

saltergate side-lines

Tonight the opposition is supplied by Swindon Town and we extend to them a hearty welcome to our ground. When we visited Swindon last September we went down by the odd-goal of three in a game which we deserved at least a point.

Swindon hit the high spots this season with some sparkling victories in the Football League Cup and F.A. Cup competitions. As the result of those successes they got behind with their League fixtures, but recently they have had one or two setbacks and lost a little ground.

Nevertheless they are a strong side with their strikers Alan Mayes and Andy Rowland being two of the leading scorers in the Football League and with Ray McHale, one of our former players as their captain they are quite capable of renewing their promotion challenge.

Next Saturday we are due at Reading where we will be seeking to complete another double, having won the first clash 7-1 here last November. While Reading has a rather poor away record their home record is quite impressive and our task will not be easy.

Then comes our Easter programme starting with the return game with Gillingham, which has been switched from Good Friday to the previous Tuesday. Following on is a visit to Carlisle on Easter Saturday and a home game with Chester on Easter Monday.

Ry that time we should have a much clearer picture as to our promotion chances as there will only be five games outstanding. At the time of writing the exact date of our away game with Sheffield United is a little uncertain.

The reason is that the F.A. Cup semi-final between Arsenal and Liverpool has been allocated to the ground of Sheffield Wednesday which is across the other side of the City on the same day as we are due at the Lane. Watch out in the local Press for final arrangements regarding that game.

We extend our sincere thanks for the support you have given us in recent matches. It is very important indeed that we receive every ounce of support you can give us.

Quite a lot of money has been spent on new players and we hope you will give us your full backing in order that we can fulfil our aim to get back into the Second Division.

The task in the weeks ahead will not be easy, but your encouragement can play a very important part in the final issues.

We extend a warm Saltergate welcome to promotion contenders Swindon Town for this evening's important League fixture. For a team who looked to be well on course for Division 2 until an extended Cup run interfered with their rhythm of League successes, Swindon have now gone a couple of months in which their form has been very patchy indeed. Just three wins in their last eleven games has coincided with a time when their rivals are putting together their best results of the season, and this has unfortunately reduced the Wiltshire club from promotion favourites at the turn of the year to outsiders now.

The Cup runs received a lot of publicity which elevated Swindon to hero status. A League Cup Semi-Final spot and a place in the F.A. Cup 5th Round draw came as a result of morale-boosting vistories over Arsenal and Wolves and a draw against Spurs, but it has been against lesser teams that Swindon have recently failed to get a result. Manager Bobby Smith would now surely trade in all that Cup glory for League points as his team battle to rediscover their early season form.

Their success then was based on the free-scoring flair of their twin strikers Alan Mayes and Andy Rowland who have so far notched up a half-century of goals between them. The goals from this pair have temporarily dried up but they can never be written off as they are likely to strike at any time, as also is their captain and former Spireite Ray McHale who always seems in such inspired form against his old club.

Here's to a good game tonight and to the two points staying at Saltergate!

focus on . . .

JIMMY ALLAN (Goalkeeper) Jimmy comes from Inverness and was signed from Scottish Non-League football in October 1970. Although he made his debut in September 1971, he had to wait for a first team place and had made 183 League appearances to the end of the last season.

RUSSELL LEWIS (Defender) From Wales, he was signed from Welsh League football in the early part of the 1975/76 season and had made 13 League appearances at the end of the last season all as a central defender.

KEN STROUD (Defender) Originally from London Ken is one of the longest serving players at the Club having joined from school. He signed professional in 1970 and made his League debut in 1971/72 season. He had played 200 League games to the end of last season, many of them in midfield, although more recently he has settled into his favourite position playing beside the centre half in the middle of the defence.

RAY McHALE (Midfield) A native of Sheffield he made his League debut for Chesterfield in Season 1971/72. After 123 League games he signed for Halifax Town and did not miss a single first team game whilst there making 86 League appearances. He signed for Swindon in September 1976, and had made another 130 appearances in the League to the end of last season. He usually plays in the centre of midfield linking the play, but has a hard shot when in sight of goal.

RILLY TUCKER (Defender) From Hereford he played at centre half for Hereford United in their Southern League days. He stayed with that club after election to the League and played in the side that eventually reached the Second Division making 135 League appearances. He moved to Bury in December 1976 and made his name with that Club before moving to Swindon in June 1979.




