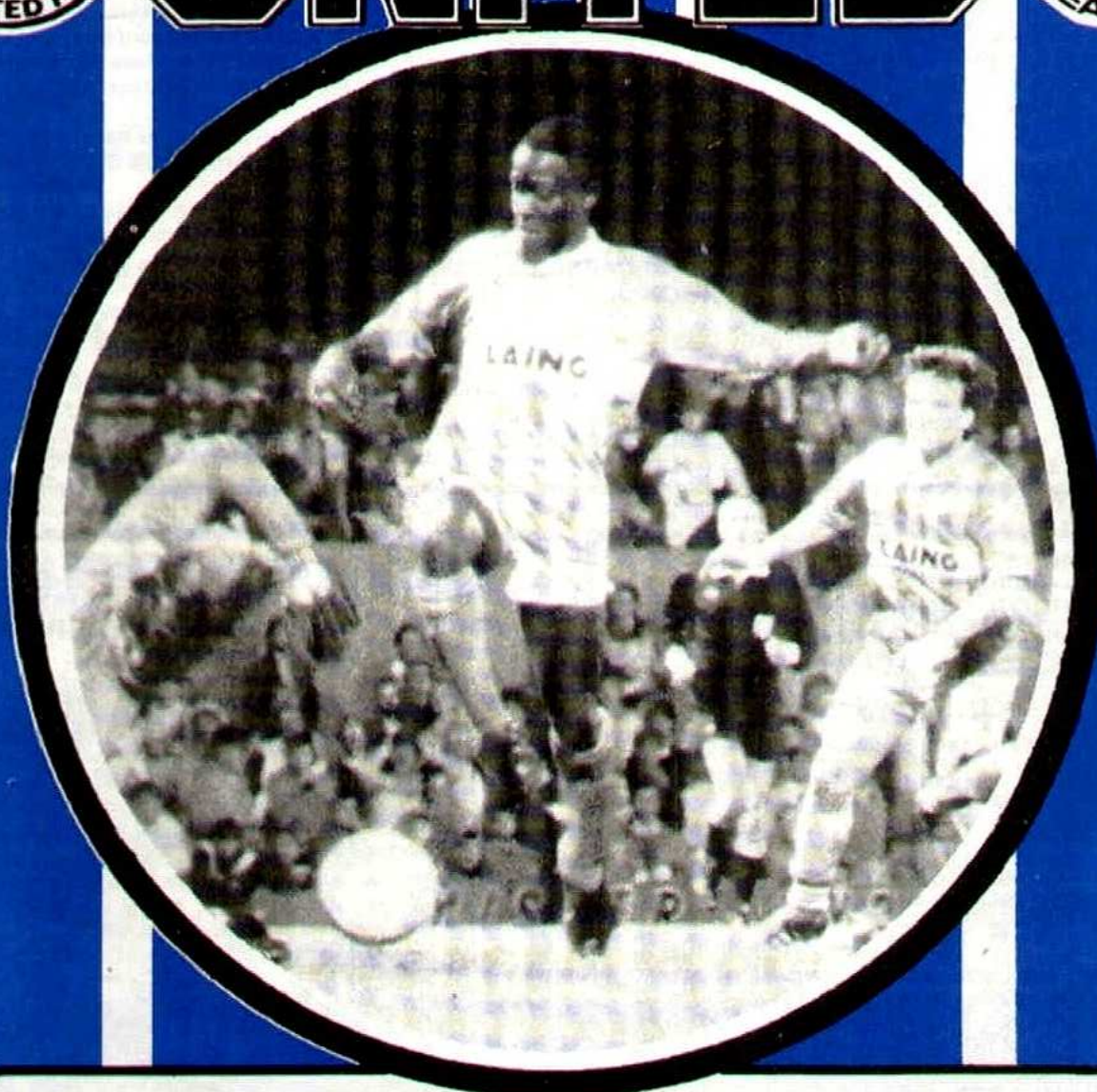

# The Southend Utd. Story

## By Jane Austen — Part Three

UNITED'S most prolific scorer in the 1906/7 season was Harold Halse, who scored no less than 91 of the 222 goals Southend scored that season in just 65 games. They only conceded 53!

Halse, along with James Axcell, was later transferred to Manchester United, who played a game at Southend as part of the fee. Halse went on to play in the Manchester United F.A. Cup winning team, alongside the legendary Billy Meredith.

United were top of the Southern League as well as the Second Division of the South Eastern League.

An average home gate was 1,000 and the gate receipts for the season totalled £875 4s 6d. (875.42½p). The wages for that season accounted for over £1,400 and the club registered a loss of £1,142 10s. (£1,142.50).

In May, 1907, United applied for promotion to the First Division of the Southern League and there was great indignation in the town when a new norther club was elected (they were Bradford Park Avenue). However, in June, United were elected to the First Division of the South Eastern League and the reserves to the Second Division.

In 1907 United played their first F.A. Cup match and they beat Second Division Clapton Orient 3-1 in a third round replay at Roots hall. Earlier on, United had drawn 1-1 with Orient at Homerton. The gate receipts were a record £83. However, United were beaten 4-0 by Carlisle in the next round.

