NEWS and VIEWS

Despite the fact that many minds and thoughts are still on cup football, tonight we must get down to the serious business of improving our league position.

It is all very well saying our goal average is good and we have as many as two matches in hand. The plain fact is we are at present in the relegation group, i.e., the bottom four places, and it is going to require a great effort on the part of everyone of us to move out of the danger zone. We may be two games in hand, but our league form over the past six matches has not produced one point per game. In fact the six games have not provided us with a single point. The Cup provides interest, sometimes finance, but whatever happens, even if we went to Wembley(!!!) we must retain our league status. Relegation to Division IV would be most detrimental to Swindon Town.

This evening, with hopes of an improvement riding high, we entertain Grimsby Town who, like ourselves, is not enjoying the best of league football.

Last season we were due to play them twice in the Christmas holiday. In the away game played on Boxing Day we drew 2—2, but the return to be played the following day was postponed owing to the surface of the County Ground being frozen. At the time Grimsby Town was participating in a successful run, and occupied third position in the league table. It was

Age 19, comes from Hull. Wrote to Grimsby Town for a trial in January, 1964. Played in three F.A. Amateur Youth Internationals. Got his place when Grimsby Town transferred Charlie Wright to Charlton Athletic in March, 1966.

JIMMY BLOOMER (Right Back)

Son of a former Grimsby Town centre forward. Joined Grimsby Town as a junior and graduated through nursery teams. Also 19 and, like Dad, was a centre forward until converted to full back by a former Grimsby Town manager, Tim Ward, now at Derby County.

GRAHAM TAYLOR (Left Back)

Team captain, joined Grimsby Town as an amateur in 1961. Played for England Grammar Schools that year. Formerly with Scunthorpe United, just 22.

KEITH JOBLING (Centre Half)

Long service player recruited from local football in 1953 and has proved a sound club man all the time.

RON COCKERILL (Left Half)

A talented ball player with a wealth of experience. A six-footer, joined Grimsby Town from Hudderfield Town in 1958 but made his debut three years earlier in First Division football.

JOHN FIELDING (Outside Right)

Signed from Brentford last December. Once an amateur with Everton, his first club was Wigan. He moved to Southport in 1961 and two years later was transferred to Brentford.

DAVE WORTHINGTON (Outside Right)

Signed in the close season from Barrow, who gave him a free transfer. Born at Halifax, Dave, 21, can put in a workmanlike show at any position. Though recognised as a wing half, he has already played at centre forward and on the wing for Grimsby Town.

BILLY RUDD (Inside Left)

Grimsby Town's only other close season signing from York City and proving a key figure in the forward line. Previously with Birmingham City.

BRIAN HILL (Outside Left)

Joined Grimsby Town as a 17-year-old six years ago, now maturing into a clever player. Gave a brilliant display, apart from scoring three goals, in Grimsby Town's 7—1 win against local rivals Scunthorpe United on 7th September, 1966.

RAY LANCASTER (Wing Half)

Signed from Rotherham United, where he was talked of as potential England Under 23 material. Suffered a cartilage injury which necessitated an operation early last season and just regaining form.

DOUG COLLINS (Left Winger)

Aged 21, released by Rotherham United when a junior. Clever on the ball.

NORMAN OAKLEY (Goalkeeper)

Signed in September, 1966, from Swindon Town. Began with Doncaster Rovers and then moved to Hartlepools United who transferred him to Swindon Town in March, 1964. Broke a leg in October, 1965.

ANGUS DAVIDSON (Wing Half)

Joined Grimsby Town from Arbroath Boys Club as an amateur in 1964. Was only 17 when he made senior debut against West Ham United in League Cup fifth round in November, 1965.

JOHN WILKINSON (Left Back)

Comes from Mansfield. Age 17. Played in six league games last season.





Our congratulations now go to the team for the victory over Bury in last Saturday's cup-tie. Perhaps it did not reach the heights reached in the West Ham matches, but the result was just as decisive - a pass into the next round and a most attractive draw against Notts Forest. I am sure that many thousands of loyal supporters will travel to the match, and I am sure the trip will be worth it. Notts Forest playing pitch is acknowledged to be one of the best in England, and this will, in itself, be of great help to the lads. Further, win, draw or lose, they will be able to play football, and on this account alone will stand a good chance of upsetting the prophets of the Press. I am looking forward to comparing Don Rogers with Ian Moore, the Forest left-winger who has been chosen for the next England under-23 team. Swindon supporters are in no doubt as to Don's ability, and if Sir Alfred Ramsey should also be at the match, he could do much worse than to keep an eye on John Trollope, who I personally consider to be one of the most unrecognised players in League football today.

I am advised by a colleague of mine — a Notts Forest supporter incidentally — that anyone travelling to Nottingham by car would be advised to leave the M1 motorway where it crosses the Derby/Nottingham by-pass, and keep on the North side of the Trent river, heading for the Notts County ground. There is ample parking facilities here — in Meadow Lane which is off London Road — including the cattle market, which can hold about 4,000 cars. This is about 400 yards from the Forest ground — a short walk over Trent Bridge from the car park — and he tells me that car parking facilities around the Forest ground are particularly bad when leaving after a

match.

Particulars of arrangements in the event of a replay at Swindon, are not yet to hand. These should be available by next Saturday, the 4th March, and will be included in our Suppliers to the Swindon Team


