As he's 6'2" I promptly apologised and went to find my seat for the game between Tampa Bay Rowdies and New York Cosmos — the highlight of my holiday, sorry, vacation.

That in itself took nearly 10 minutes as I journeyed onwards and upwards. Tampa Stadium has an all-seated capacity of 71,600 and has a parking lot (car park) the size of Rochester Airport.

Winston didn't actually play as Kevin Keelan was in goal that evening.

However, whilst waiting for the kick off I guzzled a quarter-gallon bucket of Coke (it was a hot summer's evening) and munched through a hot dog nearly a foot long before getting to know something about Winston through 'Kick' — the North American soccer magazine which also doubles as a match programme.

Winston, or 'Cancin' Du' as he's nicknamed by the fannies (supporters), had an interesting bio (pen picture) which is worth repeating:

"Put this man on top of a tall Dallas skyscraper with a tall glass of cold iced tea and good friends to watch the sun set and you'll find a lazy smile emerge on his face. Winston loves to relax and watch the sun disappear at the end of the day. Add the sound of the Eagles Styx, Poco or Eddie Money and the aroma of prime ribs of beef and he'll probably stay there all night. Winston would snap out of it fast, however, if you handed him a set of keys for a Porsche 924 waiting outside on the ground floor."



Winston (25) was born in Florida and joined the Rowdies in 1977. Highly rated by chief coach Gordon Jago — and, no doubt, by Keith Peacock who was his assistant at Tampa before becoming Gillingham boss — Winston has kept goal for the national team.

He has spent three previous off seasons in this country, training with clubs such as Ipswich.

The match? That finished as a 2-1 win for the Rowdies through Frank Worthington (Leicester) and Tony Kinsell (ex-Millwall).

Soccer is presented differently in the States and is geared to entertainment. It's catching on fast and a crowd of around 35,000 certainly enjoyed the match I saw.

Food for thought there, too, as there were only two crowds bigger than that in the Football League last Saturday.



FRUSTRATION ROVERS

Doncaster Rovers, who were promoted last season from Division Four, are currently trying out a new style of play away from their Belle Vue Ground. Rovers, now managed by former Leeds United and Scotland captain Billy Bremner, adopt a 4-5-1 formation on their travels. Bremner's aim is to pack the midfield with five players and leave lone striker Richard Dawson to forage up front. "The idea is for us to frustrate the home side as much as possible, although we still intend to be positive and try to push forward quickly down the wings," said Billy. So far this season, Bremner's "frustration-tactics" seem to be having reasonable success with two wins and two draws from five away matches.

EASTVILLE ROVERS

Terry Cooper, the former Leeds United and England full back, became the latest managerial casualty last week when he was sacked by struggling Bristol Rovers. Although Terry had been unable to produce a winning team at Fastville it is a sad fact that he was working on a shoestring budget and was unable to tempt the right sort of players that he wanted to the Bristol club. Archie Stephens, the 27-year-old striker that Cooper snapped up for next-to-nothing from Western League Melksham, was the only signing during the close season and, although Stephens has scored four times this season, Rovers have stayed in the bottom half of the talks. After 186 League appearances for us he moved to Southampton in February 1974 for a record fee. Whilst there he won an F.A. Cup Winners medal, scored in a League Cup Final and won representative honours for the Football League. Cost Swindon a record fee in March 1980.

Gary Williams (Defender). Born Nantwich. Cost a £40,000 fee to Blackpool in August. Began his career with Tranmere Rovers and later played for Dutch side Djurgaarden.

Ken Stroud (Defender). Born London. Also joined Swindon straight from school and signed professional forms in 1970. Missed the early part of last season through injury, but is now approaching 300 League appearances for the 'Robins'.

Russell Lewis (Defender). Born Blaengwynfi. After being spotted playing part time football in the Welsh League, he joined Swindon in September 1976. Last season he was voted 'Player of the Year' by the supporters for his tireless efforts in defence.

Mike Graham (Defender). Born Lancaster. Be-gan his career with Bolton Wanderers and made his debut for them in September 1978. Although his first team opportunities were limited he made 46 League appearances before moving to Swindon in July.



# WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Having read recently about the transfer of ex-Gills defender Gary Armstrong from Wimbledon to Gravesend, I was set thinking about the whereabouts of other former Priestfield favourites. Gary, recently a member of the Wimbledon side beaten 0-2 by the Gills, joins Damien Richardson and ex-youth team player Paul Harding at Stonebridge Road, where the manager is Dave Galvin, a resolute defender for us between 1969 and 1977. Up the road at Dartford there is Glenn Aitken - the last amateur player to represent the Gills in a league match - who was until recently a colleague of Frank Ovard at Maidsone. Others at Maidstone are central defenders John Hutton and Kenny Hill, both of whom contributed handsomely to their unfortunate FA cup success over us last last season. Just down Chatham hill, messrs Ribbins, Rogers, Harrison and Housden were joined in the close season by previous com-patriots in Dave Quirke and Alan "Arthur" Wilks, who had played alongside Graham "Bootsie" Knight at Canterbury towards the end of 1981-81.

At a slightly higher level, Southern League Folkestone include the much-travelled Pat Hilton, who, since leaving Gills in April 1977 has played for Aldershot, Southport and Dover amongst others. Still at Dover's Crabble Ground are Andy Keeley and Terry Jolley, though Steve Wheatley, an erstwhile Gills' reserve keeper, left the club last month. On the subject of goalkeepers, Phil Owers — who spent 1975-76 at Priestfield making 2 appearances — is now up north with Bishop Auckland.

Most of us know about ex-Gills players still in the Football League but there are a few surprises. Phil Parkes' goalkeeping understudy at West Ham, Tom McAllister, has played for Gills. McAllister, a Scot then with Blackpool, played for the Gills in the 3-1 challenge match victory over Chatham in February 1980. Another former Gills' keeper on the books of a league club was Derek Bellotti. Derek, who left Gills for Charlton some 11 years ago, played as reserve to Vince O'Keefe at Torquay last season, but after the end of the season fell out of favour when his ex-Priestfield team-mate Mike Green was sacked as manager.

Finally, one lesser-known player is George Clark, another Scot (well, there are a lot of us about!) who played as a midfielder in our reserve side during 1977-78. He is now resident in the Scottish Premier League with Patrick Thistle whom he joined 2 years ago from Ballock Juveniles. Since Terry Nicholl is off to play for Wichita Wings in the USA it certainly does show what a widely-travelled lot footballers are nowadays.
