FORM NOT SO GOOD AGAINST THE TOP SIX

This afternoon we face yet another vital match in regards whether we reach the play-offs. We must face facts and admit our record against the teams currently occupying the leading six positions in the League table is poor.

We drew 1-1 with Chelsea at the County Ground and lost 3-2 at Stamford Bridge. We lost 2-1 at Maine Road last Saturday and we had previously lost by a similar scoreline at the County Ground.

We drew both matches with Blackburn Rovers, 0-0 at Ewood Park and 1-1 at the County Ground. West Bromwich Albion defeated us 3-1 at the Hawthorns and then we were held to a 1-1 draw on Easter Saturday at the County Ground. Crystal Palace defeated us 2-1 at Selhurst Park and we face Steve Coppell's team on Tuesday. April 25th.


We defeated Watford 3-2 at Vicarage Road and it is vital we take three points today and also deprive Crystal Palace of a win.

THE NEED TO REPEAT OUR FORM OF VICARAGE ROAD

Watford have recovered some of their early season form of late and their vital single goal win at Bournemouth last Saturday in my opinion makes one of the playoff positions a contest between ourselves and Steve Harrison's teams. Matches are now beginning to run out and every point will be vital.

If we can reproduce our form that we displayed at Vicarage Road we will cause Watford problems. It will be a hard and difficult game, the Crystal Palace match will be identical. Close encounters with one chance taken being vital. A bonanza of goals is rare, teams tend to want to eliminate mistakes and patience is the vital ingredient.

SEVEN TO GO AFTER TODAY
Following todays match we have seven



fixtures to play. Three at home and four away fixtures. We should be capable of taking our fair share of points from these fixtures.

The four away matches are at Brighton who now appear to be safely secure from relegation. Walsall who look doomed to relegation and Oldham Athletic who are in a secure position. Also Birmingham City who have one step in the Third Division. At home we have the tough encounter with Crystal Palace, the home match with Shrewsbury Town who will probably be doomed to Third Division football by that time for next season. Our final match is at home against Stoke City who would appear to be struggling in recent matches and falling adrift of the play-off positions.

THE CHASE IS NOW ON

Our form at this time is varied. Recent matches have all been tense and a struggle to impose our form and strength upon the opposition.

The exciting contest with West Bromwich Albion was followed by a disastrous match at Plymouth. Individual mistakes contributed to our downfall. We failed to capitalise on the opportunities we created against Blackburn Rovers and were punished by dropping two vital points. We managed to defeat Bradford City and also the weather to gain a single goal win. The match at Manchester City last Saturday saw Duncan Shearer give us the lead. The penalty we conceded just before half-time gave City a vital life-line and then they secured the precious three points by scoring the second half winning goal through David Oldfield. I had always felt that if we could have taken a point from this match we would have been in an advantageous position with regard to the play-offs. We now have to chase the leading group and that chase begins this afternoon. We must defeat both Watford today and Crystal Palace on April




NOBODY FROM THE 'ROVERS RETURN' CAME TO MY AID

PARKING OF CARS

There has been a gradual increase in the number of complaints received from residents in the vicinity of the County Ground – particularly Walcot and Park South districts.

I am pleased to be given the opportunity to explain that I will be paying attention to inconsiderate and unlawful parking in these areas. Fixed Penalty fines will be issued for these offences

I issue this warning in order that you may review your parking paractices, especially on Match days, with large attendances. In order to avoid prosecution the following advice will help you

- Do not block driveways.
- Comply with waiting restrictions and 'No Waiting' signs.
- Do not park on both sides of narrow roads which are through roads. Some are bus routes.
- Do not park on verges.
- Do not use car parks near to the Ground.
- Do not restrict junctions or entrances

Please heed the advice otherwise more drastic action will have to be considered resulting in vehicles being towed away, which will cause drivers considerable expense. Inconsiderate parking causes a great deal of inconvenience to local residents, and I look forward to your co-operation in this matter.

Don't back Leeds United for promotion now. That's the tip from Manager Howard Wilkinson after Sean McCarthy's late winner for Plymouth Argyle last Sunday. He said: "It was always going to be touch and go about getting into the play-offs. Now I don't think the bookies will be losing any sleep about our chances."

Manchester City Manager Mel Machen on our visit to Maine Road last week, "I was fearful that another visiting sweeper system would smother my team's path to a First Division future. We occupied their two full backs and they were curtailed."

Sergei Baltacha's agreement with Ipswich Town comes under review in June. The Russian International who has been in fine form recently will be sharing Manager John Duncan's optimism about reaching the promotion play-offs, "You have to remain optimistic. But I'm not pretending that our last six games are going to be easy."


