# **Swindon Town**

LOU MACARI Swindon's player-manager had a distinguished career with Celtic, Manchester United and Scotland (26 caps) before moving south. Plays in midfield these days, but still gets among the goals.

SCOTT ENDERSBY First aroused notice when he played in goal for Kettering in an F.A. Cup tie when just 15. Won England Youth cap while an apprentice with Ipswich. Made 91 appearances for Tranmere Rovers before joining Swindon in July 1983.

CHRIS RAMSAY Twenty-three at the end of April, this young defender was on Bristol City's books as an amateur. But it was Brighton who signed him as a pro. After four seasons at The Goldstone joined Swindon on loan before signing full time last December.

**COLIN BAILIE** A 21 year-old defender who was an apprentice with the club. Now in his fourth season is established in the side. Can also play in midfield.

CHARLIE HENRY Usually occupies the right-back berth. Now 23, and in his fifth full season at Swindon where he was an apprentice.

**DAVID COLE** A young defender signed in February when he was released by Swansea City.

ANDY ROWLAND Now 30, started out as an amateur with Derby County. Won England Youth cap and then spent five seasons with Bury. Arrived at Swindon in 1978 and has been a regular in the side ever since. Normally plays up front but has also been at centre-half and emergency goalkeeper for the club.

PETER COYNE Rescued by Lou Macari from nonleague football. Was with Manchester United and Crewe before drifting into North-West Counties League football with Hyde United, Has been a consistent scorer for Swindon in this his first season.

**DAVE HOCKADAY** An experienced midfield man who spent eight seasons with Blackpool his only other league club. His best position is playing out wide on the right.

GARY NELSON A Braintree man who made his league debut for Southend against Colchester in October 1979. Spent four seasons at Roots Hall. Basically an old fashioned type of left winger.

MIKE GRAHAM A 26 year-old defender who started his career with Bolton Wanderers. Joined Swindon in July 1981. Re-signed at the start of the season after being given a free transfer at the end of the last campaign.

PAUL BATTY Was an apprentice with the club, and was a regular in the centre of midfield until sidelined by injury.

**COLIN GORDON** A tall striker who has made a big impact and scord regularly since being signed from Oldbury Town.

**ALAN MAYES** A mobile striker now in his second spell at Swindon where this season injury has limited his appearances. Has netted well over 100 league appearances.

**LEIGH BARNARD** Midfield player in his third season at Swindon has been out on loan to Exeter City.

MARK GARDENER A young forward who has made a few senior appearances.

GARY FULBROOK, ANDY WOLLEN, MARK PAYNE, ALAN CHURCHWARD & JAMES REYNOLDS are young players who have made odd appearances in senior squad.





Especially bearing in mind that trips to places like Torquay involve a there and back journey of around 600 miles. Yet the U's unscheduled extra overnight stop after the recent match at Plainmoor evoked considerable press comment. But Joe Osborne, and his drivers can take comfort from the fact that the things that make the news headlines are the unexpected. Over three decades Osborne & Sons,

Tollesbury based coaches have driven successive United teams hundreds of thousands of miles without a mishap. No wonder one little hiccup was big news. Still it would have been better would it not, if while mentioning the overnight hold-up, the stories had also stressed that this was a unique occurence. They might also have made a little more of the fact, that, though it was getting on for midnight before contact was made with Tollesbury, there was a replacement coach with Jimmy James at the wheel at Torquay by 6.30 p.m. next morning.

Remember Bob Oates the former England Youth International who played against the U's for both Scunthorpe and Rochdale? This season he has been knocking the goals in for Anglian Combination side Watton United. Watton have applied for admission to the Eastern Counties League for next season and with their well appointed ground and good facilities, must have a chance of getting in. In addition to the two clubs applying for re-election however, they also face opposition from Diss Town where Duncan Forbes is the coach.

When Stuart Youngman came on as substitute for his debut at Aldershot, he became the 275th player to appear in Colchester United colours since they were elected into the league 35 years ago.





# **Division Four**

We may be a little premature, but is certainly looks as if Chesterfield, Darlington, Blackpool and Bury will be the four teams for promotion. Hereford, like Colchester, have found a late season spate of injuries has blunted their challenge. With only a small squad the Edgar Street side have faded in the run in. Apart from Cambridge United, already down, there is a real dog fight to avoid the drop at the bottom of Division Three. Two famous clubs Burnley and Preston North End are deeply involved, and these two. together with Orient, at the time of writing, look the likeliest to come down. Swansea City who looked certain candidates at one juncture have perked up recently under John Bond. With Robin Turner from Ipswich getting goals they look as if they might just steer clear. Loncoln City and Wigan appear to have just enough cushion to keep clear of trouble.

The bottom of Division Four is still anybodies guess. Northampton, after propping up the table for a long time, have started to pick up points but have probably left it too late. While Halifax, who seem to win where they shouldn't, and lose when they should win, will also be lucky to escape the bottom four. Wrexham's Houdini act since Bobby Roberts left and Rochdale who showed such fight, in more ways than one, at Layer Road recently may scrape clear. That would leave Torquay and Chester in the other two trouble spots. But it looks as if the basement battle may go to the last games of the season before it is finally

resolved.

