Chairman's Notes

Still we cling to our precarious hold on Third Division football. Remote though the prospect may be, survival still remains a possibility even after the loss of the home point against Walsall last Tuesday night and though it is difficult to put from one's mind the earlier events of a thoroughly disappointing season. I think it is right to pay tribute to the character and the spirit shown by the side under John Newman's constant urging, at a time when the cause seemed completely lost.

What we are left with, of course, is a situation in which we have to wait for results other than our own to decide our immediate destiny. Also, the team's commendable end of season effort is bound to bring to mind a number of occasions when points have been needlessly lost — indeed in sufficient number to have made our current struggle so unnecessary.

But also, if our supporters needed any reminder of the sort of ill-luck which has contributed to the situation, then surely Tuesday's match provided just that. It is true that poor finishing has cost us dearly this season and Walsall, too, enjoyed the benefit of some waywardness by the Mariners in front of goal. But there were a number of occasions when only an unfavourable bounce robbed the Town — as it has on many occasions in this frustrating season.

All of this is not to excuse the many below par performances which have contributed to our parlous situation. However, the current form of the team is such as to make a mockery of the fact that we may be on our way into Division Four and, in those circumstances there will be many people thinking back over the campaign and saying: "If only"

What was evident against Walsall was the new confidence within the team. From it stemmed some of the best football we have seen throughout the whole Blundell Park programme, and if Town can reproduce that sort of performance again today, then at least they will sign off the season at home with some degree of credit.

There follows the last match of the season, away at Reading, and if the relegation issue is indeed extended to the last moment what a tremendous climax that game could prove to be. We have to wait and to see beyond this afternoon's meeting with Swindon, what remains of our survival prospects. We can but hope.

SWINDON TOWN

STEVE AIZLEWOOD (centre half). First appeared for Newport in season 1968-69 and went on to make nearly 200 League appearances before his transfer to Swindon in March, 1976. Won four Welsh U.23 caps.

JIMMY ALLEN (Goalkeeper). Joined Brora Rangers from school and was signed from them as an apprentice in 1970. Signed professional in 1971 making his debut in 1971. Has had spells as first choice and made 71 League appearances to the end of last season.

TREVOR ANDERSON (forward). Began his career with Portadown, but transferred to Manchester Utd. in 1972 before moving to Swindon. Following his debut for Swindon in 1974 he made 70 League appearances to the end of last season. 7 caps for Northern Ireland. Was joint leading scorer last season with 15 goals.

WILL DIXON (midfield). Originally with Arsenal he made his League debut with Reading for whom he made 150 League appearances. Transferred to Swindon in September, 1973.

JOHN McLAUGHLIN (full back). Started his career with Colchester for whom he made 66 League appearances. Joined Swindon in December, 1973. Originally a full back he moved to midfield, but has since reverted to defence.

DAVID MOSS (forward). Signed from his local non-league club as an apprentice and on full forms in 1969. He had made 129 League appearances to the end of last season.

GERRY O'BRIEN (midfield). First played for Clydebank but moved to Southampton in 1970. He made a total of 67 League appearances for the Saints. Transferred to Swindon in March, 1976.

COLIN PROPHETT (defender). Played for Crewe an an amateur but his league debut came for Sheffield Wednesday in 1968. He moved to Norwich in 1973. making 34 appearances in the first division before his transfer to Swindon in 1974. 67 League appearances for the Town to the end of last season.

DON ROGERS (forward). Made 401 League appearances for the Town and scored twice in the 1969 League Cup Final victory over Arsenal before transferring to Crystal Palace for £150,000 in 1972. After 69 League games for Palace he moved to QPR in October, 1974 but made only 13 full appearances prior to his transfer back to Swindon in March, 1976.

KEN STROUD (defender). Joined as apprentice in 1967, signed pro in 1970 and had made 78 League appearances to the end of last season.

DAVID SYRETT (forward). Another former apprentice he joined the club in July, 1972, signing pro. in November, 1973. Capped by England at Youth level and had made 67 League appearances to the end of last season.

JOHN TROLLOPE (full back). The club's longest serving professional, signed in 1960. Has since broken the club's appearances record making 662 League appearances to the end of last season, and 750 including cup games. A member of the promotion winning side of 1963 and 1969 and the League Cup winning side in 1969.

RAY McHALE (midfield). Signed early in the season for £12,000 from Halifax after he had turned down a move to Grimsby.

TONY TAYLOR (defender). Signed on free transfer from Southend. Formerly with Crystal Palace.


RUSSELL LEWIS (defender). Only 20, made his debut at York on April 19th.








CLIFFORD A. E. MASKELL, (Cambridge)


