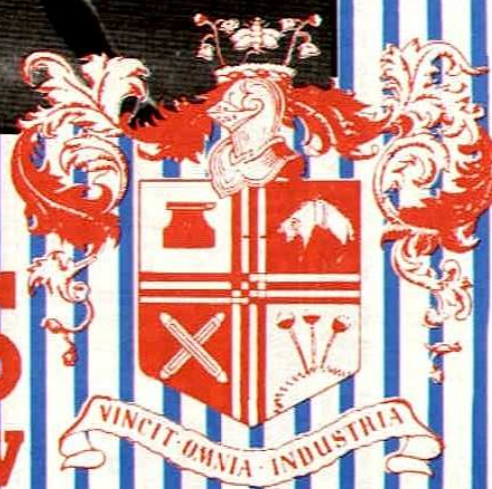

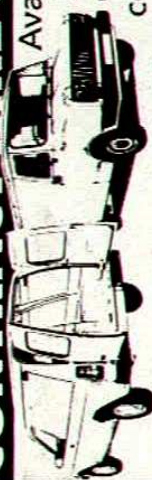

It was very gratifying for everyone at the club that Billy Bingham went on record as saying how pleased he was with Phil Hughes' performance for Northern Ireland against Turkey in what had threatened to be a fairly difficult game. Everyone is delighted with Phil's progress at International level and it is a credit to the player that he came through the game with flying colours.

Having been eliminated from both the Littlewoods and F.A. Cup, we must now give the Freight Rover Trophy everything we have got to taste a little of the excitement and interest which Bolton found when they reached last season's final. We begin up at Carlisle on Tuesday and will give it a go, realising though that it is our League position and League points which are most vital.

Third Division Round Up

Last Saturday the First Round of the F.A. Cup brought its usual crop of excitement, jubilation, upset and disappointment. None more so than the Shaker's humiliating defeat at Preston which many would say is what Cup football is all about. Perhaps it is, but definitely not when you are on the receiving end. When the draw was made a few weeks ago an away tie at Deepdale was always going to be a tricky encounter against an in-form team with an artificial surface. At the end of the day the "plastic" pitch was not a significant factor. Whilst it clearly unsettled some of the players none of the goals could be blamed on the pitch over and above more natural factors. Last weekend must clearly be forgotten if a climb up the Third Division table is to be achieved.

Our Third Division rivals generally fared much better with only Doncaster being held by a Non-League club, namely Whitby Town, although a goal only ten minutes from time secured a 2-2 draw. Six other Division Three clubs were due to replay earlier this week. Near neighbours Bolton Wanderers managed a 1-1 draw with crisis club Halifax at the Shay as George O'Ghani stole a last minute equaliser for the visitors. Unfortunately Bolton's so-called supporters were again involved in ugly scenes on their travels. Four of the other clubs managed two draws between them. Bottom club Rotherham were the visitors at Chester's Sealand Road ground - the result, surprisingly, a 1-1 draw. Any bets on how many replays this tie will go to? Notts County's excellent home form deserted them as they shared two goals with an improving Carlisle side, whilst Fulham were involved in a six goal thriller at Edgar Street with Hereford United and must hope for an improved defensive performance back in South-West London.

Today's visitors Swindon Town disposed of Vauxhall-Opel League Farnborough Town in a game played at the County Ground despite the Wiltshire club being second out of the hat. The 4-0 scoreline looked more flattering than it may actually have been as a Gilligan goal and an own goal by Baker doubled the score in the last minute. Five other Non-League sides were sent packing by their Third Division superiors. Most comprehensively defeated were Southern League side Fareham Town, who despite being a goal to the good after only fifteen minutes were dismissed from Dean Court by a 7-2 scoreline which included a hat-trick by Bournemouth's ex-Southampton striker David Puckett. Bristol City were another side who found themselves a goal down to Non-League opposition. This time it was V.S. Rugby who looked to be on for a shock, but three goals in the last seventeen minutes saw the Robins through to the Second round. Port Vale defeated Conference neighbours Stafford Rangers with a solitary goal from Robbie Earle despite having star striker Andy Jones sent-off in the first-half. Another Conference side to fall to League opposition were Kettering Town who were sunk by three first-half goals despite having home advantage to Third Division pacesetters Gillingham.

