### WELCOME TO SWINDON TOWN

Swindon are one of the clubs to have been affected by the change to three points for a win this season that they have at different times been in the promotion race and battling against relegation. At the time of writing it seems that they may still be in need of points today to ensure that they do not slip down to a first-ever experience of Division Four.

Founded in 1881 they were, like ourselves, members of the Southern League before securing election as founder-members of Division Three (South) in 1920. By this time they had already reached the semi-final of the F.A. Cup on two occasions, but their time in Division Three (South) was relatively uneventful, surviving three re-election applications and climbing to fourth place on three occasions.

Having been allocated to the new Division Three in the reorganisation of 1958 they won promotion to Division Two for the first time in 1963, were relegated in 1965 and then enjoyed their best season ever in 1968-9 when winning promotion again and also winning the F.L. Cup after a thrilling win in extra time against Arsenal at Wembley.

A year later they came within striking distance of Division One then finishing fifth in the Second Division and they also won the Anglo-Italian Cup for good measure. Since slipping back to Division Three, however, they have had mixed experiences. In 1974-5 they just missed promotion; in 1975-6 they just escaped relegation; in 1978-9 and 1979-80 they fell away after mounting promotion bids in the first half of the season and last season they just managed to stay up after drawing their last game at Brentford.

## SWINDON TOWN

### THIS SEASON

It seemed that they were on their way to another promotion bid when they won three and drew two of their first five league games. After that however they won only one more home game (against Carlisle) before the turn of the year and at this stage they were faring rather better away from home with impressive wins at Burnley and Bristol Rovers. Having landed in the relegation zone they have in the last month won three of the five home games and two out of five away games, their victims including promotion-seeking Watford ten days ago. Young striker **PAUL RIDEOUT** in his first full season got two goals against Oxford to follow up a hat-trick against Chester a few days earlier and he is likely to be key figure up front today alongside versatile **ROY CARTER**, who came from Hereford in 1977. **GARY EMMANUEL** (ex-Birmingham and Bristol Rovers) has done well in midfield in his first season with Swindon and is likely to be linking up today with **ROY GREENWOOD** (from Derby two years ago after spells with Hull and Sunderland) and **STEVE ABBLEY**, a young player in his second season.

Ex-Bolton man **MIKE GRAHAM** has been wearing a number 11 shirt recently playing a mainly defensive role. At the heart of the defence **RUSSELL LEWIS** (last season's Player of the Year) and long-serving **KENNY STROUD** are the men to look out for with **CHARLIE HENRY**, a young player in his second full season, and former Bristol City apprentice **KEVIN BADDELEY** on the flanks. Behind them **JIMMY ALLAN** has played well over 300 League games since his debut in 1971. Though not scoring so regularly this season **ANDY ROWLAND**, the former Bury striker who has been leading scorer in

the past two seasons may also come into the reckoning.

**ALLAN, Jim** (Goalkeeper) Born Inverness. Experienced goalkeeper who has been with Swindon since signing from Scottish junior football in 1970. He made his debut against Q.P.R. in September 1971 and has been the regular first team keeper for several seasons. Had made 272 league appearances at the end of last season.

**BADDELEY, Kevin** (Defender) Born Swindon. Young defender who served his apprenticeship with Bristol City and made his league debut for that club last season. He was unable to claim a regular first team place and moved to Swindon in the 1981 close season.

**CARTER, Roy** (Midfield) Born Torpoint. Played Western league football with Falmouth before joining Hereford United in the summer of 1975. He made 64 league appearances there and was a member of the Third Division Championship side in 1976. He signed for Swindon in December 1977 making his debut against Carlisle that month. He had made 147 league appearances for Swindon at the end of last season and when not required elsewhere plays in midfield. A genuine utility player he can play on either side in midfield and in all

back four positions. He had also made the occasional appearance at centre forward.

**EMMANUEL, Gary** (Midfield) Born Swansea. Began his career with Birmingham City making his league debut in January 1975 and playing in 61 first division matches before his transfer to Bristol Rovers in December 1978. He made a similar number of league appearances for Rovers and joined Swindon in July 1981.

**GRAHAM, Mike** (Defender) Born Lancaster. Began his career with Bolton Wanderers and played his first full league game in September 1978. His chances were limited at Bolton but he made about 30 league appearances mostly at full back before moving to Swindon in July 1981.

