Editorial

The Last Lap

Supporters will agree that as recent games have come and gone there has been a feeling that the pressure on all at Gigg Lane has increased relentlessly. Week by week the team has achieved the target of around a point per match, winning some games unexpectedly, then dropping occasional points which it could have been felt were there for the taking.

The last two matches well illustrate this point, although there is no doubt that in both our team has played very well. Before a fine crowd Sheffield Wednesday's unbeaten run was justly ended, and then two shots against the woodwork at Chesterfield last Saturday cruelly robbed us of at least one point which even the home fans agreed our play justified.

Such is the game, but the time has now come when there is little room for manoeuvre. Central League experience.







 Swindon won the Football League Cup in 1968-69, also gaining promotion from the Third Division.

IN THE BEGINNING . . .

Founded in 1881 by the Reverend W. Pitt, the club turned professional in 1894, in which season they became one of the original members of the Southern League. In 1896 the move was made from Swindon's first ground, the Croft, to the County Ground, where the club has played ever since.

Season 1907-08 saw the commencement of Swindon's rise to fame, and from then on the club has never looked back. Competing in the FA Cup for the first time Town reached the Third Round in 1907, and three years later reached the semi-final, to be beaten by Newcastle United.

The Club won the Southern League Championship in 1911 and again in 1914, and during the period of 1907-14 never finished lower than fifth in the table. The players who formed the combination of the sides at this time are remembered in Wiltshire to this day, but none is referred to more than H. J. Fleming, capped nine times by England, a loyal one club man.

Reward for these fine early years came in 1920 when the Club became Founder Members of Division Three, where apart from two short spells in the Second Division, they have played up to date.
