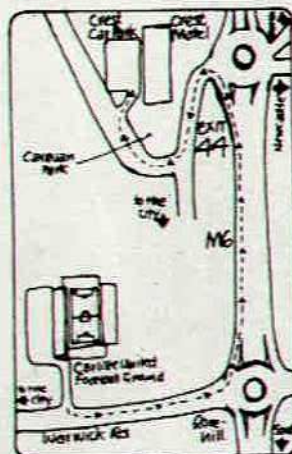
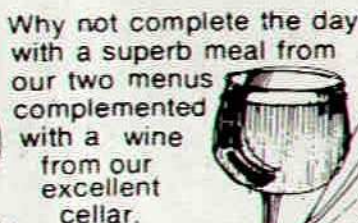

We know all about making draws with Swindon, today's visitors to Brunton Park.

Last season, Bill Rafferty and Mick Tait scored the goals that gave us a share of the spoils in a 2 - 2 draw in Wiltshire. And the same score was repeated on the final day of the season at Brunton Park when Jim Lumby and Phil Bonnyman scored.

Since that last game between the teams, though, there has been a change or two at Swindon.

For a start their manager is Bobby Smith who last term was in charge of Port Vale after a successful spell at Bury. And Bob himself has made a change or two in the playing personnel.

Gone are strikers Chris Guthrie and David Moss, and during the close season Bob Smith laid out a big fee for midfielder Brian Williams, who made his name at Bury before moving on to QPR and the First Division.

Swindon today find themselves in the kind of strong challenging position we held down a few weeks ago. They are there because of a fine home record although it's worth noting that they recorded their first away win of the season last weekend at Lincoln.

is talking soccer

There was a time when the Tyne/Wear derby game was a 'must' for every Newcastle and Sunderland fan the only problem was where to put them all.

A fortnight ago at Roker Park something like 12,000 tickets were left unsold . . . 35,000 paid, when the ceiling figure for the all ticket game was 47,000. If there was ever any question of the effect the yobs are having on the game, that attendance figure might have answered it.

The conclusion I draw is that if the true fans interested only in watching ninety minutes football can't have the comparative safety of a seat in the stand, then they're not going to take a chance on the terraces, especially at games where local rivalry raises the temperature.

On my travels in recent weeks I've had to listen to the press getting a bit of stick for giving the hooligan element so much coverage. But if a photographer ignores a youth with a dart stuck in his head or a yobbo having a go at a policeman, is it going to stop.

If you try to brush dirt under a carpet you end up with a mound of dirt and even classing violence as a social disease rather than a football problem isn't going to bring back supporters.

You've got to admire people who try to do something about it. Former Leeds full back Paul Reaney, now with Bradford City hit on the idea of the handshake with the slogan "Peace" on an armlet to be worn, and that's now being backed by a few personalities.

Last season Brian Clough put a personal appeal to the fans in a prominent position inside the ground to try and end the foul language. This year he threatened to close part of the ground and has given the names and addresses of trouble makers in the programme.

Last week, West Ham gave players a lead for in the programme against Stoke there was an appeal from skipper Billy Bonds, Frank Lampard, Trevor Brooking and Bryan Robson for an end to the foul language on the terraces.

They said "The limit was reached at our last home game against Millwall. The almost ceaseless, mindless chanting and the foul language really upset the whole team and many complained after the game that they found it hard to concentrate."

What a pity the match report I read ran . . . "John McDowell became the first West Ham player to be booked for a heavy foul on Irvine in the 76th minute. Bonds eventually received the booking he deserved in the 82nd minute for yet another foul on Crooks".

If you're going to ask the terraces to behave, why not set them an example when you go out on to the park.

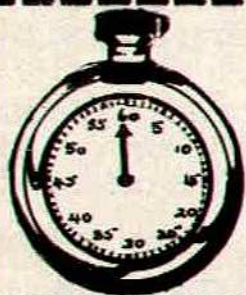

SWINDON T.

STEVE AIZLEWOOD, Defender:— Steve started with home-town Newport County in 1969 and made 191 appearances for them before joining Swindon in March 76. Has made 71 League appearances for Swindon to the end of last season and is a former Welsh under-23 International.

JIMMY ALLAN, Goalkeeper:— Born in Inverness he was signed from Brora Rangers in October, 1970 as an apprentice and on full forms nine months later. Although he made his debut in September, 1971, it was not until 1976/77 that he became established in the side. Had made 158 League appearances at the end of last season.

PHIL BATES, Forward:— Known as Chic he comes from West Bromwich but spent seven years as a part-time Southern League player before signing for Shrewsbury in 1974. Made 160 League appearances for Shrewsbury being top scorer for two seasons before signing for Swindon in January, 1978. Made a further eleven appearances for Swindon last season.

ROY CARTER, Midfield:— Roy who comes from Torpoint, Cornwall played part-time Western League Football with Falmouth before joining Hereford in the summer of 1975. He quickly established himself in this side there and played in the team that won promotion to the second division in 1975/76. Signed for Swindon in December 1977 having made 64 League appearances for Hereford and had made 18 more for Swindon by the seasons end.

