TOMMY MAC SAYS



With the Mansfield defeat last Saturday making three in a row, we have dropped down the League table. Our last two home games — Wrexham and Grimsby — have been the worst two displays by the team in my four seasons as manager. I have had a few players off form in games, but never so many as in the past two home games.

In my capacity as manager I have to make many decisions, such as the decision in the Grimsby game when I replaced Bobby Wallace with Malcolm Crosby. My idea was a tactical decision. At the time of the substitution we were 2-0 down, so I decided that Crosby, being fresh and quicker at going forward, would (with Morrissey) make six attacking players in the hope that we could reduce the scoreline. I know as a manager I can't please everybody, but I can assure you I only do the best for Aldershot Football Club.

Our game at Mansfield was a hard slogging match, with the team working very hard and on occasions looking very dangerous. As I have said, we worked hard but failed to produce that added flair that would turn the game in our favour. Our best football came in the last twenty minutes in which we just failed on occasions to produce the equaliser. Mansfield scored from a corner when McKenzie (centre-half) headed home.

I could not let the season close without a mention of Bertie Mee, the Arsenal manager who is finishing at the end of the season. Bertie, in my opinion, has been a first-class manager and a gentleman. Since the days when we were on coaching courses his knowledge of the game has impressed me tremendously, and this knowledge had a lot to do with the Arsenal double. I hope Bertie (who is on the Football League Secretaries and Managers Association committee) is not lost to the game, because if there is a deeper thinker on the ways to improve our game of football, I have yet to meet him. Best of luck in the future, Bertie.

Today we welcome Swindon Town in a game of importance to both teams as it is what we call a 'four-pointer'. This game we *must* win to keep Swindon below us in the League table. Every player is keen to make up for the last two defeats at home.

So, come on and help, and get behind the team and cheer them on to what we all hope will be a victory.

takes a look at today's opponents

SWINDON TOWN

Through the years fixtures with Swindon Town have often had a special significance or produced an interesting result. As recently as our match at the County Ground in February, which Swindon won 6-3, there has been something out of the ordinary about the event. In fact, the day after we drew 2-2 there in September, 1939, war was declared!

But on that most recent occasion the scoreline rather flattered our victors, particularly the half-time scoreline which was 5-0 in their favour! Naturally the time for action to put the record straight is now...

There was another match which is vividly recalled: a fourth round cup-tie in the F.A. Cup here in 1964 when Swindon won 2-1 at our expense. Nobody played better for the visitors that day than Don Rogers, then a teenager and now back again on his familiar haunts after service away with Crystal Palace and Q.P.R.

Rogers was one of several signings at the time of the transfer deadline last month which resulted in striker Peter Eastoe leaving to join Rangers, and two other newcomers donning the red and white in Steve Aizlewood, the Newport County centre-half, and Gerry O'Brien, the Southampton midfielder player or winger.

This has given the Swindon side a new look, coupled with the older-established favourites like left-back John Trollope who has well over 600 League appearances in the club's service.

Trollope's partner has been John McLaughlin, the former Colchester United player, who has reappeared at full-

back after a spell in midfield. Lining up in the middle of the back division with Aizlewood has been Colin Prohett, the one-time Norwich and Sheffield Wednesday centre-half.

Goalkeeper Jim Barrow has made League appearances for five League clubs now. Wolves, Chelsea, Oxford and Nottingham Forest were his previous teams.

In midfield Ken Stroud and Will Dixon have been linking up with newcomer O'Brien. Stroud has been with no other senior club, though Dixon was at Reading for some while and began his career on the books of Arsenal.

Strikers Dave Moss, Dave Syrett and Trevor Anderson were recruited respectively from local sources in the first two instances, and Manchester United in the latter case. Anderson, in fact, won honours at full level for Northern Ireland, while at Old Trafford, and was formerly with the Irish League club Portadown.

Other Swindon players with senior appearances of late include striker Geoff Chalklin, midfielder John Gilligan and centre-back Frank Burrows. With more than 250 League appearances for the club, Burrows is another long-serving player, having previously been with Scunthorpe and Raith Rovers. Former Newcastle United midfielder man Joe Butler has cleared more than 350 League games for Swindon, too.

Back in January, 1947, Aldershot began the New Year with a home game with Swindon. They had ended the Old Year by losing 9-0 at Ashton Gate to Bristol City. But the match with Swindon (who had earlier beaten us 7-0) produced a welcome 2-0 win for Aldershot...

