



The squad

Ron Atkinson (Manager). Born Liverpool. Began his professional career at Aston Villa but his name became synonymous with Oxford United, where he figured prominently in their climb into the Football League in 1962 and their rapid rise from the Fourth to the Second Division. In 1971 he became player-manager at Kettering Town, and began his League management career at Cambridge United in 1974, leading them from Division Four to the brink of Division Two. He joined West Brom in 1978, building a successful First Division side before moving to Manchester United in 1981. In his five full seasons at Old Trafford. United never finished out of the top four, won the F.A. Cup twice and reached the League Cup Final. He returned to West Brom in 1987 and then had a brief spell at Atletico Madrid. He joined Wednesday in February 1989. Trevor Francis (Striker). Born Plymouth. Started with Birmingham City in 1970. Quickly gained recognition as one of the outstanding players of his generation, gaining 52 England caps and becoming a £1 million player when he moved to Nottingham Forest in 1979 after scoring 118 goals in 280 League games. Manchester City also paid £1 million plus for him in 1981. He then went to Sampdoria and later played in the United States with Atlanta before returning to Britain with Glasgow Rangers. Returned to English soccer with Q.P.R., where he became player-manager for a short spell. Wednesday obtained his services on a free transfer in January 1990. David Hirst (Striker). Born Barnsley. Started

Phil King (Defender). Born Bristol. Joined the Owls for £400,000 from the Town in November 1989 and missed only two games last season, making a big impact and proving popular with supporters. Came to Swindon from Torquay United for £12,500 early in 1987 and was previously with Exeter City. Lawrie Madden (Defender). Born London. Veteran of over 400 League and Cup games with Mansfield, Charlton, Millwall and Wednesday. Went to Hillsborough in 1983 on a free transfer and helped the Owls win promotion. In his early career he played as a part-timer to concentrate on his studies, and he now boasts degrees from Manchester and Sheffield Universities.

Steve McCall (Defender). Born Carlisle. After over 259 League games for Ipswich Town and England honours at Youth, Under-21 and 'B' levels, he joined Wednesday in June 1987 for £250,000 but suffered a broken leg in only his fifth appearance. It marked the beginning of a long struggle for fitness which was not helped when he later suffered a cartilage injury. He made three appearances towards the end of

Roland Nilsson (Defender). Born Helsingborg. Swedish International capped 35 times and a member of his country's 1990 World Cup side. Joined Wednesday in December 1989 from Gothenburg for £375,000. Recently absent through injury, having been carried off at Millwall.

Carlton Palmer (Midfield). Born Oldbury. Began with West Brom, for whom he made some 140 appearances before joining Wednesday for a club record fee of £750,000 in February 1989. Has gained 4 England Under-21 caps and played for England 'B' last

Nigel Pearson (Defender). Born Nottingham. Plucked from non-League Heanor Town in 1981, he made over 180 appearances for Shrewsbury Town before joining Wednesday for £250,000 in October 1987. Has been club captain for two years.

Kevin Pressman (Goalkeeper). Born Fareham. Celebrates his 23rd birthday today. Joined Wednesday as an apprentice in June 1984 after being on schoolboy forms. Became a full professional in November 1985. A former England schoolboy and England Youth player, he also has one England Under-21 cap. Made his League debut in March 1987 when Martin Hodge's long, consecutive run came to an end.

Peter Shirtliff (Defender). Born Chapeltown. Sheffield. Signed schoolboy forms in 1975 and went on to become an apprentice in June 1977. Moved up to professional level in October 1978. He made 223 appearances for Wednesday before joining Charlton in July 1986 and over 100 League appearances for the London side before returning to Hillsborough for a £500,000 fee in the summer of 1989.

John Sheridan (Midfield). Born Manchester. Made over 250 appearances for Leeds and scored some 50 goals, winning Republic of Ireland caps at Youth, Under-21 and Full International levels, Joined Wednesday in November 1989 for £500,000 after a brief spell at Nottingham Forest, where he made only one appearances in over three months.

Chris Turner (Goalkeeper). Originally with Wednesday as a schoolboy from September 1973, he made 115 appearances before being transferred to Sunderland for £80,000 in 1979. He made 223 appearances for the Roker club before moving to Manchester United for £275,000 in 1985. After some 80 games for the Old Trafford club, he rejoined Wednesday in September 1988 for £175,000.

Steve Whitton (Striker). Born East Ham, Has some 240 League appearances to his credit with Coventry, West Ham, Birmingham and Wednesday. Cost the Owls £275,000 in March 1989, and played a significant part in the push to avoid relegation that year. Last season he scored four times in the record 8-0 League Cup triumph at Aldershot, but his senior outings were infrequent. Had a loan spell at Halmstad, in Sweden, in the summer.

Paul Williams (Striker). Charlton's leading scorer in the last two seasons, having reached them from non-League Woodford Town and made such an impact following his debut in September 1987 that he gained England Under-21 recognition. Studied accountancy before becoming a full time professional. Joined Wednesday in August 1990 for a £600,000 fee.

Danny Wilson (Midfield). Born Wigan. Started with Wigan Athletic but began his League career at Bury in late 1977, since when he has made over 550 League and Cup appearances, scored some 90 goals, and collected nearly 20 caps for Northern Ireland. Joined Chesterfield in 1980 and had a year at Nottingham Forest before enjoying his best spells with Brighton and, since 1987, Luton Town. He helped Luton to two League Cup finals - and contributed to their dramatic escape from relegation last season. Cost Wednesday £200,000 in the summer of 1990.

