## COLLECTORS CORNER

Tonight we feature **Derby County** in our unique series of 'AFC Nicknames' printed in 1933 by **Ogden's Cigarettes**. **Derby** have always been nicknamed the '**Rams**' since their formation in 1884. The name is believed to have come from the agricultural pursuits in the **Derby** area. **Derby** or the '**Rams**' were founder members of the **Football League** when they were admitted in 1888.

**DERBY COUNTY**

Derby County have always been called the 'Rams' and they are depicted for illustrative purposes in the guise of one of these sprightly animals. The derivation of the name is not obvious, but it is supposed to be drawn from the agricultural pursuits of the county; a mounted ram's head is hung in the director's room at the back of the stand. Founded in 1884 the County has been a prominent League club, several players having won great distinction. One of the most brilliant was Bloomer, who scored 352 goals in League matches and also obtained 28 in international matches. During his day Bloomer had no rival as an inside right.



## Swindon Aim for the Top

**Swindon Town** go into tonight's match looking for three points which will put them back on top of **Division Four**. So far this season they have won nineteen games out of twenty eight and lost eight games with only one draw. At home they have won 13, drawn none and lost only one scoring 29 goals and conceding just 12. Their form away from home is the fourth best in the League behind **Chester**, ourselves and **Northampton**. Their away statistics are won 6, drawn 1 and lost 7. They have surprisingly, only scored 10 away goals and conceded 17. They now have a total of 58 points and they are just two points behind **Chester**. Last week **Swindon** beat **Northampton** away by one goal to nil.

**Swindon** have already beaten **County 1-0** this season and so they will be looking to record a double over us tonight.

**BARNARD Leigh** (midfield) Born Worsely. Served his apprenticeship with Portsmouth and made his League debut for them at Exeter City in September 1977. Made 89 appearances for Pompey plus four on loan to Peterborough United before signing for Swindon Town in July, 1982. An enthusiastic player always in the thick of the action, he can play in any midfield position but is most effective playing wide. Last season he had a short loan period with Exeter City. Has made 115 appearances for the Town.

**CALDERWOOD Colin** (Defender) Born Stranraer. Previously with Mansfield Town for whom he made his League debut at Crewe Alexandra in March, 1982. A strong defender who was signed by Swindon in June, 1985

after 100 League appearances for the Field Mill Club, 41 of them last season. **COLE David** (Defender) Born Isle of Man. Signed for Swindon in February, 1985 from Swansea City where he had made eight appearances. He then made 20 appearances for Swindon last season, including some stylish displays at centre half.

**COYNE Peter** (Forward) Born Hartlepool. An Apprentice with **Manchester United**, his League debut at Aston Villa in February, 1976. He made one other appearance that season but was given a free transfer at the end. He was out of League football until August, 1977 when he began again for Crewe Alexandra for whom he made 133 League appearances and was three times leading goalscorer. Another free transfer in May 1981 saw him leave League football until Swindon signed him in August 1984 from Hyde United. Although he played some of last season in mid field he is seen at best up front beside the centre forward. He made 42 appearances last season.

**ENDERSBY Scott** (Goalkeeper) Born Lewisham. He appeared in an F.A. Cup tie for Kettering Town at the age of 15 but served his apprenticeship with Ipswich Town where he won England Youth Honours. He moved to Tranmere Rovers in the summer of 1981 and made his League debut against Hereford United in September of that year. He made 91 appearances for the Birkenhead Club and joined Swindon in July, 1983. Had made 82 League appearances for the Town to the end of last season.

**GORDON Colin** (Forward) Born Stourbridge. Although on non-contract forms with Wolverhampton Wanderers at one time Colin played non-League football with Worcester City, Bromsgrove Rovers and Oldbury United before signing for Swindon in November, 1984 at the age of almost 22. He scored on his debut at Rochdale

that month and went on to make 32 appearances and one substitute appearance. A bustling player who made such rapid improvement that he was voted Player of the Year by supporters.

**HALL Derek.** (Midfield) Born Manchester. Former Coventry City apprentice who made one appearance for that club at Birmingham City in September, 1982. At the end of the 1983/84 season he made 10 appearances on loan to Torquay United and after being released by Coventry City he joined the Plainmoor club full time. He made 45 League appearances last season and signed for Swindon in June, 1985.

**HENRY Charlie** (Defender) Born Acton. Former Swindon apprentice who signed professional in February, 1980 and made his first team debut in September of that year at Lincoln City. A popular and hard tackling player who has played mainly at right full back.

**HOCKADAY David** (Midfield) Born Billingham. Before joining Swindon in the summer of 1983 he had played 178 games over eight years with Blackpool, his only other club. A versatile player who now seems to have settled into a midfield role although he can play on the wing or in the forward line. Had made 533 appearances and four substitute appearances for Swindon at the end of last season.

