

## Twenty-Five Years Ago . . .

Our struggle to get away from the re-election zone continued on 18th February, 1950, when we snatched a valuable point at Northampton in a 1-1 draw, CHRIS DURKIN equalising a JACK ENGLISH goal, both scoring efforts coming in the first half.

This was a particularly meritorious effort when it is realised that Northampton still had a chance of promotion. Unfortunately for us, although we drew level with Millwall (beaten 2-1 at Bristol City), Exeter caught up with us by dint of a 3-1 win over Port Vale and all three clubs were left on the 20-point mark.

Ipswich were just a point ahead after a 2-1 defeat at Nottingham Forest, who were in third place in the table, three points behind Torquay, who fought out an exciting 3-3 draw at Norwich, and six points behind Notts County, who showed their power once again with a 4-1 win at Leyton Orient with three famous names — TOM JOHNSTON, FRANK BROOME and JACKIE SEWELL — figuring on the score chart.

Highest score of the day was Reading's five goals against Southend, with present-day commentator MAURICE EDELSTON getting one of the goals, and today's visitors Swindon (just below Reading in mid-table) gained a good win 2-1 at Newport with ONSLOW and BAIN getting their goals.

In fact, goals in general were quite scarce, with no team netting more than two goals in Division I. None of the top teams had a particularly good day, Liverpool scraping a 2-1 win over W.B. Albion, Manchester United earning a 2-2 draw at Sunderland, where over 60,000 saw centre-half ALLENBY CHILTON get a late equaliser, and third-place Blackpool losing 1-0 at Fulham.

Bottom teams Birmingham and Manchester City both lost 1-0 — at Bolton and at home to Middlesbrough respectively, and with Charlton, the team immediately above them, beating Everton 2-0, relegation was beginning to loom in two of the biggest cities.

In Division Two a couple of goals by LEN DUQUEMIN helped Spurs to a 3-1 win at Bradford, and it seemed merely a matter of who would go up with them. Second-place Sheffield Wednesday, held to a 3-3 draw by Brentford at Hillsborough, were no fewer than 12 points behind, and with Sheffield United winning 3-1 at Q.P.R., a rare old struggle was developing between the steel city teams, who were now level on points. This defeat left Q.P.R. in bottom place, one point below no fewer than four teams — Coventry, Bradford, Plymouth and Luton.

Meanwhile, Doncaster kept a two-point lead in Division III (North), both they and Rochdale (two points behind) being held to draws by Hartlepool and Bradford City respectively.

We have, however, been averaging a point a game over the last six weeks, and a continuation of this sort of form should just about see us through.



The three-up and three-down system does have the merit that at this stage of the season virtually every team is still within hope of promotion or in danger of relegation. Not so long ago in the old Division III (South) days, only one club went up and two applied for re-election, so that many teams faced the season from this point onwards with nothing really to play for.

Tonight's match gives us the chance of a close look at Swindon's ace striker, PETER EASTOE, and prompts the speculation of how many clubs in our Division have now currently at least one prolific scorer.

F.A. Cup giant-killers Walsall have ALAN BUCKLEY, current leading scorer in the Division, Hereford, have DIXIE McNEILL, Chesterfield ERNIE MOSS, Huddersfield ALAN GOWLING, Colchester JOHN FROGGATT, and so on. It will be noticed, however, that none of the clubs listed are in the top three positions in the talbe currently. Certainly it seems that the teams whose scoring potential is spread throughout most of the team are the ones achieving the most effect in current results.



Who, then, will be the clubs to go up at the end of the season? After a moderate start, Plymouth Argyle have been carrying all before them in the last three months and appear to be the strongest side in the Division at present. One feels, too, that after seven years in Division III, they are due for another spell in Division II from which they have led a rather fluctuating existence over the years.

Although they have been at or near top position most of the season, Blackburn have slipped up a few times, the most notable occasion being in the 6-3 defeat at Hereford, but they probably have enough ability and determination not to fall below third place.

Charlton are the immediate candidates for the other promotion position, but their defence, which has conceded 39 goals to date, doesn't really look to be a promotion one, and with so many teams within striking distance, one does have serious doubts about the I ondoners

Peterborough, who after a temporary lapse in form just before and after Christmas seem to be right in form again now, and could well achieve the distinction of going from Division IV to Division II in consecutive seasons, whilst today's visitors Swindon have the advantage of two games in hand over most of the teams above them.

Who will go down? Despite Alan Gowling's scoring efforts, Huddersfield seem to have little going for them at the moment and it really does look as though they will complete the descent from Division I to Division IV in the space of four years.

Bournemouth would seem to have enough talent to draw themselves clear now that JOHN BENSON has taken over as manager, and the other two teams to go down could come from the three teams Halifax, Chesterfield and Brighton, and of these maybe the extra encouragement they get from a large home crowd, plus the general guile of manager PETER TAYLOR, will just give them the edge, leaving Chesterfield and Halifax to return to Division IV.

### We welcome...

### **SWINDON TOWN**

#### By GEOFF ALLMAN

At various times this season Swindon Town have looked to be extremely strong candidates for an immediate return to Division III, which they left at the end of last season, and if they could improve their away form they would appear to be right on course once again.

