




ood afternoon everybody, Today





PAUL BODIN (Defender) age 25. Born Cardiff. Took over at left-back following Phil King's departure to Sheffield Wednesday in November. Won his first Welsh cap against Costa Rica in May. Signed in March 1988 from Newport County for £25,000. Previously with Bath City, where he was their top scorer with 16 goals in 1986/87. Appearances: 1989/90: 53 + 3 Goals: 6.

COLIN CALDERWOOD (Defender) Age 25. Born Glasgow. The club captain - one of only two Town players to be "ever present" last season (his third maximum in five seasons at the County Ground). Signed from Mansfield Town where he began as an apprentice. Recently recovered from a calf injury and ready to lead the club's bid to regain their First Division place. Appearances: 1989/90: 61 Goals: 3.

SHAUN CLOSE (Striker) Age 23. Born Islington, London. A £70,000 signing from AFC Bournemouth soon after the start of last season. With the Shearer White partnership yielding over fifty goals, Shaun was restricted to just four full appearances and was sent off in one of them. Has yet to score a senior goal for the club. Previously with Tottenham. Appearances: 1989/90: 4 + 11.

FRASER DIGBY (Goalkeeper) Age 27. Born Sheffield. Recently married. The England Under 21 keeper missed just one game last year. The first time he had been absent in over two years. United apprentice, signed in 1986, was back to his best form towards the end of the season. Appearances: 1989/90: 60.

STEVE FOLEY (Midfield) Age 27. Born Liverpool. Missed the first three months of last season with an ankle injury, but was soon buzzing again as "The Town" went 22 games without making a change to their line-up. A knee operation forced him out for a further seven games in the spring. Signed from Sheffield United in 1987. Appearances: 1989/90 30 + 3 Goals: 6.

**TONY GALVIN** (Midfield) Age 34. Born Huddersfield. The Republic of Ireland international was Ossie Ardiles' first signing for Swindon last July. Came on a free transfer from Sheffield Wednesday, who had to pay Tottenham £140,000 for him only two years earlier. Recently recovered from a back injury. Has a degree in Russian. Appearances: 1989/90:6+8.

JON GITTENS (Defender) Age 26 Born Moseley, Birmingham. After a three match suspension following dismissal at Leeds, Jon settled down to his most consistent spell since arriving at Swindon three years ago. Previously with Southampton who spotted him playing in non-League football with Paget Rangers in 1985. Appearances: 1989/90 55 Goals: 4.

DAVE HOCKADAY (Defender) Age 32. Born in Billingham, Co. Durham. The longest serving player at the Club, having been signed from Blackpool by Ken Beamish in 1983. Successfully converted from a winger to a full-back during the Town's Fourth Division championship season. A fractured cheekbone in November cost Dave his place, when new signing, David Kerslake took over. Appearances: 1989/90 15 + 10.

TOM JONES (Midfield) Age 25. Born Aldershot. Made a speedy recovery from a cartilage operation last summer and clearly enjoyed the Town's short ball game. A former Chelsea apprentice, Tom arrived at the County Ground in September 1988 via Farnborough, Weymouth and Aberdeen. Appearances: 1989/90 56 + 2 Goals: 2.

DAVID KERSLAKE (Midfield/Defender) Age 24. Born London. Signed for £110,000 from QPR last November, David stopped in at right-back and became a firm favourite with the fans with his sorties upfield. An England schoolboy, youth and Under-21 international, he joined the Loftus Road Club as an apprentice and made his first team debut in a UEFA cup tie in October1984. Appearances: 1989/90 37.

ROSS MACLAREN (Midfield) Age 23. Born Manchester. The Swindon Evening Advertiser Readers' Player of the Year is still recovering from an operation for a groin injury following his return from Italy with the Republic of Ireland squad (where he made two appearances as substitute). Was missing from Swindon's starting line -up only once last season. A free transfer signing from Manchester United in 1986. Appearances: 1989/90 60 + 1 Goals: 16.

**DUNCAN SHEARER** (Striker) Age 27. Born Fort William. Joint top goalscorer with Steve White, Duncan has topped his club's scoring list for a fourth successive season (including twice with Huddersfield Town). Signed from the Yorkshire club for £230,000, he was released by Chelsea on a "free" in 1986. Now has a career record of 91 goals in under 200 games. Appearances: 1989/90 57 Goals: 27.

