Today we greet Swindon Town, and offer a cordial welcome to their players and officials,

Last week's trip to Reading produced a severe disappointment. We played well, certainly much better than the tired home team and yet goals were conceded in three fleeting raids on our goal.

The injury to Bill Williams weakened us after five minutes play, but at half-time David Quirke substituted and, ably supported by Mel Machin, he made a very creditable impression.

There was a pleasing return to form of several players last week, but we were still not able to maintain the mid-field superiority that we established in the first half-hour. Let us hope the ball will run more kindly for us today and, for 'the Robins', a good result at Sheffield to add to their home triumphs against Salisbury, Luton Town and Blackburn Rovers.
