

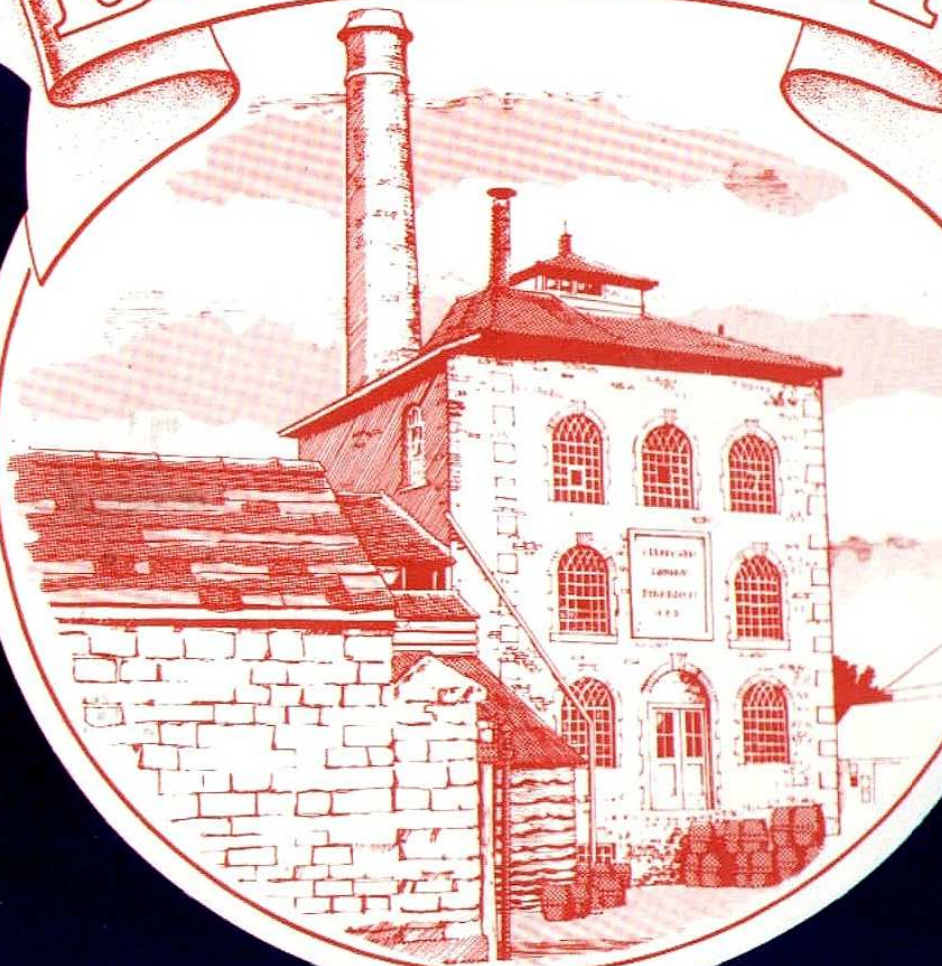

# Talk of the Town by the Chairman

Today we are pleased to welcome the Players and Officials from Doncaster Rovers who are enjoying a very good start to this season after their promotion to our league. It is many years since we have had the pleasure of their company and we wish them success after today's match.

We have had a very eventful week, after winning so handsomely at Bristol and then being on the receiving end at Walsall. During the many years that I have been connected with the game, I have never seen such a keen and closely contested game as was played at Walsall and ending with such a one sided score. Unless one witnessed this game it would be impossible to even imagine how it was contested. This is what makes our game so attractive to millions of people, the excitement and the uncertainties.

This week started very sadly for us, with the death of Fred Ford who was respected throughout the Football World for his knowledge of the game, his dedication, his friendly manner, his integrity, his love for the game and especially his coaching at all levels. Fred did more for football in our part of the country than anyone I know and we shall miss him very much indeed.

On a happier note, this week we celebrated our Centenary Year with a gathering of officials of Football Clubs from Group Five which included Plymouth, Torquay, Bournemouth, Newport, Reading, Bristol, Exeter, Cardiff and Oxford. The Football League and the Football Association were represented and we received an Illuminated Address from the Football Association to mark this occasion and also a gift from the Football League.