FITZROY SIMPSON (Midfield) Age 20. Born Bradford - upon - Avon. A former trainee, Fitzroy made his first full appearance against Sunderland in February 1989. Sent off against the same club on the opening day last season and again six games later, he now seems to have overcome his disciplinary problems. Appearances: 1989/90 25 +13 Goals: 2.

STEVE WHITE (Striker) Age 31. Born Chipping Sodbury. Probably the best free transfer signing ever made by Swindon Town, Steve was the other half of the 54 goal partnership last season. About to commence his 13th year in League football. Previously with Bristol Rovers (twice with Charlton Athletic). Appearances: 1989/90 50 + 1 Goals: 27.

## FLASH BACK

#### 25 YEARS AGO

The Tigers having beaten Swindon Town at home in midweek 1-0 with a Wagstaff goal, they then suffered their first defeat of the season in Division Three, losing at home 1-3 to Queens Park Rangers. City suffered an early blow when Rangers took the lead after only 2 minutes, the defence being caught out by a long throw from full back Langley and Les Allen nipped in to score with a low shot. Eight minutes later Allen dashed in to make it 2-0. Roger Morgan put the game beyond the Tigers reach after 32 minutes. City began to show some urgency mid-way through the second half and from a Terry Heath corner, Chris Chilton pulled a goal back. Ken Wagstaff worked hard in attack and Chris Simpkin grafted well in midfield, but it was all to no avail.

The Tigers continued their Division Two campaign with a 1-0 home victory over Orient, having been beaten by the same score at Oldham the previous week.

It was Orient's spoiling tactics that frustrated the Tigers for much of the first half and something special was needed to break down the defensive shroud. Indeed that is what happened in the 40th minute when Alf Wood scored a magnificent goal to claim the points. Peter Fletcher got up well to City's sixth first half corner taken by Vince Grimes. The Orient défence failed to clear the danger and the ball bounced to Wood who scored with a brilliant overhead kick, giving keeper Jackson no chance. It brought sparkle to an otherwise dull game.

#### **5 YEARS AGO**

Hull City continued their campaign with a goalless draw at home to Middlesbrough, having lost 1-3 at Oldham the previous week. A double disaster for the Tigers in this game, with a missed penalty in the tenth minute by Whitehurst after Bunn had been brought down by keeper Pears and a disallowed goal 2 minutes from time. Substitute Mike Ring crossed for Askew to head into the path of Whitehurst who stroked the ball home, but Bunn was ruled to be in an offside position. City dominated the game as a whole but were usually well off target. It was one of those frustrating days for the Tigers.

Two quite brilliant goals by Ken Wagstaff in the third minute and Chris Chilton in the 22nd minute, gave the Tigers a fine victory and took them to the top of the Second Division - albeit briefly.

But what turned out to be the biggest gate of the season to date saw City's defence give their shakiest performance to which manager Terry Neill blamed most of the anxiety on himself. Indeed he had to be thankful for a marvellous display from Billy Wilkinson for keeping the Tigers out of trouble. Close behind were the hard working Ken Houghton and Malcolm Lord in midfield prompting the attack in the first half and helping the defence during a rather scrappy second half.

However, City got off to a whirlwind start by opening the scoring after only three minutes. It was a crisp move linking Don Beardsley, Chris Chilton and Ian Butler finding Wagstaff who flicked the ball up with one foot and dipped a 20 yard volley home with the other. The Tigers increased their lead in the 22nd minute when another sweeping move over half the length of the field with De Vries, Houghton and Wagstaff combining brilliantly to find Chilton around the edge of the penalty area and he rattled the ball home.

In between the goals though, Swindon could also have scored twice as centre forward Chris Jones missed good chances - having only lan McKecknie to beat. The next play by Don Rodgers was largely responsible for the chances Swindon had but he too was guilty of missing chances. City lost a lot of their attacking rythm in the second half and injuries to Wagstaff and Chilton didn't help their cause. Wagstaff hurt a knee just before halftime following a tackle by keeper Jones and then Chilton had to leave the field in the 64th minute to receive stitches to a head wound after colliding with Burrows in a heading dual. He was replaced by Stuart Pearson.

