THE TOWN CRIER BACKTRACKS WITH MIKE SKINNER

10 Years Ago - December 1975

On the sixth Swindon travelled to Mansfield, the only team below the Town in the League, trying for their third consecutive victory. But the Stags had other ideas, netting three times to the Town's one, a 50th minute effort from Peter Eastoe, with their third coming from our former striker Ray Clarke. A week later Swindon left the worry of the League behind as they paid a visit to Claremont Road, Hendon, for the Second Round of the F.A. Cup. 3,349 saw the visitors struggle and eventually go through thanks to a David Moss penalty 14 minutes from time.

Back to the League seven days later and a trip to Sealand Road, Chester, where, despite Trevor Anderson giving us the lead one minute into the second period, the Town slumped to a 2-1 reverse. However, within a week Swindon pulled off one of the shock results of the season. Playing hosts to top five Club Cardiff City on Boxing Day, the Town managed to net four times without reply! No doubt inspired by the large crowd of 10,003 Anderson gave us the lead after 25 minutes, Eastoe adding the second on the stroke of half-time. Frank Burrows and Wilf Dixon completed a fine victory that unfortunately did nothing to our League position of 23rd. Twenty-four hours later a point was gained in a creditable goal-less draw at Millwall.

20 Years Ago - December 1965

The first Saturday of the month, the 4th, saw us engaged in the Second Round of the F.A. Cup, away at Grantham. After a goal-less first-half in which the home side were unlucky not to be two up, Swindon dominated the second, scoring six times in a sixteen minute spell. Eric Weaver started the rout in the 53rd minute, followed by goals from Mel Nurse, Dennis Brown, Roger Smart (2), and Keith East who surprisingly only managed one. A week later it was back to League action and a trip just further up the road to Scunthorpe, where we were unlucky to go down 2-1 in front of 4,303. The game remained goal-less until

the second-half when, after a 10 minute break due to floodlight failure, the home side scored two quick goals. Although Swindon managed to pull one back through Dennis Brown the draw was unobtainable. As a result we slipped to eleventh spot.

Our home game with second placed Millwall the following Saturday was postponed, so it was to be sixteen days before action was again seen. Swindon making the trip to Cleethorpes to challenge third placed Grimsby. A bumper crowd of 12,284 saw the visitors gain a creditable draw, sharing four goals with the hosts. Keith East and Dennis Brown getting ours, one in each half, to take us to seventh spot. The return on the next day was also called off - there had now been no first team action at the County Ground since November 20th.

30 Years Ago - December 1955

Swindon opened the month entertaining Watford to a goal-less draw on the third, before playing hosts to then Non-League Peterborough United on the 10th for a F.A. Cup Second Round game. critics, with some justification, were predicting our exit, and this looked to be on the cards as we went in one down at the interval. However Maurice Owen scored in the 68th minute to force a replay in front of 23,983 - nearly three times our League 'gate'. In the replay the following Thursday afternoon Andy Micklewright put us in front after 21 minutes, but the home side equalised in the second-half to force extra-time. However Jimmy Cross completed the job in our favour with his goal in the 113th minute.

Two days later we gained another League point, thanks to a Southampton own-goal at the County Ground, before travelling to Shrewsbury on Christmas Eve. Jim Brennan scored our equaliser to notch up his one and only League goal in the I-I draw. Forty-eight hours later 9,082 saw another home point gained from the goalless draw with Crystal Palace.



The first half of this season has seen pride and passion return to the County Ground. Emotions that have been missing during recent seasons as the Club appeared to stagnate in the wastes of Fourth Division soccer. The visits of Sunderland and Sheffield Wednesday in this season's Milk Cup competition aroused those dormant feelings. That were commonplace only five years ago – as Swindon Town reached the Semi-Finals of the Football League Cup. Those nights of old have returned due to the passion instilled in players who had come to accept all to easily that it was their forte to be second best.

Lou Macari knows only one way to attempt to do anything. He tackles everything with pride, passion and purpose. A willing gambler on and off the pitch. He tackles situations with the odds-on occasions stacked against him - but he is a winner and Swindon Town have lacked that for far too long.

It is difficult at the half way stage of a season to put events into perspective and perception can become clouded in blossom time. Autumn came with Swindon Town trailing the majority of the Fourth Division. Not by design but more because of the inability of Preston North End to fulfil a mid-September League fixture. The more experienced of soccer managers will always prefer to have points in hand than matches.

