NOTES

Today's visitors are Swindon Town, to whom we extend a warm welcome. They were last season's Fourth Division champions and are managed by former Manchester United and Scotland star Lou Macari. Lou has obviously instilled some of his fighting spirit into the side as they are currently lying in eight place in Division Three and are proving a hard team to beat.

After saying that, I will not settle for anything less than 3 points from today's game. I had said that we might get 6 points from the Gillingham and Swindon games and although the draw with Gillingham was one of our better games, I still considered it was two points lost rather than one won. Once again, our finishing was not up to the mark, for after Alan Smith had put us ahead with his first goal for the club, we had chances to go in at half-time two or three up.

The second half display was not as good and we dropped a point to a David Shearer goal (ex 'Boro). After today's game we have two away games at Bristol Rovers and Bury so I am looking for a win today to set the team up for two difficult games. On November 8th it should be a full house for the visit of Middlesbrough. It will be good to hear Feethams ringing to the roars and cheers of a local derby game. It certainly should be a bit special.

QUAKERS

WELCOME . . .

KENNY ALLEN (Goalkeeper) – Joined Swindon from Torquay in September 1985. The former Hartlepool, West Bromwich Albion and Bournemouth player collected a Fourth Division Championship medal in his first season with the club as he made 40 League appearances. Ken certainly settled a problem position for Lou Macari.

DAVE HOCKADAY (Defender) – The versatile former Blackpool player who moved to the County Ground from the Bloomfield Road club in the close season of 1983, proved a revelation in the Full-Back role he fulfilled in the second half of last season.

CHRIS RAMSEY (Defender) – The former Bristol City and Brighton Full-Back joined the County Ground staff on loan initially. Lou Macari secured his permanent transfer in December 1984. Chris, who suffered an unfortunate injury while appearing in the 1983 Brighton v Manchester United F.A. Cup Final at Wembley, made up for the disappointment of collecting a losers medal by collecting a Fourth Division Championship medal with Swindon last season.

TIM PARSONS (Defender) – Joined the County Ground staff from Bristol Rovers in July for a Football League Tribunal fee of £27,500. He had made 219 League appearances for Rovers after moving from Malmö (Sweden). He originally made his Football League debut with Blackburn Rovers for whom he made 13 League appearances.

DAVID COLE (Central Defender) – Signed for Swindon in February 1985 on a free transfer from Swansea. During the Wiltshire club's triumphant season, the former Vetch Field Defender missed only two League matches. Dave spent brief spells with St. Mirren and Sunderland before joining the South Wales club.

COLIN CALDERWOOD (Central Defender) – Without doubt Colin proved to be Lou Macari's outstanding signing as he built his championship winning team in the summer of 1985. The former Mansfield Defender attracted a lot of attention from First Division clubs last season with his brilliant displays.

CHRIS KAMARA (Midfield) – Chris rejoined the club for a second spell in August 1985 from Brentford for a £12,500 transfer fee. Absent through injury in the first half of last season, the former Portsmouth apprentice made 19 League appearances and 1 as substitute. Chris is one of the few players in the Football League to have played for two League clubs in different spells – Portsmouth and Swindon.

STEVE WHITE (Striker) – Steve was surprisingly given a free transfer at the end of last season by Bristol Rovers. After scoring 16 goals for the former Eastville club last season, Lou Macari fought off opposition from several Third Division clubs to obtain his signature in July. Steve was in his second spell with Rovers having been transferred to Luton for a fee of £200,000 in 1979. He later played for Charlton Athletic before his return to Rovers.

LEIGH BARNARD (Midfield) – Leigh recaptured the form that he displayed in his first season with the club after signing from Portsmouth in July 1982 in the Town's championship season. The previous season he had the unusual distinction of playing for Exeter City on loan against Swindon, while the situation was reversed when the two clubs met in the return fixture. Leigh then appearing for Swindon. Leigh spent a brief period on loan with Peterborough while with Portsmouth.

