

From the desk of Ken Beamish




Today we welcome the players, officials and supporters of Tranmere Rovers to the County Ground with a special greeting to a friend of myself and of Swindon Town, Brian Hamilton.

Since our last home game we have had quite a busy time with away games at both Oxford and Colchester. The after game press statements concerning the game versus Oxford United tended to undermine the excellent result for, not only was it important on a financial basis to get through to the next round of the Associate Members Cup but also the local pride gained by players and supporters alike when a victory is achieved against a neighbouring club is equally important and I am sure that the result at the Manor Ground raised a few eyebrows, considering Oxford's feats in cup competitions this season.

It was great to see our two main strikers getting back on the score sheet with three really well taken goals and we hope for more of this this afternoon.

The result at Oxford was a marvellous confidence booster and we were in a determined frame of mind to carry this forward into our League match at Colchester. And so it turned out to be with a first half performance equal to anything played at Oxford and it would have been no more than we deserved had we gone in at half time with a one or two goal lead but, as so often happens when the team is playing well and creating pressure, the last thing they want is to hear the half time whistle. The second half proved to be a different story as one would expect playing away from home. Colchester began to press forward but, although there was nothing constructive in their play, the fact that they played long high balls into our penalty area in itself created half chances for them. Sitting on the trainers bench I felt quite confident of their score sheet remaining blank but I must admit that the final ten minutes were a little hair raising. However, it was a very encouraging result and if in these next two home games we can achieve maximum rewards our League table position will become more respectable.

Thank you for your support this afternoon and please give the team every encouragement throughout the ninety minutes.



Since I last wrote my programme article, we have played three games, all exciting in their own way Firstly the one each draw at home against Reading, a game which had its faults but must be considered exciting, the magnificent win away at Oxford, when we beat United by three goals to one in the new Associate Members' Cup and the excellent no score draw at Colchester last Saturday. I believe that to be the only occasion this season when Colchester have been unable to score in a League match at home and this must be a credit to a defence weakened by the absence of our regular centre half through suspension.

The win at Oxford United was particularly gratifying as we were uncertain how the new cup competition was going to be received by the supporters. As it was, more than four thousand people watched the game, very many of them being our own supporters and we are very grateful to them for making the journey and giving their encouragement to the team. Make no mistake, such encouragement is vital to any success, no team ever wins anything without helpful support so please, keep it up.

CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

The next game in this competition is on Tuesday, 13th March when we meet Walsall here at the County Ground. Walsall have had an excellent season, both in the League and in the Cup, and this game has all the makings of a thrilling encounter.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of the Supporters Cooperative for the donation they made to the club on the 18th February last. The cheque was for the sum of £1,127.00, intended for the furtherance of the club's youth policy. We are very appreciative of the Cooperative's efforts on our behalf and are well aware of all the work the committee undertake in their fund raising schemes, bearing in mind that this work is done in their valuable free time and without any recompense.

Today we welcome Tranmere Rovers to the County Ground. Earlier this season we lost to Tranmere at Prenton Park by two goals to one, Alan Mayes scoring our goal. In last season's game here at Swindon we won by four goals to two, our goal scorers being Rideout (2), Rowland and Barnard and I hope that this afternoon's result will be equally conclusive in our favour.

Tranmere have not had an easy time in recent years, endeavouring to obtain success in the shadow of the soccer giants, Liverpool and Everton and the very fact that they exist today is no mean achievement, under those circumstances. Their Team Manager is of course Brian Hamilton who we all know and respect from his time here at Swindon and we offer him a special welcome here this afternoon.

We thank you all for your continued support this afternoon and as ever I would ask you to get behind the team and cheer them to victory.



The Associate Members' Cup Competition took off last week and for us, far more successfully than we had anticipated for not only did the team beat the season's gian killers, Oxford United, on their own ground but almost four and a half thousand people turned up to see them do it. But, as always when a new competition is born, the 'knockers' are given another opportunity to criticize. The Chairman of the Professional Footballers Association was the latest to have a go. Gordon Taylor was supposedly reported to have called it, according to one daily newspaper, 'the competition that nobody wants'. If, in fact he does think this, who is he talking for. We at Swindon certainly wanted it as did the majority of the Third and Fourth Division Clubs who voted for the competition - had they not done so it would not have existed. Perhaps Gordon was once again listening to the successful people in the game such as Jim Smith, the Manager of Oxford United who has just experienced very lucrative cup runs and has a millionaire Chairman, Jim decried the competition but I wonder if he would have done so if Oxford were in the financial position they found themselves in three years ago.