DAVID CUNNINGHAM, Forward:— Dave from Kircaldy, played 44 games for Brechin City in the Scottish League and moved to Southend in 1973. After 56 League appearances and a period on loan to Hartlepool he moved to Swindon in the 1977 close season and made 16 League appearances last season. Although short in stature he does not lack determination and can play in midfield or on the wing.

ANDY FORD, Defender:— Andy comes from Minehead and started his career with Bournemouth although he did not reach their League team. A move to Southend in 1972 led to a place in that clubs League side and he made 135 such appearances before moving to Swindon at the start of last season. He made 33 appearances last season mostly at left back where he has taken over from the long serving John Trollope, but he has also played in midfield and as a Central Defender.

GUS GILLIGAN, Forward:— One of the Clubs younger players he comes from Abingdon and has been a regular scorer with the Youth and Reserve teams. Played twice in the League team last season.

CHRIS GUTHRIE, Forward:— Chris made only 5 League appearances for his home town Club Newcastle but he became a regular member of the Southend side following his transfer in 1972/1973. After 107 appearances and twice being leading scorer he moved to Sheffield United in the Summer of 1975 but never settled and was transferred to Swindon 58 games later in the summer of 1977. Chris made 38 appearances for Swindon last season and plays a traditional centre-forward role.

CHRIS KAMARA, Midfield:— Chris comes from Middlesbrough but made his League debut for Portsmouth in September 1975 as one of a number of young players given a first team chance by that club due to financial problems. Those

problems forced Portsmouth to sell Chris to Swindon just before last season after 56 League games and he has since played 40 more for Swindon. A few of these have been as deputy centre forward, but he is at his best attacking from midfield.

RUSSELL LEWIS, Defender:— Russell comes from Blaengwynfi and was signed from Welsh League football in the early part of the 1976/77 season. A young player who had made 6 League appearances to the end of last season in central defensive roles.

RAY McHALE, Midfield:— Ray comes from Sheffield and made his League debut for Chesterfield in Season 1971/72. After 123 League games he signed for Halifax Town where he was top scorer in one season although a midfield player. He did not miss a single match before signing for Swindon in September 1976 after 86 games. Ray made 81 League appearances for Swindon to the end of last season and usually plays as the link man in midfield although he likes to get forward and has a hard shot that made him the regular penalty taker last term.

JOHN McLAUGHLIN, Defender:— John a Londoner, made his debut for Colchester in Season 1971/- but after winning England Youth honours and 66 League games he moved to Swindon in December 1973. Has made 177 League appearances for Swindon to the end of last season mostly at right back, but he also had quite a lot of experience in midfield.

COLIN PROPHETT, Defender:— Colin comes from Crewe and his first professional club was Sheffield Wednesday for whom he made 113 League appearances. In 1973 he moved to Norwich but only stayed until September 1974. He made 34 first division appearances, before his move to Swindon for whom he had played 154 games at the end of last season. Club Captain for the past two seasons and a fixture at Centre Back during that time.

KEVIN ROBERTS, Goalkeeper:— Kevin is from Bristol and was a part-time player until he signed for Swindon from Welton Rovers in March 1977 Made two first-team appearances last season.

KENNY STROUD, Midfield:— Ken is a Londoner but has been with the Club since he was an apprentice and is now one of the longest serving players at the Club. Although signed as a professional in 1970 and made his League debut in 1971/72 it was not until 1974/75 that he gained a regular place in the team. Ken had made 154 League appearances to the end of last season, mostly in midfield but he enjoys playing as a central defender, when the need arises.

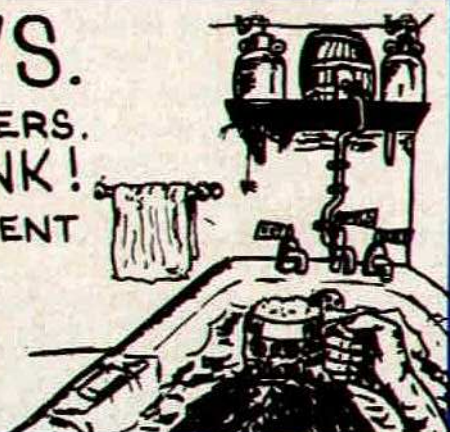

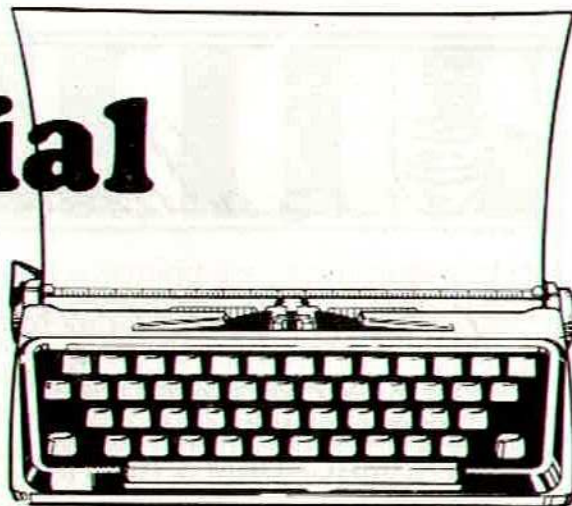