We were honoured with the presence of His Worshipful the Mayor and dignitaries from the Local Authority, along with the prominent people of our Town. Mr Frank Peart, Secretary of the Wiltshire Football Association represented the county's interest. We were also delighted to have with us for this occasion, members of our successful League Cup Squad of 1969 including Frank Burrows, Rod Thomas, John Smith, Joe Butler, Don Heath, Willie Penman and of course, John Trollope and Don Rogers.

The Press was represented by Mr Terry Woodhouse and Mr Clive King from the Sports Desk of the Evening Advertiser. With our present and past players gathered together it was an eventful and enjoyable evening which was, of course, also an historical event in the Football World.

Last week all clubs from the Football Leagues Division Three and Four met in London to consider the restructuring of these divisions which had been suggested by the management of the Football League. As you will now have read, the clubs turned down this suggestion without one club speaking in favour of it. Clubs are now being asked to come forward with suggestions that might improve the game and also help clubs at the same time.

As a part of the Swindon Shopping Spree celebration, at half time today the Swindon Athletic Club are holding a relay race for your entertainment and details of this event will be given over the public address system.

We are pleased to welcome John and Lorraine Deane who are in charge of our Rendezvous Club for a few weeks until we make a permanent appointment. Let's hope that we can give our supporters something to celebrate today.

# JOHN TROLLOPE

For the last three week's we have again experienced the ups and downs of football having won one game when we did not play particularly well, winning another at Bristol Rovers where we played brilliantly and losing the third at Walsall having played well despite the score line of 0 - 5.

Firstly, the Carlisle game ended with the right result but overall, our performance left a lot to be desired. This is the first occasion that I have fielded a side at home which did not include a natural winger, for which some people have criticized me, but having gained some good points away from home it was difficult to change the side. In the event we played more attacking football without a winger than we have in the past with one and although it did not work particularly well against Carlisle, we achieved the result we wanted.

Having been criticized for our performance against Carlisle, it was pleasing that so many of our supporters witnessed the excellent performance at Bristol Rovers where, from start to finish, I did not think the result was ever in doubt. A great team performance which again took us to the top of the league.

Then came the disappointing face of football with the 0 - 5 defeat at Walsall. Looking at the

result people must think we were annihilated but those of you who travelled must still be wondering how the score line came about for not only were we not outplayed, we did enough to have won the game. The performance of the players was on par with the other away games, but it was just one of those nights where explanations are difficult to find.

I would like to thank the supporters who travelled to the two away games for the excellent encouragement that gave to the team and if this backing could be carried through to home games I am sure we will see improved performances.

Ken Beamish is now achieving improved results with the Reserve Team having won away at Leicester 2 - 0, and at home against Luton Town 3 - 0, and these results are reflected in our improved position in the league table.

These notes were written on the day of our League Cup Dinner, and I am looking forward to meeting many of the League Cup winning squad of 1969 who are joining us for this occasion.

Today we welcome the players, officials and supporters of Doncaster Rovers who are certainly making their mark in the Third Division under the managership of Billy Bremner, and I am sure today's game is going to be a very hard fought affair and I make no apologies for once again saying that your encouragement is of vital importance.

Thank you for your attendance this afternoon and let us all hope that we see another resounding win for Swindon Town.

# DONCASTER

**BILLY BREMNER (Manager)** Born Stirling, now in his third full season as Manager after a distinguished career as a midfield player with Leeds United and, later, Hull City. Billy made over 600 League appearances and also gained 54 International Caps for Scotland. He was, of course, Captain of the famous Leeds United side of the 60's and 70's and won honours in just about every major competition. Gained his first success as a Manager when Rovers won promotion last season.

**DAVE BENTLEY (Coach)** A former Rovers player, Dave was appointed as Junior Coach in December, 1979, and then First Team Coach a year later. An experienced player in the area, Dave used to play for Rotherham, Chesterfield and Mansfield (on loan). Still registered with the Club as a non contract player.

**ALAN WARBOYS (Striker)** Born Goldthorpe. Previous Clubs were Hull City, Doncaster Rovers, Sheffield Wednesday, Cardiff City, Sheffield United and Bristol Rovers, the latter for whom he made well over 100 League appearances. Voted Rovers "Player of the Year" in 1980, Alan is as consistent as ever.

**WILLIE BOYD (Goalkeeper)** Born Bellshill. Signed from Hull City shortly before the departure of Dennis Peacock to Bolton Wanderers in March, 1980. Willie is a former Scottish Youth International and Schoolboy. He made his debut for the Club at Peterborough in March, 1980, and missed only one game in last years promotion winning season.

