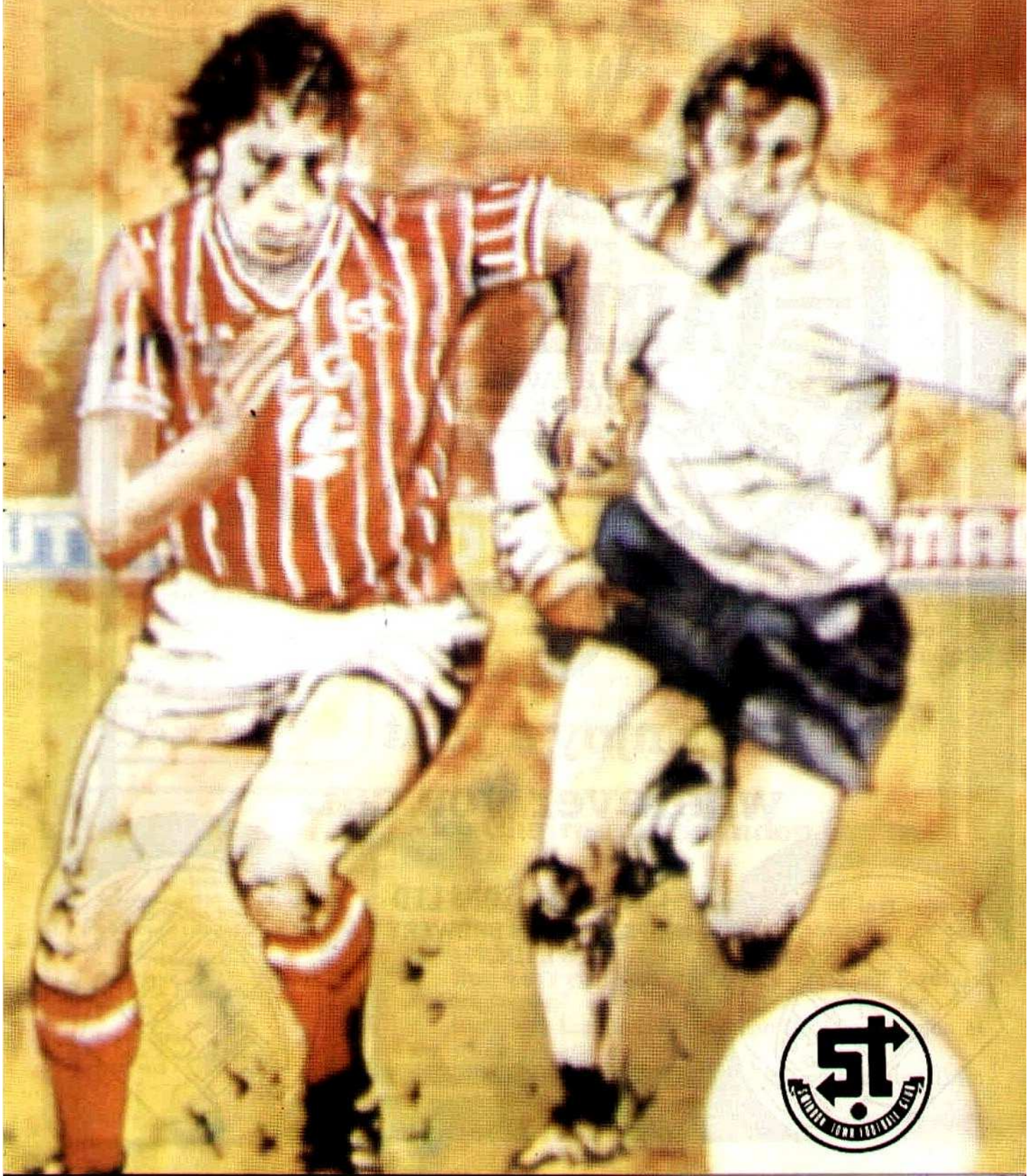

# Face to Face

A NEW PROGRAMME FEATURE  
WHERE LOU ANSWERS QUESTIONS  
FROM DAVE KING -  
THE PROGRAMME EDITOR



**Q:** What is the situation regarding your statement that you were looking for defenders, any progress?

**LOU:** I have looked again at a defender who played against us in one of our pre-season matches for Chesham United, although he created a favourable impression in our match on the second occasion he did not come up to standard. I am also looking at a defender with Gola League Kidderminster.