ANDY ROWLAND (Defender) – Andy is now Swindon's longest serving professional, having joined Swindon from Bury in September 1978 for a £80,000 fee. Tantalisingly placed on 99 League goals, the champagne remains on ice for the former Bury striker who has made a career total of 542 first team appearances during which he has scored 169 goals.

MARK CARDINER (Striker) – Progressed through the club's junior ranks to made his League debut against Mansfield in April 1984. Despite the fact that Mark has been a prolific goalscorer at Junior and Reserve team level, he has found his opportunities restricted to 5 League matches since his debut.

MARK HUGHES (Striker) – The local born Striker who formed a prolific goalscoring partnership with Mark Cardiner in the South East Counties League in the 1982/83 season made his only League appearance to date on March 6th 1984 against Northampton in a goal-less match at Swindon's County Ground.

JAMIE REYNOLDS (Midfield) – Regarded by many as Swindon's finest discovery in recent seasons. Jamie, an England Youth International, toured China during the close season with the England team. He made his League debut against Crewe Alexandra in March 1984 in a 1-1 draw at the County Ground.

CHARLIE HENRY (Midfield) – The former club apprentice was a revelation in his Midfield role of last season. Converted from his customary Full-Back position, Charlie astounded everyone by becoming the club's leading goalscorer with 18 League goals. He joined Swindon as a professional in February 1980.

MARTIN LING (Midfield) – Moved to the County Ground in July for a Football League Tribunal fee of £25,000 from Exeter. The St. James' Park club had set a fee of £115,000 originally. Martin had made 117 League appearances for the Devon club whom he had joined as an apprentice in 1982.

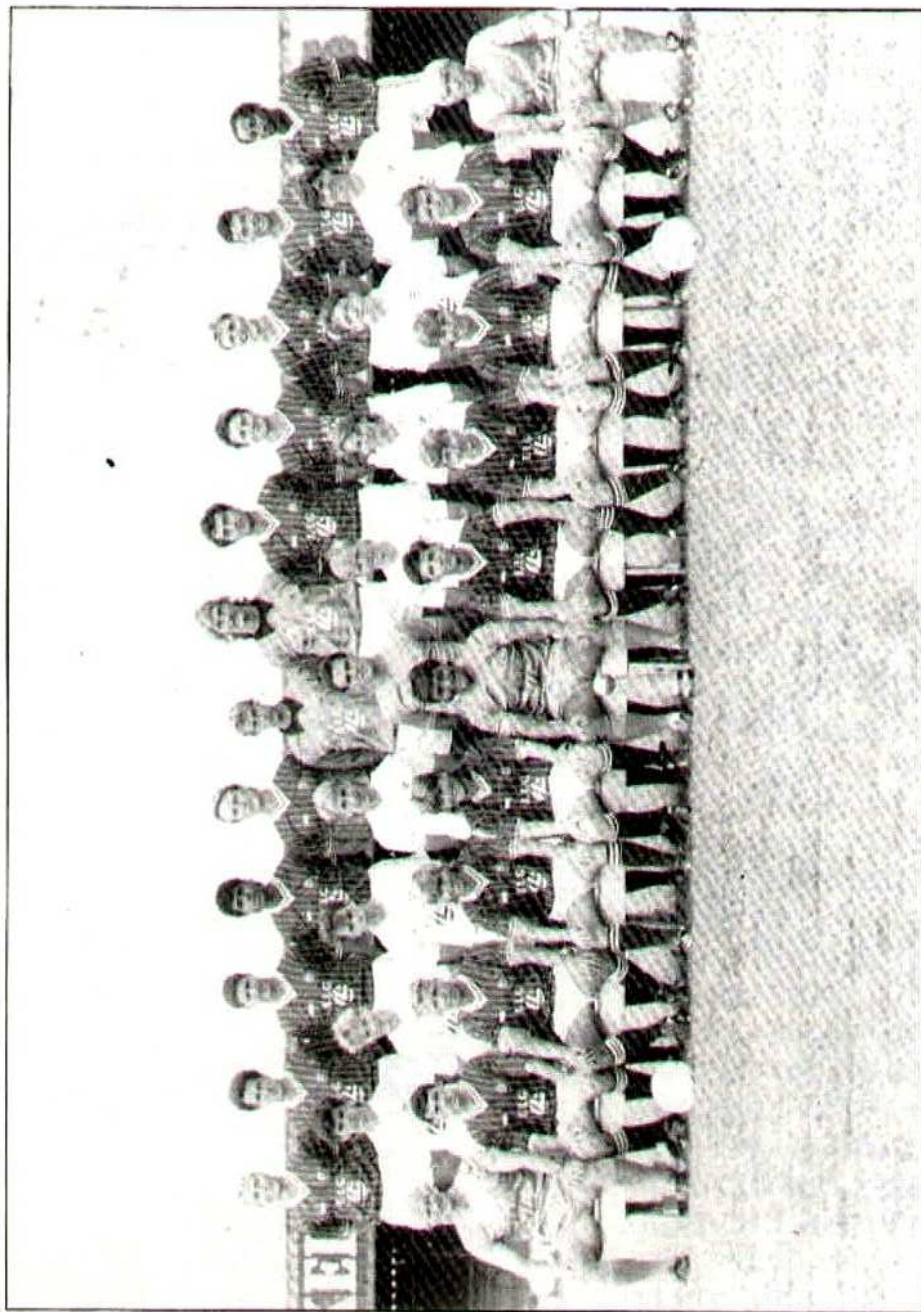
DAVE BAMBER (Striker) – Joined the club from Portsmouth for a fee of £15,000 in March 1986 after an initial period on loan. Previously with Blackpool, Walsall and Coventry, he brought a dimension to the team in the final matches leading to the Fourth Division Championship that had perhaps been lacking following Peter Coyne's early season injury. The fact that he scored 9 goals in the latter part of last season contributed greatly to the club's championship title.