In June 1908, the following year, the United were elected to the First Division of the Southern league, and they beat Milwall 3-0 in front of a crowd of 6,000.

In April 1909, the Southern League held an unofficial meeting and five of the sixteen clubs were not invited. Southend United were among those not invited, and at the special meeting it was revealed that the other eleven clubs had decided to apply for inclusion into the Third Division of the English League...

# HOWARD'S NOTEBOOK

I HATE to say it ... but I told you so! My notebook for the Orient game predicted that Richard Cadette would explode on the Roots Hall scene.

But to be honest I could not have envisaged just what an impact it would be — more like an H-bomb with those fabulous four goals.

Surely no Southend player can ever have produced such a stunning individual performance on his first full 90 minutes.

The first two goals were real gems while the other couple provided proof of his opportunism — cashing in after shots from Steve Phillips had been blocked.

And team-mates Phillips and Paul Clark were glowing in praise for their new pal.

"Richard is a tremendous prospect. He is so difficult to mark and is always prepared to do the unpredictable. I reckon he will go right to the top," said Phillips.

And Clark, who has paraded his tackling skills at the highest level with Brighton, told me: "I would hate to mark him — he is so quick and seems to ride tackles and shrug off efforts to clog him out of the game.

"I feel he will prove a real find this season and get many more goals in the weeks and months ahead."

Cadette himself looked far from the conquering hero, accepting the slaps on the back with a shy grin.

"It was a bit like a dream out there — everything I did came off," he said. "Obviously I am delighted to get among the goals so soon in my career at Southend.

"It will probably take me a day or two to come down to earth, but I know in soccer you are only as good as your last game and I must keep up the high standard I have set.

"I would like to give my team-mates a big thank you. It was a fine all-round team display ... I could not have done it on my own."

One nice touch was that Orient manager Frank Clark, the man who had sold Cadette to Southend for £5,000, proved himself a real sportsman.

It must have stuck in his throat that Cadette had blasted his side to oblivion, but he was one of the first people in the Blues' dressing room afterwards.

"Frank told me how well I had done and certainly did not begrudge me my night of glory," said Cadette.

And there's no doubt that the Southend faithful who have had so little to lift them over the last few agonising seasons, took to the little fellow from the start.

"I've never known a crowd warm to anyone the way our fans did to Cadette," said Phillips. "Let's hope they continue to support him when possibly the things he tries do not always come off the way they did tonight.

"It's vital that a youngster with this sort of rare talent gets backing from the terraces — it can boost his confidence no end."

While on the subject of goals it was good to see our other new face Danny O'Shea getting his name on the scoresheet.

# AT ROOTS HALL TODAY -

**LEIGH BARNARD (Midfield).** Born Worsley. served his apprenticeship with Portsmouth and made his League debut for them at Exeter City in September 1977. Made 89 appearances for Pompey plus four on loan to Peterborough United before signing for Swindon Town in July 1982. An enthusiastic player always in the thick of the action, he can play in any midfield position, but is most effective playing wide. Last season he had a short loan period with Exeter City. Has made 115 appearances for the Town.

**COLIN CALDERWOOD (Defender).** Born Stranraer. Previously with Mansfield Town for whom he made his League debut at Crewe Alexandra in March 1982. A strong defender who was signed by Swindon in June 1985 after 100 League appearances for the Field Mill Club, 41 of them last season.

**DAVID COLE (Defender).** Born Isle of Man. Signed for Swindon in February 1985 from Swansea City where he had made eight appearances. He then made 20 appearances for Swindon last season, including some stylish displays at centre half.

**PETER COYNE (Forward).** Born Hartlepool. An apprentice with Manchester United, his League debut coming at Aston Villa in February 1976. He made one other appearance that season but was given a free transfer at the end. He was out of League football until August 1977 when he began again for Crewe Alexandra for whom he made 133 League appearances and was three times leading goalscorer. Another free transfer in May 1981 saw him leave League football until Swindon signed him in August 1984 from Hyde United. Although he played some of last season in midfield he is seen at best up front beside the centre forward. He made 42 appearances last season.

**SCOTT ENDERSBY (Goalkeeper).** Born Lewisham. He appeared in an F.A. Cup tie for Kettering Town at the age of 15, but served his apprenticeship with Ipswich Town where he won England Youth Honours. He moved to Tranmere Rovers in the summer of 1981 and made his League debut against Hereford United in September of that year. He made 91 appearances for the Birkenhead Club and joined Swindon in July 1983. Had made 82 League appearances for the Town to the end of season.

**CHRIS RAMSEY (Defender).** Born Birmingham. Although an amateur with Bristol City his League debut came after signing for Brighton and was at Crystal Palace in April 1981. He made 30 appearances for Brighton in the League, but also played in the 1983 Cup Final where he broke a leg, missing the replay. A stylish full back, particularly when on the attack, he signed for Swindon in December 1984 after a loan period earlier in the season. Made 32 League appearances last season.

