

NEWS and VIEWS

We must approach the Christmas programme with a certain amount of confidence after the past two matches — the splendid win at Oldham, followed by the Cup victory over Salisbury by four goals to nil.

Whatever is said about the game and the opposition (yes, a Western League team), the Cup competition, as we all know, is a great leveller, and the non-league team can play above itself and produce surprising results. Instance Runcorn's defeat of Notts County, and Tow Law's victory over Mansfield by five goals to one, after being one down at half-time.

However, we are over the first hurdle, and look forward with eager anticipation, to the next round, then in with the "big guns" and really hopes of a repeat performance of last year.

In addition we are in quite a healthy position in the League table. At present in sixth place with twenty-four points from twenty-two games, and merely one point less than Oxford United in fourth position. Just take note of our goal average, 37—23, one of the best in the League.

Stockport County, our opponents tonight, are three places above us yet their goal average is 33—30. Seems very odd. We last played them in Season 1958-59, when unfortunately they finished in twenty-first position, and so were relegated to Division 4. During the last few seasons they have made great progress and last season won promotion and the Division 4 League Championship by a substantial margin over Southport of five points, with the following record:

The away results prove their strength, won 10, drawn 7, a total of 27 points — most impressive. They bought a number of players, among them two former Swindon Town lads, Bill Atkins and Keith East (since transferred to Bournemouth & B.A.). Originally he came to us from Portsmouth, so he is almost back home.

We hope "Big" Bill will be playing tonight. A likeable, genuine lad, a favourite with his colleagues, he will be sure to get a good reception from the home crowd, although we are afraid they did not always realise his worth whilst playing at the County Ground. Possessor of a deadly shot, he scored many fine goals and, with his height, he was a good header of the ball. Welcome back, Bill. Coronation Street will be pleased to see you.

We mentioned earlier that in Season 1958-59, Stockport County was relegated and the final position was twenty-first. Swindon's League positions from last season to Season 1958-59 make interesting reading.

1966-67, 8th; 1965-66, 7th; a gap of two seasons; 1962-63, 2nd; 1961-62, 9th; 1960-61, 16th; 1959-60, 16th; 1958-59, 15th. Two seasons in Division 2: 1964-65, 21st; 1963-64, 14th. All in all quite a good record, although somewhat disappointing when we lost our place in Division 2 after two seasons. It is quite a factor this season that promoted clubs are finding things very difficult in a higher sphere, instance Coventry City.
