I'm really confident that once this season is finished we'll be making serious plans to make sure that by the new kick-off time, Wrexham's loyal and patient fans again will have something to shout about.



SWINDON

Swindon manager Ken Beamish is as baffled as his fans as to why the team has not enjoyed a more successful season.

Things seem to have fallen apart since Christmas. How can you explain a side that beat Carlisle Utd. 3–1 in the F.A. Cup ending United's 16 game without defeat in the Second Division – then losing at home to Chesterfield the following Saturday!

Mr. Beamish, the former prolific marksman with his home town club Tranmere Rovers, Brighton, Blackburn, Port Vale and Bury took over from 'Mr. Swindon' John Trollope (now youth coach) in April last year.

Injuries have forced big Andy Rowland to play a more defensive role this season and the club suffered a blow last week when the former Bury striker was carried off during a minor cup tie with an ankle injury that will force him out for the rest of the season.

Jim Quinn 13 goals and Alan Mayes 12 (six penalties) lead the marksmens list.

Away from home this season Swindon have lost 11 games, drawn six and won three.

SCOTT ENDERSBY (Goalkeeper) Born Lewisham. Former Ipswich apprentice who moved to Tranmere Rovers for whom he made his league debut against Hereford United in September 1981. Spent two seasons between the posts for Tranmere before joining Swindon in May 1983.

CHARLIE HENRY (Defender) Born Acton. Former apprentice who signed professional in February 1980 and made his league debut as substitute at Reading in September of that year. Most of his 93 league appearances to the end of last season have been at right full back, but he can also play in the centre of the defence. COLIN BAILIE (Defender)

Born Belfast. A former apprentice he made his league debut at Oxford United in April 1982 and established himself in the first team last season with assured displays in both full back positions. Had made 27 League appearances to the end of last season.

KEVIN BADDELEY (Defender)
Born Swindon, Served his apprenticeship with Bristol City and made his league debut against West Ham Utd. in August 1980. That was his only appearance for City but he established himself in Swindon's First Team shortly after his transfer in July 1981. Had made 65 league appearances to the end of last season and likes to overlap when he can. Can play in either full back position but usually on the left.

PAUL BATTY (Midfield)

Born Edlington. Paul served his apprenticeship at Swindon and made his league debut against Crewe Alexandra in September



Born Worsley. Served his apprenticeship with Portsmouth and after making his league debut against Exeter City in September

1977 went on to make 79 league appearances for Pompey. He also played 4 matches on loan to Peterborough but moved to Swindon in June 1982. Was ever present last season and is seen to best advantage on the left of midfield.

GARY EMMANUEL (Midfield) Born Swansea. Gary began with Birmingham City making his

Birmingham City making his debut at Stoke City in January 1975. He played 71 First Division games for the Blues, moved to Bristol Rovers in December 1978 and added 65 league appearances there before his transfer to Swindon in the 1981 close season. A hard working player who was held back by injury last season but had made 69 league appearances for the club by its end.

GARY NELSON (Forward)

Born Braintree. Joined Southend United from school and made his league debut as substitute against Colchester United in October 1979. He made around 100 appearances for Southend before his move to Swindon in August 1983.

JIMMY QUINN (Forward)

Born Belfast. Signed from Oswestry Town in December 1981, he enjoyed a rapid rise from parks football to his league debut as substitute against Walsall in March 1982. A tall forward who is good in the air, his opportunities have been limited but he had made 18 league appearances

by the end of last season.

ALAN MAYES (Forward)

Born London. Now in his second spell with Swindon, Alan began with QPR but his league debut came after a move to Watford and was against Port Vale in November 1974. He made 133 league appearances for Watford plus 10 on loan to Northampton Town before signing for Swindon in February 1979. Although at Swindon for less than two years, he made 89 league appearances and struck up a good partnership with Andy Rowland. He joined Chelsea in December 1980 and made about 70 league appearances for them before re-joining Swindon in July 1983. Mobile forward very quick in the penalty area.

SIMON GIBSON (Defender)

Born Nottingham. A rugged centre half signed from Chelsea on loan on 20th October 1983. After one month, transferred to the County Ground on 17th November 1983.

MIKE GRAHAM (Defender)

Born Lancaster, Mike began with Bolton Wanderers making his debut at Mansfield in March 1978. He made 46 appearances for Bolton before signing for Swindon in July 1981. Had made 76 league appearances for Swindon to the end of last season mainly playing beside the centre half but can also play in midfield or at full-back.

■ Wrexham skipper Jake King and Jack Keay have seen their former team Shrewsbury six times this season, including the Welsh Cup semi-final leg against Swansea at Shrewsbury.

Jake said, "Obviously they are going to be tough games in the final. Shrewsbury won't give you anything. We'd just like to go back on better terms. It's going back at the wrong time for us because we are struggling at the bottom of the 4th division.

We know a lot of people there and we still live there. We don't want to disgrace ourselves. We only hope we can shake off our poor League form for those two matches.

The first leg at Shrewsbury is on Friday 18th May and the second leg at the Racecourse on Friday 25th May.

- Fans going to tomorrow's 'derby' game at Chester should make for turnstiles 13 and 14, the 'kop' end of the Sealand Road Stadium. If a lot of Wrexham fans turn up arrangements will be made for nearby turnstiles to be used.
- Wrexham's recently appointed part time secretary Mr. Stan Gandy will be going back to his old club tomorrow for the Chester v Wrexham match. It's going to be very strange for me after all I was with Chester for many years. But, obviously, the side I'll be cheering for will be Wrexham," he said.
- On the grapevine . . . Wrexham's Junior Reds started voting for their 'Player of the Year' at last Sunday's meeting and news is that DAVE GREGORY is romping away with the votes. Once again the 'Evening Leader' will be linking up with the Supporters Association for a general ballot for the club's fans. Voting forms will soon appear in the paper.
- Wrexham's next home league game will be against Bobby Roberts former club Colchester Utd. on 5th May. "It'll be a case of just another match a chance to gain points, that's all," said the Reds

manager. The game, of course, will bring back PHIL COLEMAN now in the Utd. side. He, of course, gave Wrexham tremendous service during his loan periods earlier in the season.

Colchester manager CYRIL LEA is, of course, no stranger to Wrexham either . . . he comes from Gwersyllt!

Tickets are now on sale for the Wales v England game at the Racecourse on Wednesday 2nd May — when a host of top players will be on view.

Despite Chelsea having a hectic programme as they fight for promotion to Division One ex Wrexham manager JOHN NEAL has stated that both JOEY JONES, MICKEY THOMAS and EDDIE NIEDZWIECKI will be released for Wales.

It's doubtful if Niedzwiecki can oust the brilliant NEVILLE SOUTHALL of Everton, but Jones and Thomas are automatic selections. It could be that Wales manager MIKE ENGLAND will give the big match another local boost by including Manchester Utd's striker MARK HUGHES who comes from Ruabon.

Despite recent home results Wrexham's on loan 'keeper RON SINCLAIR is enjoying himself at the Racecourse. "The Fourth Division is a lot more physical than playing Central League Football with Nottingham Forest. I feel that we only need one good result and it could make the world of difference. It has been a blow playing without Jack Keay and Steve Wright in the centre of the defence. Not many sides could get away with having two key players out at the same time," said Ron.

It is understood that Forest are keeping a close eye on the young Scots 'keeper and although he is away from the First Division club manager Brian Clough is having him watched while playing for Wrexham.