I well remember reporters and clubs decrying the Football League Cup, Liverpool being one of the leading critics, calling it the Micky Mouse Cup. I wager there are no derogatory references to the Milk Cup in March when they run out on to the pitch at Wembley Stadium.

The Football League have just announced the prize money for the Associate Members' Cup, £5000 for the winners, £2000 for the runner-up and £1000 each for the losing area finalists, North and South.





of mass media exposure as one of the first League clubs to be under the threat of extinction. Television cameras were soon in evidence to record the near collapse of the Birmingham Club, but instead they were to witness the resurgence of a Club dwarfed by their Merseyside neighbours Liverpool and Everton. That they are still in existence is in no small way due to the loyal band of fans who attended meetings held in the main grandstand and donated ready cash to a 'Save our Club' appeal. Managed by our former player Bryan Hamilton, who in his stay at the County Ground made twenty six First team appearances. The former Northern Ireland International who made 50 appearances for his country spanning a career spent with Ipswich, Everton, Millwall and Swindon before his appointment as Rovers manager in October 1980 has worked skilfully and frugally to improve his Club's prospects.

Today's visitors Tranmere Rovers were the subject

Working on a stringent budget which includes a mixture of the full time and part time professional, Bryan Hamilton has built a team with the tag of hard to beat, in fact they arrive at the County Ground today having been undefeated in their last five away matches including meritous draws at top clubs Doncaster and York.

To replace Scott Endersby, now a firm favourite at the County Ground, Tranmere signed the veteran Welsh international goalkeeper Dai Davies from Swansea City. Dai has fifty two caps to his credit, thirty five years old he began his career with Swansea making eleven first team appearances before his £15,000 transfer to Everton. At Goodison Park he made ninety three appearances, before moving to Wrexham in a £50,000 transfer deal, it was here he made the most appearances for any of his league clubs, one hundred and sixty four in total. When John Toshack was seeking an experienced goalkeeper to add to his Swansea squad he bought Dai from Wrexham for a fee of £35,000.

The players appearing in front of Dai are the experienced John McMahon, a 33 year old free transfer signing from Third Division Wigan Athletic. Spending most of his career with Preston North End he made 256 league appearances for the Deepdale Club, also being released for loan periods with Southend, and Chesterfield for brief periods, before being given a free transfer to Crewe, where he made 70 first team appearances.

Dave Burgess this season passed the century mark in league appearances for Tranmere, his only club. Last season he was the only Tranmere player to make the maximum of 46 league appearances, in fact Dave achieved exactly the same distinction the previous season, laying sole claim to the left back spot.

Centre back Dave Philpott is in his second spell with the Rovers, a former Coventry City apprentice making three appearances for the Highfield Road Club, before moving to ex league club Southport on loan for eight league matches. He first signed for Tranmere in 1974, going onto appear in 174 league matches before leaving Prenton Park in 1977. After a spell in America he is now back with Rovers.

Steve Mungall, a Scot, signed on a free transfer from Motherwell, has appeared in Rovers defence on over 140 occasions.

Versatile Les Parry is a veteran of over two hundred and fifty matches for Rovers in league football. With a small staff many of whom have been part time professionals, it is with great pride that Rovers visit the County Ground today with the best defensive record away from home, in fact they have conceded only fourteen goals.

Former Town player Gary Williams, who operates either at full back or in midfield, is Tranmere's second highest joint scorer. On his move from the County Ground last season Gary made 13 appearances for Rovers, this season he has been almost a regular, originally a non-contract player with Tranmere, Gary moved to Djugarden, he returned to league football with Blackpool, playing 36 games for the seasider's before his £40,000 transfer to us, after 41 matches he returned North.

John Williams at 6' 2" is one of Rovers tallest players, a one club man, he had made over 120 first team appearances before this season, but has had to take a back seat on occasions this term, with the competition keen for defensive duties. Midfield duties have been shared between Bobby Hutchinson a Scot who had played 196 matches in Scottish Football for Montrose, Dundee and Hibernian, before moving South to Wigan where after 35 matches he moved to Prenton Park, and Mark Palios another player in his second spell with Tranmere, originally making over 200 appearances at Prenton Park he then moved on a free transfer to Crewe, with over a hundred appearances he then moved back to Tranmere last year for a second spell, Mark is Birkenhead born.

Liverpool born Mark Ferguson is another midfield player, a one club man Mark has now played over fifty matches for the club. Neville Powell is a Welsh Youth International hailing from Flint, like Mark he has now made over fifty appearances for the Rovers, after a mid season recall.