Rebuilding has been the name of the game with several of the Fourth Division outfits in the last couple of months. A lot of players have come and gone in their endeavours to find the right blend in readiness for next season. Aldershot for example had only five left of the team who played at Colchester in the party for the recent return game at The Recreation Ground. The story was the same down at Torquay where only five of their players were in the 12 that turned out at Layer Road last October. Rochdale had a new look side on parade at Layer Road in mid-April. While at Exeter the local press lads reckon they have had so many changes they hardly recognise their own players.

Next season at this point in time seems a long way off. But it is the behind the scenes planning going on right now that can ultimately have a big say in playing fortunes in 1985/86. Some of the clubs that struggled early on have quietly sorted things out and teams like today's opponents Swindon could be one to watch when another campaign gets under way. Despite the recent traumas in the Wiltshire club Lou Macari has now got his lads breathing down the U's necks. They together with Scunthorpe and latterly Aldershot are finishing the present campaign on a high note. So while the U's can look forward to another season in the Division with a certain amount of expectation, it will still be a tough hard grind to try to move up a division a year or so from now.

# **News in Reserve**

The game against Lowestoft Town at Layer Road gave me more pleasure than practically any other Eastern Counties match we have played this season. For one thing both teams played football. For another, our young side stuck to their task against an older and more experienced outfit. At the end of a well contested encounter the general feeling was that we had done enough to deserve to win. Without taking anything away from Lowestoft, I think that was a fair appraisal of the match.

George Dalorto, showing some lovely touches, frequently stretched the visiting defence. Trevor Saunders, recently released by Norwich City, was twice at full stretch to save first from Dalorto, and then from a well struck free kick by Youngman. He also did well to fist away a clever lob from the ever busy Dave Hubbick. At the other end, John Black twice distinguished himself with brave saves from Phill Lythgoe another former Norwich player. Yet it was a sudden lapse of concentration by the keeper that led to the Lowestoft's goal. He completely missed a cross from Atterton and all Riley had to do was walk the ball into the net. But the youngsters are learning. They kept their cool - continued to knock the ball about - and were rewarded just before half-time when Paul Cribb cracked in the equaliser. Youngman went close with another free kick and then a blatent foul on Cribb inside the box went unpunished with neither the referee or the linesman up with play. Dalorto with eight minutes left was too quick for

the Lowestoft defence, he rounded the keeper, only for Doug Evens to just get a boot to the ball and put it behind for a corner. Just before the end Cullum rattled the woodwork with a power drive. The ball ran back to Larter and Black saved the day at point black range. A lovely game, full of incident and good play from both sides. Made all the better by a convivial get together in the Blue Eagles bar after the match.

The previous Tuesday night on a bonehard bumpy pitch we went down 3-0 to Gorleston at Layer Road. The Greens are a big hard side and it was very much a case of men against boys. Fittingly Hubble, who stole the show, got the third goal just before the final whistle.





# Looking Back

The U's crippling injury list finally put paid to promotion hopes this season. Disappointing perhaps, but yet all in all it has to be said that the re-shaped side has done a lot better than even the most ardent fan envisaged at the start of the present campaign. Last August, with the departure of several players who had provided the hard core of the team for some considerable time, the cupboard looked extremely bare. There was no money to buy experienced players, and little in the kitty to be able to offer terms to match the requirements of many so called free transfers.

Of the 1983/84 squad Micky Cook, Tony Hadley, Steve Wignall, Steve Leslie, Les Mutrie and Phil Coleman had gone. While the only newcomer with any league experience was Noel Parkinson, released by Scunthorpe. So Manager Cyril Lea had the awesome task of rebuilding a side without a hope of taking on established players already hooded in the league. And didn't he do well!

Eight months later, before the injury bogey took its toll, he had, against the odds, assembled a squad who were always among the front runners.

Russell Irving, brought up in a different football academy, took time to adjust but has now proved to be a very shrewd investment for the future. There was another equally astute capture in Tony English and like Irving, he cost nothing. Keith Day, given his chance, stepped up from the obscurity of Aveley, to make the No. 5 shirt his own. Three real pluses and all now established and improving performances, with Irving and English doing


well in what is not their best roles.

Then again a batch of young players from the reserves, brought in to plug the injury gaps, have done better than one could fairly have expected. Rudi Hedman, who must at times have wondered whether his chance would ever come, was finally rewarded just before Christmas, the Witham lad stepped into the side and has retained his place ever since.

Andy Farrell, now with over 50 league appearances, and still only 19, has played in several positions, and is another youngster who has made his mark. While more recently as the walking wounded toll mounted, Simon Burman and Stewart Youngman have stepped into the breach.

In goal Alec Chamberlain is now firmly established as one of the best young keepers in the country. While the loss of the services through injury of Stuart Houston, Ian Phillips, Jeff Hull and Tony Adcock, has cost the club precious points, has at least given opportunities for others, and indicated there are real hopes for the future on the playing side.

