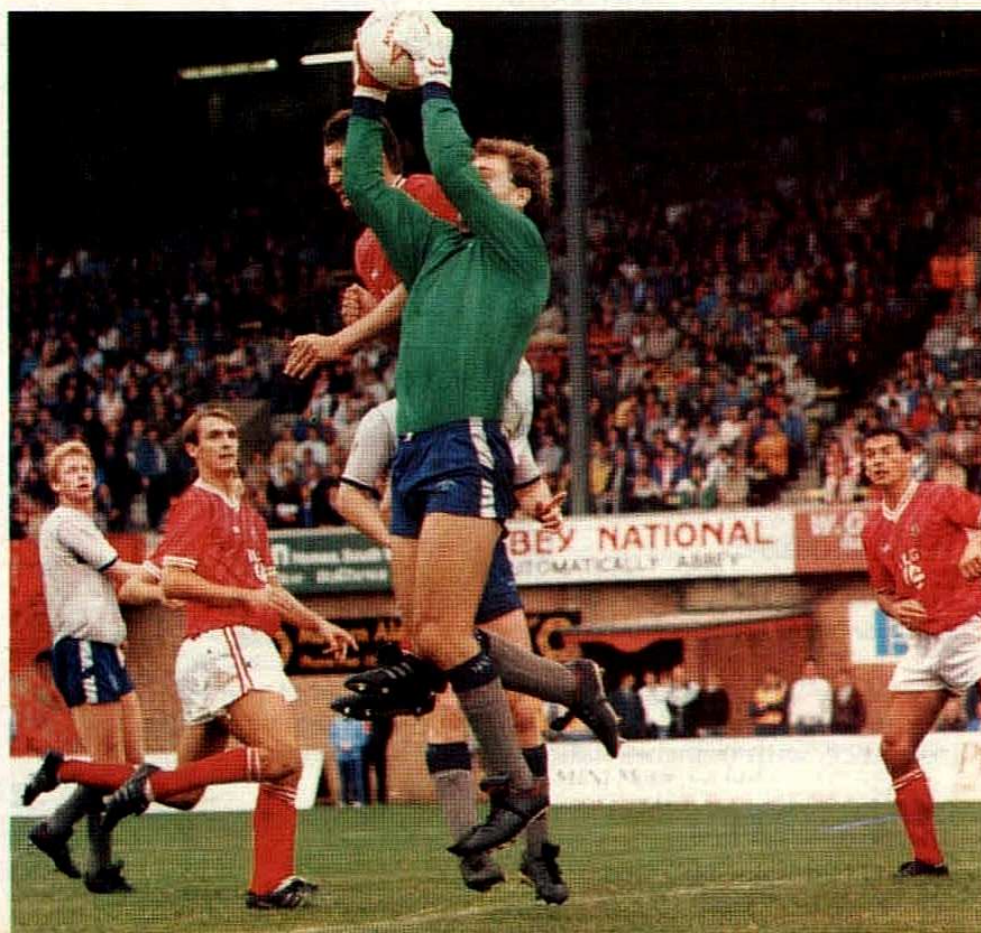

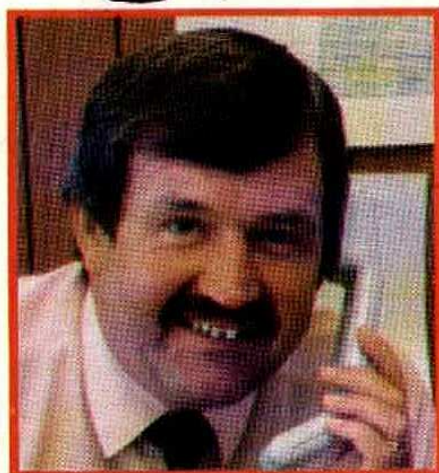

Along with the Club Secretary, I recently attended the Extraordinary Meeting called by the Football League to discuss the one man, one Club controversy. Frankly the matter enters the realms of legal jargon and is a complicated issue where league regulations are concerned. The matter will now hopefully rest, and we all hope that the recent constant talk of take-overs will subside and matters concerning the actual playing of the game will prevail.

It was a hard lesson but one that we can reap benefits from.**

League results have been non-existent recently due to abandoned and postponed matches. Although we have not actually suffered in the respect that we have not maintained our League position. What we have experienced is the fact that several Clubs have been able to widen the gap between themselves and Swindon Town. Points gained are always worth more than matches still to play.