**Q:** Are you concentrating solely on non-league teams then?

**LOU:** No, but any Manager worth his salt is not going to let anyone go at this early stage of the season. Especially with early season mid-week matches still on. He will need a surplus of staff in case of injury or loss of form.

**Q:** You obviously must have received a recommendation of the player with Kidderminster?

**LOU:** He was recommended by Bert Head. I am now looking at the player myself to see if he is what we require.

**Q:** You had Torquay United central defender John Impey on trial, did he impress you?

**LOU:** No, he was not fit enough, we would have had to wait all of a month for him to have reached a standard of fitness that would have been somewhat acceptable and we could not wait for that.

**Q:** What about Kenny Stroud who played in the same Reserve match?

**LOU:** I had never seen him play before and he was asked to fill in a vacant position to help us out with the Reserves. With Ken I don't think he is really interested in playing full-time.

**Q:** Colin Gordon is having a lean start to the season. Is he lacking confidence?

**LOU:** Well, when everything is going your way like it was for Colin last season life is O.K. Now it is a test of character for him, now that things are not going so good. It is the first of many setbacks he will face. We will now see if he has the mettle to overcome them. A lot of people will be interested in the answers to that.

**Q:** What is the latest situation with Scott Endersby. Is it any nearer to being resolved?

**LOU:** There is nothing to be resolved, it is really up to the player. He declined a rise that was offered to him, he was told he could go elsewhere which he still wants to do, but no club has asked for him. If no interest is shown in him what can we do further?

**Q:** How much emphasis do you put on watching the opposition before hand. There was the classic example of Bobby

**Q:** Will the sweeper system become a permanent feature of away matches this season?

**LOU:** Until I have capable defenders we will probably operate with it in some matches, according to what opposition we face.

# Place the Face-Gary Herbert



Gary is the Club Vice-Chairman, he lives at Blunsdon with his wife Janice and their two sons Richard aged twelve years and Ben who is eight.

Born in Gooch Street, Swindon, Gary progressed to become a successful business man in the Town. He was appointed a Director of the Town Football Club in 1983, after reading a report in the local Evening Newspaper which stated that the Club were hoping to increase the number of Directors, if anyone was interested.

The report interested the Swindon Town season ticket holder, although Gary readily admits that he had only purchased a season ticket for one season. Usually paying admittance on match days. Gary decided to contact the past Vice-Chairman of the Club, Paul Heath, to see what qualifications would be required. He was promptly told the requirement was £20,000. A meeting was arranged with the Club Chairman Cecil Green and Gary duly joined the Board of Directors.

His earliest recollections of visiting the County Ground were at the age of four when he was allowed to carry the music sheets for the former Great Western Railway Band, who in those bygone days performed before most County Ground matches.

The first impression of players came in the shape of George 'Garth' Hudson, Andy Micklewright and John Richards, names prominent in the late 'Fifties and Sixties'. These were the early memories of a young supporter who was brought along to uphold a family tradition of supporting the Town.

As he grew older Gary enjoyed playing in local amateur soccer numbering among

the clubs he appeared for, Borough League Club Walcot and Westcot of the Wiltshire League.

Gary has fond memories of appearing for the Swindon Sunday League Team, Greyhound. They apparently had a good side in those days. He spent seven years with Swindon District League Club, Shaw, who won Divisions 3, 2, 1 and the Premier League during his time with the Club.

No doubt he was in pursuit of a mythical emulation of some of the County Ground players he had watched perform their skills at a higher level! We all have our dreams.

What of his hopes for the future of Swindon Town Football Club? 'I want success and really this club has the facilities for a better class of football, at least Second Division. Although I must stress that it must be built on a good foundation, we have to afford to be successful, not waste money the club is not in possession of, we must seek financial stability. Do you know, I am an optimist and I have confidence and faith in our present set up'.

When asked if he was aware of the Club's need for improved public relations, Gary did not avoid the issue, replying, 'I am always pleased to meet or talk to any supporter on a constructive basis, it is a wish of mine to meet more of our regular fans. It is imperative that we have unity between the supporters and the Club. I don't wish to sound patronising but I was a supporter before a Director. So I have seen both sides of the fence'.

