I'm sure our paths will cross again just as I'm sure the name David Dent will become really well known


and respected throughout football.

# SPOTLIGHT ON...

## **SWINDON TOWN**

Swindon Town were not far off their promotion target but they didn't quite make it and, when it was known they would be spending another season in the Third Division, the Board decided upon a change of policy. Manager Danny Williams has now changed jobs and, when a successor is found, he will become the club's Football Executive. The club is at this moment sifting through applications for the vacant managerial post.

The Swindon team has undergone considerable change over the past year. During the last close-season Mr. Williams signed midfield players David Cunningham (from Southend), forwards Chris Guthrie (Sheffield United) and

Chris Kamara (Portsmouth) and defender Andy Ford (Southend).

During the course of the season he added the signatures of Hereford midfield man, or defender, Roy Carter and Shrewsbury's Chic Bates who can play in attack or midfield.

Swindon enjoyed one unbeaten run of 12 League games in mid-season but, though they kept in reasonable touch with the promotion group, they were

never more than an outside bet.

Until just recently they had maintained an outstanding home record but defeats by Preston, Wrexham and Walsall wrecked it and perhaps suggested that they were not quite good enough to go up this year anyway.

They have won four away games— at Portsmouth (2–1), Shrewsbury (3–2), Plymouth (2–0) and Rotherham (3–1), all achieved during the second half of

the season. They didn't win their first away game until well into January.

Swindon have drawn at Sheffield Wednesday (1–1), Preston (1–1), Hereford (1–1), Oxford (3–3), Gillingham (2–2), Bury (0–0), Exeter (0–0) and Tranmere (1–1) but they were beaten at Walsall (0–2), Wrexham (1–2), Cambridge (2–5), Lincoln (1–3), Chester (0–1), Colchester (0–2), Port Vale (0–1), and Peterborough (0–2).

The team has taken on a fairly settled look as the season has progressed. Jimmy Allan has missed only one game in goal and the back four usually lines out with John McLaughlin, Colin Prophett, Steve Aizlewood (or Roy Carter)

and Andy Ford on parade.

That grand old campaigner John Trollope, who has been the club's left-back since 1960 and who has well smashed all previous club appearance records, is still in the side but has been turning out in midfield of late. With him in the middle have been Roy Carter (or Chic Bates) and David Cunningham.

David Moss, Chris Guthrie and Ray McHale normally make up the attack.

Swindon enjoyed good runs in both Cups. They eliminated Swansea, Cardiff and Portsmouth in the League Cup before going down 0-2 at Wrexham in the fourth round.

Boreham Wood and Brentford were removed from the F.A. Cup but Nottingham Forest proved too good for them in round four. Swindon lost 1-4 at Forest.

The Swindon Club was formed in 1881 by a clergyman and they became one of the founder members of the Southern League in 1894. They built a fine reputation in that competition, winning the championship twice before gaining admittance to the Football League Division Three (South) in 1920 when the Southern League was taken over en bloc.

They finished fourth in their first ever season in the League — a position

they were unable to improve on until winning promotion 43 years later!

Yet Swindon were still a Southern League club when they first hit the national headlines. In 1910 they fought their way to the semi-final of the F. A. Cup after defeating First Division Spurs (3-2), and two Second Division sides - Burnley (2-0) and the divisional champions-to-be Manchester City (2-0) before falling to the reigning League C hampions Newcastle (0-2) at Totten ham. Two years later they made another appearance in the semi-final.

On that occasion they were held by the eventual winners, Barnsley, to a 0-0

draw before going down 0-1 in the replay.

It was in 1963 that they moved into Division Two for the first time in their history, a star-studded team of local discoveries taking them there. One or two of those players - Mike Summerbee, Bobby Woodruff, Don Rogers, Cliff Jackson and Ernie Hunt — moved onto win fame with bigger clubs. John Trollope still remains in the side today!!

The 1963 team was the creation of Bert Head, and in the opening weeks of

their Second Division Season, Swindon went to the top of the table.
Yet after making such a wonderful start to their Second Division career, Swindon failed to make any lasting impression. Within two years they were back in the Third Division.

And Bert Head was sacked.