**IAN SNODEN (Midfield)** Born Thrybergh. Only 18, Ian made his debut for the Club against Bournemouth in March, 1980. Scored his first goal for Rovers in a 1-1 draw at Aldershot in the April. Ian is, of course, the younger brother of Glynn and an England Youth International with great promise.

**HUGH DOWD (Defender)** Born Lurgan. Hugh was signed from Sheffield Wednesday in August, 1979, for a fee of £15,000. A Northern Ireland International, he made 110 appearances for Sheffield Wednesday before joining Rovers and scored his first goal for Rovers at Crewe in October, 1979.

**GLYNN SNODEN (Defender)** Born Thrybergh, Glynn made his debut at the age of 17 in 1977 having progressed through the junior ranks. Glynn can play at full back or midfield and has attracted interest from several First Division Clubs with his stylish play. Won the Sunday People/Redifusion award for the most consistent player in the Fourth Division last term.

**ALAN LITTLE (Midfield)** Born C. Durham. The Clubs record signing made from Barnsley for £25,000 in December, 1979, Alan made over 200 League appearances for Southend and Barnsley prior to joining Rovers. He scored his first goal for Rovers against Huddersfield in 1979. The Clubs second top goal scorer last term with 7 goals and also "Player of the Year".

**BILLY RUSSELL (Defender)** Signed in the summer of 1979 from Celtic, Billy was the regular right back in the side last season. He was previously with Everton as an apprentice. Billy is a Scotland Youth and Schoolboy International and also appeared in a Youth Cup Final for Everton when they lost narrowly to Crystal Palace three years ago. The Clubs only ever-present during their promotion season.

**PAT LALLY (Midfield)** Pat was signed from Swansea City for £15,000 in the summer of 1978 and was voted "Player of the Year" in 1979. Born Paddington, he played for several Clubs including Millwall, York and Aldershot making 224 appearances in all, before joining Rovers. Now fully fit after a cartilage operation during the summer of 1981.

# ROVERS

**DAVID HARLE (Midfield)** Only 18, Dave made his debut for Rovers as an apprentice in a League match at Port Vale in 1980. He is a solid midfield player with great potential who has also trained with the England Youth Team.

**DARAL PUGH (Striker)** Born Crynant. Signed as an apprentice in August, 1977, Daral signed professional forms in December, 1978, and has been a first team choice ever since. Reached the Welsh Under 21 squad last season, scored 5 League goals last term and has now made over 80 appearances for the Club.

**STEVE LISTER (Midfield)** Signed as an apprentice in 1978, Steve signed professional forms in 1979. Still only 19, he has played in attack and defence scoring 12 goals for the Club in 1979 - 80. Born Doncaster, Steve is a player who has attracted interest from several big Clubs during his career. Now a regular in the side.

**IAN NIMMO (Striker)** Born Boston. Also signed from Sheffield Wednesday in the summer of 1979, Ian is a hard working forward who rarely gets the credit he deserves. He has been the Clubs top scorer for the last two years with 14 and 18 goals. Ian also scored goals in limited appearances for Peterborough United and Sheffield Wednesday.

**STEWART MELL (Forward)** Born Doncaster, Stewart made his debut for Rovers in 1979 as a non contract player and later signed full professional forms for the Club. Stewarts former Club was non league side Appleby Frodingham. 23 years of age, Stewart is a pacy striker.

**GLENN HUMPHRIES (Defender)** Still with the Club on apprentice forms, Glenn made his debut in the last game of the season at Mansfield Town as a late substitute.

**CARL SWAN (Defender)** Son of former Sheffield Wednesday and England centre half Peter Swan, Carl was signed from non league Club, Burton Albion, for a fee of £6,000 in December, 1980. A successful debut at Bournemouth the same month was capped by a brilliant first goal for the Club. Carl finally made 12 full appearances during the Clubs promotion winning year.

**RICHARD DAWSON (Forward)** Richard was signed from neighbours, Rotherham United, in February, 1981, scoring his first goal for the Club that month in the home game against York City. Richard, like fellow striker Ian Nimmo, is a player with a "goal every two games" average. Born in Chesterfield.

