

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

It's all about discipline

You will be pleased to know, and you may not realise this, that we have a good disciplinary record and come somewhere in the top twenty. I hope I am not tempting providence by mentioning this in the programme but it is something you spectators usually never get to know.

We do have our bad lads from time to time. Many bookings come through fear and stupidity by players but we do fine players for dissent, which, I think, is one of the worst offences.

I am hoping, however, we can maintain our good standard. It does provide for better concentration, better discipline and therefore a better standard of football and a better standard of football must suit the supporters.

It has probably been a tall order to gain promotion immediately but I am hoping that we can further establish ourselves in the Third and look forward to a brighter future. Of course your support and vocal encouragement is necessary for all of this, so 'don't give up on us baby', yet.

The magazine chose what they considered to be an ideal Third Division team. In goal that day was TERRY GENNOE now with Southampton who are due to appear at Wembley Stadium tomorrow in the Football League Cup Final against Nottingham Forest. Obviously this is an important weekend for many professional footballers.



It's a boy!

Heartiest congratulations to Janet and Mick Laverick on the birth of a son last Sunday.

Division Three (South). At the top Brighton led the way, a 3-0 win over Crystal Palace stretching their lead over Ipswich to three points. Coventry. Southampton and Bristol City were also in Division Three (South) in those days as were today's visitors Swindon Town, who went down 2-0 at Northampton on that particular day and were only just above the reelection zone.

Third Division clubs were also to the fore in the Sixth Round F.A. Cup-ties played on the same day with Port Vale going through 1-0 at Leyton Orient, as they were then known. W.B.Albion beat Tottenham 3-0 and the other two ties were drawn, Leicester against Preston and Sheffield Wednesday against Bolton.

In Division One wooden-spoonists Liver-pool went down 2-1 at Sheffield United and it

is interesting to modern eyes to see third place Huddersfield beating Newcastle 3-2. The Yorkshire lads, however, had little chance of catching leaders W.B.Albion or second place Wolves.

Stoke romped home 6-0 at Bury in Division Two, but they were still only halfway up the league with Everton and Blackburn holding on to the top two positions: with wins over Rotherham and West Ham respectively.

Hat-tricksters in Division Three (North) included two men who have since made their mark as Managers, JIMMY McGUIGAN for Hartlepools and ALAN ASHMAN for Carlisle. Chester then occupied bottom place while Gateshead, Barrow, Bradford, Accrington, Workington and Southport were all comfortably placed.

The opposition

WELCOME to SWINDON TOWN

Today we welcome old friends from our Third Division (South) days who are currently well placed for winning promotion to Division Two for the third time since the war.

Like ourselves they were founder members of Division Three (South) in 1920 and it was not until 1963 that they played in any division besides the Third. That spell lasted just two seasons and after climbing back up again in 1969 the year of their sensational League Cup final victory over Arsenal they were only a few points short of a First Division place a year later.

1974 saw them back in Division Three, however, and 1975/6 brought them uncomfortably close to a first-ever spell in Division Four. They survived, however, and last season climbed as high as eighth.

This gave new Manager BOB SMITH,

formerly with Bury and briefly with Port Vale, a useful launching pad and they have gathered momentum as the season has developed. A League Cup win at West Ham boosted their confidence and though they ultimately went out to Peterborough they also progressed to Round Four of the F.A. Cup before going down at Aldershot. Though losing at home to Plymouth and Blackpool, and being held 0-0 by Carlisle last Saturday, they have won their other twelve home games in the League while on their travels they have won at Lincoln. Mansfield. Swansea and Rotherham.

HERE TODAY

It was in the game at Rotherham that ALAN MAYNES, newly signed from Watford, kicked off with a hat-trick and another striker in form recently has been ANDY ROWLAND, signed from

Bob Smith's former club, Bury, CHIC BATES (from Shrewsbury last season) completed the likely front trio while from CHRIS midfield KAMARA (from Portsmouth last year) and PAUL GILCHRIST (ex-Southampton) have both slotted home goals this season as has ROY CARTER, who came from Hereford last season.

In defence ANDY FORD of course moved from us in the summer of 1977 and he is likely to be on the opposite flank from JOHN McLAUGHLIN (over 200 games since moving from Colchester) with STEVE AIZLEWOOD (from Newport three years ago) and one-club man KENNY STROUD in the centre and either CHRIS OGDEN (from Oldham this season) or home-grown KEVIN ROBERTS in goal.

Swindon's last visit here was in October 1975 when we beat them 3-0.


