much more enjoyable. Surely full-time, highly trained professionals can play two games in a week. That is not too much to expect. Many of us know amateur players of quite a high standard who often at the end of a season, to complete the fixtures, play four games in a week, and work all day in a factory from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Two matches a week could perhaps cause some congestion of fixtures, but organisation could prevent much of that. There would be more wear and tear of pitches. Some are pretty poor now, and they couldn't get much worse. Certainly more use would be made of football stadiums, but would the public stand for it — would they get fed-up with football? Finally, could they afford to pay for two games every week?

Whatever happens, it appears something will have to be done to place many clubs on a sound financial basis. Quite a number today only exist on donations from Supporters' Clubs and various competitions and lotteries. Fewer people watch each year, yet overall expenses rise higher and higher. Some clubs try to overcome the difficulties by reducing the size of the playing staff. (It is frequently stated that players wages account for 80% of outgoings. We wouldn't put it quite as high as that.) This reduction sometimes create an embarrassing position, although only one team is run. Will some teams cease to exist? It seems very much as if that is the trend of things. Certainly many Southern League clubs are near to closing down.


SUPPORTERS CLUB NOTES

the moment. It's all very well complaining that Third Division football is not worth watching, and using this as an excuse for not coming to the County Ground regularly, but what you are saying, in effect, is that you, yourselves, are not prepared to put yourselves out to help the Club move up to higher Divisions. It's all very comforting to say that this or that player must be bought, but without your regular support, how can you expect the Club to be in a position to buy such players — or for that matter afford the almost equal expense of training young and promising players from the time they leave school until they are capable of taking their places in the senior teams.

Our next opponents in the F.A. Cup competition is Bury—no newcomers to the County Ground. This will be a hard match to win—perhaps as difficult a cup opponent as West Ham United. The players I have spoken to over the last few days are under no illusion whatsoever on this score. Your support on the 18th February will be as important as it was on Tuesday night, if entry into the next round is to be achieved. Our regular supporters—the steady average of about 10,000—will be there, as they are today, together with you, the missing thousands. Do your part to the last echo and we shall be through to the next round.

I would again thank the West Ham United team and supporters for the very gallant and sportsmanlike way in which these two matches were played. We had a number of West Ham United supporters in the Social Club after the match, and a very nice bunch of lads they were. They stayed until the Club closed, although this meant that they had to wait until the 2.30 a.m. train before they could leave for home. As I said in my


