

## saltergate side-lines

Tonight we extend a welcome to Swindon Town in the Third Division game which was postponed on December 2nd. Little did we think when that game was called-off that we were in for such a terrible spell of weather.

Our hopes are that there will not be any more hold-ups as the financial strain has been tremendous. In addition, of course, it is not good for players to build-up week by week only for the efforts to be wasted due to postponements.

Now we face a tremendously busy programme in order to complete our fixtures. It means that we will be playing a match nearly every third day between now and the end of the season, and it is vitally important that we do well in order to recoup some of our losses.

Swindon are well to the fore in the Third Division and if they keep it up they could be one of the firm candidates for promotion to the Second Division.

On Saturday we pay a visit to high-riding Watford, who beat us 2-0 here last October in a game which we deserved at least a point. Watford are indeed a very strong side, with tremendous resources and it will be a big surprise if they do not go straight through from the Fourth Division to the Second Division in two seasons.

A week tonight we have Shrewsbury as visitors in the first of three successive games at home in the space of eight days. The others are against Tranmere on the Saturday and the re-arranged match with Blackpool on the following Wednesday.

If we can win tonight, then give Watford a surprise and follow-up by beating Shrewsbury, Tranmere and Blackpool — which we are capable of doing — then our position in the Third Division would indeed be vastly improved.

# meet our visitors

It is with a warm welcome that we greet our opponents from Swindon for this evening's game, a fixture that has usually produced excitement and entertainment in the past and which today should be no exception, particularly as two of the players involved in today's match have more than usual to inspire them onwards towards producing a good performance. These are, of course, former Spireite Ray McHale and our recent acquisition from Swindon Colin Prophett, who should also find themselves as respective captains this evening. The best of luck to you both, gentlemen!

Ever since dropping into the third Division in 1974, Swindon have annually threatened to regain their Division 2 status, usually starting the season among the tipsters' favourites to take the step up. Very near they have come too, but last season saw them finish in, for them, a disappointing 10th position, one place behind us but on the same points score of 48. New manager Bobby Smith, the former boss of Bury and Port Vale, will no doubt be looking to improve on that 10th place of last year, and the signs are that he has already made the Wiltshire club a force to be reckoned with this season. Currently in 4th position and with possibly the best in-form record in the Division, Swindon look poised to make the big push for promotion this time round, but so do we, and this all adds up to an exciting match in prospect this evening.

Since taking over in May from Danny Williams, who has now taken up administrative duties at the Club as general manager, Bobby Smith has played the transfer market in a big way. Seven sales have gone through, the departures being David Moss (to Luton), Micky French (to Doncaster), Colin Prophett (to us) and Chris Guthrie (to Fulham), whilst new arrivals have been Ian Miller (from Doncaster), Brian Williams (from Q.P.R.) and Andy Rowlands (from Bury), big money having been spent on all three incoming players, a further

sign of Swindon's intention to suceed this season.

Unlikely to be turning out for our visitors this evening is their manager Bobby Smith or his assistant Wilf Tranter, but that's exactly what they did some weeks ago when an injury crisis hit the club. They both played in a reserve game against Chelsea in order to make up the team and both were reported to have enjoyed the experience, even though they were on the wrong end of a 1-0 scoreline!

Last season, the honours were evenly shared between our clubs as each registered a home win. Swindon beat us 2-1 at the County Ground whilst, in the last game of last season here at Saltergate, we chalked up a fine 3-1 victory, a game in which a certain C. Prophett scored for the visitors! J.P.

#### Focus on

#### STEVE AIZLEWOOD

(Defender) Steve started with home town Newport County in 1969 and made 191 appearances for them before joining Swindon in March 1976. Had made 71 League appearances for Swindon to the end of last season and is a former Welsh under-23 International.

#### JIMMY ALLAN

(Goalkeeper) Born in Inverness he was signed from Brora Rangers in October, 1970. Although he made his debut in September 1971, it was not until 1976/77 that he became established in the side. Had made 158 League appearances at the end of last season.

#### PHIL BATES

(Forward) Known as Chic he comes from West Bromwich but spent seven years as a part-time Southern League player before signing for Shrewsbury in 1974. Made 160 League appearances for Shrewsbury, being top scorer for two seasons, before signing for Swindon in January, 1978. Made 11 appearances for Swindon last season.

#### ROY CARTER

(Midfield) Roy who comes from Torpoint, Cornwall played part-time with Falmouth before joining Hereford in the summer of 1975. He quickly established himself in the side there and played in the team that won promotion to the Second Division in 1975/76. Signed for Swindon in December 1977 having made 64 League appearances for Hereford and had made 18 more for Swindon by the season's end.

#### ANDY FORD

(Defender)
Andy comes from Minehead and started his career with Bournemouth. A move to Southend in 1972 led to a place in that club's League side and he made 135 such appearances before moving to Swindon at the start of last season. He made 33 appearances last season mostly at left-back where he has taken over from the long-serving John Trollope, but he has also played in midfield and as a central defender.

#### RAY McHALE

(Midfield) Ray comes from Sheffield and made his League debut for Chesterfield in season 1971/72. After 123 League games he signed for Halifax Town. He did not miss a single match before signing for Swindon in September 1976 after 86 games. Ray made 81 League appearances for Swindon to the end of last season and usually plays as the link man in midfield although he likes to get forward and has a hard shot that made him the regular penalty taker last term.

#### JOHN McLAUGHLIN

(Defender) John a Londoner, made his debut for Colchester in season 1971/72 but after winning England Youth honours and 66 League games he moved to Swindon in December 1973. He made 177 League appearances for Swindon to the end of last season mostly at right back, but he also had quite a lot of experience in midfield.
