

I was fuming after the first leg at Swindon last week because we threw it away after playing really well for the first 45 minutes and the 3-0 scoreline was no reflection on the game.

Everything hinged on Gordon Owen's sending-off early in the second half. He let everyone down with a split second loss of temper which resulted in a heavy club fine.

Paul Fitzpatrick was also disciplined for a foul late in the game that might well have brought his dismissal and I hope the point has now been made that I shall not tolerate any further misconduct of that kind.

I would rather dwell on the positive aspects of the first leg. We really knocked the ball about well in the first half and almost scored a magnificent goal when Micky Tanner's shot hit the bar after an end-to-end move.

To finish the evening without scoring and having conceded three was rather demoralising. But we are conceding nothing and the lads will be told to go out and have a real go at Swindon tonight.

Starting 3-0 down against Second Division opposition is not an ideal situation, but we had Swindon worried for long periods at the County Ground and they know they are in for another tough battle.

My worst moment in last week's tie was when I thought Russell Bromage had broken a leg in a sickening collision with Swindon goalkeeper Fraser Digby.

Russell's enthusiasm got the better of him as he raced in to try and pull a goal back and I was convinced he had a serious injury when he went down. Thankfully that did not prove the case because he has settled in very quickly and looks likely to prove a great asset. Enjoy yourselves this evening and remember whatever the result to behave in a way that does credit to Bristol City.

I was sickened to hear about the crowd trouble at Scarborough's opening match against Wolves and we want no hint of that sort of thing at Ashton Gate in what is a crucial season for English football.

SWINDON TOWN

Justice was seen to be done when Swindon achieved promotion to the Second Division at the end of last season. With 46 games played they were in 3rd position which meant a place in the play-offs. After beating Wigan they overcame Gillingham who were a massive 9 points adrift of them in fifth position in the final league table. Promotion to Division 2 has come only 12 months after Town won the 4th Division championship. Manager Lou Macari has impressed many in football with the blend of flair, skill and fitness he has brought into his team. Marcari has already been linked with the big club managerial jobs and if choice was on his career pedigree when a player, he certainly has the right credentials -numerous appearances for his country, Scotland, and club service with Celtic and Manchester Utd. However, Macari seems quite content to stay in Wiltshire and with Swindon being in an economic and population expansion area many hope the club's rise will not end in the Second Division.

Despite promotion sucess Swindon made no fewer than six close season signings, two of them from under the nose of City's Terry Cooper. Terry saw JOHN KELLY as the ideal man to strengthen the midfield but the former Chester player signed for Town in a £15,000 deal. Lively forward STEVE FOLEY came to Ashton Gate for talks before joining Town in a £35,000 move from Sheffield Utd. The largest fee paid was £40,000 to Southampton for 23 year old JOHN GITTENS. The others signed on free transfers were TERRY MERRIMAN from Coventry City. KIERAN O'REAGAN (4 full caps with Eire) from Brighton and goalkeeper NICKY HAMMOND from Arsenal. Hammond, had a short spell on loan at Bristol Rovers whilst at the London club for whom he never made a full first team appearance.

First choice goalkeeper is **FRASER DIGBY.** The former Man Utd. apprentice is tipped for the top but he will have to cool his temperament. A moment of madness saw him sent off against Aldershot last season and probably cost Swindon a place in the Freight Rover Southern Area Final. Players competing for places in defence include **DAVE HOCKADAY** who starts his fifth season with the club. **PHIL KING** a Bristolian aged 20 who began his career with Exeter City, former Mansfield Town player **COLIN CALDERWOOD** and an exBristol Rover in the form of towering **TIM PARKIN** who has now settled in after an uncertain start to his career at the County Ground.

Midfielder CHRIS KAMARA is in his second spell at the club. He spent four years at Brentford sandwiched between his total of six years at Swindon. LES BERRY was signed for £15,000 from Newport towards the end of last season and helped in the promotion run in. LEIGH BARNARD also figured strongly in the last season's campaign. The former Portsmouth player has been with Swindon for 5 years.