The signal for change and progess at Watford Football Club began in May 1976 when rock superstar Elton John became Chairman of the Club he had supported since boyhood. His ambition to lift the Club from the Fourth Division all the way to Division One.

The first important step he took to achieve this was to appoint a new, young and ambitious Manager in June 1977. That man was Graham Taylor, who had already tasted success with Lincoln City, leading them to the Fourth Division title in 1975–76 with a record 74 points.

Also brought to the Club around this time was Bertie Mee, a respected ex-Manager of Arsenal, who had the rare distinction of managing a 'double' winning team, among other honours. He came in as Assistant Manager with specific responsibility to develop a scheme that would bring young, talented players to the Club.

With a new team at the helm, success was almost instant and Watford stormed to the Fourth Division title of 1977–78 with 71 points.

The following season, 1978-79, brought promotion again, this time from the 3rd

Division to the Second Watford finished runners-up to Shrewsbury Town.

At the outset of the 1981-82 season promotion from the Second to First Division seemed a tantalising hope, by May it became reality.

On May 4th, 1982 Watford faced Wrexham at Vicarage Road, needing one point to ensure a place in the First Division. Twenty thousand fans saw Ross Jenkin score twice and Watford had realised Elton John's dream – they were a First Division Club – in only six years since he took over.

Now in the First Division, all the pundits expected Watford to struggle. But one by one the big names were humbled and the Club remained in the top three for virtually the whole season, never dropping below sixth place.

The final match of the season brought champions Liverpool to Vicarage Road, with a Watford win needed to secure the runners-up spot. A 2-1 victory completed a memorable season and ensured a place in the UEFA Cup for the following term.

1983-84 started inauspiciously and the Hornets found themselves in 20th place in the League by December, under threat of relegation. But the winter months saw the Club regain its confidence and move steadily up the League and then reach Wembley in the F.A. Cup for the first time. Alas the dream was not completed and Watford went down 2-0 to Everton.

In the 1986-87 season Watford finished ninth in Division One (the Club's second highest position) and also reached the semi-finals of the F.A. Cup.

On the eve of the Club's tour of China. Manager Graham Taylor resigned, ending a decade at Vicarage Road. He joine Aston Villa, and was replaced at Watford by former Wimbledon boss Dave Bassett.

Under his guidance last season, Watford

made a disastrous start and never recovered. Bassett eventually departed to be replaced in January 1988 by Steve Harrison.

Watford, though, ended the season being relegated to the Second Division. At the time of writing they are in with a chance of reaching the promotional play-offs and a quick return.

MEET THE MANAGER AND PLAYERS

Steve Harrison (Manager). Appointed Manager at Watford in January 1988 in succession to Dave Bassett. Previous managerial appointment was assistant at Aston Villa. As a defender, the 37 year old's playing career encompassed Blackpool, Vancouver Whitecaps, Watford and Charlton.

Tony Coton (Goalkeeper). Born Tamworth he joined Watford from Birmingham City for a fee of £300,000 in September 1984. Now in his fifth season at Vicarage Road he has made over 200 appearances for the Hornets. Only just failed at the end of last season – he finished third – to become the first player to win the 'Player of the Season' award in three consecutive years. Mel Rees (Goalkeeper). Born Cardiff. He signed for Watford for £60,000 from his local club in the summer of 1987. A former Welsh Youth International he is the understudy to Coton.

Nigel Gibbs (Defender). Born St. Albans He joined Watford as an apprentice. A former England Youth and Under-21 International. To the start of this season had made 116 League appearances.

John McClelland (Defender). Born Belfast. Club Captain and also current Captain of his country, Northern Ireland. Played in the side representing the Football League in the 'Centenary Classic'. The 33 year old has also seen service with Portadown, Cardiff City, Mansfield and Glasgow Rangers.

Kenny Jackett (Midfielder). Born Watford. Established full Welsh International, whose father, Frank, also played for Watford. Normally plays on the left side of midfield, but has also appeared at the back. A one Club man is near to making 400 first team appearances for the Club.

Willie Falconer (Defender). Born Aberdeen Signed for Aberdeen for £300,000 in June 1988. The 23 year old is a former Scottish Youth International.

Paul Miller (Defender). Born London Signed during this season from Charlton. A former apprentice with Spurs he went on to make 208 League apperances for them before switching across London to Charlton

Rod Thomas (Forward). Born London A former trainee with Watford, he signed professional forms for the Club in May of last year. An England Youth International

Paul Wilkinson (Forward). Born Lough. Another costly summer '88 signing at £300,000 from Notts. Forest. An England Under-21 International he also played for Grimsby and Everton as well as Forest.