Leading scorer is John Aspinall who has only appeared in the league for Tranmere. He has eleven goals to his name this season. Fellow striker Mark Hilditch was given a free transfer by Rochdale last season after 205 appearances scoring 44 goals, he has scored five goals so far this season.

Barry Wellings, former York City player where he scored 9 goals from 47 matches, was signed also from Rochdale where he had scored 33 goals in 112 matches for Dale.

Former England schoolboy International Ron Goodlass was originally with Everton making thirty five First Division appearances at Goodison Park, before moving to Holland with Den Haag. He returned to Fulham in 1980 for a 22 match appearance, now 31 Ron is now back with a Liverpool club, much to his liking.

Veteran Ray Mathias who has made over 600 appearances in Rovers colours has made an occasional appearance, is now Club Coach, this is his 21st season at Prenton Park.

When Bury dismissed Jim Iley as manager he became the fifth manager to leave his post this season. With only one win in the last nine league matches prior to his dismissal, the Bury directors thought a change would pay dividends and have appointed Wilf McGuiness, former Manchester United manager and Iley's assistant, on a caretaker basis.

Bury only missed promotion last season by two points, but have failed to sustain a challenge this season.

Three of our former players have signed for new clubs in recent weeks. Peter Osborne released earlier this season is now with Oxford United, while John Bond who made several appearances for our Reserve Team before moving to a spell of Australian Football has returned and signed for Western League Club Bristol Manor Farm. Mark Stevens is now playing for local Bristol Club Avon St. Phillips who play in the Gloucestershire County League and are coached by former Bristol City assistant manager Ken Wimshurst.

Alan Slough, former Torquay United coach who left the Club when Bruce Rioch resigned as manager, is making a playing comeback with Alliance League Club Weymouth on a match to match basis. Transfer moves . . . Paul Derrick has moved from Shepton Mallet, the Western League Club to Bristol City. He is the 20 year old son of former Ashton Gate favourite Jantzen a player who made over 300 appearances for City in the 1960's Hereford United have signed 18 year old Alan Riches from West Midland Club Westfields who had been interesting Stoke City . . Peterborough have signed Gary Worrall on loan from Manchester United for a month Russell Musker Bristol City midfield player has finally signed for Third Division Gillingham after spending a three month loan period with the Kent Club our on loan signing Ian Andrews from Leicester City is to stay for a further month . John Dungworth Mansfield striker has joined Third Division Rotherham United on loan Lee Dixon has moved from Burnley to Chester for a small fee . . Kevin Hitchcock is on loan to Mansfield from Notts Forest . . . Eugene Martinzen has moved from Newport to Northampton on loan . . the transfer deadline is on March 24th.

In the new Associate Members Cup we seem to be fated to encounter this seasons success teams of the Third Division and Cup giant killers, first Oxford United where we ably dealt a blow to local pride, and now Walsall.

Club discipline with a difference is now in operation with bottom club Chester since John McGrath took over as manager! When two of his younger players were booked for dissent in a recent match, he gave Peter Bulmer and Ron Hilldersley a scrubbing brush each and ordered them to scrub the dressing room floor stating 'with their take home pay no more than £30 a week it would be pointless and unfair to fine them'. Small consolation for the two players was that whilst they were scrubbing a face appeared at the window! It was John McGrath who had fined himself for being late for the team coach at an away

match and was busy cleaning the windows!

Torquay United have decided to play two matches in 24 hours! They travel to Hartlepool on Saturday March 17th and on their return South they will stop off at Chesterfield to play a re-arranged league match on the Sunday, it will not affect Chesterfield quite so much they are away to Stockport on the Friday for an evening kick off.

Although not for the first time when we played our recent first ever Associated Members 1st Round Cup Tie at Oxford the unique situation of brothers on opposing sides occurred when Stuart Gibson came on as a second half substitute for United to face his brother Simon who has proved a fine acquisition for us this season. Stuart who has yet to make a league debut was a former Birmingham City apprentice, his soccer has been confined to the Football Combination where he has made sixteen appearances for United's Reserve Team this season. Slightly older than Simon at 20, he no doubt wishes to emulate his younger brother and appear at League level, to keep up the family tradition for their father Alex, who was a centre half like Simon, played 344 full league games for Notts County, with 3 substitute appearances scoring 10 goals in a league career spanning nineteen years from 1949-68. A Scot born in Kilconnel, and signed from Auchinlech Town, this gave Simon the family background to appear for Scotland at Youth Team level despite being born in England.

We are one of nine survivors in our Division to enter the second round of this season's new Cup competition. Three clubs still retain unbeaten home records, Doncaster, Reading and Colchester, while Chester are the only club without an away win this season.



