TONY HICKS (Goalkeeper).

Born Swindon. He has been with Swindon for five years. He joined the Club as a schoolboy and progressed through the ranks of the junior teams before becoming one of the three senior goalkeepers.

JOHN TROLLOPE (Left Back).

Born Swindon. Another local player who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the first team at the beginning of the 1960/61 Season when he was just 16 years old, and was ever present during that Season. A strong player who has proved his worth in a good defence.

KEITH MORGAN (Right Half).

Born Trowbridge. A tall fast attacking player who progressed through the Club's junior teams after joining Swindon ground staff at the age of 16. He has been a regular player for the Town first team.

MEL NURSE (Centre Half).

Signed from Middlesbrough at the beginning of last Season. He is a strong forceful player and is an International with Wales. His ability and experience has done much to strengthen the teams defence.

STAN HARLAND (Left Back).

Born Liverpool. Signed during close Season from Carlisle United. He is a forceful player and is able to go forward to back up the forwards in attack.

ROGER SMART (Inside Right).

Born Swindon. Another local born player who joined the Club direct from Swindon Schoolboys team. At 17 he was appearing regularly at centre-forward in the reserve team, but he excels as a deep lying inside-forward or wing-half.

DONALD ROGERS (Outside Left).

Born Paulton. A player of outstanding ability. He has long been the target for many of the English First Division Clubs. He has played for England Youth Team and also the England under 23 X1.

KEN SKEEN (Inside Forward).

Born Cheltenham. He played originally as an amateur with Club but subsequently joined Trowbridge Town and re-joined Swindon as a professional in September, 1964.

ROD THOMAS (Full Back).

Born Glyncorrwg. A former youth player with the Club, whose speed and strength has made him a reliable defender. Made his debut in the First Team last Season.

BRUCE WALKER (Outside Left).

Born Westwood Lay. Joined Swindon from County football. Though he is not a big player his ability and speed makes him a menace to any defence.

RUN BY ENTHUSIASTS

Reprinted from "Football League Review."

It's a national disgrace — but don't blame football

British Rail's decision to run special trains for The League Cup final at Wembley only if West Bromwich Albion appointed vigilantes to supervise passengers met with a great deal of criticism.

The facts are that trains all over the country have been smashed by hooligans travelling under the guise of football supporters.

British Rail claim that damage caused has meant that football specials are run at a loss. No public transport body can tolerate that. It is true that outbreaks of vandalism have yet to affect trains used by the supporters of many clubs, including Albion's. It is also true that there is no knowing where the next rash of hooliganism will occur.

The facts are that it is not the true football supporter, no matter how young he may be, who perpetrates violence and vandalism.

It was because they firmly believed this that both The President and the Secretary of The Football League made representations to British Rail on behalf of Albion Supporters' Club. We hope that by the time this has been published the Wembley experiment will have proved that hooliganism on trains can be controlled by supervision.

Coventry City have long proved this. The club runs its own Sky Blue trains to away fixtures and there has never been trouble on these excursions.

The game's image must not be impaired because of a hooligan fringe, and it was unfortunate that the deputy chairman of Leicester magistrates should recently have received so much publicity with his charge that "the behaviour of people at football matches is becoming a thorough national disgrace."

He might have performed a better service to the community had he said that the general standard of behaviour of some people everywhere is becoming a national disgrace.

Five men were dealt with by the court after trouble at the Leicester - Glasgow Rangers friendly. One openly admitted to the magistrates that he was not a football fan.

The behaviour of the hooligan fringe is a disgrace, but the average, well-behaved football fan does not deserve to be identified with people like these.

Nor do the clubs. Nor does the game.

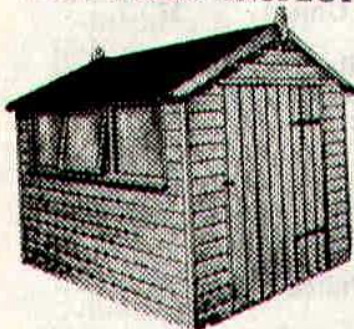

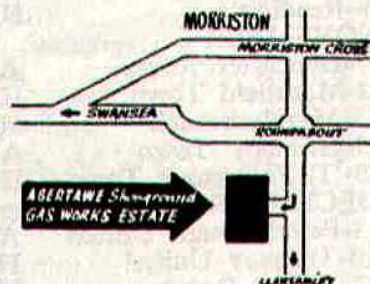