Were there any regrets about becoming a Director? Gary replied, 'Oh yes, several times, but we all have the same ideal, although we may not always agree, surely that is for the good of Swindon Town Football Club. It is a concern of mine that our image is portrayed as a Club that wants to involve all of those who watch the Town play, and there lies the crux of the situation'.

'If the team wins and plays well we all feel happier, particularly after an away game'.

# A Look at Four

A round up of News  
and Views on the  
Division

Although teenage striker Richard Cadette failed to score in our creditable goal-less draw at Southend United last Friday. He had previously scored four goals for the Roots Hall Club on his debut against Orient - the club who sold him for £5,000 to the 'Seasiders' during the summer.

Cadette 19, scored two superb individual goals after thirty-six and forty five minutes, then tapped in a third soon after the break and wrapped it all up two minutes from time.

He was not content with scoring four goals, for he also laid on Southend's other goal for Danny O'Shea, the former Exeter City midfield player.

After four matches only four clubs remain unbeaten, Peterborough United, Rochdale, Southend United and Wrexham, not surprisingly all four clubs are in the leading positions. Although not one of those clubs have taken maximum points from their fixtures. Which suggests that this season will see a highly competitive division in which bottom club will defeat top on several occasions this season.

Have you noticed how much Wrexham are relying on midfield players Barry Horne and Steve Charles to score their goals, remember how Steve scored the only goal of our opening day match here at the County Ground? They have contributed four of the six goals that the North Wales Club have scored so far this season.

Frank Worthington the new Player Manager of Tranmere Rovers has certainly taken a liking to life in the Fourth Division for apart from his hat-trick against Cambridge United on August 23rd. He has also scored in three of Rovers first four League matches of this season to take his tally to five goals.

Last season Tranmere had the most deadly duo in the Fourth Division with Colin Clarke and John Clayton spearheading their attack with fifty three

League goals between them. It was expected the departure of 31 goal Colin Clarke to A.F.C. Bournemouth would reduce the goal output of the Tranmere attack.

The arrival of Frank Worthington to replace the former Ipswich and Peterborough player had initiated an equally dangerous partnership, for both Frank and John Clayton had scored nine of Rovers eleven League goals so far.

That newly formed partnership was broken up last week when John Clayton moved to Plymouth Argyle as a replacement for Argyle's Tommy Tynan who had returned North to join Rotherham United.

It was a black day at the Victoria Ground, Hartlepool. Where three players - Bob Newton of Hartlepool and Orient's Pat Corbett and skipper Tommy Cunningham were sent off in a tough clash in last Saturday's match between the two clubs. Orient survived the better to snatch a 2-1 win.

Mansfield Town again rate as the most miserly club in the division for Phil Cavener's twelfth minute penalty for Northampton Town, our visitors to the County Ground this evening, was the first goal the impressive keeper Kevin Hitchcock had conceded this season!

A 29th minute goal from Stewart Phillips preserved Hereford United's one hundred per cent record against Cambridge United. After five goals against Bristol City in the Milk Cup and four against us, the Edgar Street faithfuls were starved of goals last week-end with just that solitary effort! Most teams will leave Edgar Street pointless this season.

# The Ambassadors

When our former striker Paul Rideout joined the exodus of top British soccer players to the Continent during the summer, he became the ninth star player currently playing in European football.

Paul joined the following well known names currently seeking their fortunes outside the Canon League.

**STEVE ARCHIBALD** (Barcelona)

The former Tottenham striker spearheaded the Spanish Club to their first Championship win for eleven years and his goals will become a crucial factor in whether the Spanish will be able to lift the European Cup under former Q.P.R. Manager Terry Venables.

**LIAM BRADY** (Inter-Milan)

The Eire International Liam is the longest serving exile, he is now established as one of the top midfield players in the world. A player on whom Inter-Milan are pinning their faith on to help the famous Italian Club to reclaim their former glories. Liam was previously with Arsenal, Juventus and Sampdoria.

**TREVOR FRANCIS** (Sampdoria)

Trevor is a firm favourite with the Sampdoria Club although he fails to score as many goals as his detractors quickly point out. The injury prone striker who is now thirty-one could begin to struggle as his pace which is the strongest facet of his game begins to desert him.