**HENRY, Charlie** (Defender) Born London. Joined the club from school as an apprentice signing full professional forms in February 1980. Although his first team debut was at centre forward in a league cup game at Lincoln City in September 1980 he is normally a defender and quickly settled into the right back position where his determined play made him popular with supporters. He made 31 league appearances last season.

**LEWIS, Russell** (Defender) Born Blaengwynfi. After being spotted playing part time football in the Welsh league, he signed for Swindon in September 1976



making his league debut against York City in April 1977. He had to spend several seasons as reserve centre-half but in August 1979 had the opportunity to play at full back which resulted in him holding down the right back position for the rest of that season. Last season he reverted to centre-half and was voted Player of the Year by the supporters for his tireless efforts in defence. He had made 89 league appearances at the end of last season.

**RIDEOUT, Paul** (Forward) Paul signed pro forms on 14 August last but appeared in the first team last season as an apprentice. He scored on his debut against Hull City in November 1980 and made 12 full league appearances last season. A former England Schoolboy International he scored a hat-trick against Scotland Schoolboys in May 1980.

**ROWLAND, Andy** (Forward) Born Derby. Andy was an apprentice with his home town club but his league debut came after a transfer to Bury in the summer of 1974. He was three times leading scorer and made 169 league appearances before his move to Swindon in September 1978. He made his debut for the club against Blackpool that month and has been a consistent goal scorer throughout the 114 league games that he had played for the club up to the end of last season.

**STROUD, Ken** (Defender) Born London. Served his apprenticeship with Swindon, signing professional forms in 1970 and is now the longest serving player with the club. He made his debut against Q.P.R. in September 1971 and had made 272 league appearances at the end of last season. Much of his early career was spent in midfield but he is now established as a central defender.

#### THE MANAGER

**JOHN TROLLOPE** Born at Wroughton near Swindon, he joined the club as an apprentice and made his debut in 1960 against Halifax Town. He played in the promotion winning teams of 1963 and 1969 and at one stage played in 368 consecutive first team games. The height of his playing career came when he played in the side that beat Arsenal in the 1969 League Cup Final. In March 1978 he made his 832nd first team appearance (727 in the league) and retired to become the club's youth manager. He was however, recalled to first team duty later that season and in the following season. It seemed that a game at Blackpool in May 1979 would be his last but another recall in September 1980 saw him make a new appearance record for a single club of 770 league games. If cup games are included he has played 878 matches for the club nearly all of them at full back.

The Manager's job became vacant in October 1980 and after considerable thought John decided to accept the position in November even though there was a real threat of relegation. He was awarded the MBE in 1978.

## STAR VISITOR PAUL RIDEOUT

If Swindon stay up at the end of the season and so avoid a first-ever spell in Division Four they will be considerably indebted to the goalscoring feats of 17-year old Paul Rideout during the last few vital weeks.

Paul, a native of Bournemouth, came to the fore as a schoolboy, being capped for England and scoring a hat-trick against Scotland Schoolboys in May 1980. He was signed on apprenticeship terms by Swindon and made his debut against Hull in November 1980, thereby sharing a distinction with manager John Trollope of having played for the Robins when only 16 years old.

He scored three more goals before the end of the season and on reaching the age of 17 signed professional during the close season. He came back into the team soon after the start of this season, netting in the 2-1 win over high-flying Carlisle in October and again in the 4-1 win at Bristol Rovers a week later.

He has scored regularly since then, netting again the return game at Carlisle when Swindon snatched a precious point and getting two in a game for the first time in the return game with Bristol Rovers. Then in the course of five games at the end of April and the beginning of May he scored a hat-trick against Chester and two goals in the 3-21 wwin over Oxford.

With 14 goals up to the time of writing he looks an outstanding prospect and could well be a key figure as Swindon climb back towards their triumphs of a decade ago.