**STEVE HUMPHRIES (Goalkeeper)** Steve was signed during the summer of 1981 from Leicester City where he became cover for the experienced Mark Wallington. Brother of young apprentice, Glenn, Steve was born in Hull.

**DES BENNETT (Forward)** Formerly with the Club on apprentice forms, Des made his debut for Rovers against Northampton Town in February, 1981. During the summer of that year, he was fortunate enough to spend some time with Gisborne City playing in New Zealand prior to his return to Belle Vue at the start of the new season.

**RUSSELL WILCOX (Midfield)** Another local player with enormous promise, Russell is an apprentice who, like Glenn Humphries, made his debut in the last game of the season when Rovers clinched third position in the Fourth Division table with a 1-1 draw at Mansfield.

# Colin Benson spotlights

## BILLY BREMNER

BILLY BREMNER one of football's greatest captains is fast becoming a managerial legend around South Yorkshire.

The little Scot - he stands just 5' 5½", joined Doncaster Rovers in the autumn of 1978 as manager. He perhaps did not realise what he was letting himself in for, because after many years in the soccer wilderness the club were at rock bottom. Even Billy's enthusiastic drive could not avert disaster and by the end of the season Rovers were forced to seek re-election for the third time in their history.

After being voted back into the League that following summer a relieved Bremner reflected: "I could so easily have been manager of a non-league club just nine months after starting my managerial career."

"I must admit it had not been what I expected. I'd always been associated with success at Leeds United and took it for granted that was the way clubs were run. The attitude of the players was wrong the club was unprofessional and so it all had to be changed."

Bremner had been brought up by the man he describes as the "greatest manager" Don Revie, with whom he shared his most successful triumphs. It was the then Leeds manager Jack Taylor who had brought the little Glaswegian south from Scottish Junior football in 1958, but it was Don Revie who persuaded the homesick teenager to stick it out when he felt like returning home.

It was Revie who partnered Billy when he made his football League debut against Chelsea at Stamford Bridge in 1959 - Revie at inside right and Billy at outside right. And it was Revie who after becoming manager in 1962, converted him into a midfield general, a position in which he established himself as the dynamo of the Leeds team and later of Scotland.

Bremner's illustrious playing career covered 586 League games for Leeds, during which he scored 92 goals. In 1970 he was acclaimed throughout the land when voted the Footballer of the Year and between 1965 and 1976 he collected 54 Scottish international caps.

Perhaps the famous Leeds side did not win as many prizes as they should have done, but even so Bremner's trophy case is well stocked with Championship, FA Cup, Football League Cup

and European momentos. And just what esteem the Leeds public held him in was richly displayed when his testimonial game in 1974 netted him a record near £40,000.

Billy parted company with Leeds in the autumn of 1976 to join Hull City and when he retired at the end of the 1977-78 season he had added another 61 games and six goals to his Football League record.

Since then Bremner has made four appearances for Doncaster although he stresses this was only because the club were stricken by injuries, pushing his appearances up to 651.

But back to his current role, where he has displayed the same leadership qualities he used to perform on the field. Billy set about changing the whole atmosphere of the Doncaster club and started at the bottom with the tea ladies, gate-men and stewards: "You need to make everyone in the club feel they are important and needed and then they will show pride in their work," he explains.

As for the players they are treated like top class professionals, staying in the best hotels, kitted out in smart blazers and slacks. "Psychology" says Bremner "is essential to successful management."