**MARK HATELEY** (A.C. Milan)

Popularly known as 'Attila', Mark took Italian soccer by storm last season, plundering goals in his early days with A.C. Milan. After suffering a knee injury the former Coventry City and Portsmouth striker began to find life more difficult as defenders came to grips with his all action style.

**MARK MCGHEE** (Hamburg)

Mark could not have got off to a worse start with the German Club when he was sent off in his first game. Not a lot has gone right for him since and it may well be that the former Aberdeen striker will be looking homeward when his contract expires:- maybe sooner.



**GRAEME SOUNESS** (Sampdoria)

The former Anfield midfield star fitted in so well with Sampdoria last season it appeared as though the Scotland International had been playing in Italian football all his life. His inspirational Captaincy and influential midfield play was Liverpool's loss and Sampdoria's gain. Graeme will be hoping to lead Scotland in Mexico next year.

**RAY WILKINS** (A.C. Milan)

The so often criticised midfield player found Italian soccer to his liking. The slower pace accommodated his style of play to perfection. Regarded as somewhat predictable in his style of play at Chelsea and Manchester United the Italian fans will be hoping Ray can mastermind a Milan challenge for the League title, particularly now that Paulo Rossi will be teaming up alongside Mark Hateley.

**GORDON COWANS** (Bari)

Cruelly unfortunate to break his leg two years ago, the former Aston Villa midfield star will be seeking to re-surrect a career that promised so much, not only at Club level but also International. No doubt that a change of club may be beneficial for Gordon who was all set to move to Italy once before until the deal was nullified.

**PAUL RIDEOUT** (Bari)

From Shrivenham Road to Italian soccer was a dream come true for Paul, his move to Bari will at least have secured financial security for the Villa leading marksman of last season. Paul will be hoping to emulate some of his predecessors who have become Britain's ambassadors from the soccer world. Everyone at the County Ground will be hoping that Paul makes his mark in Italian soccer this season.



# Backtrack

Swindon first met Northampton in the First Division of the Southern League way back in November 1901, when we lost 3-1 at home. The return on 22nd February saw us go down by a massive 8-0, which is their biggest victory to date over us, and Swindon finished bottom of the League. Our first win over the Cobblers didn't occur until two years later, when we beat them 2-0 at home on 23rd April 1904, and our first away victory wasn't until April 15th 1911, when we won by the only goal of the game. That season we gained our first Championship, and Northampton were runners-up - two season earlier the positions had been reversed!

With the Southern League First Division becoming the Football League Third Division for 1920-21, the first encounter between the two Clubs came on March 28th 1921, when goals from Harold Fleming and Fred Hawley gave us a 2-1 victory. This score line was repeated the following day at Northampton, this time Dave Rogers getting the goals. Our first League defeat by the Cobblers came the following season, in the now regionalised Third Division, when we lost 2-1 away, and the first home set back came on 3rd April 1926, again by 2-1, Jimmy Clarke getting our consolation.

Notable pre-war victories came when we scored five on three occasions, all at home, the first being in November 1925 with none in reply. Seven years later, in April 1931, a 5-1 win was recorded - Harry Morris getting a hat-trick with Frank Richardson and Alec Cruickshank adding the others. The third came on 2nd March 1935, when a win of five goals to three was notched up. On the other hand, Northampton managed a 6-0 win on their home ground in September 1932, and scored four on another three occasions.

There are two other pre-war encounters worth mentioning, the first came on 26th February 1936, when we met in the Semi-Final of the Southern Section Cup - a forerunner of what is now the Freight Rover Trophy. Alan Fowler gave us the goal that brought victory, but Swindon lost 5-2 on aggregate to Coventry in the Final. The Second is when we travelled to Northampton on 26th August 1939 and lost 1-0, but the result was nullified just over a week later when the League was suspended due to the outbreak of the war.

When football resumed in 1946, the first game of the season was a visit to Northampton, where we lost 4-1, Gordon 'Slacker' Williams getting ours in front of 11,937. However, there is little of note until September 17th, 1949, when we inflicted our biggest victory to date over the Cobblers. Goals from Harry Lunn, Morris Jones (2), Jimmy Bain, Maurice Owen and Tommy Dawson gave us a 6-1 victory with 15,219 present.

