

OUR GUESTS . . .

O NE of the big puzzles of the season is how Swindon Town came to be struggling in the Third Division relegation zone when they are capable of extending First Division giants Nottingham Forest to three matches by dint of constructive, pleasing football after thrashing West Ham after two games.

Swindon say, with justification, that they are not able to flower their game in the League. Certainly, it would be a tragedy if such a fine side lost their status.

Manager Danny Williams has a judicious mixture of youth and experience. In goal is local boy **Tony Hicks**, who has taken over so capably following the cartilage injury to first choice Peter Downsborough.

Full backs are local boy John Trollope who made his debut at 16 and made his 250th consecutive appearance in December, and Rod Thomas, from Gloucester who has won Welsh Under 23 caps this season.

Wing halves are Westbury-born Keith Morgan and Stan Harland, who has been playing great football since he joined from Carlisle last October. Centre half is club captain Mel Nurse, the Welsh international who signed from Middlesbrough.

At outside right is **Don Rogers**, local born star who is the target of several First Division clubs. He is partnere by **Willie Penman**, clever ball playing Scot who was signed only last November from Newcastle. He was previously with Glasgow Rangers.

Centre forward is Pat Terry, signed from Reading only a few weeks ago and who did not take part in the Cup run. Also Cup-tied was left winger Bobby Jones, former Bristol Rovers stalwart, who was signed a few weeks ago after only three months at Northampton.

His partner is Roger Smart, yet another local boy who has made good, and who caught the eye in Town's exciting Cup run.

Personality of the Week . . .

GEOFF COX

NE of Torquay's longest serving players, Geoff Cox, has not been Torquay's luckiest footballer in recent years. Cartilage trouble put him out of the game last season and, after six first team matches early in this campaign, he has been featuring in the Western League side.

His good work at wing half has been a big help to the younger Reserve footballers.

Recruited from Birmingham City over nine years ago, Geoff played on the wing in his early games for United but he was later converted to inside forward or wing half and gave splendid service in both positions—a thoroughly good club man.

Cox joined Birmingham City straight from school, signing as a full professional at the age of 17 after a short spell on the ground staff.

The same year he had 23 League games for Birmingham, playing on the right and left wings and at inside forward.

As a National Serviceman he had representative matches for the Army against Jersey and Guernsey in the Channel Islands and the Irish League, but when he returned to Birmingham he found that City, with established stars such as Gordon Astall and Alex Govan on the wings, could not offer him a regular first team place, and he moved to Plainmoor.
