





SIMON GIBSON this 19 year-old defender was signed from Chelsea after first joining Swindon on loan.

KEVIN BADDELEY out of favour early in the season, the 21 year-old former Bristol City defender has regained his place in the team.

COLIN BAILLIE this young Irish lad was an apprentice at the club. Usually in the back four but has also figured in midfield.

NIGEL GRAY has been in and out of the team. Previously with Orient and had a loan spell with Charlton. Defender. PAUL BATTY signed full time after being an apprentice with the club.

CHRIS HENRY young defender, was an apprentice.

GARY EMMANUEL experienced midfield player who once cost Bristol Rovers £50,000 when they signed him from Birmingham.

GARY NELSON midfield player who signed on a free transfer from Southend United.

DAVID HOCKADAY this 26 year-old midfield player gave Blackpool good service before moving south to Swindon.

JIMMY QUINN cost Swindon £10,000 from Northern Premier side Oswestry Town. Scored a dozen goals this season.

ALAN MAYES back at Swindon who sold him to Chelsea for £200,000. The 30 year-old striker has scored 12 goals to date.

ANDY ROWLAND former England Youth International. The big striker has recently been playing in defence.

News & Views

Halifax Town's announcement that, after this season, they intend to cut their full time staff to six or seven players hardly comes as a surprise. Many of the breadline clubs are obviously having to take a hard and realistic look at the wages bill. And obviously the use of part-time and non-contract players is one way of achieving this objective.

Yet on the other side of the coin the idea has been tried before, and then discarded. Indeed Halifax were one of the first clubs to experiment along these lines but then abandoned the plan — presumably because they found it didn't work.

It also raises a question of what view would be taken by the league if a club staffed mainly by part-timers came up for re-election? Could it mean an opportunity for outside aspirants like Altrincham, Scarborough or Maidstone to secure a place in the league?

Of the Fourth Division registrations in the last three months 47 have been non-contract players, 20 have been on monthly terms, and there have been 26 loan transfers. During the same period transfers involving money total just eight. So here again is a clear indication of how clubs are tightening their belts. With almost all the signings being short term so that load shedding on wages

becomes an easy matter if finances become overstretched.

All of which in many ways adds up to the fact that it is going to become harder and harder for players to achieve real job security in a more and more competitive field. It also inevitably points to a further decrease in the number of full time professionals and an even higher struggle for young players to become established in the game.

Not so long ago a club could afford to run a reserve, and often a third team, and give young players a few seasons to develop and show their potential. Now quite a number of league sides operate on a small squad with no reserve team back-up. So not only is the intake of young players restricted, the length of time a club can give them to blossom is also severely curtailed.


It could be argued of course, that with the limitations on the number of players employed, clubs can be more selective and standards improved. But where is the evidence to prove this is happening?

Looking through all four divisions of the league there is certainly evidence of a levelling of performance. But whether the levelling is up or down is a matter of opinion.

Division IV News

Latest results have done little to sort out the section's front runners. For while leaders York City continue to extend their lead at the top, the eight clubs below them are still locked in an intriguing battle for the remaining promotion spots.

Colchester found both Doncaster and Crewe tough opposition, and two points out of a possible six on the face of it hardly looks promotion form. But on the other hand with both the opposing sides still in the hunt it meant the relative positions of the trio remained unaltered.

With Doncaster held at home on Saturday by Tranmere, Bristol City going down at Peterborough and Reading only getting a point at Swindon the results went well for the U's. At the same time however Peterborough's win hoists them back into the reckoning, while Aldershot continue to confound the critics. Sixteen goals in the last three games is impressive stuff.

Today's games provide Colchester with a real chance of gaining ground on their rivals. Bristol City entertain Aldershot, Reading are at home to York, while Blackpool will not find it easy at Chesterfield. Doncaster after that slip at home to Tranmere go to Halifax who need points to keep out of the bottom four. So a Saturday sort out is clearly on the cards.

