From the Chair . . .

I need hardly say again that the club is going through trying times and the bad results which have brought a serious decline in our support make it extremely difficult for us to cope. Wages and expenses have to be found each week regardless of support and the money coming in. Normally a club hopes to break the back of its overall running costs through the gates, and we have certainly not done this. We shall have to cut back on expenses to measure up to our reduced income, but this is such a negative policy. We must increase our income. That is why we are going ahead with our Sports complex.

All clubs raise money from Fund Raising Schemes and the more popular way is by means of the Small Lottery under the Betting, Gaming and Lotteries Act 1963. That Act is considerably overdue for revision and a new Lotteries Bill has just had its second reading in Parliament. At present the maximum prize is only £100, the maximum price for a ticket is 5p and the number of tickets sold in each lottery must not exceed £750. This has proved steadily more restrictive as inflation has gone on, but when the new Act comes into force we hope to be able to produce a much more attractive ticket and the permitted prizes will be much higher and more attractive. In the meantime, please help by buying the tickets, especially the Golden Goal tickets which are on sale on match days by the Ground Staff Association. Your support in this will help us through a difficult period. We are always looking for helpers in selling tickets and in many other phases of our work. If you want to help please contact me or Dickie Dowsett at Dean Court: and if you have any ideas we are very pleased to give them consideration.

Another source or revenue for a club is through its Supporters Club and we are particularly fortunate at Dean Court. We have had a lot of practical support from the Supporters Club and we are most appreciative, and thank all members, and particularly the Committee, for their help. If you are not a member why don't you join. You will find it very rewarding and the atmoshpere in the Social Club is warm and friendly.

Reg's Round-up

Having written in my last issue about the financial state of the game in general, maybe there are reasons for this. No doubt there are plenty. The average fan will say that the entertainment has gone out of the game; others will argue about playing systems, defensive policy, no wingers. Reasons are bantered from town to village, pub to club. I have even heard women get quite heated over who should be in the team. I don't really think that these things keep people away — not the hard core, anyway.

My observation is that violence has played its part — one has read in the past of fighting at Newcastle, when the referee had to stop the Cup game against Notts Forest. 30 arrests were made, and 21 taken to hospital; 2 at Ninian Park, Cardiff, rival gangs pelted each other with stones, rubble and bottles. 40 to 50 people were carried away injured, and at the height of the battle, gangs of youths stormed an eight-foot barrier and a double cordon of police. Then, of course, there was the tragedy of the young boy being fatally stabbed at Blackpool. The fact that they caught the culprit doesn't make the action any the less serious.

The violence is even being expanded abroad. In Ostend a crowd of Manchester City supporters went wild wrecking cafes, homes and cars. Then, of course, there was the case of the Spurs supporters running riot in Rotterdam — our image in these countries is one of drunken youngsters throwing bottles and wielding sticks — I am sure this is not really the case. The trouble-makers are very much in the minority. I understood that people living near the grounds of some clubs barricade their shops and homes. Thank goodness it doesn't happen here at Dean Court — not to my knowledge, anyway.

What are the answers to all these questions — dozens have been put forward — my own personal opinion is that we shall always get this type of hooliganism, but only at certain games, like for instance, Manchester United v Manchester City, Liverpool v Everton, but not at a game like Rochdale v Workington or Hartlepool v Darlington — in fact, again it is only at the minority of clubs where this soccer sickness occurs.

Thank goodness one reads less about the uglier side of the game these days — so maybe those people who have stayed away and kept their children at home, will now start drifting back and so enable their respective clubs to improve facilities for their own comfort and improvements.

"Football clubs have become battle-grounds", says Minister Denis Howell. He has plenty of ideas on how to improve the image and safety of the game. I hope to goodness he puts some of them into operation — and quickly. (Quote: "I saw Mr. Howell at the Torquay v Lincoln match a fortnight ago — the crowd 2,154. I suppose the best one could make of that was that he is looking at the poorer clubs." Unquote).





THIRD DIVISION SCENE

HECTIC TRANSFER ACTIVITY by Tony Pullein

Third Division clubs were as busy as most in the hectic pre-deadline transfer rush. We, of course, signed Stuart Morgan from Colchester and loaned out Brian Greenhalgh to Watford. All around the country there were plenty of comings and goings.

One character to burst back onto the League scene is goalkeeper Alan Boswell who has come back from the shadows, with Oswestry Town, to join Blackburn Rovers. Boswell, who began with Walsall, did his early soccer practice in his mother's pub! He later played for Shrewsbury and Wolves, asking the Molineux club for his cards when he decided to retire.

Yet, within weeks he was back on League duty with Bolton Wanderers. They sold him to Port Vale in 1972 and, when he was freed at the end of last season, it seemed as if his firstclass days really had come to an end.

Another well-known player on the move was Republic of Ireland international Ray Treacy, who has been loaned by Preston to Oldham Athletic. Treacy emerged with West Bromwich in the mid 'sixties, enjoying his best days after transferring to Charlton in 1968.

Treacy was on two occasions Charlton's top scorer before he moved on to Swindon for £35,000 in 1972. He was their top scorer, too, in his first season but then he made another move — to Preston for £30,000 — without again recovering his best scoring form.

An exchange deal between Blackburn and Huddersfield saw Bobby Endean leave Ewood Park for Huddersfield, with Bobby Hoy going in the other direction. Endean, once a top scorer with Watford, spent a year with Charlton before going to Blackburn in 1971. These days he usually plays in midfield.

Huddersfield manager, Bobby Collins, whose team is in a desperate position, also signed Derby defender John Turner who had earlier been on loan to Doncaster Rovers.

Malcolm Partridge, who didn't quite make the top grade with Leicester, is back in the Third Division again, following his transfer to Grimsby Town. Partridge made a big hit in his Mansfield days but got only a handful of games in Leicester's First Division team.

Swindon boss Danny Williams concerned himself with in-and-out loan deals. Mick McGovern, the former Queen's Park Rangers player, has joined Aldershot on a temporary transfer while Swindon have been given the services of Spurs' man Mike Dillon, an occasional first-teamer at White Hart Lane.

Aldershot have also signed defender Neil Warnock from Scunthorpe U. Warnock began his career with Chesterfield and served Rotherham and Hartlepool on his way to Scunthorpe in 1972.

With money being so short, there was no traditional last-minute bigspending this year. Even the big stars found themselves going for bargain prices. Martin Peters, not long ago our first £200,000 player, left Tottenham for Norwich for £50,000.

Best bargain of all, perhaps, was Wolves purchase of Scottish international midfield man Willie Carr for £100,000. Coventry had turned down a £240,000 bid only five months earlier!

Top value of all major transfers this season came to approximately £6,500,000 — £1¼ million down on last season.

Plenty more transfer activity is anticipated at the end of the season. Most of it, alas, will be outgoing — with many a hopeful player having to say goodbye to a career in League football.

Almost every club in the country has announced its intention of cutting its staff. Several Third and Fourth Division clubs will be relying more on part-time players.




