Two thoroughly satisfactory performances away from home - first at Gillingham, then at Peterborough - produced three points.

More than that they gave us very clear evidence of growing stability in the techniques, style and method we are developing.

Finally, a rather special welcome today for Danny Williams who brings his Swindon Town team to Millmoor.

Every club has its outstanding player personalities across the years - Danny, who also had a period as mangager at Millmoor, is just such a man. The game is better and brighter for people like him.

FROM THE MILLERMAN

This afternoon we welcome Swindon Town and Danny ... Danny Williams, one of the outstanding players and personalities of Millmoor, whose 631 League and Cup appearances for the club will almost surely stand as all-time record.

Last time Town and Danny were here they clinched promotion to Division II with a 1-1 draw and did us a lap of honour round the ground with the League Cup they had won

a few weeks earlier. That was May, 1969.

Today they come in a disappointing and surprising position at the foot of the table (and with promoted Chester and Mansfield also in the lower reaches). Mind you, it is 'early doors' yet as Danny himself might well say...!

Meetings between the clubs have been few ... in Town's promotion year of 1968-69 (Watford under Ken Furphy management were the champions of Division III and Swindon runners-up), Jim Mullen had made his debut for us at

Swindon.

It was four years earlier in Division II when Danny was our manager, that Swindon were previously at Millmoor and the season before that saw us meet for the first time - a goalless draw at Rotherham the week after Colin Clish had broken

a leg in the F.A. Cup tie at Burnley.

Danny's visit almost coincides with the return to town for a brief holiday of one of his former team-mates ... Scotsman Ian Wilson visiting from Canada. Ian was a member of one of the very best era teams that we have known - the side that almost went into Division I on goal-average in 1954-55.

In fact he hit FOUR goals in the final match of that unforgettable season - to help beat Liverpool 6-1!

Incidentally our players had hoped to see Carl Gilbert at Gillingham last week but he was not able to be there ... Carl, who started his League career at Gillingham, is playing in the Southern League Premier section with Margate these days.


Like Ian Wilson he is one of that select band of Millers who have scored four times in a match ... a Rotherham list in which Walt Ardron stands supreme. Walt did it THREE times in successive seasons 1946 to 1949 against Crewe, Carlisle and Hartlepool.


F.A. Cup 7-2 win at Darlington.





He made his debut in the First Team in September 1971. TREVOR ANDERSON (Forward) Born Belfast. Signed 1st November 1974 from Manchester United. Northern Ireland International. FRANK BURROWS (Centre-half) Born Larkhall, Scotland, A strong defender who has made his mark in the First Team. Regular member of promotion winning side of Season 1968/69. Played in Football League Cup Final winning team of Season 1968/ JOE BUTLER (Full-back) Born Newcastle, Joined Swindon from Newcastle United in August 1965 where he graduated to the senior ranks through the Club's Junior Team. Regular member of Promotion winning side of Season 1968/69. WILFRED DIXON (Full-back or Mid-field) Born London. Signed September, 1973 from Reading. PETER EASTOE (Forward) Born in Tamworth, Staffs: Signed from Wolverhampton Wanderers on 13th March, 1974 having joined Wolves as a boy. Played only 19 games last season during which time he became the Club's top goal scorer. TERRY HUBBARD (Inside Forward) Born Newport. Joined Club as an Apprentice

sional 1969. Has now established himself as a regular First Team and Welsh Under-23 player.

TOM JENKINS (Winger) Born London, Signed from Southampton in October 1972 after Swindon had sold Don Rogers to Crystal Palace.
