THE wonderful win over Tottenham last week in the quarter-final of the Milk Cup at White Hart Lane must go down as one of the best results in Burnley Football Club's 100-year history. Now for Liverpool . . .

The players were understandably absolutely delighted on the long coach journey home

from London.

Their feelings were perhaps best summed up by skipper Martin Dobson. "It just goes to show what a crazy game football is," he said. "After the way results have gone in the League to go to Tottenham and win 4-1 takes some believing.

"The idea was to deny Spurs space and it worked a treat. In the second-half the way their defence opened up was amazing. With so much to play for this season we've got to remember that we have won the important battle but we haven't won the war.

The win was judged the best performance last week by a Fiat panel of experts - including Tottenham manager Keith Burkinshaw! It was a unanimous vote and the others on the panel were England manager Bobby Robson, Ron Atkinson (Manchester United), David

Pleat (Luton), Emlyn Hughes (Rotherham) and former Bournemouth manager David Webb.

Additionally, Billy Hamilton, scorer of two of the four Burnley goals, was named as player of the round by the Sun-Milk Cup panel. Billy receives a trophy, and £500 automatically goes to the club for help in the development of young players — plus another £500 to the charity of Billy's choice.

He decided to give that £500 to the fund for Gary Plane, the twoyear-old Burnley toddler who had to have both legs amputated after being blown under a lorry last week.

Said Billy: "It's the best result we have had all season. To win the Sun award as well made it really special for me. And I didn't have any hesitation in deciding where the money was going. Young Gary's story is so terribly sad and I'm glad to be able to help in some way."


It wasn't surprising that the Tottenham display and result hit the newspaper headlines

in a big way. Keith McNee wrote in the Evening Star: "Burnley stormed gloriously through to join Liverpool, Manchester United and Arsenal in the semifinals with a devastating second-half display after being a goal down and Tottenham - Ossie Ardiles, Glen Hoddle, Ricky Villa and all— could have no grumbles

about it whatever."
And Peter Higgs said in the Burnley Express: "Burnley pulled off their result of the century at White Hart Lane. Never in the field of football conflict in their 100-year history have they achieved a more unlikely or outrageous victory.

"What achievement from the Burnley archives can improve on the team 21st in the Second Division defeating the FA Cup holders?"



Andy Rowland

BORN in Derby, Andy joined his home town club as an apprentice but after graduating through the junior sides failed to win a first team place with County, at the time one of the front runners in Division One.

In the summer of 1974 he decided to try his luck in the lower divisions and moved north, signing for Bury, who had just won promotion to Division Three. He made his debut in the opening game—at Swindon!—and in the seasons which followed proved to be a consistent goal-scorer. He went on to make close on 200 appearances for the Gigg Lane side, scoring 58 goals, heading the scoring charts on three separate occasions.

His goal-scoring exploits attracted the attention of a number of clubs and he eventually signed for Swindon Town in September 1978. He proved a crowd pleaser at the County ground and, with Alan Mayes, made up a strikeforce which contributed 57 of the 104 goals scored in season 1979-80. A highlight of that season was the 6-2 victory over Rotherham with

Andy scoring four of the goals.

TODAY'S FA Cup clash with Swindon will remind many supporters of the remarkable League Cup semifinal in 1968-69 when, after winning here at Turf Moor, Swindon required a third game before emerging as finalists.

With the strong running Don Rogers always a danger they went on to win at Wembley, beating Arsenal 3-1. Left back in that successful side, current Swindon manager John Trollope M.B.E., went on to make 753 appearances with Town in a career which spanned 20 years.

Second in the Fourth Division table going into the Christmas fixtures, they could only muster three points over the holiday period and have since slipped into sixth place.

In the FA Cup, victory over non-League Wealdstone was followed by a 2-2 home draw with Brentford. They emerged victorious after extra time in the replay, but had no such problems in the last round beating Aldershot 7-0.

Currently leading the club's goalscoring charts is former Bury striker ANDY ROWLAND, who has formed a formidable



striking partnership with former England schoolboy No.9 PAUL RIDEOUT, still only 18, but with 50 appearances for Town and a "hat-trick" scorer last week against Rochdale.

Also one of the recognised front runners HOWARD PRITCHARD, an orthodox wingman, has a free role and operates down both flanks.