PETER COYNE (Midfield/Striker) – The former Manchester United, Crewe Alexandra and Hyde United Striker was in brilliant form in the first half of last season. A stomach injury curtailed his season from the end of October as Peter struggled to regain form and fitness. Peter scored 11 goals from his 30 League appearances and 1 as substitute in last season's title win.

JIMMY O'LLIGAN (Striker) – Jimmy was the first of Lou Macari's summer signings as he bid to strengthen his line-up in preparation for Third Division soccer. Jimmy moved to the County Ground in June for a £31,500 transfer fee from Grimsby. He had only been with the Blundell Park club for one season following his £100,000 transfer in the previous summer from First Division Watford.

BRYAN WADE (Striker) – Bryan made a successful entry into League soccer last season from Southern League Trowbridge Town. To have finished with a championship medal in his first season of full-time soccer was beyond the former Bath City and Trowbridge Town's Striker's wildest dreams.

We welcome Swindon Town to Feethams this afternoon for only the fifth time in League competition, although we first met as long ago as 1911 in the F.A. Cup, well before either club joined the Football League. Our League encounters have all taken place in the last twenty years with the first being in Division Three in 1966/7 and then a trio of seasons in Division Four from 1982 to 1985. We also met twice in the early Sixties in the Football League Cup, once at Feethams and once down at the County Ground, Swindon.

Let's go back over seventy years to that first meeting between the sides in the F.A. Cup competition of 1910/11. The Quakers had made history by playing eleven games in eight rounds from the first qualifying round to the last sixteen: the highlight being a win over First Division Sheffield United at Bramall Lane. Swindon, too, had done their giant killing by defeating Arsenal on their way to the last sixteen. So on 26th February 1911 North Eastern League Darlington received Southern League Swindon Town at Feethams in front of over nine thousand spectators. Alas, the majority went home disappointed as Swindon ran out 3-0 winners and went on to meet Chelsea in the quarter-finals. It was fifty two years before the sides met again, this time in the second round of the Football League Cup at the County Ground, Swindon, in September 1962. Again Swindon triumphed; this time by four goals to nil. Only three years passed before we met again in the second round of the Football League Cup, but this time the Quakers had home advantage. It proved to be third time lucky for Darlington as goals from Bryan Conlon and Jim Lawton saw the Quakers through to round three. After the match, goal hero Jim Lawton was transferred to Swindon in a deal that saw Alan Sproates come to us in part exchange. The first League game between the clubs took