Garry Thompson (Forward). Born Birmingham. He joined Watford for £325,000 from Coventry City. The 29 year old began his career at Coventry but after 134 League appearances moved to Midlands rivals West Bromwich Albion. Has also played for Sheffield Wednesday and Aston Villa.

Gary Porter (Midfield). Born Sunderland Left-sided midfield player who is an England Under-21 and Youth Inernational Made his Watford first team debut when only 17. Just turned 23 years of age he has made over 100 League appearances for the Club

Glyn Hodges (Forward). Born Stretham Joined Watford on September 28 1987 from Newcastle in a £300,000 deal. He had previously been with Wimbledon, for whom he made 232 League appearances scoring 49 goals at both Full and Under-21 level.

David Holdsworth (Defender). Born London. A former apprentice at the Club who signed professional forms in November 1986. An England Youth International and Captain. Made Watford debut in January '88 against Ipswich in Simod Cup.

Dean Holdsworth (Forward). Born London Twin brother of David. Forced himself, after a serious knee injury, into the first team picture in the latter part of last season. Top scorer in the Reserves last season.

Iwan Roberts (Forward). Born Bangor. Welsh Youth International who made his first team debut in March 1986 when only 17.

Rick Holden (Forward). Born Skipton. Signed from Halifax in March '88 for £125,000 plus £25,000 after 20 first team appearances. The 24 year old played only one game for Burnley before moving to Halifax.

G.W.R.F.C.







MY THIRD SEASON

This is my third season as Groundsman with Swindon Town Football Club and during that period of time I have been quietly pleased with the improvement of the playing surface.

In fact this season has seen the most significant improvement but of course this is due to the culmination of three years progress. Having been pleased with this progression I am aware that further improvement can be made.

IMPROVEMENT STILL NEEDED That improvement concerns the centre of the pitch and the two goalmouths. There is no doubt that all Groundsmen face this problem area with any playing surface.

What is reassuring is the comments made by visitors, opposing teams and match officials. We have been lucky this season because we have had a mild winter. Although I must tistress there has been no reduction in the number of matches played at the County Ground. There is always the normal wear and tear to contend with whether it is a mild or severe winter!

WAITING FOR THE CLOSE SEASON We are now nearing the completion of the season and I am obviously anxious to put into operation the work that is required during this close season.

Last summer we had the pitch Vertidrained and the same process will be put in operation in May. This entails putting long spikes down into the ground by means of a tractor. This relieves the compaction of the ground. We then spread 80 tons of sand over the pitch and the mass bulk of this is driven into those ten inch holes. This creates a reservoir, water will drain quicker into the drains and so alleviate the risk of any waterlogging. Ironically as I am writing this column the news of a possible further postponement at

Birmingham City has sifted through. A broken drain at St Andrews, where I was once the Groundsman, is the main cause of flooding.

BARCLAYS? NO, NOT QUITE, ITS DOUBLE DUTCH!

Immediately all of that preparation is complete it is time to seed the whole area. Obviously some areas need to be seeded rather more than others. The centre circle and penalty areas come readily to mind.

Rye grass is the bulk of the seed we spread. It is a variety called Barclay seed. I can assure you that it is in no way connected with the Football League sponsors! It is a type of seed that is Dutch bred, hard wearing, very fine with fine powers of recovery. In my opinion the powers of recovery of this ground now borders on the phenomenal. There have been two or three matches where the pitch, when the game has been completed, has appeared to be worn. The recent Midland Youth Cup match with Leicester City, a fine example.

WE ALL NEED ENCOURAGEMENT Praise for all of us in our occupations is always welcome encouragement and I have been grateful in recent weeks to several for this type of comment.

A recent official was generous in praise and there have been players from opposing teams who have been genuinely surprised and pleased at the surface. Previous visits of seasons past had led them to expect an inferior product at the County Ground. On the same day the doubt arose at Birmingham City we could have played at the

County Ground. An inspection would not have been required.

THE MOST HECTIC HOURS

The busiest hours for me are following a match where the playing surface is badly cut-up. The first job following such a match is to replace the divots. I am lucky to have my two sons, Stephen and Ian, to help me immediately the final whistle blows.

You may find it strange that my next job is to pray for more rain! Actually it helps to wash the pitch down. If you could see the ground following an immediate downpour you would be amazed at the immediate improvement. If a frost is forecast, the first task it to roll the pitch. When I return to the County Ground on the following Monday, if it is a Saturday fixture, and the weather allows me, I set out to spike the pitch to two or three inches depth, this allows any surface water to drain away.

Most Groundsmen obviously hope that their grounds will not be cut-up. I hope this insight enlightens you into the ways of the upkeep required. I hope you enjoy your summer months, sun by day and rain by night, a Groundsman's plea for summer weather!