# PORTSMOUTH v SWINDON TOWN

This afternoon we welcome Swindon to Fratton, and hope today's clash will live up to the standard set by some of our recent meetings. Our Football League associations with the Robins stretch back to 1920/21 in the Third Division South. That season saw Swindon take three points off of us, winning 5-2 at the County Ground, and drawing 1-1 at Fratton. Following our promotion to the Second Division in 1924, we did not meet again until August 1961, when Pompey commenced their Third Division programme with a fine 3-1 win at the County Ground. The return at Fratton ended 2-2. September 1964 saw Pompey thrash Swindon 5-0 at Fratton with all five goals coming in the first-half. That win ultimately proved to be crucial, as we avoided relegation to the Third Division by just one point... from Swindon! Since our relegation to Division Three in 1976, Swindon have enjoyed considerable success against Pompey, although that superiority was challenged last season as we completed a welcome double, winning 1-0 at Fratton and 2-0 away. The late seventies saw Pompey and Swindon paired together in the League Cup three seasons in succession. Each time Swindon won at the County Ground after drawing at Fratton. In October 1977, a tragic error five minutes from time, allowed David Moss to cancel out Mick Mellows' first-half opener. The replay saw Pompey fight bravely back after trailing 3-1, only to succumb 4-3. The following season a drab 0-0 draw at Fratton was followed by another splendid encounter at Swindon which saw the home side triumph 4-2, all the goals coming in the second-half. Our last Cup meeting was in August 1979, when two second-half goals by Carter and a Peter Mellor own-goal saw Swindon into the next round after a 1-1 draw at Fratton. We also met in 1966/67 (losing 4-1) and 1974/75 (winning 1-0) to complete a remarkable sequence of League Cup meetings.

Despite some fine matches between the teams recently, the most memorable must surely be a Third Round F. A. Cup tie at Fratton on January 5th, 1974. Swindon had already lost 3-1 at Fratton earlier in the season, and were in dire relegation trouble at the foot of the table. Pompey were comfortably placed in tenth position on the fringe of the promotion race.

Swindon raced into a fourth minute lead, when Tommy Jenkins sent a swerving shot past John Milkins that gently kissed the post on its way to the net. Swindon were clearly revelling in the time and space Pompey were allowing them and although Ron Davies equalised after 20 minutes, it was no surprise when they re-established their lead three minutes later. A cross from Dixon eluded Milkins, and Moss rose above Roberts at the far post to head home. Swindon continued to run the match, and their lowly position was further belief when Trollope flicked Butler's free-kick past Milkins on the stroke of half-time.

There was certainly more zest and purpose in Pompey's play as the second-half proceeded, but they rarely troubled a resolute Swindon back four. Mellows was unlucky to see a chip drift just wide, before Pompey finally pulled themselves back into the match. A cross-ball was flicked on by Davies, and Paul Went was on hand to crash a half-volley into the roof of the net, with just 12 minutes remaining. As the match went into injury time, a final, desperate surge was halted as Brian Lewis was sent sprawling over Butler's outstretched leg. Referee Daniels pointed at once to the spot, and amid all the mayhem Bobby Kellard calmly sent Allan the wrong way and earn a somewhat fortunate replay. To add insult to injury, it was Kellard who struck the only goal of the second match to send Pompey through to a Fourth round clash with Orient.

# POINT OF CONTROVERSY

*Aston Villa were not thrown out of the European Cup Final because of crowd trouble at their semi-final tie in Anderlecht, but the heavy fine and the demand that the next home European game be played behind closed doors.*

*Now why is such savage punishment inflicted? Presumably so that the club will not repeat its 'offences' in future. But what else could Villa have done then ensure that their supply of tickets were supplied to their own bona fide supporters only. The troublemakers obtained tickets from a different source and so weren't linked with Villa in any way. To punish the club will in fact encourage mindless morons in other parts of the country in the knowledge that a club will suffer for it any mischief they might get up to.*

Despite it all Villa have given a great boost to English football by reaching the final and played attractive football in so doing.*

## WHAT THE PAPERS SAY

### MILLWALL 1 PORTSMOUTH 0

**NEWS OF THE WORLD:** Bobby Shinton scored his third goal since returning to Millwall from Newcastle in March and that was enough to give the Lions a 1-0 win over Portsmouth at The Den. Millwall survived two early raids before Shinton chipped home from the edge of the area to secure Lions' 16th point from their last six games.