I would like to pay tribute to the emerging Nicky Hammond. Nicky came into the team due to the unfortunate injury that Fraser Digby encountered. Despite the fact that both Tim Flowers and Paul Crichton joined us for loan periods he proved equal to any challenge they could offer. Both of those players have returned to their Clubs and Nicky Hammond is installed in the Swindon Town team. Fraser Digby, when he is fit to return, faces a challenge for what was his first team place. That is the progress that Nicky Hammond has made.

Aston Villa, as I expected, have begun to look clear championship contenders. Their away form is phenomenal and they probably only need a slight upsurge in their home form to clutch the title. Behind them the rest of the chasing pack are all clambering for that one guaranteed place to accompany, what I am sure



will be Aston Villa.

It is impossible to state that one Club more than any other will achieve that aim. The rest have their merits and also their deficiencies, that is why they are unable to establish superiority.

Crystal Palace, managed by my former Old Trafford team mate Steve Coppell, have been able to sell the talented Andy Gray to promotion rivals Aston Villa and yet maintain their bid. That is a compliment to Steve's ability to balance his playing staff adequately.

Middlesbrough have had a marvellous season. To move from the brink of extinction, to promotion in the same year was amazing. But to move onto the Second Division scene

and clearly establish a firm bid for First Division status is amazing. Bruce Rioch, a former Scotland team mate of mine was a saviour in time for the Ayresome Park Club.

Of the rest, Ipswich Town have shown their intention by signing John Wark from Liverpool. His return to Portman Road will boost their goal power. Two goals against Watford in the Simod Cup showed that he had not lost that instinct.

Manchester City have added Trevor Morley from Northampton Town to their staff, releasing Tony Adcock in the deal. I have always felt that City needed to stiffen their defence to make themselves worthy contenders for promotion. Leeds Utd. probably regret their poor start to the season, while the heavy spending Millwall have had a good season to date. Blackburn Rovers have begun to improve with the arrival of Steve Archibald at Ewood Park. His signing alone seems to have inspired his team mates.

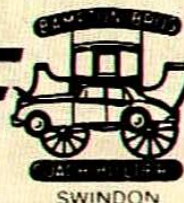
## TUESDAY

**'Singing in the Rain' may have been the favourite song of Gene Kelly, but it certainly could not be stated the same of Swindon Town groundsman Geoff Warren.**

While the majority of people have welcomed the mild winter. Geoff is a man who has been presented with a mountain of problems. When he was asked about his concern, he immediately said, "Will it ever stop raining in Swindon?" Geoff then elaborated a little further, "Since I came here it has rained ever since, it's heart breaking."

Geoff, who resides in Clevedon and who has seen similar service with Birmingham City, Walsall and Bristol City, has seen the bast lain plans aborted. "It all started last summer, the play-offs meant that work was unable to proceed. Actually I seeded the County Ground on the day we played Gillingham, far too late really."

The summer months presented problems for the Birmingham born groundsman as he explained. "It was such a poor summer, it was the first time that I have not had to use sprinklers at a time when you expect to. The amount of rain was phenomenal. I have to be brutally frank and state that any improvement made to the ground has been lost this season. The ground will require more work this summer than last year."



**GEOFF WARREN**

Geoff is an advocate of careful thought and as he explained, he felt mistakes had been made in the past regarding treatment of the County Ground. "The drains beneath the surface have been damaged through heavy rolling and all this achieves is making the ground compact. Water is then difficult to release and the ground becomes waterlogged. From my point of view the biggest problem comes when the ground is played upon when it is wet. A lot of spiking is then required. The middle of the pitch is in poor condition because of constant rolling."

Geoff's difficult life, is one we should all sympathise with at present, "The ground will require a lot more

sand on it in the next 2 to 3 years." Incidentally the sand is taken not far from Geoff's home at Clevedon. The sand is actually taken from the sea is at Holm in the Bristol Channel. It is then washed down with fresh water.

"During this close season we shall require 20 tons of sand on the pitch. Providing there are no play-off matches" added Geoff. The Birmingham born groundsman added, tongue in cheek. "Of course if players didn't kick the pitch up I would not have a job."

Geoff gave an insight into the consistency of the County Ground pitch. "The ground is clay based and that is a problem, but most of the grounds are in poor condition this season. What we now need is wind, a drying wind, no frost. If frost prevailed I would then have problems with the Shrivenham Road side of the ground, yet we have only had two frosts to-date. It's a difficult job especially with two matches a week. The situation is not helped with no training facilities."

