

news & views

No doubt our supporters were well pleased with the fine victory at Aston Villa, perhaps the best result so far this season. So three games in eight days,

five points, and six goals scored.

Swindon, as usual, had a fine following of supporters, and all present at the game will long remember the wonderful goal scored by Rodney Thomas. It will surely go down as the goal of the year if not the century. We have noted with pleasure the fact that our players do not run yards and indulge in hugging and back-slapping when one of their colleagues score a goal.

These notes must be compiled long before the result of the game in Italy will be known. We wish everyone well. We face a rather long and exacting programme. The party going to Rome left Swindon at 6.15 a.m. on Monday morning. The match itself was played late on Wednesday evening, round about 9 p.m. for kick-off, our time. The departure time from Italy was twelve noon, with arrival in Swindon in the early evening. Not very long to get over the tiredness and effects of such a journey before today's vital match with Charlton.

On Tuesday we travel to Swansea to play the second round of the League Cup. This game gives every promise of being a great attraction in the Welsh town. The supporters are anxious to see the League Cup winners, especially as for many years we were opponents. This in many respects makes the

match all the more harder for us.

Today we are pleased to welcome to Swindon once again the Officials and Players of Charlton Athletic. We look upon them as some of our best friends, as several of their party have associations with Swindon and the neighbourhood. We last played Charlton in season 1964-65. The away game took place on 5th September, 1964. Result 2-3. Both Swindon's goals were scored by Bill Atkins from quite long range. The home fixture was the first of the New Year — 2nd January, 1965. We thought the New Year would bring a turn of fortune in our favour, as we began with the victory of 2—0 and followed this by winning 2-1 at Manchester City. The ground for the Charlton game was very muddy and heavy making it difficult to play on. Our lads played with tremendous spirit and determination. The first goal was only scored by sheer perseverance. The teams playing that day make interesting reading. Charlton: Rose; Hewie, Kinsey; Bailey (Capt. of Wolves), Haydock, Tocknell; Kenning, Kennedy, Matthews, Peacock, Glover (Leicester).

May we make a final appeal to those who occupy the Ring Seats not to move until the game has ended. Spectators moving so close to the actual playing pitch create much disturbance, and if this continues there is great danger of complaint by the referee and opposing teams. This could result in the Club having to remove these seats, which would mean the loss of 750

places.

We noted with pleasure that Sheffield Wednesday won at Sunderland, so despite the very bad start that team has collected four points, and now occupy fifteenth position in the League table. Well done, Danny!

CHARLIE WRIGHT

Born Glasgow. Previous clubs, Rangers, Workington and Grimsby Town. Joined Charlton Athletic on 16th March, 1966. Began career with Glentyan Thistle, with whom he won a Scottish Juvenile Cup Final medal.

BOB CURTIS

Born Langwith. Became an apprentice professional with Charlton Athletic on 12th April, 1965, and a full professional on 25th January, 1967. Made his League debut shortly after and has since been a consistent member of the first team.

BRIAN KINSEY

Born Eltham. Played for the Southern Counties v. Northern Counties as an amateur before he was 17. Signed as a professional for Charlton Athletic on 2nd October, 1956. Has been a first team regular for many seasons and was granted a testimonial in 1968/69 season. Recently appointed Commercial Development Officer for Charlton Athletic F.C. ALAN CAMPBELL

Born Arbroath. Joined Charlton Athletic from Arbroath Lads Club and signed as a professional on 8th February, 1965. Played for Scotland Youth v. England and in the Easter Youth Tournament in 1966. Selected to play for Scotland Under 23 v. England and Wales during season 1968/69 but both games were postponed.

PAUL WENT

Born Bow. Played 6 times for England Schoolboys and made 10 appearances for England Youth and succeeded Peter Reeves of Charlton Athletic, as England Youth Team captain. Signed for Charlton Athletic from Leyton Orient on 8th June, 1967, for record fee for a 17-year-old of £24,500.

PETER REEVES

Born Eltham. Played for Woolwich, Kent and London Schools. Played as an amateur with Penhill Standard and became an apprentice professional with Charlton Athletic on 27th July, 1964, and signed professional forms on 7th February, 1966. Captained England Youth Team in 1967, and played v. Germany, Scotland (2), Italy, Spain, Yugoslavia, France and Russia, the team reaching the final of the European Youth Tournament.

HARRY GREGORY

Born Homerton, Played for Hackney Boys and played for England Youth v. Switzerland. Joined Charlton Athletic from Leyton Orient on 27th July, 1966.

MIKE KENNING

Born Birmingham. Joined Charlton Athletic via Aston Villa and Shrewsbury Town. Was transferred to Norwich City in December, 1966. From Norwich City he was transferred to Wolverhampton Wanderers and re-joined Charlton Athletic in March. 1969.

RAY CRAWFORD

Born Portsmouth. Was a member of the Ipswich Town promotion and Football League Championship side and gained England International honours. Joined Charlton Athletic in March, 1969, from Ipswich Town after spells with West Bromwich Albion and Wolverhampton Wanderers.

MATT TEES

Born Johnstone. Joined Airdrieonians in 1960 and moved to Grimsby Town in July, 1963. Played 113 League games and scored 51 goals before moving to Charlton Athletic in January, 1967. GRAHAM MOORE

Born Hengoed, Glamorgan. Gained Welsh Youth Caps while with Bargoed YMCA. Became a professional with Cardiff City in 1958 and won Welsh Under 23 Caps and full International honours. Played for the Football League v. League of Ireland in 1961. Joined Chelsea in 1961 and moved to Manchester United in November, 1963, where he gained further Under 23 and full International Caps. Was transferred to Northampton Town in December, 1965, and played for Wales v. Chile. Joined Charlton Athletic in May, 1967, and is a current Welsh International.

KEITH PEACOCK

Born Barnehurst. Played as an amateur for Charlton Athletic before signing as a professional in July, 1961. Is approaching 200 League appearances and is another of Charlton Athletic's popular local products.







Swindon received a great ovation in the magnificent Olympic Stadium. The Town were a goal down at half-time. Roger Smart misjudged a tackle on Elvio Salvori, and Enzo lashed in the spot kick. But seven minutes later after the restart John Smith chipped in a free kick from near the right by line and, as the ball ran loose, Peter Noble rifled home a splendid shot. Roma went into the lead with a magnificent header by Cappellini. After this result the return leg should be a thriller.