**THE NEWS:** Pompey's unbeaten run is over after seven matches – and yet, perversely, only those whose sole guideline to a performance is the result will be depressed. This was a far better team performance than some which have earned bonus money recently. Pompey played some neat and imaginative football and had their finishing been marginally sharper, they would have left The Den with some reward. For particularly in the second half as they chased the match which Millwall had collared in the first half through a piece of sharp thinking and finishing by veteran Bobby Shinton, Pompey carved out marvellous chances, but failed to take them, Bobby Campbell had surprised with his team selection by pushing Steve Berry forward and bringing Peter Ellis into midfield. But both moves worked well for young Berry looked the pick up front, while Ellis did a tremendous job in midfield both defensively and creatively.

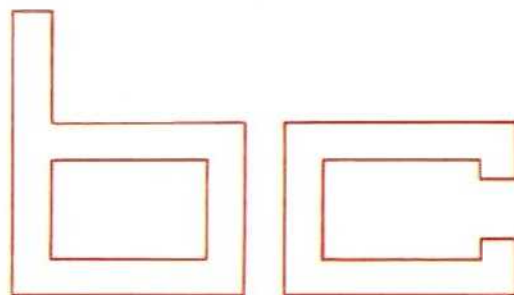

# THIRD DIMENSION

Last Saturday's fixtures saw the four promotion places in Division Four settled and we look forward to matches v. Sheffield United, Wigan, Bradford and Bournemouth next season. Also confirmed for next season was new opponents Orient who lost their Division two status by losing 2-0 at Norwich. As to who joins them, seven clubs are still involved in the relegation battle. However, matches played midweek after these notes were written could see Crystal Palace send Wrexham down and Leicester make Grimsby's position rest on their game today versus Cardiff. The promotion candidates from Division three had a very mixed day and the situation is certainly the most complicated of all four divisions. Leaders Carlisle got a very useful point at Reading. Kerry put Reading in the lead after a Neil Webb penalty had equalised a Tom Ritchie goal for Carlisle. But a 30 yard shot by Coughlin levelled it again. Lincoln maintained their challenge with a 2-1 win at relegated Chester whose caretaker Manager Cliff Sear said "The youngsters played their hearts out. But their heads were in the clouds after taking the lead and they allowed Lincoln to get back into the game". Doncaster boosted their hopes of survival and dealt Fulham's promotion chances a severe blow in a bruising battle in which seven players were booked. Fulham were knocked out of their stride by Doncaster's fiercely competitive approach. A first minute goal put Burnley on the road to a 2-1 win over Walsall to keep them in contention. Although Walsall also got a first minute goal in the second half Young scored the winner for Burnley just three minutes later. Gillingham maybe out of the promotion race but they are having a say in who goes up. Having beaten Fulham and Lincoln they jolted Oxford's chances by coming from behind to win 2-1. Gillingham's manager Keith Peacock said "We are certainly making sure no one gets the champagne out too early. We seem to play well against the promotion seeking sides". Southend boss Dave Smith admitted after the 1-1 draw at Exeter, "That result just about puts an end to our

promotion hopes. We did our best but on the day it wasn't good enough". Today's visitors Swindon were held to a 1-1 draw at home by fellow strugglers Newport. County's boss Colin Addison was furious about the two penalties awarded to Swindon. He fumed "The first was a clear case of obstruction, nothing more. The second was as good an instance of accidental hands I've ever seen". With Walsall having a fairly easy game today against Doncaster, the final relegation place could be decided at Somerton Park on Tuesday when Swindon and Newport meet again and possibly resolve who joins Chester, Bristol City and Wimbledon in Division four.

