

SWINDON TOWN

Although Swindon Town appear to have missed the promotion boat this season they have proved a difficult team to beat in recent weeks. Since the start of the New Year they have lost just 2 of their 13 league fixtures winning 4 and drawing 7 and they have progressed to the quarter finals of the Associate Members Cup knocking out leading 3rd Division Clubs Oxford United and Walsall. Going back to mid October they have only lost 3 of 11 away league matches and have drawn at such strongholds as Blackpool, Colchester, Peterborough and Reading. Their 3 away league wins have been at Chester, Hartlepool and Stockport. In the Milk Cup they fell to Plymouth Argyle at the first hurdle but in the F. A. Cup they reached the 4th Round. They won 7 - 0 at Kettering in the 1st Round and then knocked out 3rd Division Millwall and 2nd Division Carlisle United before losing at home to Blackburn Rovers. **KEN BEAMISH** was appointed Manager in April 1983 after a short period as Caretaker Manager. His first match in charge of Town in that latter capacity was incidentally at Bootham Crescent in the corresponding game here last season exactly one year ago. He was formerly the Club's player coach and during his playing career was with Tranmere, Brighton, Blackburn, Port Vale and Bury and was a prolific scorer. His team for today's game will likely include players from the following squad:

Close season signing from Tranmere Rovers **SCOTT ENDERSBY** took over in goal early in the campaign from long serving keeper **JIM ALLAN** who had the misfortune to break an arm. Jim is Town's longest serving player making his debut back in 1971/2. **CHARLIE HENRY** is a former apprentice who made his senior debut in 1980/1. Another former apprentice is **COLIN BAILIE** who established himself in the first team last season. He scored one of Town's goals in their 3 - 2 victory over us at The County Ground in October. **KEVIN BADDELEY** was signed from Bristol City in July 1981. **MIKE GRAHAM** is also in his 3rd season with Town and was formerly with Bolton Wanderers. Tall central defender **NIGEL GRAY** joined the Club from Orient last summer. He made over 200 senior appearances with the Londoners. **SIMON GIBSON** was signed from Chelsea in November after a period on loan. Swindon's 2 other goals against us earlier in the season were scored by midfield players **GARY EMMANUEL** and **LEIGH BARNARD**. Gary started his career with Birmingham City and was transferred to Town from Bristol Rovers in 1981 whilst Leigh was signed from Portsmouth 2 years ago after several seasons at Fratton Park. Other midfield players are former apprentice **PAUL BATTY**, who made his league debut in 1982/3, and experienced campaigner **PAUL RICHARDSON** who joined the Club as Player Coach during the close season. Paul made his league debut in May 1968 for Nottingham Forest and has also played with Chester, Stoke and Sheffield United. He was a team mate of Denis Smith in Stoke's promotion winning side of 1978/9. Up front Swindon have 3 new faces this season - **DAVE HOCKADAY**, **GARY NELSON** and **ALAN MAYES**. Dave, formerly with Blackpool, scored the goal in Town's 1 - 0 victory over Crewe last Sunday. Gary was previously with Southend whilst Alan is in his second spell with the Club having also been on the books of Q. P. R., Watford and Chelsea. Whilst with Watford he scored a hat-trick at Bootham Crescent in a 4th Division match in 1977/8. Also in Watford's side that day (they won 4 - 0) was Brian Pollard. Irishman **JIMMY QUINN** was signed from non-league football in December 1981 whilst consistent goal scorer **ANDY ROWLAND** joined Town from Bury in September 1978.

Founded in 1881 Swindon were original members of Division 3 in 1920 and remained in that league until 1963 when they were promoted to Division 2. Relegated 2 years later they went on to spend a further period in the 2nd Division (1969-74). Then followed 8 seasons in Division 3 before they were relegated for the first time to the 4th Division in May 1982 and last term they finished one place below us in 8th position. They won the Football League Cup in 1969 and The Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970. They have appeared in 2 F. A. Cup Semi-Finals 1910 and 1912. We have never met in Cup football and today's match is the 10th league game between our Clubs.

Last season's corresponding game (26 March 1983) ended in a goal-less draw and halted not only our run of 13 successive league and cup wins at Bootham Crescent but also a record breaking sequence of 30 consecutive matches in which we had scored at home.



City's Football League History

Part 47

SEASON 1982/3

1982 marked the diamond jubilee of the founding of the Club and also the 50th anniversary of the move from Fulfordgate to Bootham Crescent. Under the new management team of Denis Smith and Viv Busby City experienced their best season by far since the return to Division 4 in 1977. They finished just 4 points short of a promotion place and this was chiefly due to indifferent away form especially in the first half of the season. At home they were well nigh invincible and had one sequence of 13 successive league and cup victories at Bootham Crescent scoring 47 goals in the process. In total City netted 100 goals - 88 league and 12 cup. The previous campaign City had conceded more goals - 91 - than any other league Club and for this season they paraded a completely new defence. Roger Jones former goalkeeper with Bournemouth, Blackburn, Newcastle and Derby became the new Club captain. The other newcomers were full backs Chris Evans (ex Stoke City) and Alan Hay (ex Bristol City) whilst Ricky Sbragia, formerly with Walsall and Blackpool, teamed up with Denis Smith in the centre of the defence. John MacPhail was signed late in the season from Sheffield United. Keith Walwyn again topped the 20 goal mark and 'Player of the Year' was Derek Hood. Average league attendances rose to 3,243 the highest since the 2nd Division days of 1975/6. During the season goalkeeper Eddie Blackburn moved to Hartlepool United whilst Mick Laverick left for non-league football. In May former player and physiotherapist John Simpson had a testimonial match against Leeds United, prior to retiring.