**MOSS David** (Forward) Born Witney. Signed by Swindon from Witney Town and made his League debut against Watford in April, 1972. He went on to make 230 appearances for the club before a transfer to Luton Town in the summer of 1978. In seven seasons with Luton he saw promotion to Division One in 1982 and made around 230 more League appearances. Signed for Swindon the second time in June, 1985. A tricky winger who also has a good goal scoring record.

**PAYNE Mark** (Midfield) A Young player who made his first team debut against Bristol Rovers in the Milk Cup in September, 1984. Made three other

appearances last season, all as substitute.

**RAMSEY Chris** (Defender) Born Birmingham. Although an amateur with Bristol City his League debut came after signing for Brighton and was at Crystal Palace in April, 1981. He made 30 appearances for Brighton in the League but also played in the 1983 cup final where he broke a leg, missing the replay. A stylish full back, particularly when on the attack, he signed for Swindon in December, 1984 after a loan period earlier in the season. Made 32 League last season.

**WADE Brian** (Forward) Signed from non-League football in May, 1985 he was formerly with Bath City, Paulton Rovers and Trowbridge Town.



## Division 4 round-up

### Weekend Saturday 1st February

**Chester** and **Swindon** continued their lengthy battle at the top of Division 4 although both were faced with tricky matches at the weekend, **Chester** away at **Hereford** and **Swindon** away at **Northampton**. **Chester**, though, seemed to have little difficulty recording a 2-0 victory at **Hereford**. Their hero was striker **Gary Bennett** who scored both goals, one each side of half time and one from the penalty spot. A crowd of nearly 4,500 turned up at the **County Ground** to see revitalised **Northampton** take on **Swindon**. After a poor first half display from both teams, **Swindon's** **Charlie Henry** finally broke the deadlock with a priceless winner in the second half. These results left **Chester** top of the league with sixty points and **Swindon** in second place with fifty eight points, although still with a game in hand over the leaders.

The third club, **Mansfield Town**, remained five points behind **Swindon** even though they managed a 2-1 victory away at struggling **Wrexham**. **Nick Hencher** got the **Wrexham** goals but one each from **Cassells** and **Vinter** were enough to give **Mansfield** victory.

**Hartlepool** filled the final promotion place as they also won at home to **Burnley**. A goalless first half made for an exciting second half and under great pressure, **Burnley** gave away two penalties which were easily converted by **Shoulder**. **Unighan** grabbed a third for the home side and **Burnley's** solitary reply came from **Lawrence** to make a final scoreline of 3-1.

**Port Vale** and **Stockport** were both victorious completing a clean sweep of wins for the top six clubs. **Robbie Earle** grabbed two goals at home to fellow promotion candidates **Orient** as **Port Vale** recorded a 2-0 victory. **County's** three goals all came in the second half after a goalless first half saw **Crewe** striker **Dave Waller** sent off. **Andy Hodgkinson** opened the scoring for **County** and super striker **Mark Leonard** added two more to give **County** a very healthy 3-0 victory.

**Southend** kept up their now slim challenge for promotion with a 2-0 victory at home to **Exeter**. Despite the victory **Southend** slipped into eighth place, ten points behind the promotion places.

**Tranmere** also kept their very slight hopes alive with a 2-1 victory over **Scunthorpe United** but the Merseyside club are still thirteen points behind the promotion pack and twenty points off the leaders **Chester**.

Lower down the table, **Colchester** were held to a 2-2 draw away at **Hallifax** and goals from **Fleider** and **Stew** gave **Aldershot** a 2-1 home victory against **Cambridge United**. While **Colchester** and **Aldershot** remained mid-table, **Cambridge** and **Hallifax** slipped into twentieth and twenty first position respectively.


**GROUND FACTS:** The capacity at **Edgar Street** is 17,500 with 2,600 seats. The largest ever attendance was 18,114 in January, 1958 when they entertained **Sheffield Wednesday** in the Cup. The pitch size is 111 yards x 74 yards.

**NOTES:** **Edgar Street** first belonged to **Hereford City** who agreed to share the ground with **United** when they were formed in 1924. **United** became sole owners in 1939 when **City** went out of business.

**Hereford** built a cantilevered Main Stand in 1968 which helped to get them into the League and when they shot to Division Two in 1974 they built a second cantilever stand making them the only non-First Division club to have two cantilever stands.

This second cantilever stand is surprisingly narrow due to **Edgar Street** behind it and it does not follow the line of the pitch but **Edgar Street** and so the ends are further from the pitch than the centre.

**TRAVEL:** Follow **A49 Hereford** signs straight into **Edgar Street**.



At the very bottom of the league, **Torquay** entertained **Preston** and managed a rare 1-0 victory with a first half goal from **Compton**. Both **Torquay** and **Preston** seem destined to be re-election applicants at the end of the season.

In the eleven Fourth Division games there were twenty eight goals scored in seven home wins, just one draw and three away wins. A total of just over 25,000 people watched Division 4 football with the biggest crowd of 4,449 at **Northampton v Swindon** and the smallest crowd of 1,131 at **Aldershot v Cambridge**.