**MARK GARDINER (Forward).** Born Cirencester. Young forward with eight first team games to his credit who has graduated from the apprentices and made his League debut against Mansfield Town in April 1984.

**MARK PAYNE (Midfield).** A young player who made his first team debut against Bristol Rovers in the Milk Cup in September 1984. Made three other appearances last season, all as substitute.

**JOHN (JAKE) FINDLAY (Goalkeeper).** Born Blairgowrie. Former Aston Villa apprentice who made his League debut in season 1973/74 but as opportunities were limited he moved to Luton Town in December 1978, playing eventually in the Second Division Championship winning team of 1981/2. More recently he lost his place at Luton after 167 League appearances, injury restricting him to three last season. He has had loan periods with Second Division clubs Barnsley and Derby County and signed for Swindon in July 1985.

**JAMIE REYNOLDS (Forward).** A winger who made one appearance last season as substitute against Crewe Alexandra in March 1985 whilst still an apprentice.

**ANDY ROWLAND (Defender).** Born Derby. Although he started his career at Derby County it was not until he moved to Bury that he played his first game in the first team. Made his League debut at Swindon in 1974 and made 174 League appearances for Bury before moving to Swindon in September 1978. A consistent goalscorer for much of his career he has recently played at centre back. Also the club's emergency goalkeeper he has made 267 League appearances for Swindon at the end of last season.

**BRIAN WADE (Forward).** Signed from non-League football in May 1985 he was formerly with Bath City, Paulton Rovers and Trowbridge Town.

**COLIN GORDON (Forward).** Born Stourbridge. Although on non-contract forms with Wolverhampton Wanderers at one time Colin played non-League football with Worcester City, Bromsgrove Rovers and Oldbury United before signing for Swindon in November 1984 at the age of almost 22. He scored on his debut at Rochdale that month and went on to make 32 appearances and one substitute appearance. A bustling player who made such rapid improvement that he was voted Player of the Year by supporters.

**DEREK HALL (Midfield).** Born Manchester. Former Coventry City apprentice who made one appearance for that club at Birmingham City in September 1982. At the end of the 1983/84 season he made 10 appearances on loan to Torquay United and, after being released by Coventry City, he joined the Plainmoor club full time. He made 45 League appearances last season and signed for Swindon in June 1985.

**CHARLIE HENRY (Defender).** Born Acton. Former Swindon apprentice who signed professional in February 1980 and made his first team debut in September of that year at Lincoln City. A popular and hard tackling player who has played mainly at right full back but with occasional games as a central defender and was tried in midfield last season. Had made 133 League appearances at the end of that season.

**DAVID HOCKADAY (Midfield).** Born Billingham. Before joining Swindon in the summer of 1983 he had played 178 games over eight years with Blackpool, his only other club. A versatile player who now seems to have settled into a midfield role, although he can play on the wing or in the forward line. Had made 53 appearances and four substitute appearances for Swindon at the end of last season.

**MARK HUGHES (Forward).** Born Swindon. A young forward who made his debut whilst still an apprentice by coming on as substitute against Northampton Town in March 1984 and had made one other first team appearance by the end of last season.

**LOU MACARI (Midfield).** Born Edinburgh. Swindon Player/Manager appointed in July 1984 after a distinguished career with Celtic, Manchester United and Scotland. He joined United in 1973 after over 50 appearances for Celtic and made 329 League appearances for the Old Trafford Club. He also played 24 times for Scotland. Originally a forward and later a midfield player he has played in a variety of roles for Swindon and continues to display the class that marked his appearances in a higher grade of football.

**DAVID MOSS (Forward).** Born Witney. Signed by Swindon from Witney Town and had his League debut against Watford in April 1972. He went on to make 230 appearances for the club before a transfer to Luton Town in the summer of 1978. In seven seasons with Luton he saw promotion to Division One in 1982 and made around 230 more League appearances. Signed for Swindon the second time in June 1985. A tricky winger who also has a good goal scoring record.

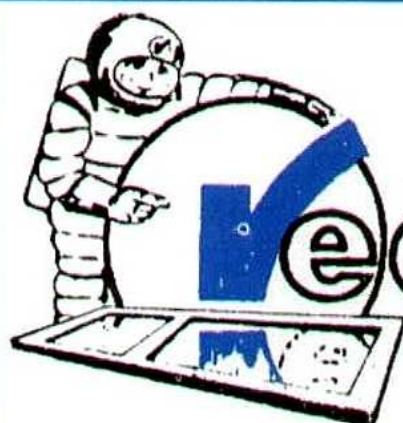

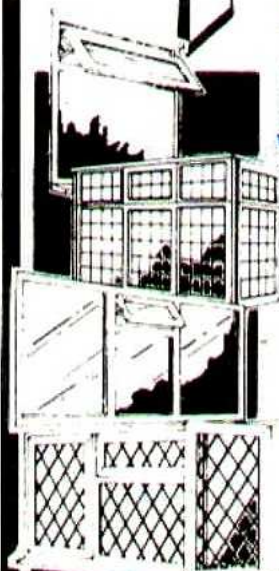