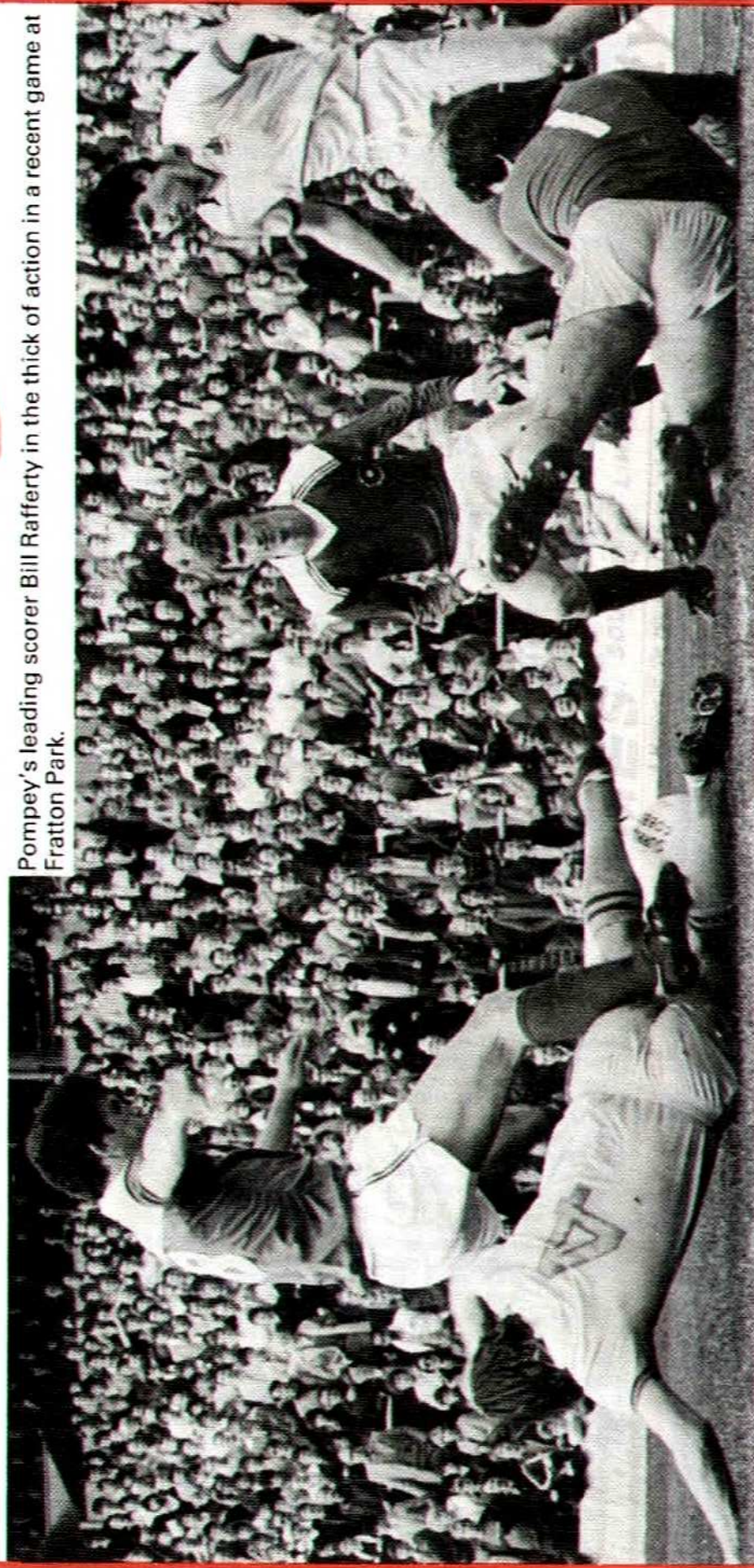

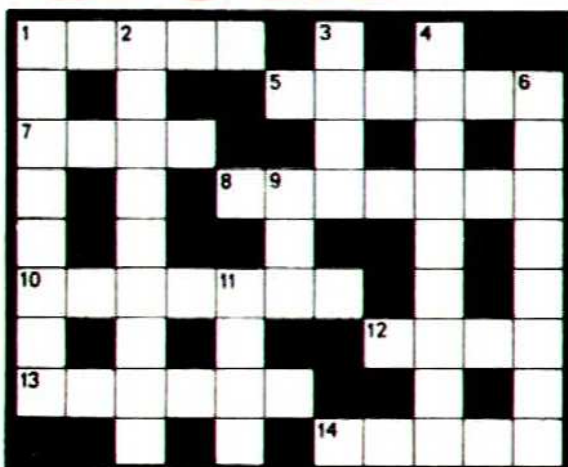

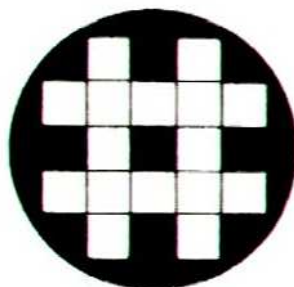