You may have noticed that Geoff is often accompanied by his two sons, Stephen and Ian, on a match-day. If you stay behind after a game you will soon be aware of their invaluable help. Geoff left the office, rain was lashing against the window. Gene Kelly is now long departed, but a dispirited Geoff Warren was left to try to sing in the rain!

## A COUNTY GROUND



It is almost a year ago that Swindon and Middlesbrough last met at the County Ground... the first meeting for nearly fourteen years.

It was a very vital match for both Clubs, as they sought promotion to the Second Division.

Swindon ran out victors from a 'controversial' Steve White goal in the second half, but it was Middlesbrough who went on to gain automatic promotion to Division 2, finishing as runners-up to Bournemouth. It left Swindon having to win promotion the hard way, via the Play-offs.

To re-gain a place in Division 2 at the first attempt was a remarkable achievement by the 'Boro', and Manager Bruce Rioch.

Ayresome Park, a venue for the 1966 World Cup, had been closed during the summer of 1986 by the official receiver and Manager Bruce Rioch was sacked.

Then began the saga of whether the Club would continue to function. Rioch continued to train the players, but the financial situation was not finally resolved until Middlesbrough had been forced to play their first home League game of the season at Hartlepool.

Hopefully the financial problems are now behind them and this famous Club can once again rise to past glories.

It was only back in 1973/74 that they ran away with the Second Division title with a record 65 points.

The Championship was won with 7 games left to play and in the end the largest margin ever - 15 points. After losing the first game at home they reached top spot in the League, after 8 games, and were never headed again.

Whilst in the 1st Division, Middlesbrough then reached the Sixth Round of the F.A. Cup three times, the Football League Cup Semi-finals once, and won the Anglo-Scottish Cup. The 'boro' finally lost their status in the top flight in 1982, being relegated together with Wolves and Leeds United.

## MIDDLESBROUGH

### MEET THE PLAYERS AND MANAGER

**Bruce Rioch (Manager).** Appointed Manager at Ayresome Park in February 1986, formerly player/manager at Torquay United. Capped 24 times by Scotland and a member of the ill-fated 1978 World Cup team. As a midfielder saw service with Luton, Aston Villa, Derby, Everton, Birmingham, Sheffield United, Seattle Sounders and Torquay.

**Stephen Pears (Goalkeeper).** Born in Brandon, County Durham, but was spotted and signed by Manchester United. Joined Middlesbrough on loan after making four League appearances for the Red Devils. Middlesbrough finally managed to sign him permanently in June 1985. Ever-present last season.

**Tony Mowbray (Defender).** A Teessider, who played rugby at school, but soccer was his number one game. Played for Cleveland County as a junior. Signed as an apprentice for Middlesbrough in 1980 and became full time two year later. Ever-present in last seasons promotion winning side, taking his League appearances to 182.

**Gary Pallister (Defender).** Born in Ramsgate, but it was at Billingham, as a youngster, that he came to notice. A very tall and commanding player. Missed only two games last season. Has been trailed by the big Clubs, but Middlesbrough have turned away prospective buyers.

**Colin Cooper (Defender).** A local youngster, born at Sedgefield. Signed for Middlesbrough as a 16 year old in 1983. Impressive form in the reserve side earned him a regular first team place.

**Gary Parkinson (Defender).** A Middlesbrough lad. He forced his way into the first team squad after his prominent role in the promotion winning Central League side. In his first full season last year, played in all the 46 League games.

**Gary Gill (Midfield).** A local lad, who signed as an apprentice in 1981 and professional a year later. Injuries have limited his first team appearances.

**Gary Hamilton (Midfield).** Born in Glasgow, a former apprentice who has played for Scotland Under-21's.

Can play in defence or midfield. Made over 150 League appearances for Middlesbrough.

**Alan Kernaghan (Forward).** An Irish lad, who signed for Middlesbrough as an apprentice in 1983 and as a professional two years later. To the beginning of this season had made 27 League appearances.

**Stuart Ripley (Forward).** Another local youngster, and another for whom big things are confidently predicted. Only missed two League games last season.

**Bernie Slaven (Forward).** Top scorer North of the Border with 27 goals whilst with Albion Rovers. **Paul Prondlock (Forward).** Born in Hartlepool, made 15 appearances for his home town Club before joining the 'Boro'. Hoping to command a regular first team place this season.

