



REPORT

FROM THE MANAGER



JOE SHAW writes

Victories over Sheffield Wednesday and Rotherham United considerably eased our position in the Third Division, but the situation is so close that a couple of defeats could see us right back in trouble.

Not that we are right out of trouble yet, but there is no doubt that the position is a lot easier than it was three or four weeks ago. After being held to a draw at home by Cardiff City we faced four successive away matches, but we came out of them reasonably well with wins at Shrewsbury and Hillsborough.

The 3-1 victory which enabled us to complete the double over the Owls was indeed a smart performance. Things didn't look too healthy for us when Wednesday went ahead, but a penalty taken by Malcolm Darling quickly put us back in the game and when Rodney Fern scored one of the best goals I have seen for a long time I knew we were on the right path.

After Malcolm had made it 3-1 just after halftime we started to sit back and let Wednesday come at us and I thought we overdid it a little for if they had managed to snatch another goal we might have been up against it. That would have been a traversty of justice for as far as football was concerned we were the far better side.

What a great tragedy it is that such a famous club as Sheffield Wednesday with their magnificent ground are in such a sorry plight. They managed to win against another of the clubs in deep water, Colchester United, last Saturday, but the defeat we inflicted on them will take some getting over.

Last Saturday we captured two more points towards our safety goal by defeating Rotherham United 1-0 at home in a game which overall was not a particularly good one to watch. In fact the first 20 minutes I thought we were going to give a repeat performance of the Hillsborough display, but it did not turn out that way.

Last Tuesday we had another vital away game – against Halifax Town at The Shay, but due to the early deadline for these notes I am unable to comment on what happened in this programme. Halifax, of course, are another of the clubs in the relegation zone and so the outcome would be of double value.

This afternoon we receive yet another of the clubs in the battle for Third Division survival, Swindon Town, who are managed by a well-known figure Danny Williams. Last Saturday Swindon went down at home to our neighbours Mansfield Town and as a result found themselves in bottom place.

We visited Swindon in the opening match of the season and came away with both points from a 1-0 victory. Danny's lads will be fighting hard to try to ease their position this afternoon and we cannot afford to take any chances with them.

It will be a tough fight, but our players are beginning to realise that they are not a relegation side and the sooner they fully realise it the easier the task will become. Let's hope it sinks home and that they show you just what are capable of doing.

We have another tough home game on Wednesday with Brighton and Hove Albion supplying the opposition. Brighton are right up at the top of the table fighting hard for promotion and so this should prove to be a very entertaining game.







22 year old Steve was born in Sheffield, where he still lives with his wife Anne and their two children, daughters Sarah (3½) and Sally (1), although he is presently on the look-out for a house in or around the Chesterfield area.

Steve's soccer career began in 1969 when he joined Sheffield United straight from school, after having impressed them with his performances for Sheffield Boys. 1972 was a big year for Steve, starting with his League debut away at Chelsea, and culminating in his call-up for the England Youth team to take part in the Mini World Cup in Spain, which England won, beating W. Germany in the Final 2-0 on Barcelona's ground. Steve played an important part in this victory, some of his now famous team-mates being Trevor Francis, Kevin Beattie and Graham Moseley, to name but three. Steve naturally regards his international call-up as the high-point of his career so far.

First-team appearances at Bramall Lane were at a premium, however, Steve having played only 22 full games (5 goals) in his 7 years with Sheffield United, so it didn't take him long to decide to join Chesterfield with the prospect of regular first-team soccer. Steve joined us 22nd January, 1976 in a £15,000 deal, which equalled our record transfer fee paid (also to Sheffield United for Frank Barlow in 1972).

Steve admits to having found Division 3 football difficult to get used to, but there is now ample evidence to suggest that he will be a big asset to us in the future. And what a shot he has! Welcome to Saltergate, Cammy, and let's hope that the goals keep coming!