## THE MATCH FACTS

Today's meeting is the 35th between Hull City and Swindon Town - all in the Football League. The Tigers have won 8, Town 13 with 13 drawn. City's biggest win against Swindon Town is the 3-1 success at the County Ground last season.

Swindon's summer was dominated by their controversial demotion to Division Three, just two weeks after qualifying to play in the First Division for the first time in their history after pleading guilty to 36 charges relating to irregular payments since 1985. The Football Association's Board of Appeal overturned the League's decision and promoted - or should it be relegated Town to the Second Division?

In the corresponding fixture last season, played on Saturday 7 October, Town left Boothferry Park with three points thanks to goals from Fitzroy Simpson, Alan McLoughlin and Tim Parkin; Peter Swann hit two in reply for the Tigers in front of 5,366.

Swindon Town was formed in 1881 by the Reverend W. Pitt and was an amateur organistion until professionalism was adotped in 1894. They were original members of the Southern League and played on the Croft until 1896 when they moved to the County Ground. They began playing on the area which is now a cricket pitch.

Recent visits from Swindon Town rarely hold happy memories for Tiger fans. Town won 4-1 here on 15 April 1988 with two goals from Dave Bamber - not only Town's biggest win against City and our heaviest League defeat at Boothferry Park for twelve years but Brian Horton's last match in charge of the Tigers. Seven years earlier City and Town fought out a goalless draw, an attendance of only 2,789 indicative that this result relegated City to the Fourth Division.

The first Swindon Town - Hull City meeting took place at the County Ground on Wednesday 27th August, 1958 when Town won a Third Division encounter with goals from Andy Nicklewright and Bob Edwards. Five days later Swindon made their first visit to Boothferry Park, earning a goalless draw before 12,035.

Like Notts County, our only previous visitors this season, Swindon Town, finished the 1989/90 campaign by winning a Play-Off Final at Wembley Stadium.

Tigers striker, Dave Bamber, should today face the club where he enjoyed some of the most successful days of his career. Dave led the Swindon attack on their way up from the Fourth to the Second Divison following his £12,500 move from Portsmouth in March, 1986. 106 League games and 31 goals later he joined Watford for £105,000.

Other Tigers / Robins include Charlie Flood, Roy Greenwood, Alan Moore, John Neal, Johnny Stephens and George Rushton.

Much of the sympathy generated by the Swindon Town Scandal Saga has quite rightly been directed towards the Wiltshire club's loyal fans but at least one fan wants more than mere sympathy. 30 year-old insurance worker David Richardson is taking the Football League to the small claims court in Blackpool on 16 October. He wants £83 reimbursement for the money he spent watching Town's Play-Off matches. In view of subsequent events, he insists the matches were meaningless as the League were aware of the facts before the matches took place.

This operation was a great success resulting in 350 calls, the vast majority of which contained information and intelligence of use to the Unit.

As a result of this success, the National Football Intelligence Unit feel it would be advantageous if this number could be available to decent football supporters on a regular basis in an effort to combat the hooligans who are bringing our National game into disrepute.




The Football Trust 1990 has been created to help the game at all levels and to assist clubs meet the requirements of Lord Justice Taylor's Final Report.

Safety and comfort for all spectators is the primary objective and substantial funds have been made available for the provision of seating at Football League grounds. At the same time the Trust's commitment to family and community initiatives will continue with the provision of more family enclosures, better toilet facilities, covered accommodation, artificial pitches for local use and the development of women's and junior football particularly through community programmes, plus a wide range of policing and crowd control measures.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zetters. This money will be invested in projects which benefit football throughout the United Kingdom.

## PLAYER PROFILE

Viking F.M.'s Tim Maitland continues his quest for the truth, by Interviewing Garreth Roberts, City's longest serving player.



ou can still be happy and cheerful in this game, you know. They say you've got to be ruthless to be a winner but I think you can balance it 50-50." That statement sums up Garreth Roberts' attitude to the game, but it's also slightly misleading. Ask him how many games he's played for Hull City. He'll tell you exactly. He'll say 409 league, 480 in all and he'll barely be able to disguise the satisfaction he gets from saying it.

