

From Jim's Desk

Good evening everybody and welcome to St. James' Park for what we all hope will be an entertaining evening of Fourth Division football.

I would like to say a little bit about our two away games last week and the differing

fortunes we suffered.

The first trip to Colchester provided the club with its first away win in just over a year and that did a lot to lift spirits among the players.

I was proud of the determination our players showed in that game. They were just

not going to be beaten even when they went 2-1 and 3-2 down.

Everybody kept battling for 90 minutes and that is the sort of attitude we must have, particularly away from home.

At Chesterfield on Saturday we were beaten by the better team. We must be honest

and not kid ourselves that there was any other reason for the result.

They are tending to be a bit hit and miss with results but knowing Lou Macari and Harry Gregg I'm sure they will get it right eventually.



Today's Visitors with Jim Blackstone

Three months ago Swindon Town appointed Scottish International and former Celtic and Manchester United player LOU MACARI as Player/Manager. This is a bold step in an effort to lift the club out of the Fourth Division, for only ten years ago Swindon were a Second Division side.

Certainly the County Ground, Swindon, which has a capacity of 26,000, is one of the best in the Fourth Division and with a large population in Swindon and the surrounding area, a higher class of Football could be supported. Macari inherited several problems when he took over, worst of all, a lack of players. Slowly he has introduced new faces and at the time of writing these notes has used twenty players so far.

SCOTT ENDERSBY is the regular Goalkeeper, having been signed from Tranmere Rovers in the summer of 1983. He was previously with Kettering Town and Ipswich Town and was the club's Player of the Year last season. Swindon born KEVIN BADDELEY started his career at Bristol City, moving to his home town club three years ago. He was given a free transfer at the end of last season, but was quickly re-signed by Macari. COLIN BAILIE made his League debut for Swindon at Oxford United in April 1982, and has made well over 50 appearances since then. SIMON GIBSON was signed from Chelsea in November 1983 for £15,000 after a short loan period at Swindon, and is a Scottish Youth International. After playing for Netherfield, MIKE GRAHAM signed for Bolton Wanderers in 1975 as an apprentice. He spent six years at Burnden Park, before moving to Swindon on a free transfer. CHARLIE HENRY progressed through the junior ranks at the County Ground to make his full League debut against Rotherham United in September 1980. Recent signing CHRIS RAMSEY from Brighton and Hove Albion, like Baddeley, was an apprentice at Bristol City. He spent four years at Brighton, during which time he played in the 1983 F.A. Cup Final.

LEIGH BARNARD has played for Portsmouth, Yeovil Town (on loan) and Peterborough United, from where he was signed in the 1982 close season. He made his full League debut for Portsmouth at Exeter City in September 1977. England school International PETER COYNE after a promising start to his career with Manchester City, played for Manchester United, Ashton United, Crewe Alexandra and Hyde United, transferring to Swindon two months ago. DAVE HOCKADAY came from Blackpool in July 1983 on a free transfer, having made over 100 appearances for the "seasiders". In his second spell with Swindon, ALAN MAYES has appeared for Queens Park Rangers, Watford, Northampton Town and Chelsea. He has found the net regularly for all those clubs and was the leading scorer last season.

Former apprentice PAUL BATTY is a regular first teamer, making his League debut against Crewe Alexandra in September 1982. GARRY NELSON was signed from Southend United in August 1983 for a £10,000 fee and has been virtually an ever present since then. Longest serving player at the County Ground, ANDY ROWLANDS played for Derby County and Bury, moving south in September 1978 for £8,000. Originally a striker of some note he has more recently been playing in defence.

WEDNESDAY, 24th OCTOBER, 1934

Aldershot were the visitors to the Park for a Southern Section Cup second round tie. There were only about 1,000 spectators present to see the City win easily, 4–0, with goals from Jack Dryden 2, Tom Scott and Jack Scott. Exeter were two up in the first six minutes and City supporters were wondering why the Grecians could not do this in League matches. The teams lined up as follows:—Exeter City: Chesters; Angus, Smith; McClure, Webb, Lewis; J. Scott, T. Scott, Poulter, Dudley, Dryden. Aldershot: Robb; Wade, McDonald; Sheppard, Oakes, Summerbee; Izzard, Bunch, Waterston, Black, Lee.

SATURDAY, 24th OCTOBER, 1953

Nothing pleases a Footballer more than to be on a winning side against his former club, that is why City's player Manager Norman Dodgin was a happy man at the end of this game which was a keen and interesting struggle. Fittingly Dodgin himself was one of the outstanding successes of the match, giving a cultured performance.

Goals in the seventh and twelth minutes from McClelland had Reading reeling as the City were on the crest of a wave. The visitors however made a fine fight back and kept the Exeter forwards from adding to their tally, indeed, in the second half Reading had the City defence working at full stretch at times.

SATURDAY, 24th OCTOBER, 1964

Cecil Smyth had a brilliant game in a City side that was so badly hit by injury that they had to field eight defenders in the team at Scunthorpe United. Exeter were desperately playing a rearguard action, leaving only Dermot Curtis and Graham Rees up front. Smyth cleared no less than four times off the City goal line.

City had few scoring chances, the best two falling to George Ley, who missed narrowly on both occasions. All things considered this was an excellent result for Exeter holding on to achieve a 0–0 draw.
