SOCCER SCENE BY THE MILLERMAN

Today's welcome is for Swindon Town, managed by one of our very favourite football sons, Danny Williams, and always a team prepared to try and give a positive approach to their game.

Recently they have had two or three bad results but they are capable of putting on as much style and impact as any team in the section. Danny wouldn't be associated with anything that meant dull football.

At the time of writing the Pompey set-back had just occurred and the visit to Wrexham had not taken place. Whatever may have emerged here, the fact of the extra importance of today's game to us is quite clear. And Danny for one is on record as, not only fancying our chances to get a promotion place, but to take the title too ... this afternoon he'll be all out to make sure Town do their best to help prevent him being right! We have the 'double' on of course having taken a 3 - 1 win at Swindon at the height of our spell of consistently good results. The goals for us that day came from Trev Phillips 2 and Alan Crawford 2.

Games between Rotherham and Swindon have been few they were here last season (in the game in which Kev Eades made his debut as the youngest ever player to do so for the Millers) and won 2 - 0. Before that they came in May 1969 when they clinched promotion to Division Two (and brought the League Cup with them after that memorable Wembley success).

Last week's League Cup replay and dramatic triumph by Villa reminded us older Miller writers again of the first ever final when we played Villa home and away at the start of the season following the introduction of the competition! Prizes and recognition of the event - for all that certain people have called it the Mickey Mouse Cup this time - have certainly grown a bit since those early days! The smart thing then was to opt out ... and numerous fashionable clubs did so but were not long in changing their tune.... Last week brought sadness to South Yorkshire and North Derbyshire soccer fans with four deaths ex-Miller Jim Regan died at the age of 49 and Arthur Hetherington aged 70. The other two deaths were the former Chesterfield 'keeper Ray Middleton who was 56 and 'Beau' Asquith that fine Barnsley player. Our sympathies go out to their families. Jim Regan was a Joe McGuire discovery - playing with a Catholic team in Sunday League football recalls Joe in his memoirs. Those diaries of Joes make mighty interesting and informative reading for those who go back across the years. Arthur Hetherington played a valuable part in the development of many of our juniors and is remembered in football for, among other things, a hat-trick scored in six minutes for Wolves against Huddersfield Town in the Thirties ...

Pity the game and result was not a happier landing for Derek Dalton at Portsmouth last week but the Doncaster Flying Club, who so kindly flew him down, and the Portsmouth Lions, who looked after him so well, deserve everyone's gratitude for giving Derek yet another special soccer memory.

TREVOR ANDERSON (Forward) Signed from Manchester United in 1972 after starting his career with Irish club Portadown, A Northern Ireland

International, he was joint top scorer last season with 15 goals,

JIM BARRON (Goalkeeper)

First choice goalkeeper since 1974, after being signed from Nottingham Forest. Has had previous experience with Wolves, Chelsea and Oxford.

WILL DIXON (Midfield)

London-born, he began his career at Arsenal before moving to Reading from where he was transferred to Swindon in 1973. Played most of his 96 League games in defence before switching to midfield last season.

HOWARD GODDARD (Forward)

Joined A.F.C. Bournemouth form school and made the first of his 62 League appearances for them whilst still an apprentice. Released at the end of last season, he was signed by Swindon on his 19th birthday in May.

JOHN McLAUGHLIN (Full Back)

Started his career at Colphester where he was capped for England at Youth level. He joined Swindon in 1973 as a full back, but moved into midfield for most of his games for Swindon. Has since reverted to defence.

DAVID MOSS (Forward)

Signed from a local non-league club in 1969, had made 129 appearances up to the end of last season. A true orthodox winger, he plays both sides of the park and scores goals as well as making them.

COLIN PROPHETT (Defender)

Began his career with Crewe Alexandra as an amateur before joining Sheffield Wednesday in 1968. After 113 appearances for the Owls he moved to Norwich in 1973, making 34 First Division appearances. Signed by Swindon in 1974, he had made 67 League appearances to the end of last season.

DON ROGERS (Forward)

Always remembered for his two goals in the League Cup Final against Arsenal in 1969, he played 401 games for Town before moving to Crystal Palace for a £150,000 fee in 1972. After 69 games for Palace he moved to QPR in 1974 before his return to Swindon in 1976.

KEN STROUD (Defender)

Joined Town in 1967 and had made 78 appearances to the end of last season during which he claimed a regular team place. A strong player in the tackle, he prefers a central defensive role but plays quite often in midfield.

DAVID SYRETT (Forward)

Joined Swindon in 1972, making his debut whilst still an apprentice and has made 67 appearances to the end of last term. Had a spell on loan to Wolves last season before an injury crisis. Joint leading scorer last season with 15 goals.

JOHN TROLLOPE (Full Back)

The Club's longest serving professional with 662 games at the end of last season. A member of the League Cup-winning side, he has been ever-present at left back for two seasons. Club Captain and a loyal. hard working player.

Most chances to score come from balls which are dropping in or around the penalty area. So taking the chance to shoot or head quickly is essential. With heading, the same principles as hold true for shooting apply. The chief requirement is to time the jump to get above the defender and make contact with the ball with the forehead above its middle line. Only then can it be guaranteed that the ball will go down. Pace on the ball in heading is generated by the thrust of the jump and a snapping action of the back and neck muscles into the ball. Of course it is far easier to generate pace if the cross is headed back along a similar line and on headers at the far post this is usually the best tactic. Near post headers usually demand a critically timed run to arrive just in front of the defender and power is not so critical on these occasions. In both cases a ball headed down towards the line will usually win a bigger dividend than a higher placed ball.