The influx of new faces introduced to the County Ground playing staff during the summer months naturally frook time to settle. To the unbiased observer the aquisition of Colin Calderwood looked a move of outstanding judgement. Early season injury to Chris Kamara and David Moss a cruel blow - a second half bonus to come? The emergence of Bryan Wade was further recommendation that non-league soccer is not scoured so frequently as some

in the football League would have you believe. Both Peter Coyne and Colin Gordon provide testimony to that fact.



Derek Hall and Tony Evans have taken time to settle. While Jake Findlay was Lou Macari's only folly. The diffident Scott Endersby sought fresh pastures, while the giant Kenny Allen proved that he had the experience to right an achiles heel situation.

Richard Key rescued the Club from an embarresment with a display that no one had a right to expect. A display of calmness in the frantic atmosphere generated by the visit of First Division giants Sheffield Wednesday in the Milk Cup.

Nights of Old

The Club's League position began to improve almost unnoticed. October a month of autumn gold as Lou Macari took the Bell's Whisky Manager of the Month Award as his charges did him proud. League victories at home to Exeter City, Rochdale and Stockport County were matched by outstanding wins in the Milk Cup against Second Division Sunderland and First Division Sheffield Wednesday.

More importantly for Swindon Town's long term future. The away success in League matches on consecutive Saturdays at Burnley and Chester saw the Club enter

Hartlepool United.

Promotion was always Lou Macari's main aim, Cup success a welcomed bonus. Can the diminutive Scot with a heart as large as his person become only the third Manager in the Club's history to take Swindon Town to promotion?

Next May will provide that answer, there is still a long way to go. Many pitfalls ahead, hurdles to be overcome, some still within his team selection. The team is still minus a natural full back with the on loan signing of Nicky Coleman plugging a gap at present. Goalscoring



the forthcoming winter months in contention for one of the coveted four promotion places.

The F.A. Cup provided a first round exit for the second consecutive season. Compensation was financial as nearly twenty thousand attended the two ties with Bristol City. The two matches were a tribute to soccer at a lower level and the improved behaviour shown at the previously beleagured fixture.

A win by the odd goal in three against Mansfield Town as November came to a close, saw Swindon Town enter the framework for promotion for the first time this season when they took Fourth position behind Chester City, Southend and has not come so easily this season. Hence the introduction in November of another loan signing - David Bamber from Portsmouth.

Lou Macari is aware of what lies ahead, his gambling instincts serve him well. The odds on promotion this season? Unfortunately they may not be determined by playing results. But on the whims of some of the First and Second Division elite.

With money a rarity following Christmas and the January sales. If you have a little left. Take a small risk! The odds are that Lou Macari has got it right. Bargains and sales are also his game. When knights of old were so bold! He has given you a glimpse of the past and maybe the future?



The Town Crier sees Hereford

Although the Edgar Street Club entered their December League programme with an undefeated record in home matches. Their performances in away matches has

paled in comparison.

For the only points that they have collected have been from two victories at Northampton (3-1) and Wrexham (1-0). Their only other point came in sharing the honours in a 1-1 draw at Edgeley Park

against Stockport County.

Hereford's catalogue of misfortune in their remaining away matches has been as follows:- AUGUST - Mansfield Town (0-4), Crewe Alexandra (0-2). SEPTEMBER - Chester City (0-1), Preston North End (0-2). OCTOBER - Hartlepool United (1-3), Scunthorpe United (1-2). DECEMBER - Halifax Town (0-1).

Along with Aldershot and Torquay United, we have provided the Edgar Street Club with their three most convincing scorelines in League matches this season. When we lost 4-1 on August 24th. Two first half goals in the space of five minutes had given United a interval lead. Colin Calderwood with his first goal for us, had reduced the arrears in the sixty-fourth minute. But further goals in the last fifteen minutes by Ian Dalziel and Stewart Phillips scored past a forlorn Jake Findlay, left the issue well beyond our reach at the final whistle.

The following players have been selected by Manager John Newman this season:-

Evesham born, KEVIN ROSE (25) has only appeared in League Football for United. Although he spent a short period with Lincoln City beforehand. Kevin was one of three United players who appeared in all forty-six League matches last season.

Local born CHRIS PRICE (25) has now made over three hundred League appearances for United, his only League club. Chris is a full back who likes to attack, hence his five League goals last season. The former Edgar Street apprentice has also scored twice this season in home League matches against Aldershot and Rochdale in October. Chris was also on the mark in United's 5-1 home win against Bristol City in the Milk Cup First Round match in August.

Twenty-six-year-old MEL PEJIC joined United in 1980 after making a solitary League appearance for Stoke City. The New Year should see the Newcastle-Under-Lyme defender make his two hundredth League appearance for United. Mel was ever present for United last season.