Swindon are well off for strikers. N. Ireland international JIMMY QUINN is another player enjoying his second spell at the club. Former Man Utd. apprentice **PETER COYNE** also features amongst the goals as does 24 year old Trowbridge born **BRYAN WADE**. Swindon's other strikers are lanky **DAVE BAMBER** who made a name for himself as a goalkeeper with Blckpool and former Rover's striker **STEVE WHITE**.

Only one player left Swindon during the summer and that was defender and former Bristol City youth player CHRIS RAMSEY who joined Southend in an eve of season transfer deal.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Welcome to a new Season at Ashton Gate.

It is but a short time ago that we played our last match of last season, a good season in the main and runs in the Littlewood and F.A. Cup and another Wembley appearance in the Freight Rover Final which, as we all know, we failed

to win after extra time and a penalty shoot out.

However, our main goal that of gaining promotion eluded us, finishing just one point below the promotion play off positions. We know our first priority this season is to do all that is possible to obtain 2nd Division status and I can assure you that the Board is 100 per cent behind Terry and the team in our efforts to obtain this. You, I know will pay your part and get behind the team and give them all the encouragement you can. It means a great deal to the players to have your vocal support.

Regarding the new membership scheme, this as most of you will be aware, has been imposed on all League Clubs by an agreement between The Football League and The Government and we have, in common with other Clubs, had to designate certain areas of the ground which can only be entered and used by registered members on production of a membership card at the appropriate

turnstile or ticket office.

The Police have agreed that a lead in time be allowed before strict enforcement of the new regulations is put into being. So, for the first four home games spectators

will be allowed into designated areas.

After this period, no spectators will be allowed in these areas without production of a membership card. Members of Bristol City Supporters' Club, City Away Travel Members and The Junior Reds will automatically become members of the new scheme and will be issued a membership card.

Season Ticket Holders will be entitled to use membership areas on production of their current season ticket at place of entry. All other spectators must fill in an application form. (The application form printed in this programme can be used for this purpose). Membership fee is 50p.

A plan of the membership areas is shown in the programme.

In general, the areas are:-

1. The whole of the enclosure in front of the grandstand.

2. A new area for family members that is being formed under the covered end.

3. Boys' enclosure in front of the Dolman Stand.

4. Blocks F and G of the Dolman Stand.

Membership Cards can only be issued by personal application and proof of

identity must be provided.

Let us all play our part to make a success of the new scheme and once again bring back a peaceful, friendly and family atmosphere to the game. It can be done, both our Wembley Finals are proof of what can be achieved.

We all look forward again with your magnificent support to a great and successful

season.



Collectors Page

Keeping a programme in perfect condition from a match which you attend can be quite difficult. Some collectors use a plastic wallet or bag to carry their programmes in, so keeping them flat, dry and clean. Other collectors use one of our subscription services, details of which can be found in the last home programme.

In an effort to keep a programme in perfect condition, a collector will never write any team changes or any other information in a programme. Some collectors, in order to keep a perfect record, will write any team changes on a separate piece of paper and insert it loosely in the programme. I have come across examples of this in older programmes which I have purchased, where the attendance, result, scorers, notes on the referee and details of booking have also been included.

In order to keep your programme in good condition it is important that they are stored in a dry ventilated area, this will prevent dampness, which would lead to the programmes sticking together. The programmes need to be kept flat so avoiding creases, various

containers are used ranging from large filing cabinets to cardboard boxes.

One of the more popular methods is to use the programme binders which are sold in the City Shop, these hold between twenty five and thirty programmes and are ideal for keeping your programmes in good condition and in order.

If you are interested in expanding your collection to include older programmes you will have to write to dealers asking for their latest their address can catalogue, usually be found in the football magazines. Initially it is useful to obtain catalogues from several dealers, this will give you an idea type and range of of the programmes which each dealer stocks, as some dealers specialise in specific areas e.g. Scottish Clubs, Current Season, London Clubs, it will therefore save postage if you eventually only receive the catalogues which suit your needs. From this season a selection of older programmes from various clubs dating back to the 1950's, are on sale in the City Shop, these are all individually bagged and priced.