The home fixtures for the current season end on Easter Saturday with a visit from promotion-chasing Brighton and Hove Albion, who will bring with them their aspirations for Division Two plus a strong following of their supporters. These two ingredients should make for an interesting afternoon's entertainment, not to be missed.

With an experienced side available, bristling with famous players, the holiday period is timely for producing this attractive encounter. Heading the list of visitors will be their two most recent signings — Brian Horton, a mid-field player from Port Vale, and Sammy Morgan, the Irish international striker secured mid-season from Aston Villa.

The club's latest discovery from nearer home is centre-forward Peter Ward, who made a sensational debut for club away to Hereford, scoring an early goal.

Other internationals with the club are goalkeeper Peter Grummitt, who was capped for the England Under-23 side earlier in his career, right-back Joe Kinnear, an experienced Irish international in his days with Spurs, and Peter O'Sullivan, who has been fully capped by Wales and now plays in midfield after gaining fame as a winger.

In the goalscoring department, Fred Binney, the prolific goalgetter once of Exeter and Torquay, has been frequently among the leading scorers in the Division Three scene this term.

In the heart of the defence, one-time Norwich centre-half Andy Rollings has been paired with former Hull, West Ham and Millwall sweeper Dennis Burnett, while the extreme flanks in attack have been the preserve of local product Tony Towner and former Manchester City and Norwich player Ian Mellor.

Left-back Harry Wilson was secured from Burnley, local discovery Steve Piper can figure in midfield or defence, and another with recent appearances in the forward line is Gerry Fell.

All in all, a formidable line-up, and a match which will provide a well-worth-watching finale to our season at the Recreation Ground.

FROM THE SECRETARY'S OFFICE

Extending a warm welcome to the Directors, Players, Officials and Supporters of Swindon Town this evening, we all realise how vital the points are to both teams and, whilst sincerely hoping that we both meet next season in Division Three, an appeal to you 'Shots' fans to really exercise your vocal chords to will Aldershot to victory is, we feel, the order of the day.

Our Easter programme pairs us with two of the promotion hopefuls. On Easter Saturday, 17th April, Brighton & Hove Albion visit the Recreation Ground (kick-off 3.00 p.m.). There are still a few £1.00 Stand tickets available for sale at the Club office, and these are on sale after tonight's game, from 9.30 a.m. to 5 p.m. tomorrow (closed for lunch) and from 9.30 a.m. to 11 a.m. on Saturday. The office will be closed on Good Friday. On Tuesday, 20th April the 'Shots' travel to Crystal Palace and details of coaches and the route from Aldershot to Selhurst Park appear on page 7 of this programme. Referring to the home game with Brighton, we would ask for Supporters' assistance to make entry into the ground as smooth an operation as possible. If Supporters could arrive slightly earlier than usual and tender the correct money at the turnstiles (i.e. adults 65p, senior citizens and juveniles 35p) entry to the ground should be as swift as possible. Once inside, please follow the instructions of the Stewards and keep all gangways and exits clear. Season Ticket holders are reminded that the fourth turnstile from the Labour Exchange at the High Street end of the ground is reserved exclusively for their use.

Season Tickets for next season will be on sale at the Club from the 3rd of May, and again the Club are making concessions in the price of the Season Tickets if Supporters purchase them prior to the 5th June. Prices of the Season Tickets at the concessionary rate are on page 2 of this programme. Despite rising running costs, the Club are holding steady the price of admission to the ground for adults and juveniles and senior citizens for next season, i.e. adults 65p and juveniles and senior citizens 35p. The Club are, however, lowering the age of eligibility of juveniles for reduced rate admission. The juvenile rate of those who pay at the turnstile will only apply next season to those under 14 years of age. Juvenile rates can be enjoyed by those who are under 16 years of age by purchasing season tickets (see page 2). The transfer charges to the Stands will be raised slightly next season by 5p for each Stand. The new transfer charges to stands will be: North Stand and South Stand (Wings) 40p; South Stand (Centre Block) 50p.

The 'Sponsor A Player' scheme, which was launched just a month ago has received tremendous support, as, you will see on page 6. However, there are still a few items of kit to be sponsored for some of the players and it is hoped that the list will be complete by the commencement of next season. Any Supporters who wish to donate the equivalent amount for any item of kit yet to be sponsored only have to contact either Club Secretary Mike Cosway or Team Manager Tom McAnearney, either of whom will be pleased to discuss further details.

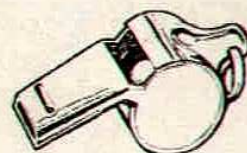
