"FLASHBACK"

50 years ago. Saturday, March 28th, 1925.

Division 1. Preston North End 1 Bury 1.

Preston kicked off under the threat of relegation against Bury, who thanks to a recent brilliant spell, were well in the title hunt.

Preston scraped a point with eight minutes to go when Harrison netted from a dubious penalty, awarded after Bradshaw carried out an apparently fair shoulder charge in a chase for a 50-50 ball.

But gradually Bury's class began to tell and mid-way through the half they took command. Robbie's fierce shot was parried by Prout and then Turner caused a few Preston hearts to flutter with a drive which flew narrowly wide.

In the 59th minute, Ball headed the first goal wide of Prout, and then came the doubtful penalty to give Preston an undeserved equaliser.

Division 2. Bury 1 Sheffield United 5.

Slammed 4-0 at West Ham the week previously, Bury returned hoping to make amends before the Gigg Lane crowd, but crashed to high-flying Sheffield Utd.

The Shakers could never match the speed and power of the Yorkshiremen. But they had only themselves to blame for three of the goals, which came as a result of defensive blunders.

The first came in the 17th minute when Fairclough misjudged a high ball. Collindridge took advantage and crossed for Smith to net off his thigh.

Twelve minutes later Smith raced after a through ball and slipped it inside to Thompson who couldn't miss.

Two minutes from the break, Bellis netted from close-in following a corner.

After the restart United again attacked and shortly scored a third through Brook.

Smith completed a hat-trick with two late goals to complete Bury's day of misery.

Bury's good fortune of recent weeks continued to change for the worse. After collecting ten points from a possible twelve, including wins over promotion-bidding Newcastle and Bolton, the Shakers followed their defeat at Southampton six days before, with a below-par display against Huddersfield.

OUR REFEREE TO-NIGHT . . .

KEVIN McNALLY (Ellesmere Port). Began refereeing when he was 14 and graduated through local leagues, the West Cheshire and Cheshire Leagues on to the League line. Served on the supplementary list and has been on the full list for two seasons. Linesman for a European Cup Winners Cup game in Malta in 1969 and also for last season's Burnley v Newcastle United F.A. Cup semi-final. Married with two young children, he owns a sweets, tobacconist and newsagents shop and is a keen gardener. Also plays tennis and likes motoring.

But Bury could count themselves unlucky to lose this one. Twice they hit the woodwork and had a good penalty claim for hands flatly denied. And the defeat meant they were once more teetering on the brink of the relegation zone.

Sunday football had proved financially to be a good move for the Shakers. They had pulled in an average 7,000 crowd on a Sunday, compared to an average of under 4,000 for previous Saturdays.

The Crewe game was a scrappy affair with Bury unable to translate their superiority into goals. Twice they hit the woodwork, and brought Parker to good saves on numerous occasions. The tally could easily have been six.

After 29 minutes, Murray was brought down in the box. Rudd notched his ninth goal of the season as Parker went to his left and the ball to his right.

Shortly afterwards, Bennett tried to head the ball back to his 'keeper, only to see Williams nip in for an opportunist goal.

SWINDON TOWN

ENTHUSIASM reached unprecedented heights in the West Country on 6th March, 1969, when Swindon Town became League Cup holders by beating Arsenal 3—1 in extra time at Wembley—and at the end of the season also gained promotion to Division Two.

A clergyman formed the club in 1881 and it became the top amateur side in Wiltshire, turning professional and entering the Southern League in 1894.

After 43 years as a Third Division club, Swindon gained promotion as runners-up in 1963. They started off well in Second Division football, being undefeated for their first nine games, but eventually finished the season well down the table, and the following year they were back in the Third Division.

One of the club's earliest stars was Harold Fleming, an inside-forward capped nine times for England. His skills played a major part in Swindon's two F.A. Cup semi-final appearances in 1910 and 1912. Others of renown have included Grenville Morris, who scored 47 League goals in 1926-27 and a total of 216 in eight seasons; Maurice Owen, another with goalscoring flair and 554 League appearances for the club (1946-63); Norman Uprichard, Ireland's goalkeeper in the 1950s; England International Mike Summerbee and Under-23 caps Ernie Hunt and Don Rogers; and Dave Mackay (ex-Tottenham and Scotland), who joined Swindon in the summer of 1971.