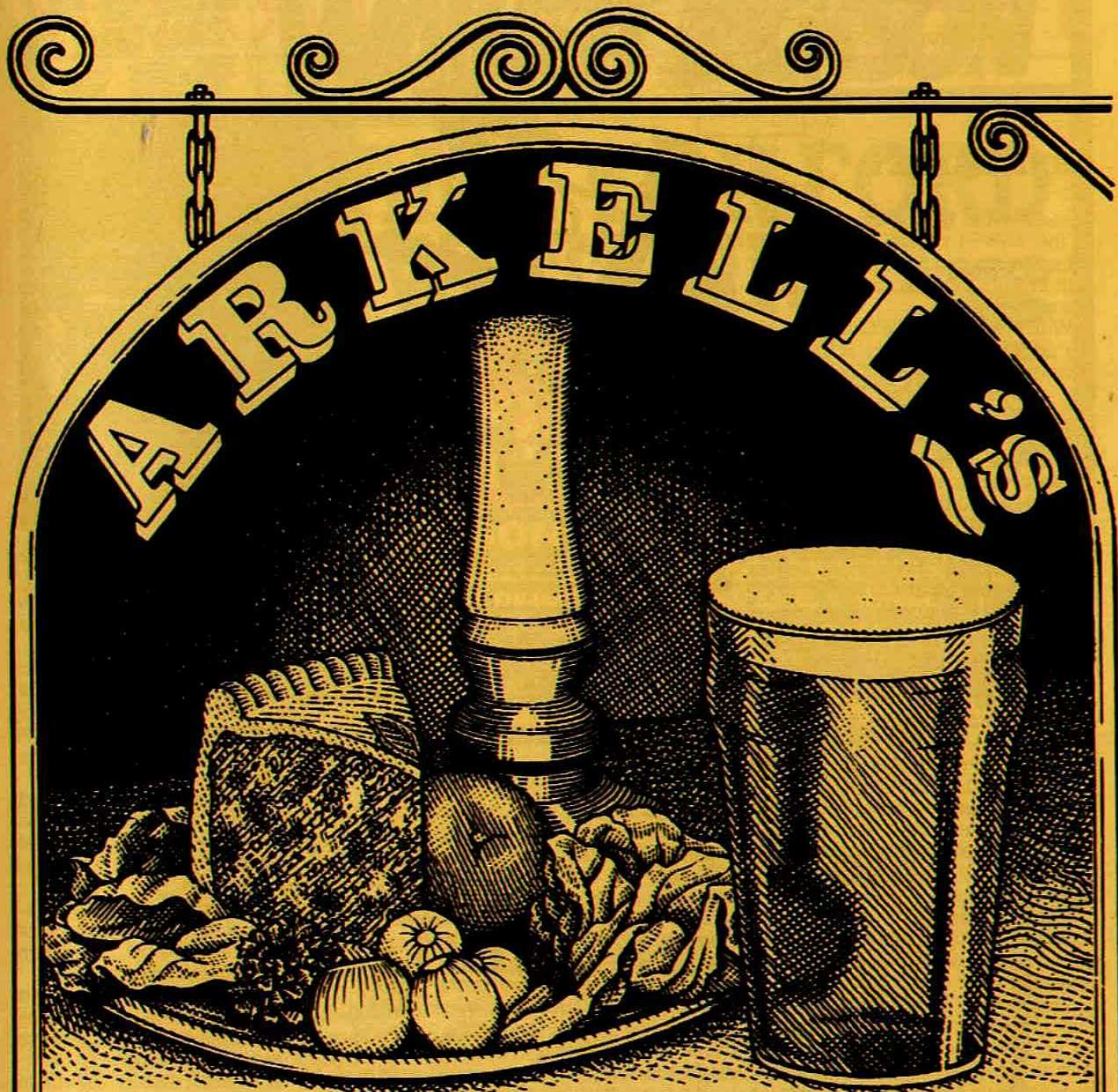

## CHRIS RAMSEY

The self-styled 'Rambo' and terrace hero of the 1985/86 championship winning side, Chris began his footballing career with Bristol City as an apprentice in the late seventies.

With the Ashton Gate Club still basking in the reflected glory of their First Division status, Chris found opportunities few and joined Second Division newcomers Brighton for the 1980/81 season. Ironically two years later, City were languishing in the Third Division and Ramsey was preparing to turn out at Wembley for Brighton in the F.A. Cup Final.

Though settled for this auspicious occasion, Chris' appearances for the 'Seagulls' were somewhat scarce during his four year spell at the Goldstone Ground.