Danny Williams took over and it wasn't long before Swindon were on the

upgrade again. Soon the Robins were to enjoy their gratest ever season

Swindon quickly established themselves among the Third Division leaders in 1968/69 but there were few signs of any sensational Cup exploits in view as they struggled to overcome Torquay and Bradford City in the first two rounds of the League Cup.

But after that they beat First Division sides Coventry and Burnley en route

to a dramatic Wembley Final against Arsenal

Came the great day on a quagmire at Wembley. Roger Smart gave Swindon a half-time lead but when Arsenal equalised through Bobby Gould four minutes from the end it seemed Swindon might be swamped in the mud during extra time. In the event Swindon grew stronger and two memorable goals from Don

A few weeks later they clinched promotion to the Second Division. Rogers gave the Third Division side an outstanding victory.

Danny Williams left soon after that spending brief periods with Sheffield Wednesday and Mansfield, before returning to Swindon shortly after they had been relegated back to Division Three in 1974

During the period Mr. Williams was away. Swindon had three managers -

Fred Ford, Dave McKay and Les Allen.

Swindon missed promotion by only two points in 1974 but the following season they were lucky not to be relegated in the end only one point separated them from the bottom four clubs.

Last season they showed an improvement again but a very poor away record prevented them from joining the promotion fight. It was a poor run of

away results that once again damaged their chances this season.

## Professional Viewpoint . .

Added pressures, fear, managers who worry about the extra relegation place as early in the season as October . . . we've had all these reasons advanced since three up and three down came into being in the First and Second Divisions.

However in a week when Brian Clough talked about Forest winning the Championship in style, providing the sort of football people want to see, I would suggest that the managers who wouldn't gamble on an extra chance of going up against that of going down, are more likely to dig in for a point than

go forward looking for two.

I know that on this final Saturday a season's work is going out of the window for some of them, but I can't remember when so many issues were down for decision this late on, or when interest was sustained for so long... and that's the key point. The gate figures at Newcastle of just over 7,000 for the final game, shows just how much attraction there is in a 'nothing' match.

While points could keep hopes alive that figure was trebled, and there are a few places to-day up and down the country where crowds are promised a late

bang.

In the top division escape artists West Ham, Q.P.R. and Wolves are all at home while Chelsea travel to Everton..... all of them desperate to avoid joining Newcastle and Leicester on the way down. It'll be next week probably before we get the picture.

The Second Division stages it's match of the season at Southampton with Spurs the visitors with a point each guaranteeing them going up with Bolton.

Southampton could still go up if they are defeated.... providing the margin is small and Brighton don't go berserk and score a few in their home game against Blackpool. I doubt if the TV cameras will miss this one... it's a natural.... and there's still a dog fight at the other end that won't be resolved today.

The key promotion matches in the third are at Cambridge, Preston and Chester. If they are all home wins we'll bid farewell to Cambridge and North End along with champions Wrexham, for Peterborough wouldn't be able to match North End's goal difference in their final game. Any other results could

put it all into the melting pot.

It isn't possible to put a fingrer on exactly why Carlisle aren't up there among them but there seems to be an echo of Sunderland about United's season in that it took the side some time to adjust to the Third Division in much the same way as it took Sunderland dropping down into the Second.

We didn't have the best of starts up here and the month of October was a disaster, with home points "given" away against Bradford and Lincoln, and Chesterfield providing the only win. We flirted briefly with second bottom place but there's been a gradual recovery.

I think there's room for a bit of optimism next season. You don't win anything long term if you don't battle away from home and United's away

record is ecncouraging to say the least.

With the World Cup in the Argentine and Scotland's interest to follow. it's going to seem like no time at all until players are reporting back for pre-season training.

# welcome to... SWINDON

JIMMY ALLAN (Goalkeeper). Jimmy grew up with Swindon and made his first League appearances in 1971/72. A couple of years later he earned himself a regular place only to drop out again until last season when he was re-instated.

League record: Swindon 156 aps.

JOHN McLAUGHLIN (Defender) John has been Swindon's right-back since his transfer from Colchester in 1974. Before that he had held his place in the Colchester side for two years.