A player to have only

finished his apprenticeship last season PAUL BATTY has made good progress in the midfield position along-side LEIGH BARNARD, formerly with Portsmouth, and the experienced GARY EMMANUEL, formerly with Birmingham and Bristol Rovers.

RAY BAVERSTOCK is establishing himself in the back four at the expense of regular number two CHARLIE HENRY, who has been out of the side injured since December. On the opposite flank is former apprentice COLIN BAILIE.

In the centre of the defence RUSSELL LEWIS will partner former Bolton Wanderers player MIKE GRAHAM.

In goal JIM ALLAN has been with Town since signing from Scottish junior

football in 1970.




SINCE the formation of the Supporters' club approximately 15 months ago we have gone from strength to strength and now have no less than seven branches (including the Burnley Branch).





OUR two Milk Cup semifinal matches against Liverpool will be all ticket games, with a two-tier system of admission prices when the League champions visit Turf Moor on Tuesday, February 15.

We have put up prices to all parts of the ground, but season ticket holders will be able to buy tickets at normal League prices.

Prices for non-members are £5.00 for the Bob Lord stand, £4.00 for the Burnley Building Society stand, £2.50 for the ground covered terrace and £2.00 for the ground uncovered terrace.

But the prices for season ticket holders remain at £3.50 (Bob Lord Stand), £2.90 (Burnley Building Society Stand) and £1.70 for the covered and uncovered terraces.

Our financial director, Mr Derek Gill, says: "We hoped to give special consideration to two categories of supporters season ticket holders and regular fans.

"We are keeping complete faith with our season ticket holders and they will pay normal prices for league matches, including reductions for children and old age pensioners.

"But we have been unable to find any satisfactory way of differentiating between regular supporters and the casual visitors,

so all other prices have to be the same.

"We think the increases made for non-members are very reasonable, particularly in relation to what happens at other clubs."



Billy Hamilton

THE last twelve months have dramatically changed the life of Billy Hamilton.

He started it as a comparatively unknown Third Division centre-forward, who had gained occasional recognition through his appearances for Northern Ireland.

Even though he had scored a couple of widely-televised goals against Scotland the tall, upright striker was hardly a household

name.

But the events of the last year made him not only Burnley's best-known player but also a familiar figure on the world stages.

When a Barcelona newspaper picked out three superstars from the 1982 World Cup and named "Zico, Maradona and Hamilton" it caused a certain amount of surprise around these parts. But the statement gives an indication of the esteem he is now held in abroad.

At £38,000 25-year-old Billy's signing from Queens Park Rangers in November, 1979, must rank as one of the best transfer deals in the club's history. In the past 10 years it compares with the deals which brought Keith Newton to Turf Moor on a free transfer from Everton and Peter Noble from Swindon for £35,000.

Billy's performances last season, in addition to helping Burnley win the Third Division championship, also led to him being named the club's "Player of the

Year"

But those honours were merely a prelude to his summer success when he played a key role in the Irish triumph in Spain. He helped them beat the host country Spain in one of the shocks of the tournament on the way to the second stage and then scored in the 2-2 draw with Austria.

Billy and his Irish team-mates continued their remakable giant-killing sequence when they beat West Germany 1-0 in Belfast in the European Championship at the end of last year.

And the Burnley No. 9 was back in the headlines last week as he netted twice in the 4-1 Milk Cup quarter-final victory at

Spurs.

Inevitably Billy's form has brought the tributes flowing in. Clarets chief scout Gordon Clayton calls him "the most honest player I have ever worked with."

Carlisle boss Bob Stokoe recently described Billy as "the best centre-forward in the Second Division" and added: "If he had a better scoring record he would be one of the top forwards in British football. He has all the other assets."

Such compliments might encourage some individuals to gain inflated ideas about their own importance. But as anyone around Turf Moor will tell you Billy remains the same quiet, unassuming character he has always been.

If he now assumes an air of assured confidence when he takes on another TV interview it's simply because he's had plenty of practice. That's one of the

advantages of fame.

But — famous or not — Billy's attitude on the pitch won't change as he continues to spearhead Burnley's fight for cup success and Second Division survival.

He summed up his appraoch after the historic win at Spurs when he said: "The whole side worked tremendously hard and that was a key factor in our victory".