The manager chopping season continued with Bury

sacking Jim Iley. He was their 16th manager in just over 30 years. Despite this turnover at the top the Gigg Lane side have never managed to recapture the Second Division spot they lost in 1968/69. Whoever succeeds to the Bury hot seat faces an uphill task. It appears the Bury board used part of the £100.000 fee paid by West Ham for Paul Hilton to pay off the remaining 18 months or so of Mr Iley's contract. This left little cash for new players and with no reserve or youth teams to fall back on there seems little scope for improving the present side.

Meantime, new signings continue to alter the playing scene. Peterborough appear to have done themselves a bit of good by taking 21 year-old winger Gary Worrell on loan from Manchester United. Wrexham have signed striker Jim Steel, and player the U's tried to get, from Port Vale. While loan signings have seen keeper lan Andrews join Swindon from Leicester, Paul Butler go from Wolves to Hereford, John Hendrix from Coventry to Hereford, and Peter Frain move from West Bromwich to Mansfield.

Finally Chester have extended the loan spells of Ronald Hildersley and Paul Sanderson from Manchester City and signed Andy Wharton and Lee Dixon from Burnley. Wharton of course, had been on loan at Torquay but could not agree terms on a final transfer.


Last Monday week saw us once again at New Writtle Street, where we played Chelmsford City in our last game in the Courage Floodlight Competition.



LOSERS CAN STILL WIN

"I don't care if we are three goals down with only five minutes to go, we've still got to go for goals.

That is a rough translation of what every manager's instructions to his team must have been when The Football League's Associate Members' Cup competition got under way this week.

Because, in the Associate Members' Cup, it is possible to lose a match and still eventually win. Thanks to yet another Football League innovation, four of the sixteen places in the area quarter-finals are reserved for the losing teams which have scored most goals in the first two rounds.

"It should certainly add to the entertainment value", says Graham Kelly, Secretary of The Football League. "It is going to be much better to lose 5-4 than 2-1 in the early rounds. There is little long-term future in a team trying to sit on a lead, and I am hoping that the experiment will give fans a feast of attacking football. I see no reason why not."

Another semi-innovation is the use of two substitutes instead of the statutory one in Canon League and Milk Cup games. "That, too", says Graham Kelly, "can give the managers more attacking options."

All 48 Third and Fourth Division

clubs are playing in the competition which is divided into north and south sections. The winner of each section will meet in the final.

The competition will be played on a straightforward knock-out principle. There will be no replays. When the scores are level after 90 minutes, a tie will be decided by 30 minutes of extratime and then, if necessary, a penalty competition.

The first round, played last Tuesday, with one exception, consisted of 24 matches. The second round, during the week of March 12, comprises 12 matches.


The second round winners will be joined in the quarter-finals by the two highest scorers in the north and south sections. The ties will be played during the week of March 19.

The area semi-finals will be played during the week of April 9 and the area finals during the week of May 14. The venue and date of the final will be decided during the later stages of the competition.

Note: If there is a tie between the highest scoring losers, clubs will be determined by:

- a) Goals difference;
- b) highest score in any one match;
- c) least number of goals conceded;
- d) ballot.

Flashback

Twenty years ago this weekend, Colchester were reported to the League. The match at Layer Road was a Third Division encounter with Bristol City. On a snowbound ground the U's lost by the odd goal in five and referee Mr R.A. Paine was bombarded with snowballs and cushions after making some very odd decisions.

The City goals were scored by England International John Atyeo who appeared to guide the ball in with his hand. Clark got their second goal, and a hotly disputed penalty put in by Tony Ford gave them the winner. Billy Stark, who had been dropped by Neil Franklin for the two previous games against Exeter City and Oldham Athletic, returned to the side and got both Colchester's goals.

Atyeo won the penalty for City with a dive that fooled no-one apart from the referee. Duncan Forbes always maintained that Atyeo fell over his own feet, and no U's player touched him. After that the referee who had earlier disallowed Colchester what looked like a good goal came in for a lot of stick. He came off under police escort to a volley of snowballs and cushions and duly reported the matter to the league.


The U's team that day was Ames, Fowler, Forbes, Loughton, Trevis, Docherty, Jones, Grice, Stark, Langley and Aitchison.

Percy Ames played in the next game against Queens Park Rangers, but the Bristol City game was his swansong at Layer Road. After 397 league appearances he gave way to big South African keeper, Sandy Kennon, signed from Norwich City. It was also John Fowler's last league appearance at Layer Road that season. He was dropped by Franklin and in the next game against Q.P.R., Brian Hall signed from Mansfield Town made his debut.