League record: Colchester 66 aps.,2gls; Swindon 178(3) aps., 7gls.

STEVE AIZLEWOOD (Defender) Steve joined Swindon from Newport for £12,00 in 1976 and he is normally the regular centreback. He had been in the Newport side since 1969 and, while at Somerton Park, he was capped by the Welsh under-23s.

League record: Newport 191(6) aps., 17 gls. Swindon 69aps., 8 gls.

COLIN PROPHETT (Defender) Sheffield Wednesday were in the First Division when Colin made his League debut for them in 1969. Four years later he was transferred to Norwich for £45,000. But little more than a year later he signed for Swindon for £20,000.

League record: Sheffield Wed. 113(6) aps., 7 gls. Norwich 34(1) aps., Swindon 155(2) aps., 10 gls.

JOHN TROLLOPE (Defender) John is now the longest serving player in the Football League and he celebrated his 700th League appearance for the club early this season. He is the last survivor of Swindon's League Cup winning in 1969 and in one wonderful run of consistency he made 368 consecutive appearances for the club.

League record: Swindon 736(1) aps., 22 gls.

ANDY FORD (Defender) Andy opened his career with Bournemouth though he didn't get into their League team. A move to Southend in 1972 boosted his career and a year later he made his League debut. Swindon signed him last summer.

Southend 135(2) aps., 3 gls. Swindon 25(2) aps., 1 gl.

DAVID CUNNINGHAM (Midfield) David arrived from Southend last summer and won his way into Swindon's first-team upon the departure of Trevor Anderson. He began with Brechin City and joined Southend United in 1973. Last season he spent a short while on loan to Hartlepool.

League record: Brechin 44(5) aps., 6gls. Southend 56(4) aps., 4 gls. Hartlepool 10(2) aps., 1 gl.

**KEN STROUD (Midfield)** Ken is a product of the club's junior sides. He came in for his League debut in 1971/72 and for the past two seasons he has been a regular member of their midfield. He has scored three goals this season.

League record: Swindon 155(9) aps., 14 gls.

ROY CARTER (Mid-field/Defender) Steve has turned out in several positions for Swindon since joining them from Hereford during the early weeks of the season. He had been at Hereford since 1975 when they signed him from Western League Club Falmouth.

League record: Hereford 64(7) aps., Swindon 15(5) aps.

CHIC BATES (Midfield) Chic is another newcomer this season, leaving Shrewsbury Town to go South. He had been a regular member of the Shrewsbury team since 1974 and last season he was their leading scorer with 15 gls.

League record: Shrewsbury 160 aps., 45 gls. Swindon 10 aps., 1 gl.

DAVID MOSS (Forward) David is Swindon's top scorer with 22 goals, including a recent match-winning hat-trick against Oxford. Another product of the youth scheme, David came into the side in 1971/72. Last season he hit 21 goals.

League record: Swindon 215(13) aps., 60 gls.

RAY McHALE (Forward) Ray was signed from Halifax last season and he proceeded to score 11 goals for his new club. This season he has hit 13 so far. He began his career with Chesterfield in 1971/72 and topped their scoring list the following season. He moved to Halifax in 1974 and was their best marksman in 1975/76.


League record: Chesterfield 123(1) aps., 27 gls. Halifax 86 aps., 21 gls. Swindon 83(1) aps., 19 gls. CHRIS KAMARA (Forward) Chris joined Swindon from Portsmouth for a £20,000 fee on the eve of this season and he has scored 11 goals this term.

He was one of many young players given their chance in the Pompey first-team two seasons ago.

League record: Portsmouth 56(7) aps., 7 gls. Swindon 36(2) aps., 11 gls.

CHRIS GUTHRIE (Forward) Chris has come back into his own since his £25,000 transfer from Sheffield United last summer. He has scored 13 goals this season. Once with Newcastle, Chris joined Southend in 1972 and was their top scorer in his first season. After topping their list again in 1974/75 he was transferred to Sheffield United for £100,000.

League record: Newcastle 3 aps. Southend 107(1) aps., 35 gls. Sheffield Un. 58(2) aps., 15 gls. Swindon 35(1) aps., 11 gls.