His first campaign brought only three opportunities and in 1981/82 he failed to appear at all. In the 1982/83 season as Brighton confounded the form book to reach the F.A. Cup Final, Chris made 23 League appearances but was unable to share in the Club's greatest day.

Within minutes of the start of the game against Manchester United Chris Ramsey's career lay in ruins as he was stretchered off Wembley's lush turf in agony.

Brighton went on to draw 2-2 after extra time with the 'Red Devils' but in the replay went down 4-0 with Chris a mere spectator.

The severity of his injury is emphasised by only four appearances in 1983/84 and Brighton's willingness to allow him the chance to rebuild his career elsewhere on loan to Swindon Town. An immediate favourite with the local crowd, Chris could not gain the same popularity with referees and was soon in trouble.

The referees notebook, seemed to follow 'Rambo' during his nine match loan period with Swindon, whether it was Ramsey himself or an opponent confronting him, there was rarely a dull moment on the Shrivensham Road side when he played.

# A to Z OF SWINDON TOWN

Doubts about his temperament and style caused Lou Macari's interest to wane for a time, but by December Ramsey was back and tackling as hard as ever.

Ramsey proved another shrewd signing, costing only £5,000 in Swindon's shoe-string success story.

1985/86 brought glory back into the Birmingham born defender's career as Swindon Town marched to the Fourth Division title. His contribution that season even included goals in both the record breaking home and away win sequences.

Chris' sweetest goalscoring moment though, must have come in the First Round of the F.A. Cup at his old workplace - Ashton Gate as the 'Town' were finally defeated in a stop-go-stop tie for the Club.

His nonchalant header in the 3-0 win at St. James' Park, Exeter, was just as memorable for the fans though, as it sealed their fifth consecutive away League victory.

The tremendous night at the County Ground as the 'Town' beat Chester 4-2 to clinch promotion also saw Chris receive one of the biggest cheers as the players appeared in the North Stand after the game. The chilling chant of 'Rambo! Rambo!' scared many opposition for-



wards, but brought more humour that night and inspired a somewhat dodgy photo session as Ramsey appeared on Stratton Bank with headband, machine gun and scantily clad model.

The fantastic achievements and laughs of that season were soured somewhat as Chris' strong will resulted in him choosing to miss the sides get-together at Grittleton Manor and thus remove himself from the historic game at Mansfield.

His disappointment was total and signalled the beginning of the end of his association with the Club as he remained in dispute throughout most of the following season.

Despite the slightly sour ending to Chris' career at the County Ground, his rich character added much to Swindon Town during his time with the Club.

The memories of his relatively short spell are many, but his diving header, an inch from the ground, last season and his incident with Denny Mundee of Northampton in 1984/85 season to endure longer than most.

That Northampton match brought Mundee's sending off on the Shrivensham Road touchline in an incident which HTV almost captured and one of the best own goals ever, scored by the Cobblers Wakeley Gage.

These days seem near and yet so far as we push towards the First Division with Chris Ramsey having left for Southend and facing challenges of his own to once again rebuild his career.