Darren Wood (Defender). Made over 100 appearances for Middlesbrough and some 150 for Chelsea before joining Wednesday in January 1989 for £400,000. Has not appeared this season due to injury.

Nigel Worthington (Defender). Born Ballymena. Began his League career with Notts County for whom he made over 80 appearances before joining Wednesday for £125,000 in February 1984. Capped 28 times for Northern Ireland.

1967/68

Two new signings appeared in the Swindon line-up on the opening day against Brighton, right-half Dave Harper from Ipswich Town and right-winger Barry Lowes from Coventry City. But collectively they made only six appearances for the Town, with injury restricting Lowes to just two hours and four minutes League football.

Danny Williams wasted no time in securing a replacement for Lowes. His choice was Norwich City's Don Heath, who made his debut in a 4-0 win over Northampton on September 16.

Another new face in a Swindon shirt, later in 1967/68, was that of Peter Noble. Signed from Newcastle United on January 25, his first full appearance was in a 5-0 crushing of Grimsby a month later. The Town's fifth goal in that victory, incidentally, was an own goal conceded by the visiting leftback, a certain Graham Taylor! Noble's inclusion at number eight followed a two-goal strike after coming on as a substitute against Bury three days earlier.

Don Rogers and John Trollope made maximum League appearances for the fourth successive season. And, as in 1966/67, the 'ever-present' record also went to wing-half Stan Harland. The Liverpudlian was handed the number nine shirt in the Town's final two games, after hitting a hat-trick for the reserves at Northampton on April 30.

Rogers was the top goalscorer, as he had been the previous season, and was again the highest scoring winger in the Football League. His tally in 1967/68 was 28 goals, 25 coming in Division Three. He was followed by the all-action Pat Terry, who grabbed 19. In a 4-0 win over Bournemouth at the County Ground on October 14, Terry plundered a hat-trick in the opening ten minutes.

The Town's League form was once again patchy. Four wins out of six up to the turn of the year took them to third place, but following a 4-0 victory over The Orient on March 12, Swindon went nine games without a win, although only two ended in defeat. They eventually finished tenth.

Swindon's efforts in the League Cup that season are best forgotten. They were unable to defeat Fourth Division Newport County at home in the First Round – conceding an own goal through Mel Nurse and needing a penalty to force a 1-1 draw – and went down 2-0 in the replay.

In the F.A. Cup, Salisbury,
Luton Town and Blackburn
Rovers were all beaten at the
County Ground before the Fourth
Round draw gave the Town a trip
to Hillsborough. Roger Smart gave
Swindon a 34th minute lead, but
Wednesday equalised through Wilf
Smith in the 65th and grabbed a
winner with just five minutes to go.
The scorer was big John Ritchie,
who had dealt the Town a similar
knockout blow in the same
competition seven years earlier
when at Kettering.

Highlights . . .

With two teams tonight doing battle in a replay for a place in Round Five of the Rumbelows Cup, let's consider some of the highlights from last weeks other ties.

Third Division Orient held Crystal Palace to a goal-less draw at Selhurst Park. Steve Coppell's side had put eight past Southend United in the competition.

Matthew LeTissier and Rod Wallace were on target in Southampton's 2-0 victory at Ipswich.

In the big match at Maine Road, Manchester City lost their unbeaten home record this season, 2-1 to Arsenal. Perry Groves and Tony Adams got the "Gunners" goals before Clive Allen hit a late consolation.

Second Division
Middlesbrough scored twice in fifteen minutes in the first half to knock out Norwich 2-0 at Ayresome Park, thanks to Paul Kerr and John Hendrie.

Trevor Putney made his comeback for the "Canaries" from a broken leg.

Colin Harvey's managerial reign at Everton ended after a 2-1 defeat by Sheffield United at Bramall Lane – all the goals came after the break: Carl Bradshaw, Brian Deane and John Pemberton putting past his own 'keeper.

In the final fixture on Tuesday, Tottenham, led by Gazza, got the better of Bradford at White Hart Lane. 2-1 after going behind to a Gavin Oliver goal. Paul Gascoigne and Paul Stewart sealed "Spurs" success.

Tony Cascarino and a David Platt penalty were on target for Aston Villa at home to Millwall - the Midlands side 2-0 winners.

Chelsea and Portsmouth shared in a goal-less draw at Stamford Bridge.

Coventry recorded a 3-0 victory over Hull at Highfield Road, thanks to second half goals by David Speedie, Jason Livingstone and Cyrille Regis.

While the Town drew nil-nil with Sheffield Wednesday at Hillsborough, Swindon's next potential opponents, Derby, thrashed Sunderland 6-0 at the Baseball Ground with a Mick Harford hat-trick, Gary Bennett own goal and two further efforts from Craig Ramage.

Last year's beaten finalists, Oldham, lost 2-0 at Leeds, Lee Chapman and Gavin Speed were on the scoresheet.

Manchester United made the headline news with the first defeat of Liverpool since April, 3-1 at Old Trafford. A Steve Bruce penalty and Mark Hughes did the damage within 60 seconds. Lee Sharpe added a third, Ray Houghton replied.


Plan of Hillsborough

Safety and comfort for all spectators is the primary objective and substantial funds have been made available for the provision of seating at Football League grounds. At the same time the Trust's commitment to family and community initiatives will continue with the provision of more family enclosures, better toilet facilities, covered accommodation, artificial pitches for local use and the development of women's and junior football particularly through community programmes, plus a wide range of policing and crowd control measures.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Little-woods, Vernons and Zetters. This money will be invested in projects which benefit football throughout the United Kingdom.