Ironically, their best achievement away from home this season was the draw which they achieved in the Fourth Round F.A. Cup Tie at West Ham, but on that occasion they failed to clinch matters in the struggle.

#### **FLUCTUATION**

After unbroken membership of Division III until 1963, they have had two comparatively brief spells in Division II, winning promotion in both 1963 and 1969, but on neither occasion really consolidating their position. The highwater mark in their history was, of course, the winning of the Football League Cup in 1969 to accompany their promotion success, and we shall probably be seeing two 'survivors' from that team, JOHN TROLLOPE and JOE BUTLER, today.

Another link is that DANNY WILLIAMS, now in his second spell as manager, was previously with them during their really successful years, and their forward line of the sixties with men of the calibre of MIKE SUMMERBEE, ERNIE HUNT and DON ROGERS, is one that still makes their supporters' mouths water.

#### **GOAL SCORERS**

They do have, however, one or two useful forwards in their team at the moment. PETER EASTOE has repaid much of the £80,000 fee that he cost last season with some 20 goals already this season. Supporters first took a liking to him during a spell on loan from Wolves. Local lad DAVID MOSS has given extremely good support this season, with some very useful goals including a hattrick against Colchester in November. The left flank of the front line is the particular terrain of TREVOR ANDERSON, a Northern Ireland international who came

from Manchester United in November, and though he hasn't commanded a regular place in recent weeks, TOM JENKINS, who has had experience throughout the Football League with Orient, Reading and Southampton, is still on his day a really exciting winger.

#### MIDFIELD

In midfield JOHN McLAUGHLIN was signed from Colchester just over a year ago, and he links up with COLIN PROPHETT, a former Sheffield Wednesday stalwart, who arrived this season after a year with Norwich. Both these lads have helped out with the occasional goal, as has TERRY HUBBARD, a local lad who completes the middle line.

In defence, JOHN TROLLOPE has given great service dating back to 1960, and his total of League appearances is now in the 590s — a club record. His fullback partner is now WILF DIXON, a former Arsenal junior who had several seasons with Reading and a short spell with Colchester, before linking up at the County Ground last season. At the heart of the defence FRANK BURROWS is a Scotsman by birth, who arrived in English football at Scunthorpe in 1963, moved on to Swindon in 1966, and has been a first team regular ever since. He has struck up a regular partnership over the years with JOE BUTLER, who, since moving from his home-town club (Newcastle) in 1965, has chalked up nearly 350 appearances.

#### LAST LINE

Behind them JIMMY BARRON, whose father kept goal for Blackburn just before the war, began his career with Wolves in the early 60s, moved on to Chelsea, and then really established himself at Oxford during their rise to Division II. He then moved on to Nottingham Forest, and was first choice there for four seasons before being signed by Swindon during the close season.

#### **NEXT IN TOWN**

#### **BLACKBURN ROVERS Saturday, 22nd February**

One of the most famous clubs in the land in their heyday, Blackburn Rovers are our next visitors on Saturday week. Six times winners of the F.A. Cup, including a hat-trick from 1884 to 1886, and League champions twice just over 60 years ago, Rovers have been suffering from having the millstone of tradition round their necks in harder days recently.

Relegated from the First Division in 1966 and down again into the Third Division in 1971, Rovers have been struggling of late at least until this season. Now, under the guidance of manager Gordon Lee, they are well in the hunt for promotion.

During the close season, Lee strengthened his team with the addition of the Preston North End centre half Graham Hawkins, Bradford City striker Graham Oates, and Brighton's goalscoring Ken Beamish. In August he added Jimmy Mullen, the experienced Rotherham United left winger, but he had the misfortune to break a leg recently. A month after Mullen's signing, Andy Burgin was purchased from Halifax Town and this full back has also played in midfield for Rocers. Their latest signing, Mike Hickman, from Grimsby, scored on Saturday.

Goalkeeper Roger Jones will be remembered for his days at Dean Court with Bournemouth and is already heading towards his 200th League appearance with his present club.

One of the mainsprings of the current side has been midfield player Stuart Metcalfe, who has passed his 200th League appearance in Rovers' distinctive blue and white halved shirt.

Though Blackburn's postwar list of managers reads like an international football Who's Who — Eddie Hapgood, Johnny Carey, Dally Duncan, Eddie Quigley, etc. — the present boss, Lee, who was formerly in charge of Port Vale, looks like getting the team back to the Second Division after just over a year in charge.

Aldershot-born George Norris was a product of local football, having been signed from North Farnborough F.C. in 1958 after a spell with Alton Town F.C .During his six seasons with the 'Shots', George made 113 appearances at centre forward, scoring 59 League and Cup goals. His debut match for Aldershot was at Burslem Park, where

George, despite scoring two goals, was in a losing Aldershot side, being beaten three goals to two by Port Vale on on 7th February, 1959.

George scored one of two hat-tricks in the 6-2 routing of Chester on 4th April, 1962, the other three goals in that match coming from inside forward Robin Stepney.

Luckily George suffered no permanent injury.