place in August 1966 and was our first away game in Division Three. Unfortunately it was a repeat of our previous visit four years before, as we went down 0-4. The return game at Feethams was on New Year's Eve that year and we repeated our previous performance by winning 2-1, with goals from Les O'Neill and Don Ratcliffe (penalty). At the end of that season we fell back into Division Four and did not meet Swindon again for fifteen years until they dropped into the Fourth Division in 1982. We recorded the double over them in 1982/3 winning at Feethams in November 1982 thanks to a single Alan Walsh goal and then recorded our first ever win at the County Ground in March 1983 by 2-1, with an own goal from 'keeper Jim Allan and a 25 yard drive from Dave McLean. The following season we won again here with a single Alan Walsh goal, this time a penalty, but lost by a Leigh Barnard goal in the return game. Two years ago in December 1984 we completed a hat trick of single goal wins here when Garry MacDonald hit the winner in front of a 6,099 Sunday crowd. We went to Swindon on 28th April, also a Sunday, in our penultimate away game desperate for points to secure promotion, but lost to an Alan Mayers goal late in the game.

We have won all four League games played here at Feethams against Swindon, so let's hope we can maintain this hundred per cent record this afternoon.

THIRD DIVISION SCENE

After losing each of their first three home games this season, Wigan have now won four in a row at Springfield Park and on Saturday they inflicted on Fulham their first away defeat of the season. They have now scored more home goals than any other Third Division club.

Meanwhile, Middlesbrough and Blackpool share, up to the time of writing, the distinction of being the only unbeaten away sides in the Football League. Both clubs won 3-1 on Saturday, against Walsall and Notts County respectively, and it is interesting that Middlesbrough's only home defeat this season was at the hands of Blackpool. Even so, their average gate of 8,029 is now the highest in Division Three.

By contrast, Carlisle's average of 3,137 is one of the lowest in the Division and their 1-0 defeat at Gillingham on Saturday leaves them without a goal in their last four away games, and in the relegation zone.

One of the clubs below Carlisle is Walsall, who despite a number of new signings, have picked up just six points from ten games so far. Their only consolation in the 3-1 defeat at Middlesbrough on Saturday was a debut goal from Trevor Christie, who two seasons ago scored a debut goal for Derby against Walsall. Much-

travelled Trevor, who has previously played for both Nottingham clubs and Leicester, and has just moved from Manchester City, is one of the few players in the Football League to have currently scored over a hundred goals at the rate of over 1 every 3 games.

Rotherham, another relegation-haunted club, eased their position a little by beating Bolton 1-0 on Saturday to maintain an excellent home record against Wanderers with four wins and two draws in their last six encounters. This was Rotherham's first win of the season and only the second time that Bolton have failed to score away from home this season.

Mansfield, who are now looking the most likely of the clubs promoted from Division Four last season, took their unbeaten record to 9 games on Saturday with a 1-1 draw at Chester, with Mike Stringfellow in his first season netting for the fourth time in succession. They have an excellent record at Chester with three wins and a draw in their last four visits.

After three successive defeats at Doncaster we were delighted to pick up a point there on Saturday, this being the first clean sheet that we had kept away from home since the goal-less draw at Walsall in March.

VISITING MANAGERS

Danny Williams managed Swindon during one of the most successful periods in their history and the success he enjoyed in management both there and at Rotherham showed just how well he had put into practice the experience he gained during his long career as a player.

Born in Rotherham in 1924, he played for Silverwood Colliery before linking up with Rotherham during the war years. He made his Football League debut as an inside forward in 1946. Soon he moved back to wing half where his prompting of ace strikers such as Wally Ardron and Gladstone Guest were a major factor in the way Rotherham dominated Division Three (North) in those early post-war years.