Newport County completed the quintet with a single goal victory at Midlands side Bromsgrove Rovers in front of an excellent crowd of 3440.

Turning our attention back to the Third Division Darlington have been in the news lately. Another virus at Feethams caused the postponement of two away games at Bristol Rovers and here at Gigg Lane. All was well, however, the following weekend for the attractive visit of Middlesbrough. One of Darlington's largest League crowds for years, 9942, saw the visitors go home with three points thanks to a late goal from leading scorer Archie Stephens. The widely reported crowd trouble will come as no surprise to most people at Gigg. Indeed one wonders how a crowd of virtually 10,000 could be allowed at an unsegregated ground such as Feethams when we have to comply with a ridiculous capacity of 8,000 here at Gigg Lane. Nevertheless Darlington's best crowd of the season added more than a 1,000 to their average gate for the season.

Still on the topic of crowds Middlesbrough's recent home game against Bournemouth saw them become the first Division Three club to aggregate 50,000 spectators for League games this season. Their total currently stands at 67,596 after eight games. The only other club to have exceeded 50,000 are Bristol City whose total is 51,843 from seven games. Middlesbrough still hold the Division's highest crowd for the visit of Blackpool, 11,470. Coincidentally Middlesbrough also had the highest attendance of last weekend's Cup matches - 11,205 - also against Blackpool. This time Middlesbrough avenged their 3-1 defeat in the first game by virtue of a Bernie Slaven hat-trick. On the other side of the coin the lowest crowd of the season is the 1,512 who turned out at Feethams to witness Darlington's 1-1 draw with Gillingham.

With the majority of the Division having played sixteen games the season is now beginning to take shape and a look at the table shows one or two interesting pointers which could prove decisive in the forthcoming months. Bournemouth are the only side with a 100% home record, whilst Gillingham, Doncaster, Bristol City and Mansfield remain unbeaten at home. Chester and Darlington are the only sides not to have won away from home. Joint top scorers in the Division are Middlesbrough and Blackpool both with 29. The latter have actually scored more goals away from home (15), thanks largely to a 6-2 victory at Swindon back in September. The most goal-shy team are Rotherham with just thirteen goals to their credit, whilst Mansfield have only scored six at Field Mill - the secret of being unbeaten is they have only conceded three goals! Struggling Chester are the draw experts with eleven in sixteen games. Ironically Chester could well be the side which has the most say in the promotion and relegation issues this season as they appear to be both able to frustrate the better sides but unable to defeat the poorer sides. Sounds familiar doesn't it?

Both players have joined the Shakers from Oldham Athletic. Bob, aged 23, began his career playing in the Welsh League for Rhos United before joining Oldham three years ago. In his spell at Boundary Park, he has made just 28 appearances in the Latics Second Division team and cost the Shakers a £15,000 fee in late October. His first Bury appearance was as substitute in our last home

game against Port Vale whilst he made his first full appearance in last Saturday's F.A. Cup game at Deepdale.

Jimmy Collins is a 19 year old Manchester born defender who joined Oldham on the YTS scheme three years ago. He signed full professional terms at Oldham at

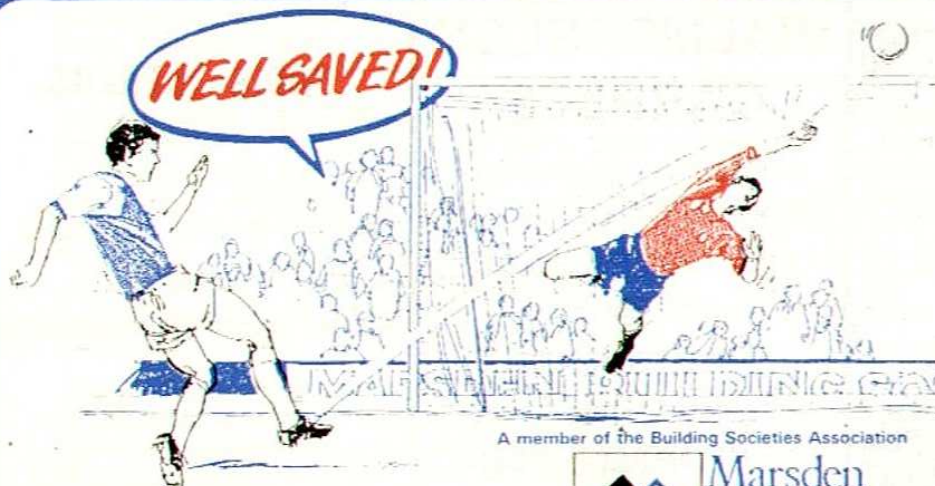
seventeen although he made just one substitute appearance in their Second Division team.

