# INEWS and VIEWS

"The tumult and the shouting dies, the captains and the kings depart". So has ended the great occasion. Nevertheless, this was our "finest hour" ever. We have often written of the tradition and great days of Swindon Town in the early days of the century (rather appropriate we play Barnsley tonight). The winning of the League Cup tops the lot, the outstanding achievement.

Swindon has been acclaimed throughout the country and in the National Press. Most have emphasised the great team effort, the superb fitness, and the willingness to work for each other. As the Manager said at the celebration after the game, the success was brought about by the efforts of many, including all those behind the scenes. Here we must mention the office staff (and remember, our office is not the best equipped in the League). Not for them the glamour, the limelight, or the financial rewards, just the hard work, and often the brickbats. Since the beginning of November — when the "all ticket" business began — Mr. R. Morse, Mr. R. Jefferies and Mrs. Moss (yes, we even name them), have been under constant pressure. We often hear the last word referred to, in connection with the players, but in the case of the office this has increased week by week, and match by match. After we reached the Final the ticket problem grew out of all proportion. The office was under constant siege. How they coped with it all I just don't know; and yet throughout they appeared calm, quiet and relaxed. I'm sure they must have found it hard to settle or sleep at night, with all the pent-up emotions, stresses and strains released.

Remember tickets were being sold up to 8 p.m. at night, and after that everything had to be cashed up and money deposited in the bank. Then back at the job next morning before 9 a.m.

In addition to all this, there were the thousand-and-one items to be dealt with in the normal day-to-day running of the Club. The working out of the wages must have been a major operation with all the various additions. I hope they feel it was worthwhile, but the strain must have been terrific. I'm sure if a replay had been necessary (and at one time it looked likely), they would have felt like disappearing to the South of France.

A word of thanks to the Chairman, Mr. Lane. In his first year in this office he has faced a tremendous task. In fact since Christmas he has almost lived at the County Ground. I know on occasions he has left home at 6.30 a.m. to attend to his business, and has not sat down once until he returned home late in the evening. I know he was a happy man on Saturday, and I am sure he felt very gratified for all his hard work.

Now to our friends the Arsenal (yes, they have been our friends for many years). I remember in the early 'fifties, an official of our Club went to them, cap in hand, for a goal-keeper. We had no money to pay — he had to be free. Mr. T. Whittaker, Manager at the time, provided such a player who, two seasons later, was transferred by Swindon for £10,000.

The defeat must have been a bitter blow to everyone connected with the Club. Yet as our players went up the steps to the Royal Box Mr. Mee, their Manager, shook hands and congratulated each one of them — a magnificent sporting gesture. Thank you, Mr. Mee.

We hope they will soon get over this defeat and go ahead to a high position in the League. I have had the pleasure of watching Arsenal play on six occasions during the last twelve months, and without wishing to detract from our team's wonderful performance and fitness, I was amazed at the sluggishness of the running of some of their team. I can't help feeling the after-effects of 'flu were still there, although of course their build-up of attacks were very slow and deliberate,

and often very square. We must admit it just had to be our day.

To me, Arsenal is one of the finest and most hospitable clubs in the country. I have visited Highbury many times, and have enjoyed it immensely. I feel sure any future visitors from Swindon will be made most welcome.

I wonder how many have noticed the fact that to date, all our players have escaped the 'flu bug, while several clubs have had to have games postponed because of it. This is entirely due to the persistence and foresight of the Club doctor. Six months ago, when an epidemic was forecast, he made tremendous efforts to obtain sufficient serum to inject and immunise most of our players, especially the first-team squad. Not only has he kept the players under constant supervision, and attended to their various injuries, but has kept them free of illness. This could easily have been a key factor in the winning of the League Cup. "Thank you, Sir!"

We have to record the death of another of our old players. He died on the day of the Cup Final. How proud he would have been. Bert Denyer (Twinkle-toes), for many years a grand outside-right in one of our finest teams. We extend to his widow, son and daughter our sympathies.

The name Barnsley will stir the memories of our older supporters, especially those over seventy years of age. Oh! yes, we still retain some of those fine men. Between 1910 and 1914 Barnsley was one of the greatest teams in the country, and Swindon Town was at the height of its fame.

In 1912, Swindon enjoyed a fine Cup run, defeating Sutton Junction 5—0; Notts County 2—0; West Ham United 4—0, after a 1—1 draw at West Ham. Then followed the great semifinal with Barnsley at Chelsea. Result 0—0. The replay was at Nottingham. Swindon unfortunately suffered an injury to the one-and-only Harold Fleming, and lost by one goal to nil. Barnsley went on to win the Final 1—0 against West Brom-

wich Albion, again after a draw 0—0. Both those Finals were played at the old Crystal Palace, where the majority of the spectators stood in the open. Little covered accommodation or seats were available in those days.

The Barnsley team was one of the "greats", containing some outstanding players. I wonder how many remember them? Cooper; Downs (the famous "Dickie"), Taylor; Glendenning, Bratley, Utley (English International); Bartrop, Tufnell, Lillycrop, Travers, Moore.


Swindon: Skiller; Kay, Walker (Scotland); Tout, Silto (he was transferred from Barnsley in 1909 — a hard, dour Yorkshireman), Handley; Jefferson, Fleming (England), Wheatcroft, Bown, Bolland.