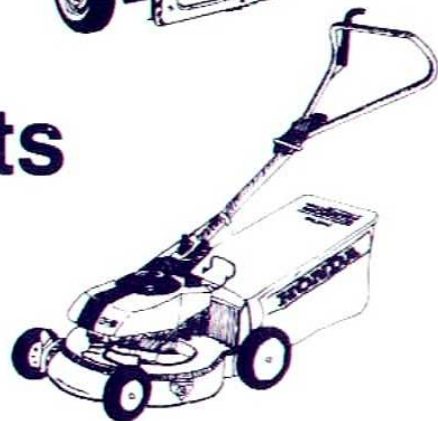

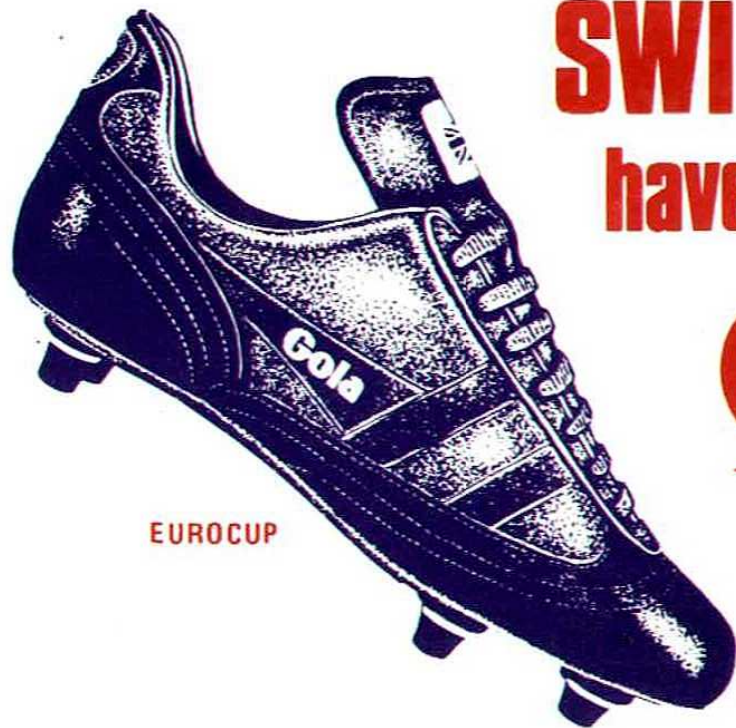