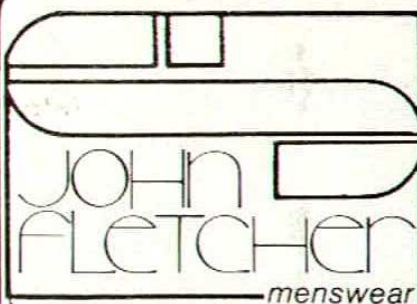

It was a case of being caught cold at Edgeley Park where the home side took a first minute lead when keeper Paladino failed to hold the ball following a corner. After 25 minutes The Shakers drew level, when Eddie Murray passed to David Lee who crossed from the left for Alan Taylor to tap home an easy goal at the far post.

Before half-time Bury had three good chances to take the lead but a mixture of good keeping and ill-luck kept out Andy Robinson, Eddie Murray and Peter Cunningham.

Bury's first goal came after 3 minutes when Peter Cunningham intercepted a back-pass and regained the lead through a diving header from Simon Cropper 33 minutes later. Burnley eventually gained the upperhand and gained the lead after 72 minutes and it was left to Lee Royle to scramble home a late goal just six minutes from time to earn a replay.

Burnley increased their lead after 53 minutes and although the Shakers hit back with a second goal after 69 minutes following a superb long free-kick by David Moran which Michael Wood knocked home, Burnley emphasised their superiority by scoring the goal of the game in the last minute, with a superb first time volley from a left wing cross.

Beamish, Billy Tucker and Brian Williams. Andy reverted some time ago to a defensive role and now finds himself helping Town's youngsters in the reserve team in his player-coach capacity. He made just 12 appearances last campaign and looks unlikely to feature in Swindon's Third Division team this season – a pity as he is reported to be poised on 99 League and Cup goals for the Wiltshire team.

Welcome Swindon Town



FRASER DIGBY (Goalkeeper). Introduced to Swindon's first team in late September following an injury to regular keeper Kenny Allen in a Littlewoods Cup tie at Southampton. 19 year old keeper who joined Swindon on loan from Manchester United.

CHRIS RAMSEY (Defender). The former Bristol City and Brighton full back joined the County Ground staff on loan initially. Lou Macari secured his permanent transfer in December 1984. Chris also suffered an unfortunate injury while appearing in the 1983 Brighton v. Manchester United F.A. Cup Final at Wembley, made up for the disappointment of collecting a losers medal by collecting a Fourth Division Championship medal with Swindon Town last season.

DAVE HOCKADAY (Defender). The versatile former Blackpool player who moved to the County Ground from the Bloomfield Road Club in the close season of 1983, proved a revelation in the full back role he fulfilled in the second half of last season.

MARK JONES (Midfield/Striker). Joined Swindon in early September this year initially on loan from Oxford United. He had spent seven years at the Manor Ground having joined United as an apprentice. Made his Swindon debut in the 1-1 home draw against Chester and impressed sufficiently to gain a permanent transfer last month.

COLIN CALDERWOOD (Defender). Without doubt Colin proved to be Lou Macari's outstanding signing as he built his championship winning team in the summer of 1985. The former Mansfield Town defender attracted a lot of attention from First Division clubs last season with his brilliant displays.

BRYAN WADE (Striker). Bryan made a successful entry into League soccer last season from Southern League Trowbridge Town. Bryan's ten League goals from his 31 League appearances, and three as substitute had a significant part in the Town's championship title win.

TIM PARKIN (Defender). Joined the County Ground staff from Bristol Rovers in July for a Football League Tribunal fee of £27,500. The tall commanding central defender had made 219 League appearances for Rovers. Tim moved to the Bristol club from Malmö (Sweden).

PETER COYNE (Midfield/Striker). The former Manchester United, Crewe Alexandra and Hyde United striker was in brilliant form in the first half of last season, as he quickly swept into the lead as the clubs leading goalscorer at the end of October. A stomach injury curtailed his season from then on as Peter struggled to regain form and fitness.