Of the others despite a troublesome ankle Keith Bowen can never be faulted for effort, Roger Osborne has continued to cover every blade of grass and give 110 per cent. While Perry Groves, after a mid-season purple patch, has at times inspired and at times infuriated, but he is still young enough to acquire the consistency needed.



Robin Reid and Steve Allen, both still only 18, have made a big advance during their Youth scheme year. Both have been regulars in the Essex Youth team. Robin was one of the first team subs, for the Freight Rover Trophy game at Walsall, while Steve has ambitions to become a physiotherapist. Stuart Youngman is another who has been unfortunate with injuries. Recently, after putting his midseason troubles behind him, he had been turning in some good performances in midfield for Colin Henson's side. Recently he also made the first team squad for the away games at Hartlepool and Torquay. From the same part of the world as Stuart, Sean Norman is another find during the present campaign. At left-back or on the left hand side of midfield, Sean is an 18 year-old who could well make the grade.

Dean Jeffries has scored more than 20 goals at various levels and has now had a number of outings at Reserve Team level. He needs to work on his game more but undoubtedly the former Gunfleet School pupil has the ability to sniff out the goals. At an even younger level the lively Scott Young, who is on schoolboy forms with the club, if he continues to develop has every chance of progressing to senior level. While two others in the 17 year-old bracket, Paul Cribb and Brian Sawyer, have caught the eye from time to time. Though both of them, together with young keeper Gary Dean, have found the physical demands of Eastern Counties League football very exacting. Cribb, by the way, has also been among the goals, his tally at present standing at 16.

Paul Keaney and Terry Clarke two more recent arrivals are obviously ones for the future and George Dalorto, in his second spell at Layer Road, is at last cashing in on his potential and scoring goals. Finally, special mention must be made of Danny King who has played in every Border League game and most of the Youth Cup matches.



# **Today's Visitors**

A clergyman, the Rev. W. Pitt, was the man behind the birth of Swindon Town way back in 1881. Rumour has it that the vicar formed the football club to keep workers from the railway workshops off the streets and out of the pubs.

The first recorded games were on a pitch in Old Swindon but within a year the club moved to first. The Globe Field and then The Croft — at that time a rugby ground. This latter ground was their headquarters when they won the Wiltshire Cup from 1886 for six successive seasons. They reached the final again in 1892/93 and 1893/94 losing to Swindon Athletic and Swindon Wanderers respectively.

At that time there was little to choose between the three Swindon clubs. But 1894 saw Town embrace professionalism and become one of the founder members of the Southern League. From then on — though Swindon Victoria challenged them from time to time — Town became the premier club in the area.


The following season 1895 saw Town move to the County Ground, which has been their home ever since. It was another dozen years however, before Swindon really got on the football map. In the 1907/08 campaign, in their first venture in the F.A. Cup they caused a real shock. They went to Sheffield after drawing 0-0 at Bramall lane in a First Round replay. In the Second Round they beat Q.P.R. 2-0, before going out in the Third Round 2-0 to Wolverhampton Wanderers.

The 1909/10 season saw Swindon in the F.A. Cup semi-final. They went down 2-0 at Tottenham to Newcastle the eventual winners. In earlier rounds they won 3-1 at Crystal Palace, beat Burnley 2-0, Spurs 3-2 and Manchester City 2-0. Season 1911/12 saw them semi-finalists again. After a 0-0 draw, they wnet out 1-0 to Barnsley, who went on to win the cup. In this golden period they also took the Southern League Championship in 1911 and 1914.

Founder members of Division Three South in 1920, there they remained until the 1957/58 season when Northern and Southern sections were scrapped. Swindon won a place in the reconstituted Division Three. In 1962/63 and again in 1968/69 they finished second in the table and had two spells in the Second Division. In the latter season too, while still a Third Division club, they won the League Cup beating Arsenal 3-1 in the final. Since then fortunes have slumped and 1982 saw Swindon in the Fourth Division for the first time.

During World War Two the County Ground became a Prisoner of War camp. There were huts built on the pitch and it was some time after hostilities ended before the ground was back to normal.

One of the first ever floodlit games was staged at Swindon in April 1951 when Town played an exhibition match with Bristol City. While another unique feature at the County Ground is the fact that it houses a bookmaker's shop underneath the main stand. No bets on the Division in which Swindon will be playing next season.







The recent drugs scare has shocked many people. But is it really the serious problem in sport, and particularly in football, that some sections of the press would have us believe?

Colchester United's physio Charlie Simpson plays down the claim. He is quite certain there is not the widespread misuse of drugs that has been suggested. In a long and distinguished career in football, Charlie has seen and treated as many injuries as most.

He says, "Clubs generally have responsible medical people who in no way want to go out and abuse players by putting their careers at risk through the misuse of drugs."

He pointed out there will always be a situation where players continue to turn out carrying an injury. Just as there will always be players who cannot do that. He contends that in general the only time a player is 100 per cent fit is at the start of a campaign when he has come through the vital pre-season build-up training.

From then on, in what is after all a game of physical contact, there will always be a percentage of performers carrying injuries of one sort or another. Some players will always have to quit the game because of those injuries. "But," the Colchester physio added, "I do not believe that it is because of the overuse or misuse of drugs."