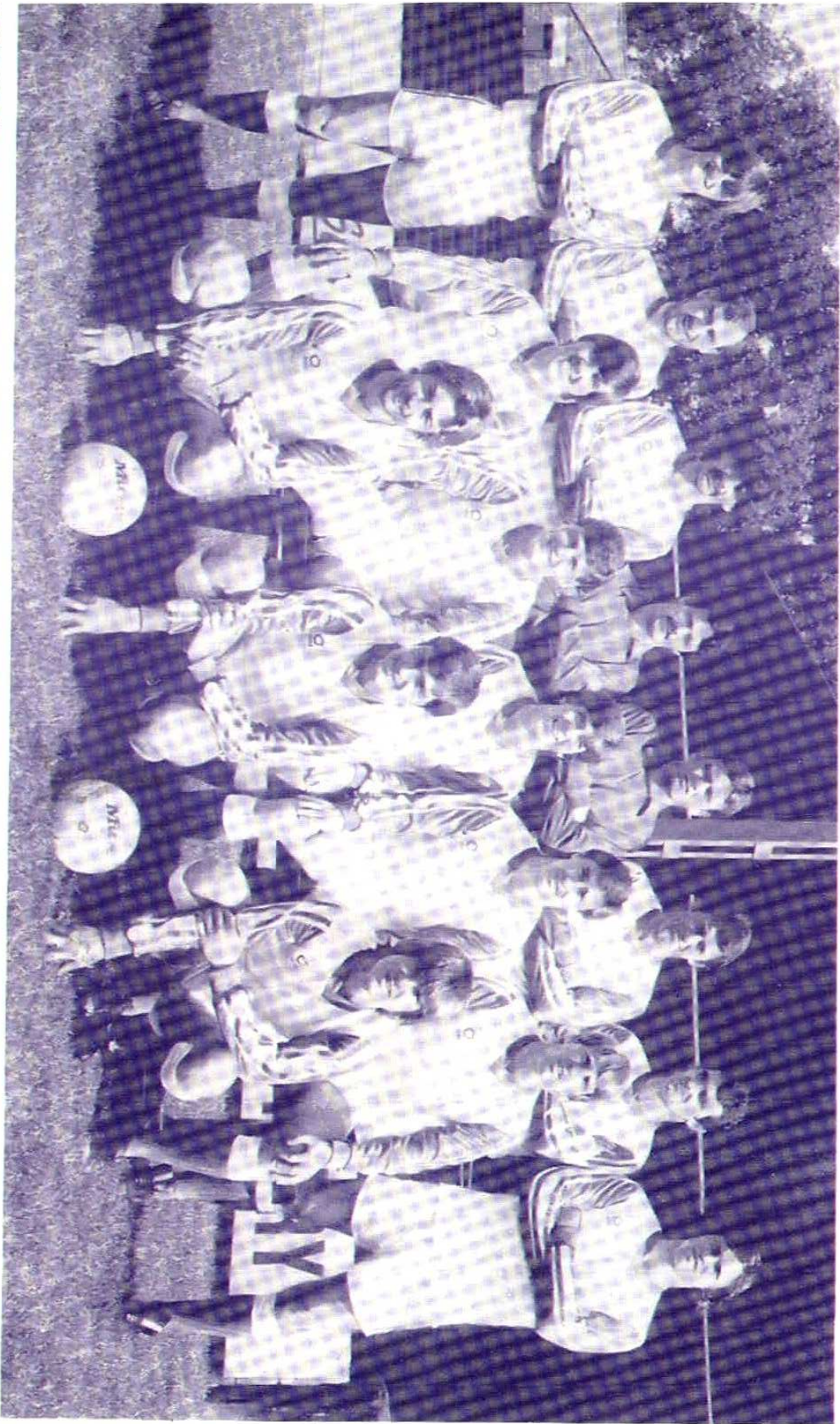

# John Ward talks to Craig Moores