STEVE WHITE (Striker). Steve was surprisingly given a free transfer at the end of last season by Bristol Rovers.

After scoring sixteen goals for the former Eastville club last season, Lou Macari fought off opposition from several Third Division clubs to obtain his signature in July. Steve was in his second spell with Rovers having been transferred to Luton Town for a fee of £200,000 in 1979. He later played for Charlton Athletic before his return to Bristol Rovers.

JIMMY GILLIGAN (Striker). Jimmy moved to the County Ground in June for a £31,500 transfer fee from Grimsby Town. Jimmy had only been with the Blundell Park club for one season following his £100,000 transfer in the previous summer of 1985 from First Division Watford. Seen as a replacement for the departed Colin Gordon.

LEIGH BARNARD (Midfield). Leigh last season recaptured the form that he displayed in his first season with the club after signing from Portsmouth in July 1982 on a free transfer. Leigh spent a brief period on loan with Peterborough United while with Portsmouth.

DAVE BAMBER (Striker). Joined the Club from Portsmouth for a fee of £15,000 in March 1986 after an initial period on loan. Previously with Blackpool, Walsall and Coventry City, he brought a dimension to the team in the final matches leading to the Fourth Division Championship that had perhaps been lacking following Peter Coyne's early season injury.

Swindon Town won their first ever League title last season as they swept to the Fourth Division Championship under the astute guidance of Team Manager Lou Macari, a figure well known around these parts from his Manchester United days. In compiling a Football League record of 102 points, Swindon passed several previously existing club records with consummate ease.

Naturally, the exploits of last season attracted several of the leading clubs to take a definite interest in the immediate future of the diminutive Scot Macari, whose playing career at Celtic and Manchester United encompassed some fifteen years. In May he turned down the chance to manage Leicester City, in June he came under scrutiny from Coventry City and in July he almost rejoined his old club, Celtic as Assistant Manager to David Hay. It was eventually a compromise that decided the immediate destiny of Swindon's manager though, Macari remaining at the County Ground but renewing his links with the Scottish champions by accepting scouting duties with emphasis placed on the South of England.

Although interest was centered around the future of Macari, he did not neglect his duties at the County Ground and in preparation for Town's return to Division Three (after a four year absence) strengthened his squad with four summer signings, and substantial fees were involved. It took £31,500 to bring striker Jimmy Gilligan south from Grimsby, a tribunal fee of £27,500 for Tim Parkin from Bristol Rovers and a further £25,000 for Exeter City's Martin Ling - who has since been transferred to

Southend United for £20,000. Striker Steve White also moved from Bristol Rovers after surprisingly being given a free transfer. In September, Swindon signed Oxford United utility player Mark Jones on loan and made the transfer permanent a few weeks ago following a number of impressive performances. One major departure from Wiltshire in June took Colin Gordon into the First Division when Wimbledon paid Swindon £90,000 for the striker who scored 17 league goals last season.

Swindon arrive at Gigg Lane this afternoon in sixth position and with three away successes already under their belts as they attempt to emulate a number of clubs in recent years and gain promotion from Division Four to Division Two in successive seasons. Indeed in away games to date, they have lost just once - by a single goal at Ayresome Park against leaders Middlesbrough and have picked up three points at Bolton (2-1), Fulham (2-0) and Port Vale (4-3) and earned draws against Newport, Darlington and Mansfield.

It is at the County Ground that they have dropped most points strangely enough, with early season home defeats by Notts County 1-2 (Dave Bamber sent-off) and a freak 6-2 defeat by Blackpool. A further home defeat followed in their last fixture when they lost 2-1 in a local derby game against Bristol Rovers which attracted a near five-figure gate to the County Ground. Sandwiched in-between the Blackpool and Bristol games were four successive home wins which boosted their league position.

In Cup competitions this season, Swindon eliminated Torquay United on a 6-2 aggregate in the Littlewoods Cup before falling to First Division Southampton (0-3 agg.) in round two. Last Saturday in the F.A. Cup, the Robins demolished non-league Farnborough at the County Ground to earn a second round tie against either Dartford or Enfield.

Striker Dave Bamber was suspended for last Saturday's game and was expected to be recalled to the side today following a one match ban.