Honours were then fairly well divided until Northampton became founder members of the Fourth Division in 1958-59, and we didn't meet again until 1961, after their promotion. The following season they took three points off us, winning 3-2 here in August, and a 1-1 draw in the return, and were promoted as Champions, with us as runners-up. But after two seasons together in the Second Division we parted again, Northampton going up, Swindon down. Together again for the two seasons 1967-69, Swindon came close to the record win of 1949 when, on November 26th 1968, we won 6-2 away from home - John Smith, Don Rogers (2), Roger Smart, Don Heath and Peter Noble

Promotion for us saw that we didn't meet again 'till 1976-77, when we played each other four times, Swindon taking three Third Division points, but losing 3-4 over two legs of the League Cup. Relegation for the Cobblers saw our paths didn't cross until we joined them in the basement in 1982, in which we've only recorded two victories in six meetings to date.



# In Town Tonight

After finishing in ninety-first position in last seasons Canon League it would appear from early season form that Northampton Town with Manager Graham Carr in his first full season in charge of team affairs will be finishing this season on a higher note.

A narrow 3-2 defeat at Burnley on the opening day of the season was followed by a goal-less draw at Peterborough United in the Milk Cup four days later. The following Bank Holiday Monday 'The Cobblers' achieved their first win of the season with a 2-1 away win at Exeter City. Having to share their ground with the County Cricket Club it was not until last week-end that they played their first home match when they defeated Mansfield Town 1-0 from a penalty scored by Phil Cavenier.

With several new faces in this seasons line-up these are the players Graham Carr the Northampton Town Manager will select from for this evenings match.

Goalkeeper PETER GLEASURE (24) began his career with Millwall, where he played in the team that won the F.A. Youth Cup. After joining Northampton on loan in 1983 he joined the Club on a permanent basis the following summer. He completed a century of League appearances in the final League match of the season.

The back four of Northampton's early season matches has consisted of PAUL CURTIS (22) a close season signing from Charlton Athletic on a free transfer, Paul made seventy-two appearances for the Valley Club including 28 last season. He is partnered in defence by the following three players, newcomer IAN DAWES (20) is a former England Schoolboy International who joined Northampton this summer from Newcastle United. Aldershot born he made his League debut in this seasons opening day match at Burnley. Central defender RUSSELL LEWIS (28) joined Northampton in 1983 after making one hundred and eighty one League appearances here at the County Ground. Russell made his ninetieth League

appearance for 'The Cobblers' in the first match of this season at Burnley. Full back BRIAN MUNDEE (21) made his seventieth appearance for the Club in League matches at the beginning of this season at Burnley. Brian joined Northampton from Bournemouth after making only four League appearances for the South Coast Club.

Twenty-two year old RICHARD HILL joined Northampton from Gola League Nuneaton during the summer. His previous experience of professional football came with Leicester City and spells abroad in New Zealand and Finland. He will appear in midfield alongside ADRIAN MANN (18) who joined the Club on the Youth Training Scheme originally. His 37 League appearances last season took his total of League matches to thirty-nine. Born in North Shields twenty-four year old PHIL CAVENER had played for Burnley, Bradford City on loan and Gillingham before joining Northampton in 1984. Phil made 24 League appearances last season before a heel operation caused him to miss the final weeks of the season.

After spells with Sheffield United, West Brom, Notts County and Peterborough, IAN BENJAMIN (23) a former England Youth International enjoyed his best season last term when he scored 18 League goals, including two hat-tricks from forty four League appearances. Ian scored his first goal of this season in the 2-1 win at Exeter on August 26th.

TREVOR MORLEY (23) was bought from Nuneaton Borough along with RICHARD HILL this summer for a combined fee of £30,000. Capped five times for the England Non-League Team, he made an immediate impression for 'The Cobblers' by scoring in both of their opening matches. On his debut at Burnley and the following League match at Exeter City.

Two more players to join Northampton during the summer from non-League football are GRAHAM REED (24) who was

signed from Frickley Athletic. Graham scored on his debut at Burnley in the opening match of the season. And GERALD NOHILLY (19) from Kent Club Sheppey United who was given a successful trial pre-season with 'The Cobblers'.