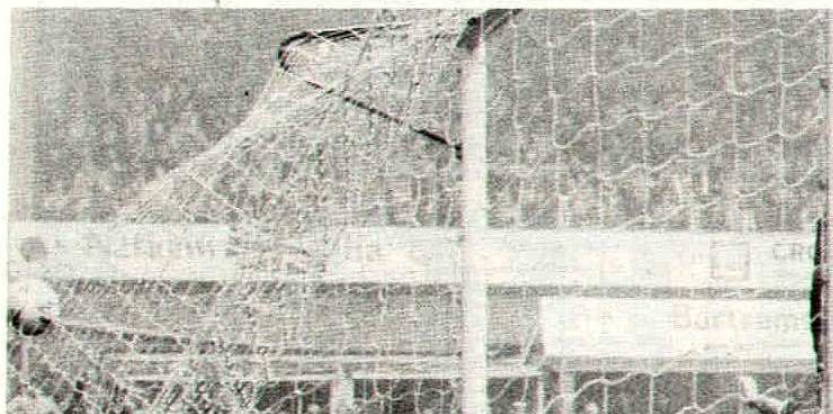

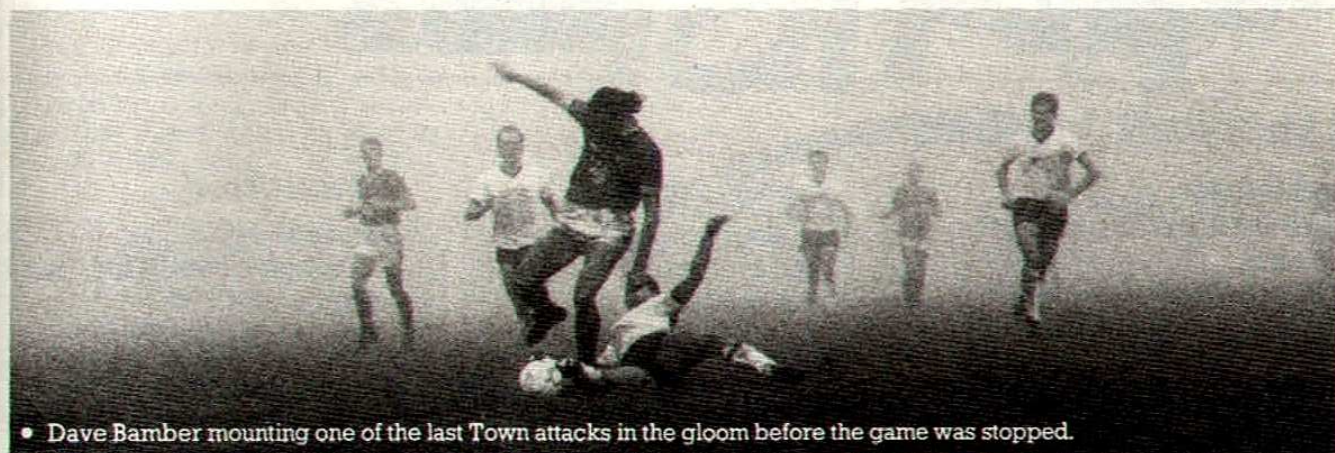

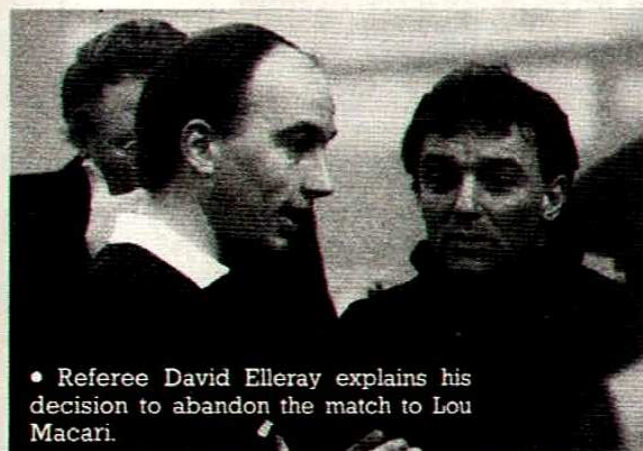

The Swindon party, who had travelled up to Humberside overnight, never even left their hotel while supporters coaches got within six miles of Boothferry Park before hearing the bad news via the radio.

The on-going ban of Bobby Barnes was a feature for the 'Daily Express'.

## BARNES WEATHER BEATEN

Bobby Barnes will miss Swindon's FA Cup clash at Newcastle because of a sending-off... and bad weather.

Barnes, the 25-year-old free-scoring winger was dismissed against West Brom on New Year's Day for allegedly making a 'V' sign to a linesman.

But although photographic evidence showed his fingers were the other way round - and he was signalling that he'd had two goals disallowed - he was refused a personal hearing and got an automatic two-match ban.

The south coast Club's leading goalscorer was surely in trepidation of the visit, considering his own previous visits to Highbury.

Garry Nelson flew off to Spain at the weekend in search of a sunshine

cure for his Arsenal blues.

The former Swindon Town winger couldn't believe his luck when Brighton pulled out the Gunners as their FA Cup fourth round opponents. The Seagulls 20-goal top scorer thought he'd seen the last of George Graham's side after being on the receiving end of an amazing 23 goals in three games.

## THUMPED

Nelson was first blasted 10-1 when he played for Swindon reserves against Arsenal's first division side.

Then last season he travelled from Plymouth as the star of Dave Smith's cock-a-hoop West Country side, only to get thumped 6-1 in the same stage of the competition.

"I thought that was it. I'd never have to come up against Arsenal again. I wasn't sorry," said Nelson.

"Then I signed for Brighton and, bang, the boss only arranged for us to play a pre-season friendly against... Arsenal.

"Charlie Nicholas smashed a hat-trick and we lost 7-1