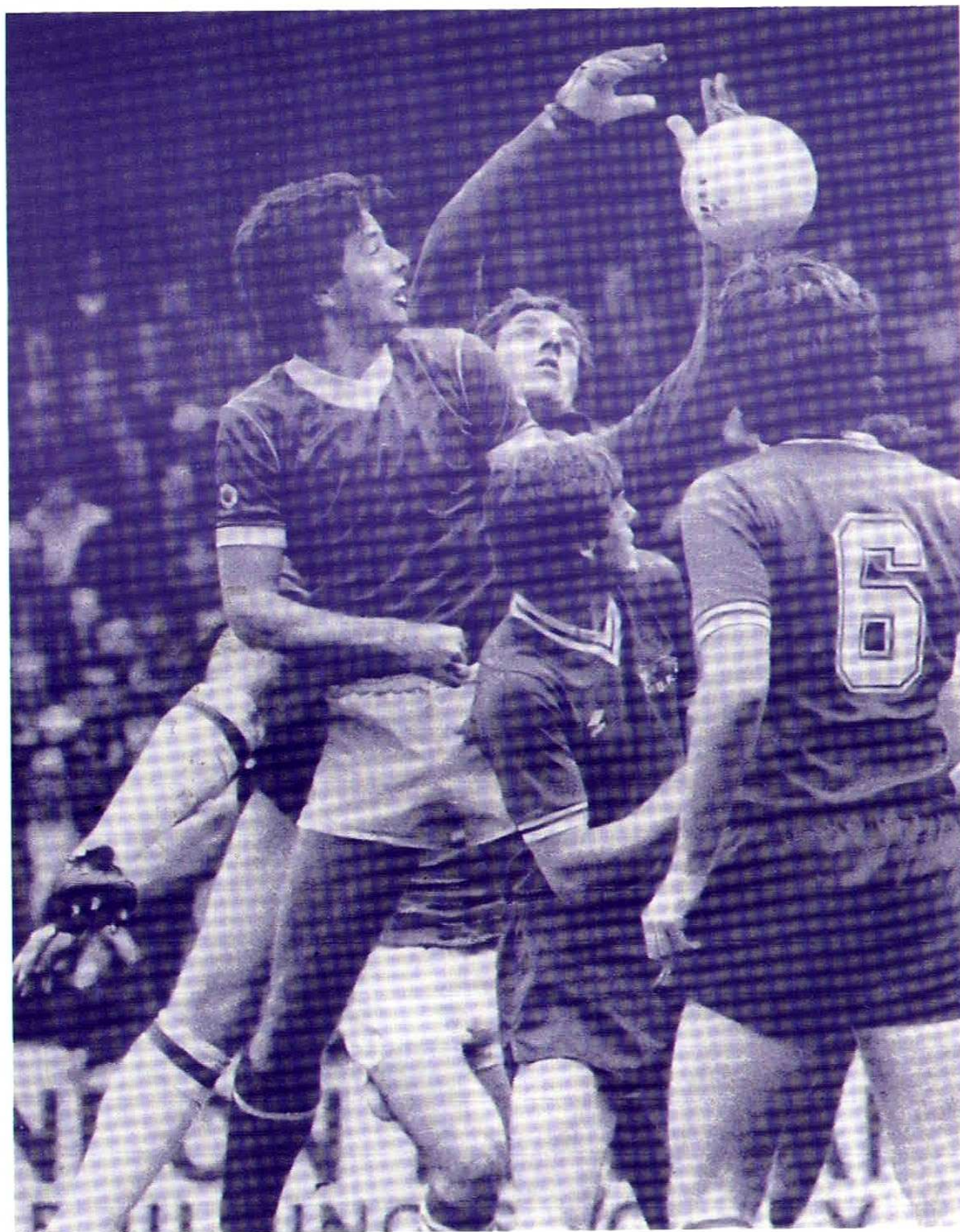

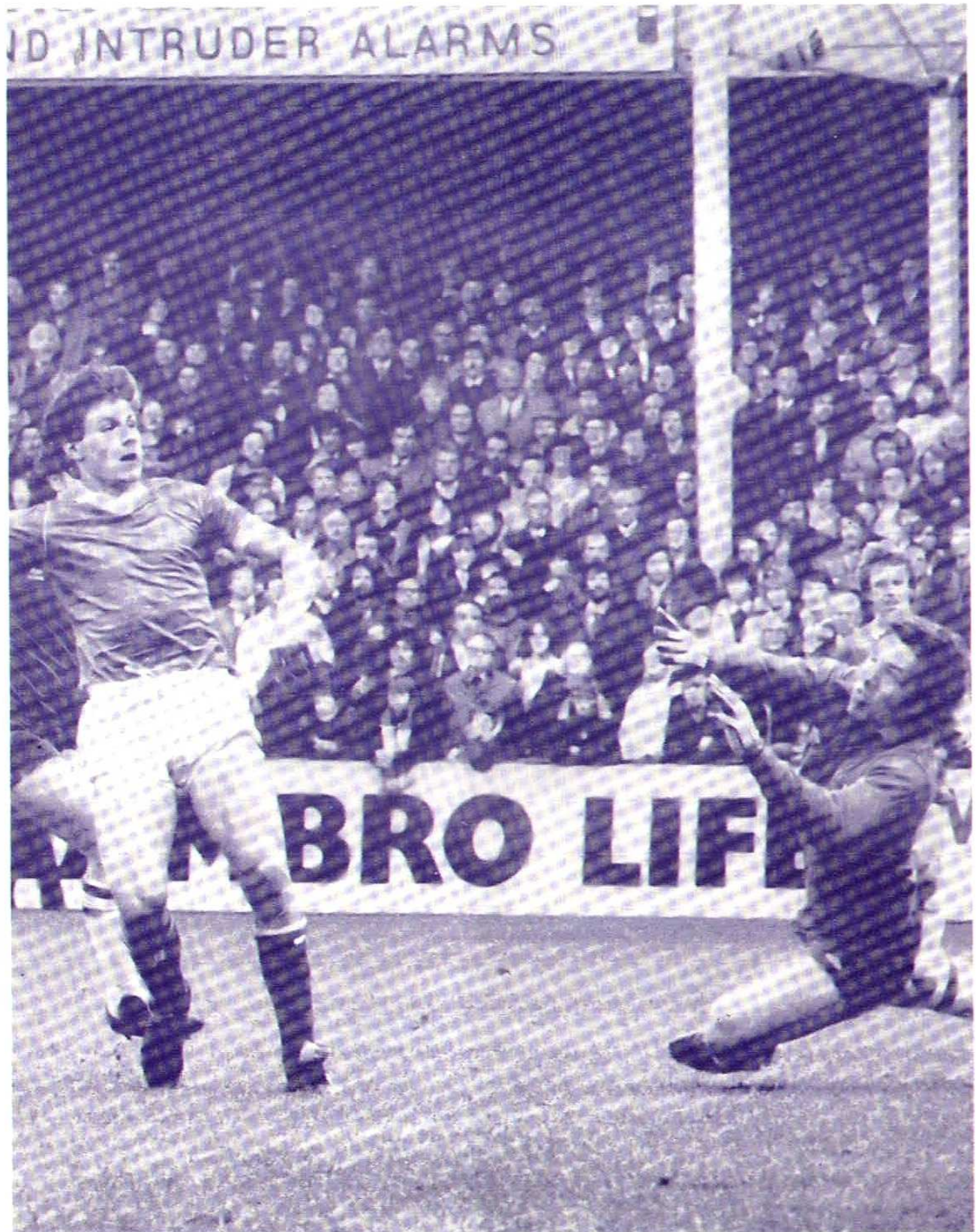