Former England Youth International MARK SCHIAVI (21) joined the Club from Bournemouth this summer. The former West Ham apprentice made eighteen League appearances for the Third Division Club last season.

PHIL CHARD also joined the Club during the close season from Peterborough United for whom he made 25 League appearances last season. Twenty year old Corby born, Phil made one hundred and

seventy two League appearances during seven seasons with the London Road Club.

# Insight

I expect many of you have purchased this programme from a young lady in a red suit and perhaps wondered who she is. She is, in fact, one of ten members of the staff of Lowndes Lambert Group Ltd., who have volunteered to give up their spare time to assist the Club in this way and we are grateful to them.

I have been requested by the Football League to bring to your attention the regulations of the ground, regulations which are of course common to all grounds and written by the League. They are as follows:-

1. All matches are played in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of The Football Association and The Football League and the Laws of the Game.
2. Play cannot be guaranteed to take place on any particular day or at any particular time and the Club reserves the right to change its advertised fixtures without notice and without liability.
3. No refund of any cash admission charge paid at the turnstile will be made.
4. Refunds will be made in respect of seats booked in advance and paid for where a match is postponed, subject to a time limitation, details of which can be obtained from the Box Office.
5. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.
6. With the exception of authorised press representatives holding official passes, the taking of photographs or cine photography inside the Ground is prohibited. In addition, no recording whether for Radio or Television or for private purposes and whether for transmission or otherwise is permitted save with a special authorisation in writing by the Club.
7. Only persons specifically authorised in writing by the Club are permitted to distribute without charge or offer for sale in the Ground any Newspapers, Periodicals or any other articles.

8. Unnecessary noise such as that from the use of Radio sets and behaviour likely to cause confusion or nuisance of any kind including foul or abusive language is not permitted in any part of the Ground.

9. The climbing of floodlight pylons, stands or other buildings in the Ground is forbidden.

10. The consumption of intoxicating liquors is permitted only in authorised places and in accordance with the Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol etc.) Bill 1985.

11. Fireworks, smoke canisters, bottles, glasses, cans, flags, banners, poles and other similar articles or containers, including anything which could or might be used as a weapon, are not permitted within the Ground, and any person in possession of such an article or container may be refused entry or ejected from the Ground.

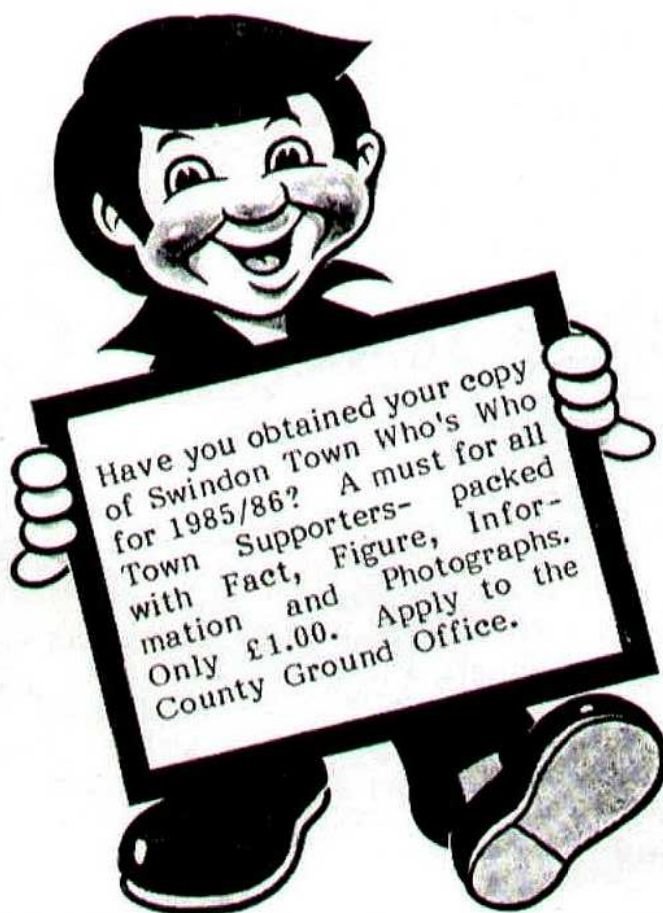