The former Newcastle United, Bury and Bristol City defender BRUCE HALLIDAY (24) has been out of action recently through injury. Sunderland born, the consistent central defender joined United on a free transfer from Bristol City in July. Bruce scored his first and only goal to date for Hereford in the 4-1 home win against Aldershot in October.

Twenty-nine-year-old WAYNE CEGIELSKI joined United on a free transfer from Blackpool last summer. The former Tottenham Hotspur apprentice had made the following appearances for his four previous League clubs, Northampton Town (11), Wrexham (123), Port Vale (92/5 goals)

and Blackpool (6).

With the influential JIMMY HARVEY currently serving a three suspension. A lot of responsibility will fall upon his fellow midfield players JOHN DELVE and PAUL MADDY. Since our defeat at Hereford in August, John (32) has failed to score again. Before joining United, the former Q.P.R. apprentice had made the following League appearances for :- Q.P.R. (15), Plymouth Argyle (132) and Exeter City (215). Paul a Welsh Under-21 International joined United from Swansea 1984 for £10,000. He previously appeared for United on loan from his first League Club Cardiff City.

Sunderland born, IAN DALZIEL (23), the former Derby County apprentice, has scored in all of United's 4-1 home wins this season against ourselves, Aldershot and Torquay United! Ian made 31 first team appearances for Derby County.

MIKE CARTER (25) is enjoying his most successful season with Hereford following a serious leg injury last season. The former Bolton and Plymouth Argyle player spent a five match loan period here at the County Ground in 1982. Mick scored a hat trick in United's 4-0 F.A. Cup

win at Yeovil last month.

Halifax born STEWART PHILLIPS (24) has been out of action with injury recently after appearing in all 46 League matches last season. Stewart who scored twice here at the County Ground last season in United's 3-0 win, also scored the fourth goal in our early season setback. He has now scored eighty goals for United in over

240 first team appearances. Newcomer IAN WELLS joined Hereford during the summer from Harrisons the West Midland non-league team. After scoring his first League goal at home against Burnley in September, he has since scored his other four goals in away matches at Stockport, Northampton, Scunthorpe and Wrexham.

The experienced OLLIE KEARNS (29) is now approaching 300 first team appearances and one hundred goals. Appearances made with Reading (99/43 goals), Oxford United (21/5), Walsall (42/12) and Hereford United (127/39). Ollie entered League soccer with the Elm Park Club from Banbury United in 1977.

Former Wolves winger PAUL BUTLER (21) joined the Molineux Club as an apprentice making thirty-three appearances for the Midland Club before joining United in 1984.





The recent dismissal Paul Richardson, our former Player-Coach from his position as Manager of Southern League Gloucester was City not without The irony was that the consternation. former Nottingham Forest and Stoke City player was dismissed and replaced by one of his own players. That player was also a former Swindon Town full back - Steve Scarrott.

The action taken by the Gloucester City Directors followed rumours which had circulated the Club for days previously. Paul Richardson left the Horton Road Club after only three and a half months in the job and with City third in the Southern League.

Paul Richardson was one of the few people unaware of the activity. He commented, 'I am dumfounded. How could they possibly justify sacking me when we are third'.

Steve Scarrott is City's fifteenth managerial appointment in twenty-two seasons. Those statistics failed to shake the Gloucester City Chairman Geoff Hester. He said, 'I do not care if I have to sack sixty-six managers so long as the sixty-seventh wins the Championship'.

The official reason for Paul Richardson's departure? 'Difficulties over communication and commitment'. Geoff Hester would not elaborate on those words but he said of City's position. 'We may be third but I think the table flatters us. We have yet to play any of the top four clubs'.

An argument which Paul Richardson found preposterous. 'They are just trying to wriggle out with flimsy excuses'. Paul said he intended to take legal action adding, 'As far as I am concerned I have done nothing wrong'.

Of the man now at the helm of the Gloucester Club - Steve Scarrott. Hester said, 'Steve is a popular figure on the local scene. He is an experienced Southern League player and an ideal choice'.



Steve moved to Horton Road from Cheltenham Town this season for his second spell with Gloucester City. The former Town full back played for Bath City upon leaving the County Ground. He joined Gloucester from Bath. Switched to Cheltenham and this season returned to Horton Road.

What did Steve say of his appointment. 'If I had not taken the job someone else would have. I am now into my 30's and there is not a lot more to achieve on the playing side'. He added, 'I am not too bothered by talk of pressures. You get those at any club. All I know is that by rights we should be top of the table by now. We have lost and drawn games we should have won'.

City lost their first match under Steve's management when Worcester City beat them 4-0 at Horton Road in the First Round of the F.A. Trophy. Steve could hardly have had a tougher baptism.