Billy Stark figured in the next home match with Watford. After being dropped he had asked to go on the transfer list and later in the season moved to Luton Town. In 95 league games for the U's he scored 32 goals. So in the space of two weeks three well known figures faded from the Layer Road scene.

All in all this was a season of change for United and after three campaigns in Division Three they were relegated along with Luton Town, Port Vale and Barnsley. Cup matches too, brought little joy, Torquay United beating them in both the League Cup and the F.A. Cup.

Apart from Stark and Ames, Ritchie Griffiths left the staff to join the police. John Docherty, who joined the club from Hearts of Midlothian, returned to his native Scotland. Martyn King had departed to Wrexham, and Bobby Hill left at the end of the season. A youngster named Tommy McColl scored perhaps the best goal I have ever seen against Mansfield. But he was a bit of a wild lad so when Tommy Docherty came along with an offer to take hime to Chelsea the club let him go. perhaps just as well, because even the "Doe" failed to tame him.





Today's Visitors

Today's visitors Swindon Town were founded by a vicar the Rev. W. PITT in 1881, and were one of the original members of the South-ern League in 1894.

As a Southern League club they reached the F.A. Cup semi-final in 1910. After winning the Southern League championship twice they were founder members of the League Division Three Southern Section. They remained in the Southern Section until 1958, when along with Colchester they earned a place in the reformed Third Division. Won promotion to Division Two twice, but were finally relegated to Division Four in the 1981/82 season.

Won the Football League Cup in


1968/69 while in the Third Division beating Arsenal 3—1 in the final — and won promotion to the Second Division to complete a marvellous season.

John Trollope, still serving the club, played a record 770 league games for them between 1960 & 1980.

The U's and Swindon have met three times in the Fourth Division.

Last season the U's won 1—0 at Layer Road a Micky Cook special being the only goal of the game.

At Swindon the home team won 3—0 in 1982/83. This season back in October though Tony Adcock converted a penalty to give the U's the lead, Rowlands and Hockaday scoring for Swindon.

View From The Terrace

Football fans in general are inclined to be fickle folk. Every team has its hard core of supporters who in good or bad times will turn out and take the rough with the smooth to urge on their favourites. Unfortunately that hard core seems to dwindle as the seasons go by and the problem becomes one of attracting in new customers.

Even the most demanding fan would admit that in the main this season the U's have provided good viewing at Layer Raod. And while everyone could pick a team that differs from the one that takes the field there is a generally united view among terrace fans that manager Cyril Lea has done a good job on limited resources.

But the fact remains that attendances continue to be disappointing, especially with a side that is handily placed for a move upstairs. The first home game against Bristol City back in September attracted just over 2,000 spectators. The recent Tuesday night game against a top side like Doncaster Rovers just about 800 more. A move in the right direction certainly, but hardly the sort of a reward for a team that has done well.

The Friday night match advocates see the present gates as justification for their pre-season opinion that the switch to Saturday afternoons would do nothing to attract more support. But it does seem whenever the

games are played somewhere round the 2,500 mark is the turnstile turnout that the club can depend on. One or two voices take the view that Sunday games should be given a trial. But surely this would raise a multitude of problems and local residents would almost certainly be opposed to any such plan.

But to turn to more cheerful topics. The manager looks like having the last laugh on the critics who were getting on the back of Perry Groves. The boss kept faith with the lad when he was certainly not one of the crowds favourite sons. During the last few games however terrace views have changed. Against Chesterfield and in the Doncaster match the lad — and folks forget he is still a teenager —has shown that Mr Lea's perserverence will pay dividends. Certainly his speed has never been in question and now that is being harnessed to ability to adapt to the teamwork as well.

It was pleasing to see the directors also giving recognition to the splendid service Micky Cook has given to the club. There has never been a more popular player with the terracites and to see Mrs Cadman; the chairman's wife, making that pre-match presentation to Micky was a heart warming sight. As Jim Smith when manager once said: "Give me 11 players like Cookie and I'd fear no-one."