Perhaps Mr. Roberts can be better summed up as a smiling assassin."I think you've got to be happy and smiling, but you've got to have that streak in you that wants to be a winner as well and hopefully that's what I've got."

It has to be said that in footballing terms, Garreth Roberts is a bit of a freak. He made his debut in March '79 as a first half substitute in a 4-1 win over Bury." Alan Warboys got cropped and I was wetting myself!". He's now in his third decade at the club, his twelfth season.

If that doesn't tell you something about his commitment then what he gives as the low point in his career speaks volumes. "When Brian Horton took away my captaincy that was my worst time in football because it meant so much to me and it really got to me. It was the closest I got to saying right!....Chuck It! Go and play for somebody else."

So, in times when players change clubs more often than the clubs change their strips, why is the man still here? "I just feel a part of the Town, I'd have been far better off financially if I'd moved, but I don't think money is everything either, It's just I love the place and all my family's here. I'm a big family man, we've just had our second child a daughter, we need a base and this is as good as any".

Roberts has just finished his testimonial season (although the testimonial game is still to come) and it's perhaps a sign of the times that he accepts how unusual that is." A few years back

you'd get maybe 40 or 50 a season but now it's one in a thousand. It's not just the players fault, the clubs do tend to take you for granted a bit. "Looking at it, the fact that Garreth has lasted so long despite coming from the City is also a little unusual. Think about some of the players who have earned your wrath in the past... Andy Flounders, Steve McClaren and Frankie Bunn are names that immediately spring to mind, "It's always how you start with the fans and I had a great start (he'd played 10 first team games before sampling defeat) and I've never had any problems with the fans. I think if you give 100 per cent commitment that's all they ask for. If you do that, you're O.K. with them."

Garreth has just signed a new contract at the club after spending the summer wrangling with Stan Ternent. He says at worst it was 60-40 in favour of him signing anyway but just as anyone would in business he held out for what he thought he was worth.

It's at this point that Garreth gets out his slippers and pipe and does his impersonation of a Grandad."The thing that annoys me nowadays is the fact that young players don't listen to older players as much as they used to. They think they've made it after a few games. They think they're there after 10 or 11 games, they think they've done it and they don't have to work at it any more. It's not like that, you have to work so hard. Colin Appleton reckons you're not a player until you've made 250 appearances. In a way I think he's right... you're just learning the game all the time."

Garreth has certainly had to do his share of learning, having played full back, across the midfield, out on the wings, even one game up front and now he's adapting to his role as a sweeper. While the start of the season on the pitch hasn't been quite what was wanted, Roberts is impressed with the way the club is going. "The Chairman's obviously got something about him and he's going to do the business. Although it's a pity about his dress sense!! It's nice to see the club being pushed in the right direction."




Top - Peter Swan, explaining the new offside rule to the referee.



## KEN KNIGHTON



igned from Blackburn Rovers on 4th March, 1971 for a club record of £60,000. He made his debut on 9th March, 1971 against Sheffield United at Bramall Lane in that memorable but bruising battle with City winning 2-1.

A hard tackling half-back born in Barnsley 20th February, 1944. He joined Wolverhampton Wanderers in 1959, turning professional with them in February 1961. He then moved around Lancashire by joing Oldham Athletic in November 1966, Preston North End in December 1967 and Blackburn Rovers in July 1969, before signing for the Tigers.

He made 80 league appearances for City before joining Sheffield Wednesday in August 1973 for £50,000. He retired from the game in 1976 becoming coach at Hillsborough. He moved on to coach at Sunderland before appointment as their manager from June 1979 until April 1981, when he was dismissed. He then became Orient Manager in October 1981 until May 1983.

After managing Orient, he then had spells in charge of top non-League sides, Dagenham and Trowbridge Town. He currently lives in the Bristol area but works in Manchester as Business Manager for GEC Plessey Communications, Northern region.

He still has a link with soccer having

his own programme on local radio.

He was a very popular figure in the two and a half years with the Tigers, being part of the second most successful side in the club's history.


