



The F.A. Cup always gets the heart running a little faster in football. It's a special competition for everyone involved with a club; the players, the manager and the fans.

That's especially true when local teams play each other. Swindon are our opponents tonight after the draw at the County ground on Sunday.

And we've had our fair share of Derby cup ties in recent seasons. It makes for a great game, I think, although the result isn't always what you want it to be.

But the League form can go right out of the window when the Cups come around.

Cup games are a one-off. In fact the competition as a whole is a one-off, and it can effect the Club in one of two ways if a run gets going.

For some Clubs it can be a terrible distraction from the bread and butter of the League.

If a team is riding high in the League it's often better for them to be knocked out, so their attention doesn't get diverted.

Cup runs can turn a great season into a bad one very quickly.

For most Clubs, though, a Cup run helps to create a tremendous amount of interest. Swindon's Milk Cup exploits this season are a good example of that.

And a good run in the Cup can spur the players on too when they play in the League. Suddenly an average season can turn into a race for promotion come Easter time.

For us, like most Third and Fourth Division Clubs the immediate Cup aim is to get to the Third Round in January and hope for a plum tie.

Getting a home draw with someone like Manchester United or Liverpool gives a Club a huge lift and helps the finances as well.

We've not had a reputation as giant killers like some of our neighbours. There's Yeovil, Hereford and of course Swindon.

But there's always time, and wouldn't it be nice to do it this year.

That's another problem with the Cup match, it gets you dreaming.

# Introducing . . .

Despite drawing at the County Ground on Sunday, City know they will have to work hard this evening to progress to the next round. With just one defeat in their last thirty matches, Swindon have moved up amongst the leaders in Division Four and are currently only 4 points behind top of the table Chester. In addition, they have already shown their cup fighting qualities by reaching the Fourth Round of the Milk Cup, having accounted for Lawrie McMenemy's Sunderland and First Division Sheffield Wednesday along the way, Indeed, had it not been for tonight's replay taking preference over the Milk Cup competition, the Wiltshire side would have met their Fourth Round opponents, Ipswich, this week. The Club then is very much on a crest of a wave at the moment and the credit for their success must go to player-manager LOU MACARI.

The holder of 24 Scottish caps, Aberdeen born Lou began his career at Celtic before joining Manchester United for a fee of £200,000. While at Old Trafford, the diminutive Scot made almost 400 appearances netting 88 goals. This is his first managerial job having been appointed in July 1984 and he has become a firm favourite with the fans. His appearances this season have been infrequent but he is available to step into the team to add his considerable experience when necessary.

The manager has added several new faces to the team, one of his latest signings being goalkeeper KEN ALLEN. His league chance came after a successful spell with Bath City. It was Bournemouth who signed him and while at Dean Court, he made over 150 appearances for the Club. After a short spell at Bury and Peterborough Ken moved to Torquay. After two seasons at Plainmoor he moved to Swindon in September. A regular in Swindon's League side, he's missed out on the the Club's Milk Cup run, having played for Torquay against Swindon in the first round. With SCOTT ENDESBY, last season's custodian, determined to leave the Club and currently on loan to Carlisle, loan signing RICHARD KEY from Brentford is understudying Allen. An experienced keeper, he became a Swindon hero in their win over Sheffield Wednesday.

For fullback CHRIS RAMSEY the F.A. Cup holds happy memories. He was a member of the Brighton team that reached the F.A. Cup finals a couple of seasons ago. He played in the first game against Manchester United which ended 2-2 but was injured and missed the replay which Brighton lost 4-0. Chris

began his career as an amateur here at Ashton Gate before joining Brighton. It was at the start of last season that he joined Swindon after a period on loan. His partner for League matches has been 19-year-old NICKY COLEMAN who is on loan from Millwall. The Second Division Club do not want him 'cup-tied' and have refused permission for him to play for Swindon in this tie. His place is likely to go to either CHARLIE HENRY or PAUL ROBERTS.

Acton born Henry is a former apprentice who signed professional in February 1980. He made his League debut in the following season, and is now approaching 150 appearances for the Club. The majority of his first team outings have been at fullback but he can also play in the centre of the defence, as can new signing Roberts. He made 146 appearances for Millwall where he became a professional after serving his apprenticeship at the Den. It was onto Brentford, where he made over 50 appearances before joining Swindon in the close season on a free transfer.

Another new signing COLIN CALDERWOOD has brought added ability to the Swindon defence. The 20-year-old Scot left Mansfield, where he had 100 first team games in the summer to come to the County Ground and has formed a promising partnership at the centre of the defence with DAVID COLE. Signed from Swansea last season, Barnsley born David started at Sunderland but didn't make the first team at Roker Park. He made 20 appearances for Swindon in the League last season.

With the manager pushing for a midfield place, the men in possession can't afford to be complacent. LEIGH BARNARD is seen at his best on the left side of midfield. Leigh served his apprenticeship at Portsmouth where he made 79 appearances. The loan spell at Peterborough was followed by a move to the County Ground in June 1982. DAVE HOCKADAY joined Swindon in the 1983 close season from Blackpool, his only other Club. A tricky speedy player he needs

to be closely watched, as does ANDY ROWLAND.

Derby born Andy, served his apprenticeship at the Baseball Ground, but it was Bury who provided him with League football. A consistent scorer at Gig Lane, he joined the Wiltshire Club in September 1978. He continued to score goals but has proved himself a useful defender in the last couple of seasons.

