



Welcome SWINDON TOWN

Swindon Town have slipped badly recently and their promotion hopes have receded. At Christmas they were 2nd in the table with the following record: P20, W12, D5, L3, Pts. 41, but since then in 14 fixtures they have won only 2 and drawn 3 and have lost their last 5 games. In 17 away matches they have won 4 (Chester, Hereford, Northampton, Stockport) and drawn 6. Former long serving player JOHN TROLLOPE was relieved of his duties as Manager earlier in the week and player/coach KEN BEAMISH has taken over as Caretaker Manager. Swindon are likely to include some of the following players this afternoon.

Scottish born goalkeeper JIM ALLAN is the Club's longest serving player having been signed from Scottish junior football in 1970. He made his league debut for Town in September 1971 and at the start of the present campaign had made 318 league appearances. KEVIN BADDELEY established himself in the first team last season. He served his apprenticeship with Bristol City and joined Town in July 1981. COLIN BAILIE is a promising young player who signed professional last season after completing his apprenticeship. GARY EMMANUEL joined the Club from Bristol Rovers in the summer of 1981. A hard working midfield player, he started his career with Birmingham City. RUSSELL LEWIS was signed from Welsh League football in 1976 and made his league debut at Bootham Crescent in April 1977. He won a regular first team place during the 1979/80 season. MIKE GRAHAM is in his 2nd season at The County Ground having been signed from Bolton Wanderers in the summer of 1981. HOWARD PRITCHARD also joined the Club during that summer and was formerly with Bristol City with whom he made a number of senior appearances. Young player PAUL BATTY completed his apprenticeship last term and made his league debut earlier this season. Former England Schoolboy's player PAUL RIDEOUT joined the Club as an apprentice in May 1980 and scored on his league debut as a 16 year old in November that year. He signed as a professional on his 17th birthday and is a highly rated forward with considerable potential. Leading scorer with 19 league and cup goals to date is ANDY ROWLAND who was signed from Bury in September 1978. A consistent goalscorer throughout his career in netting 58 goals in 4 seasons at Gigg Lane and has scored 68 league goals for Town. LEIGH BARNARD was signed from Portsmouth during the close season after several years with the South Coast club.

Original members of Division 3 in 1920 Swindon remained in that league until 1963 when they spent 2 seasons in Division 2. A further period in Division 2 followed (1969-74) but then after 8 seasons in Division 3 they were relegated last May for the first time to the 4th Division. They were winners of the Football League Cup in 1969 and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970. This is their first visit since April 1977 and only their 4th appearance at Bootham Crescent. SCRAPBOOK

City's Football League History — Part 20



Season 1955/6

After the exploits of 1954/5 there was an optimistic mood at the start of the campaign and after 10 matches City topped the league with 6 wins and 2 draws. Progress was halted, however by a bad sequence of results in October - 2 draws and 5 defeats in 7 matches - and the Club never really got back into the promotion hunt. Arthur Bottom again scored 31 league goals whilst during the season Billy Fenton completed 100 goals for the Club. Newcomers were Ron Mollatt and Clive Colbridge ex Leeds United, Jimmy Prescott ex Southport and Albert Hobson ex Blackpool. Average home league crowds were 10,250 the second highest in the Club's history.

The FA Cup again provided the major highlights. Swansea Town, then top of Division 2 and with 8 full Internationals, were beaten at The Vetch Field and then followed two magnificent tussles with mighty Sunderland. After an epic goalless draw at Bootham Crescent they narrowly went down in the replay and so for the 2nd successive season bowed out of the competition at Roker Park. In March 1956 Sam Bartram was appointed Manager. The former Charlton Athletic goalkeeper was a popular choice having guested for the Club during the war years. Sid Storey was not retained at the end of the season and moved on to 2nd Division Barnsley. In his 9 years at Bootham Crescent Sid made 329 league appearances and scored 39



YORK CITY FC PROFILE



Top Goalscorers: No. 2 — BILL FENTON

The second leading marksman in City's history is BILL FENTON, who scored 119 league goals from the outside left position in his 7 years with the Club 1951-8 and during this period he was one of the most prolific scoring wingers in the Football League. Born at Hartlepool in 1926 Bill played for Hordern Colliery Welfare before joining Blackburn Rovers in December 1948 and in 21/2 years at Ewood Park made 33 2nd Division appearances and scored 7 goals. He signed for City in May 1951 for a small fee and in his first season broke the Club's individual scoring record by netting 31 goals. He was a key member of the 1954/5 Semi-Final side and scored vital goals in the victories over Blackpool and Tottenham. His best scoring feat was when he netted 4 times in a 5-4 victory at Carlisle on 6th November 1954.

Bill moved to Scarborough after being released at the end of the 1957/8 season. A most popular player he will be remembered by City fans for his tremendous pace and thrilling runs down the wing coupled with his sharpness in front of goal. A part time player during his career he was a draughtsman by trade. It was a tremendous shock when Bill died suddenly in April 1973 at the tragically early age of 46. His name lives on, however, and "The Bill Fenton Memorial Trophy" is presented annually by his widow Margo to the Club's "Player of the Year".