Three times they missed promotion by just one place and then they finally went up in 1950/1. Danny was still with them when they came within an ace of Division One in 1954/5, being pipped by a late burst from Birmingham City. After 459 League games and 19 goals, Danny hung up his boots in 1959/60. He then succeeded Tom Johnston as manager in 1962 and in his second season

at the helm the 'Millers' climbed as high as seventh.

They were still in Division Two when he moved on to Swindon in 1965 in succession to Bert Head. Mike Summerbee had just moved to Manchester City and Bobby Woodruff to Wolves, and Swindon had just slipped out of Division Two, but with such stalwarts as Peter Downsbrough in goal and Don Rogers up front, with Peter Noble filling in wherever needed, Danny kept them consistently in the top ten before the tremendous 'double' season of 1968/9 when they won the League Cup, beating Arsenal in extra time at Wembley, and topping Division Three. At that point he accepted an invitation to First Division Sheffield Wednesday and though they were relegated at the end of his first season, he at least halted the slide.

In 1971 he moved on to Mansfield and had three seasons with them in Division Four before returning to Swindon in 1974 and only just failing to take them into Division Two in his first season back. He stayed there until 1978, being succeeded by Bobby Smith.

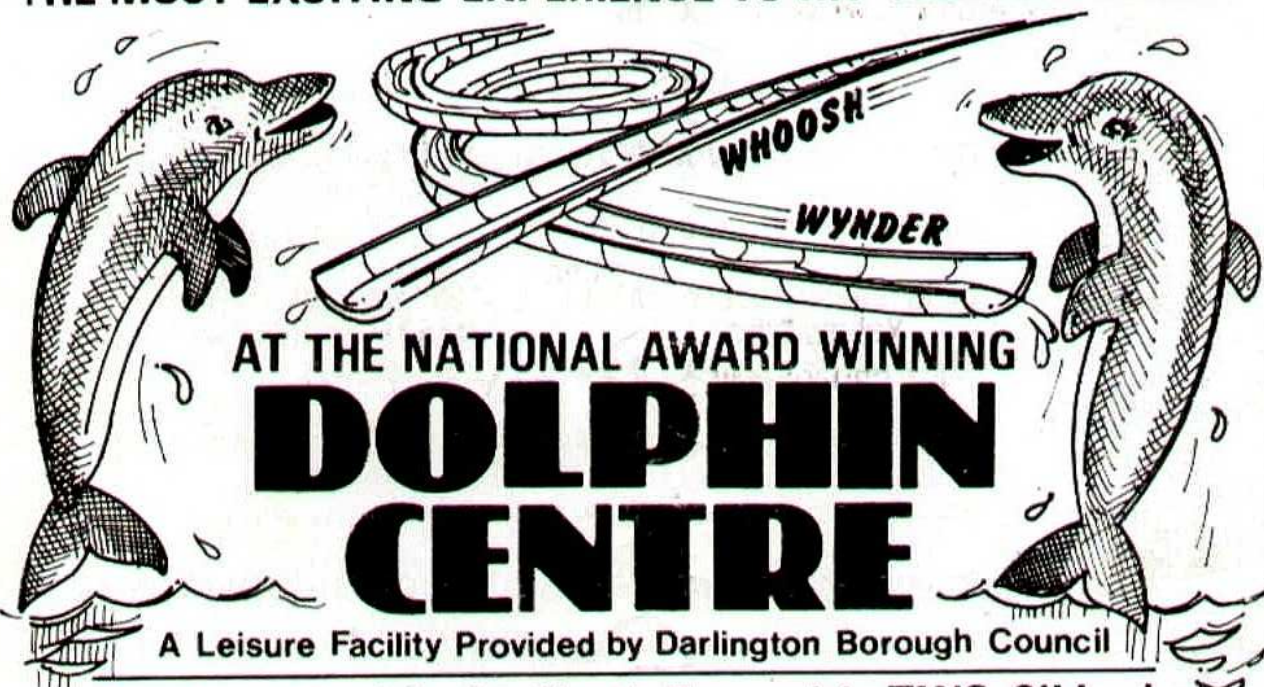