Another close season signing DEREK HALL, has appeared in midfield having joined the Club for a small fee from Torquay. Derek missed only one game for the Devon Club last season. 20-years-old, he served his apprenticeship at Coventry where he made one senior appearance. Swindon were more than pleased with the progress made last season by striker COLIN GORDON. Having joined the Club from Oldbury United, he finished as leading scorer with 17 goals. He's continued to find the net this season, as has PETER COYNE. Peter began his career at Manchester United when Lou Macari was at Old Trafford. Opportunities were limited there to just two games and he drifted out of League soccer for a while before Crewe signed him. After almost 150 games there, he was released and returned to non-league football with Hyde United. It was there that he was approached by the Swindon manager and persuaded back into the action again. He certainly justified the faith put in him by scoring 16 goals last season.

Swindon have also struck it lucky with another striker. BRIAN WADE couldn't have had a better start at the County Ground having signed from Trowbridge Town he scored a hat-trick for the reserves against Spurs and then scored on his first team debut. To cap a fairy tale start he knocked in two goals in the Milk Cup defeat of Sunderland. All this after being released from Gola League Bath City where he languished in their Western League side for much of his time at Twerton Park.

# Richard Latham Robins' Diary



DAVID TONG didn't need to be asked twice when Terry Cooper offered him the chance to stay at Ashton Gate until the end of the season.

That had been the 30-year-old midfield player's target from the moment he accepted a one-month trial with City. And it took him just four appearances to achieve it.

"I am delighted. As soon as I arrived at the Club I felt at home and the facilities would attract any player," said David.

"I was confident I could do the job the manager wanted in midfield, but a month is not long in which to prove yourself and I was under a certain amount of pressure.

"Fortunately I had a successful debut against Wolves when the whole team played superbly and I have been reasonably happy with my form in the games since.

"I was a bit worried after our goalless home draw with Brentford when I was below par, but that was a very tough match and I think the manager had made up his mind about me by then."

David's next aim is to help City mount a promotion challenge – something he still considers a realistic possibility this season.

"We haven't had much luck in front of goal since I arrived, but no team have outplayed us and I see nothing to be scared of in the Third Division," he said.

"We have some ground to make up, but with a good squad of players I am sure we can get into a challenging position."

David, who lives in Cardiff, is experienced enough to know what he is talking about. He made over 350 League appearances for Blackpool, Shrewsbury and Cardiff City, helping the latter two clubs win promotion in his first season with them.

The 23-year-old Welshman signed for Fourth Division Tranmere Rovers after spending two months with the Birkenhead Club on loan.

Rarely can a player have had such an up and down spell with one Club. Mark had an outstanding end to last season after joining City on a free transfer from Swansea and tightened the defence considerably.

But after being rewarded with an extended contract in the summer nothing went right for him. On his own admission he returned from the close season break not fully fit and lost his form completely.

"City fans did not see the best of me this season and I regret that very much," said Mark. "I lost both fitness and form and things piled up on me a bit.

"I desperately needed a change of atmosphere and moving to Tranmere on loan was the perfect tonic. I recovered my confidence in League football and results improved steadily.

"To start with, it was my intention to return and fight for my place with City, but it soon became clear there was no future for me at Ashton Gate.

"So when Tranmere offered me a contract until the end of next season on similar terms to those I received with City I was happy to accept."





# WHY CITY? Subject - FOOTBALL SECRETARY

Jean Harrison describes herself as "an ordinary woman who has to work for a living in a unique environment" which has made her "far happier and more contented than ever before".

Jean is one of eleven women Football League Club Secretaries in the male-dominated world of football administration, so how did she come to be one of this select team?

"I was born in Bristol but moved away only to return 12 years ago. I had been in my previous job for about 4½ years and felt in need of a change when I answered an advertisement in a local paper for the position of assistant to Bob Twyford. I didn't



know much about Bristol City except for the fact that the Club had been through hard times financially, but having just been promoted from Division Four the future looked promising."

After having been in the job for less than a year, Bob Twyford, Secretary at the time, gave notice of his intention to quit due to a general disillusionment in the game as a whole. This left Jean to ponder who her next boss would be.

"I was concerned at the thought of having to work with someone new. Bob had always been a great help and we worked well as a team. When Chairman Des Williams asked how I felt about taking over the reins I replied that I would not be able to handle all the facets of the job in its present format, but the Club's appointment of John Hillier to specialise in commercial matters gave me the spur to show the board that I could back their judgment."

Jean normally starts work around 9.15 a.m. in a job that requires attendance 6 days a week. It can be a thirteen hour day when there is an evening fixture but she says that, "there is no typical day because each one brings with it different tasks and problems. I never know what's going to be in the post or what the next telephone call is going to be about, but that's what makes the job so interesting."

Jean describes the most difficult part of her job as dealing with the paperwork concerned with Player registrations and contracts which have to be drawn up in accordance with the strict guidelines laid down by the League and F.A. With the level of transfer activity that has taken place during her time with the Club she has had plenty of practice but says, "I don't think I would be very popular with Terry Cooper if a Player couldn't make his debut through my failure to complete the

forms correctly or missing the 48 hour transfer deadline and, the prospect of seeing a League table for any of the Club's four teams with the remark, points deducted for fielding an unregistered player does not bear thinking about."

Jean finds that Players moderate their language when she is around and through dealing with matters like finding digs for young apprentices she doesn't deny being looked on as a mother figure at the Club.

When asked about her most memorable match Jean says she has only seen one in full in her whole life, away at Swansea last season, and she adds, "I'm lucky if I get to see 15 or 20 minutes of second half action on matchdays".

As for the future, Jean would like to have the time to promote greater family involvement in the Club, along the lines of what has been achieved at Watford.

What does Jean think about football's hooligan problem? "The media constantly draw the general public's attention to it but they never refer to the general improvement in terms of lack of incidents this season which has been no more evident than at Ashton Gate."

Finally, when asked her views on the prospect of Sunday soccer she said "Give me a break, that's the only day I get with my two grown-up children in our Henleaze home!!"


